The births of 687 children, viz., 355 boys and 332 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 726 births were registered, or 39 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in April numbered 492, viz., 270 of males and 222 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 195. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 141, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 123. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 38 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80.2° on the 9th and 10th, and the lowest was 40.3° on the 23rd. The mean temperature of the month (57.2°) was 1.7° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.2°) took place on the 8th and 9th, viz., from the maximum of 78.6° and 80.2° to the minimums of 46.4° and 48.0° respectively. The least range (7.9°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 56.8° to a minimum of 48.9°. The mean daily range was 19.13°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.964 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Forty-seven per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; 47 per cent. in April 1869; 52 per cent. in April 1868; 56 per cent. in April 1867; 54 per cent. in April 1866; and 60 per cent. in April 1865.

Nineteen persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 75, a trunk-maker, and a miller each aged 80, a gentleman aged 84, and a female aged 86 of old age, a male of occupation unknown aged 75, and a baker and a weaver each aged 79 of dysentery, a land proprietor aged 76 of disease of the liver and dropsy, a female aged 76 of apoplexy, a gardener aged 77, a laborer aged 80, a laborer aged 84, and a female servant aged 85 of bronchitis, a laborer aged 77 of ischuria, a female aged 78 of paralysis, a soldier aged 80 of aneurism of aorta, a dealer aged 81 of obstruction in bowels, and a gentleman aged 81 of diarrhoea.

Thirteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month, of which 14 were set down as accidental and 1 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A boy aged 4, and a newsagent aged 67 were passed over by vehicles, a printer aged 16 died of injuries resulting from being knocked down by a cab, a gardener aged 49 died of the effects of a fall from a dray, a female aged 50 was accidentally killed by being thrown from a buggy, a laborer aged 35 died of injuries received by falling down a quarry-hole, two female children aged 14 and 2 years died of scalds, a boy aged 7 died of the poisonous effects of fungus mistaken for mushroom, a laborer aged 38 was drowned in the River Yarra, whether by accident or suicide unknown; a newly-born male infant was accidentally suffocated at birth, a male infant aged 11 weeks died of asphyxia from overlying, and a female aged 49 committed suicide by cutting her throat.

Ninety-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 12 in the Alfred Hospital; 6 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 16 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Melbourne Industrial School; and 3 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 231, of which 124, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 107, or 46 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 138 were under one year of age, 59 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 11 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 261. Of these, 146, or 56 per cent., were males and 115, or 44 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 16 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

**Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.**—To pay proceeds of all or any mortgages to the treasurer of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied, first in payment of all incidental costs; then in payment of the amount of percentages, and of any other deductions now or hereafter to be authorized by the said Assembly to be retained and made and affecting the said proceeds; next in or towards payment of the cost of erecting the new church on the said land; and any balance is to be retained for the exclusive benefit and disposition of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria.

and northern boundaries of that run to the Moora-moora run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run, the western boundaries of Victoria Valley and Mount Sturgeon No. 1 runs, the western and southern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon No. 2 run, and the southern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon No. 3 and No. 4 runs to Pollockdale run; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundaries of that and Greenville runs easterly to the southern boundary of Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that lake, by part of the western boundary of View Lake run, by the southern boundaries of that and Fiery Creek runs and part of the southern boundary of St. Enoch's run to the Benjamin run; thence by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of that run and part of the southern boundary of Mount Enn run to the north-western corner of the Emu Hill run; thence by the western boundary of that and of Western Piggorette runs, the western and southern boundaries of Mindi, and the western and part of the southern boundaries of Commercialp to Kuruck-kuruck run; thence by the western and part of the southern boundaries of that run to Yairau run; thence by the western boundary of that run and the northern boundary of Watch Hill run westerly to lake Corangamite; thence along the eastern shore of that lake to the eastern boundaries of Parring Yalloe and Forrest runs; thence from the south-east corner of the last-named run by a direct line to Cape Otway; thence by the sea-coast westerly to the boundary line between South Australia and Victoria; thence along that line northerly to the Murray River; and thence up that river to the commencing point.

*Pursuant to Order of 31 May 1875.*

SEYMOUR CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Broken River with the Goulburn; thence up that river to the west angle of the Kathkin run; thence northerly by the western boundaries of that run and of the Gobur run to the northern boundary of the last-mentioned run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that run and the northern boundaries of Borodomanin South, Borodomanin North, and Junction runs to the Barjarg run; thence northerly by the western boundary of that run to the Lima run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Broken River; and thence down that river to the north-west corner of the Emu Station run; thence north-easterly by the north-west boundary of that run to the western boundary of Spring Station run; thence northerly by that boundary to the south-east boundary of Killawarra run; thence northerly by the western boundary of that run to the south-east corner of the Peecheba run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the southern boundary of St. James' run; thence north-westerly by that boundary to the eastern boundary of the Yabba-yabba run; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the Yabba-yabba and Benalla runs to the Broken River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the point of commencement.

Her Majesty's ship *Pearl*, at Sea,

Hydrographical Memorandum No. 15.

THE following hydrographical information, relative to the New Hebrides, Banks, and Loyalty Groups of Islands, extracted from the Remark-book of Navigating Lieutenant Henry Hosken, of H.M.S. *Pearl*, is promulgated for general information.

NEW HEBRIDES.

*Tanna, Port Resolution.*—The Mission House shown on Plan 1508 no longer exists. A new one has been built on the bluff of Point Resolution.

