QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Cooyora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpicheu run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpicheu run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypaniel in the county of Gladstone.

Parish of Kinypaniel—Mackins.—Comprising allotment 95 on the River Loddon, in the county of Gladstone.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanalta East run to Gohareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

The births of 726 children, viz., 370 boys and 356 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 623 births were registered, or 101 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in March numbered 633, viz., 322 of males and 311 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 93. The deaths were exactly equal to those in February, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 238. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 147 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93.1° on the 9th, and the lowest was 41.0° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (63.4°) was nearly one-third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.9°) took place on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 89.0° to a minimum of 52.1°. The least range (3.1°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 65.1° to a minimum of 62.0°. The mean daily range was 22.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.964 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Of the total deaths 51 per cent. were of males and 49 per cent. of females. Fifty-eight per cent. were of children under 5 years as against 46 per cent. in March 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; 52 per cent. in March 1871; 47 per cent. in March 1870; 43 per cent. in March 1869; 61 per cent. in March 1868; 63 per cent. in March 1867; 57 per cent. in March 1866; and 59 per cent. in March 1865.

Thirteen persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A blacksmith and a shepherd aged respectively 76 and 84, of old age; a hawker and a female both aged 75, and a gentleman aged 80, of paralysis; a gentleman aged 75, of disease of the heart and dropsy; a gentleman aged 76, of hepatic disease and dropsy; a painter aged 77, of cancer; a civil engineer aged 78, of dysentery; a female aged 80, of diseased liver and jaundice; a male aged 84, formerly a constable, of self-inflicted wounds; a female aged 85 of disease of the liver; and a female aged 87, of diarrhoea.

The deaths from external causes which took place during the month numbered 19, of these 17 were set down as accidental and 2 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A boy aged 14½ died of the effects of a kick from a horse; a female infant aged 3 months died of extravasation of blood on the brain, the effects of an accidental fall; a stonemason aged 47 died of injury to the spine, also caused by a fall; a female aged 26 died of concussion of the brain, the result of a fall from a buggy; a male child aged 1½ and two carters aged 34 and 43 respectively were accidentally killed, through being passed over by drays; a male child aged 2 died of scalds; a female aged 7 died of sunstroke; a boatman aged 30 was accidentally drowned in Hobson's Bay whilst in a state of drunkenness; a boy aged 9 was accidentally drowned in the Corporation Baths; four persons were found drowned, viz., a boy aged 6 and a hatmaker aged 51 in Hobson's Bay, a master mariner aged 55 and a male of occupation unknown, aged 35 in the River Yarra; a male infant aged 18 days and a female infant aged 4 months were suffocated in bed. A male aged 84 (previous occupation a constable) cut his throat in the Treasury Gardens whilst suffering from delirium tremens; a female aged 40 poisoned herself with oxalic acid.

Ninety deaths, or 14 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz. :—40 in the Melbourne Hospital; 11 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 6 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 6 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum; and 1 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 366, of which 183, or 50 per cent., were of males; and 183, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 211 were under one year of age, 101 were between one and two, 28 were between two and three, 19 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 267. Of these, 139, or 52 per cent., were males and 128, or 48 per cent., were females; 26 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases which numbered 511 in January and 308 in February, fell to 252 in March. Under this head measles caused 81 deaths as against 115 in February and 271 in January; and dysentery and diarrhoea caused 111 deaths as against 130 in February and 151 in January. When dysentery and diarrhoea are stated to have supervened upon measles they are always entered in the tables under that head, but there is no doubt that they often so supervened without the fact being recorded. Deaths from typhoid fever increased from 18 in January and 15 in February to 19 in the month under review.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 31st March 1875 was 2,258, and the mean temperature in the shade was 65.0°. The deaths numbered 1,033 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or if allowance be made for the increase of population they numbered 752 more than that average. The mean temperature during the same period exceeded the average by a small fraction.

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Administrator of the Government, in Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Commons in the Shire of Meredith.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF COMMONS IN THE SHIRE OF MEREDITH, NAMELY:

*The unoccupied portions of the Cargarie Common,
The Meredith and Coolebarghurk United Common,
The Anakie Common, and
The Darrivell Farmers' Common.*

The Council of the Shire of Meredith by virtue of the power vested in it by the Regulations issued by the Governor in Council in that behalf, has this day adopted the following Regulations in lieu of all other Regulations heretofore in force, for the management of the above commons.

1. *Persons entitled to commonage.*—Owners and occupiers of land, holders of miners' rights, business and carriers licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of a common, shall respectively be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or an equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. *Depasturing fees.*—The fees for depasturing cattle shall, in all cases, be paid in advance to the managers at the time of branding, and shall be for six months in advance, at the following rates:—Large cattle, 4s. per head per annum; horses, 6s. per head per annum; and small cattle, 1s. 4d. per head per annum.

3. *Responsibility of herdsman.*—The herdsman shall use all due vigilance over cattle placed under his charge and duly branded; but he shall not be responsible for cattle straying off a common, provided he has given notice to the owner or owners of such cattle strayed, within three days after having missed them from the common. Should, however, any cattle be impounded, he shall give notice of such impounding to the owner or owners thereof within three days, and a proof of having given such notice, either verbally or in writing, at his or her known place of residence shall exonerate the herdsman from further responsibility as to their release; failing, however, to prove the delivery of such notice as herein prescribed, the herdsman shall release such cattle at his own cost.

4. *Pounds to which responsibility extends.*—The pounds to which the foregoing regulation shall apply are the Meredith Pound and the Anakie Pound.

5. *Appointment and salary of herdsman.*—The managers may appoint competent persons to herd a common or commons, and may at any time remove or dismiss such herdsman; and all such appointments shall be for a term of not less than twelve months, and may remunerate the herdsman at per head of registered cattle, or by an annual salary: provided that in all cases it shall be part of the herdsman's duty to eradicate all thistles growing on such common or commons to the satisfaction of the inspector.

6. *Cattle to be produced and mustered by the owners.*—All cattle intended for depasture upon a common shall, in the first instance, be produced to the herdsman by the owner, either in the common yard or on the owners' premises, at the option of the herdsman, for branding and registration, and there describe the brands and other particulars of such cattle; and at each periodic branding the owner shall muster his own cattle.

7. *Contagious diseases.*—No animal affected with a contagious disease shall be allowed to run on a common.

8. *Impounding stock trespassing.*—The herdsman shall not, in any case, impound stock found trespassing on a common without an order from the managers.

9. No person shall be allowed to depasture cattle on either of the above-named commons, until they are duly registered and branded with the common brand.

10. *Penalty.*—Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

Of the deaths recorded 54 or 46½ per cent. were of children not exceeding 3 years of age, 35 or about 30 per cent. being under 1 year, and 19 or 16·3 per cent. being of the ages of 1 to 3 years, the most fatal disease among them being bronchitis and the next fatal diarrhoea; one death occurred from scarlatina. At Kew one death occurred in the Lunatic Asylum; in South Melbourne, 10 were in the hospital, 2 in the immigrant's home, and 1 in the Industrial school; and in Prahran, 4 were in the hospital. There has been a slight prevalence of typhoid and low fevers and bronchitis in a few of the districts. The death rate is still high as compared with the returns for the corresponding week in 1874.

4. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.