Cook's Pyramid, which should have been seen from the anchorage, must have been worn away by the action of the water, for all the rocks now off the N.W. point of the entrance are barely above high water mark, and are awash. The small islet shown on the Plan 1508, W. of Cook's Pyramid, is shut in when the ship is to the southward of a N.W. bearing, from her, to the N.W. point, it is of a pyramidal shape.

*East Coast.*—The west point of Tanna was found to extend 3.1 miles further to the westward than shown upon the chart.

*Sangalie Anchorage.*—The houses of the plantation on Sangalie Hill were seen when about 2' to the southward of West Point at a distance of 3½'. To make the anchorage, run down the coast at half a mile's distance, till the large house is brought to bear E. by N. nly, then steer for it; sounding will be first picked up in 18 to 20 fathoms; anchor in not less than 14 fathoms; 16 fathoms will be 2 cables from the break on shore reef. Bearings for anchorage:—Plantation House N. 78° E., south extreme of Tanna visible S. 43° E., north extreme of Tanna visible N. 43° W. From this position the Boat Cove will be open N.E. by E., where there is a good landing, protected by the reefs from winds from west round by N. to S.S.W.

Approximate position of the beach in Boat Cove:—Lat. 19° 34' S., long. 169° 14½' E.; assumed variation 10° 30' E.

*Havannah Harbor, Vati or Sandwich Island.*—Leading Marks.—The leading mark given, namely, "Distant Peak and Green Head in line," was difficult to make out, the former being clouded and the latter being backed by high land, did not show out till the ship was well up with White Sand Point.

Bluff Point kept open off White Sand Point clears the rocky patches.

Missionary Point of the chart opened out clear of White Sand Point on a N.E. by E. line of bearing. The Mission Station is now on White Sand Point, and is known to the planters by the name of Missionary Point, instead of White Sand Point.

*Nguna or Montague Island.*—Na-ora-matua Harbor.—Approximate position by bearings:—Lat. 17° 27' 30" S., long. 168° 17' E. for the anchorage; variation allowed 10° E.

*Montague Island* should extend 1½' further to the westward than shown. This would make the island 5½' long east and west.

The Harbor of Na-ora-matua is not generally known. It lies between the two westernmost points of Montague Island, and can easily be found by bringing the highest peak of Montague Island, Tavanakie, to bear S. 60° E. The anchorage is well sheltered from winds from N.N.E. round through E. to S. by E. A partial shelter is afforded by Deception Island, as far round as S.S.W. 4W.

With the prevailing S.E. wind, it would afford a fair temporary anchorage, but it is open to the westward, a ship should be ready to leave if the wind were likely to blow hard from that direction. The bottom is chiefly foul—ground-coral and volcanic rock, with sand patches between. The S.E. corner of the bay should be avoided, as it shoals quickly from 13 to 5 fathoms, but N.N.E. of the anchorage that the *Pearl* picked up, plenty of available space for anchorage will be found with tolerably level bottom 12 to 9 fathoms.

Bearings for anchorage:—Tavanakie Peak S. 60° E., south point of bay S. 11° E., Deception Island S. 32° W., north point of bay N. 13° E., Three-hill Island N. 5° W. A shore reef stretches out from all parts of the beach, which renders landing difficult in ships' boats, except within about two hours of high water. At low tide many parts of the reef are dry.

*Tongariki Island.*—This island is placed 3' too far to the westward on the chart No. 1380.

The *Shepherd Islands* appear to be correctly placed in bearing one from another.

Information obtained from Mr. Leeman, master of the schooner *Leonic*:—

*Api Island.*—There is an anchorage in the bight on the N.E. side of this island in lat. 16° 39' S.

*La Menu Island.*—Dangerous patch.—About 3' to the westward of this island there is a patch, of small extent, with only 6 feet water over it. Approximate position, lat. 16° 33' S., long. 168° 4' E.

*Pauma Island.*—There is an anchorage on the W. side in 12 fathoms, just to the northward of the reef, shown on chart, in about lat. 16° 26' 30" S.

*Ambrym Island.*—There is a good anchorage just to the northward of Dip Point in 8 fathoms, about half a mile off shore. A temporary anchorage may also be obtained off the S.E. shore, from quarter to half a mile from the beach.

*Mallicollo Island.*—The reef reported off the east coast has 2 fathoms of water (or less) over it, and extends to a distance of 3' off shore. I sailed over it in my schooner.

BANKS GROUP.

*Vanna Lava Island.*—Port Patteson.—Inside the reef which surrounds Pakea and Niwula Islands, there is a third small island; it bears about south from the latter. The three islands are covered with trees.

NEW HEBRIDES TO LOYALTY ISLANDS.

*Tiga Island.*—The position of this island on chart No. 1380, corrected to June 1870, with respect to Maré Island, is six miles too far west.

LOYALTY ISLANDS.

*Maré Island.*—This island is placed 4.3 miles too far west on chart No. 1380.

Off the north shore there are a number of coral patches and knolls, with apparently from 2 to 3 fathoms water over them N.E. by N. 4 of a mile from the Church.

*Undine Cove* is not known to the natives; and no anchorage, or signs of one, could be discovered by the *Pearl* anywhere on the west coast, till in the large S.W. Bay, which runs in from C. Castle. This is called by the natives Tandine Bay; it is from 5' to 6' across. When the bay is well open, a large white house can be seen just north of a grove of coconut trees.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Governant Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Kew has requested that certain streets within the said borough be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the lands reserved or by purchase acquired for the streets named and described in the schedule hereunto annexed to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say—
