PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING THE FIRST DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1875.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st September 1874 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued. It will be equally available for any election that may take place before the compilation of the new roll in October next.

No elector whose name is on a roll of ratepaying electors for any province or district is entitled to a renewed elector's right for such province or district (*vide* sects 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act* 1865, and sec. 21 of Act No. 334).

Twenty-two or about 29 per cent. of the total deaths were of children not exceeding 3 years, of age, 17 of which were under the age of one year. The districts are reported on favorably as regards sickness and mortality. Thirteen of the deaths in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions, and 2 of the deaths in Prahran in the hospital.

The births of 706 children, viz., 337 boys and 369 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 687 births were registered, or 19 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in May numbered 451, viz., 260 of males and 191 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 255. The deaths were fewer than those in April by 41, but were in excess of the average of May during the previous ten years by 112. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of the month during those ten years by 34 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69° 5' on the 3rd and the lowest was 36° 2' on the 19th. The mean temperature of the month (51° 3') was 17° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26° 2') took place on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 62° 4' to a minimum of 36° 2'. The least range (7° 4') was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 56° 4' to a minimum of 49° 0'. The mean daily range was 15° 6'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'909 inches) was about a tenth of a degree below the average.

Males and females died in the proportions to the total deaths of 58 per cent. and 42 per cent. respectively. Thirty-seven per cent. of those who died were children under 5 years of age as against 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1871; 38 per cent. in May 1870; 43 per cent. in May 1869; 45 per cent. in May 1868; 48 per cent. in May 1867; 47 per cent. in May 1866; and 56 per cent. in May 1865.

Eleven persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male of occupation unstated aged 75 of heart-disease, a female aged 75 of congestion of the lungs, a female aged 75 of Bright's disease, a farmer and a female inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, each aged 76, of old age; a laborer, also an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 76, of fatty degeneration of the heart; a farmer aged 77 of hypertrophy of the heart, a female aged 78 of congestion of the lungs, a female aged 79, an engineer aged 84, and a female aged 85, of old age.

Of the 20 deaths from external causes, which occurred during the month, 17 were set down as accidental, 1 as homicidal, and 2 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 11, died of injury to the spine, the result of a fall; a cooper, aged 65, died of fracture of the spine, occasioned by falling down stairs; a cabinetmaker, aged 34, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall whilst intoxicated; a boy, aged 12, died of the effects of injury to the skull, received by running against machinery; a carter, aged 26, was passed over by a lorry; a laborer, aged 51, died of fracture of the pelvis, caused by the accidental upsetting of a dray; a female child, aged 2, died of scalds; a female, aged 45, died of poisoning by strychnine, assumed to have been accidental in the absence of evidence to the contrary; a female, aged 46, died of lead poisoning; a painter, aged 55, and a boatman, aged 58, were found drowned, the former in the River Yarra, and the latter in the Alfred Graving Dock; a freholder, aged 58, was accidentally drowned in a water-hole; a female infant, aged 8 days, and three male infants, aged 10 days, 2 months, and 4 months respectively, were suffocated in bed, the last by overlying; a laborer, aged 70, was choked by food; a female, aged 36, was murdered by stabbing; a man, of occupation unknown, was drowned in the Yarra, and is believed to have committed suicide; a laborer, aged 36, whilst suffering from delirium tremens, committed suicide by throwing himself in front of a train.

Ninety-eight deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—65 in the Melbourne Hospital; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 12 in the Alfred Hospital; 1 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 163, of which 93, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 75, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 112 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 283. Of these, 167, or 59 per cent., were males, and 116, or 41 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 32 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

DIRECTION FOR THE KURRACHEE HARBOR LIGHTHOUSE.

Latitude of lighthouse on Manora Point, 24° 47' 21" N.; longitude, 66° 58' 15" E.
 The light is a fixed one, 120 feet above the sea-level, visible in clear weather 16 miles; in hazy weather, prevalent during the south-west monsoon, about 7 miles.
 Present light very inferior. A dioptric light of the second order recommended.

Tides.

High water, full and change, 10h. 30m. Average rise and fall, spring tides, 9ft. 6in.; average rise and fall, neap tides, 3ft. to 4ft. Depth of water in entrance channel at high water, spring tides, 29 feet; neap tides, 24ft. to 26ft.

Draught of Vessels entering or leaving Port.

Vessels with a draught not exceeding 21½ feet can now enter and leave the port without difficulty or delay during all seasons of the year.

During the fair season, from October to 15th May, vessels with a draught not exceeding 24 feet can now enter and leave the harbor.

Fixed moorings are placed for such vessels.

Time of Tide for entering Port.

Sailing vessels should enter port on the ebb-tide. Steamers can enter either flood or ebb, and stand at once into port.

Masters of ships should not, under any circumstances, attempt to enter the harbor without a pilot.

Harbor Improvements.

Among the extensive works executed, a breakwater* has been built, running out from Manora Point in a south-by-east direction to a distance of 1,500 feet, into 6 fathoms of water; this affords complete shelter to the entrance channel during the south-west monsoon; also a channel has been opened through the bar, with a depth of 20 feet at low water spring tides, 500 feet in breadth; the channel is marked by buoys, and these on entering should be kept on the port side about 150 feet.

NOTE.—A mail steamer arriving off the port at night and requiring a pilot should fire two guns.

Approaching the Port.—Coast of Sind.—Indus Banks.

The coast of Sind below the parallel of 24° north latitude should be approached with great caution; too much attention cannot be paid to the lead, more especially in passing the banks of the Indus. Banks of the Indus have extended about ten miles to the southward since 1856.

No sailing vessel should come nearer this coast than 20 fathoms by night or in rough weather, or under 12 fathoms by day in fine weather.

* A red light is exhibited at the outer extremity of the breakwater.

The tides during the springs are strong, the flood sets south-east and ebbs to the north-west.

From February to the end of the monsoon a strong south-easterly current is experienced, running at a rate of from 15 to 40 miles a day.

During the south-west monsoon, sailing vessels should make Ras Musri (Cape Monze), which is 18 miles west-half-north from Manora lighthouse, and keep to windward of the port, if the weather is thick, or if the tide does not suit for entering the harbor. Allowance must also be made for a strong set to the south-east, which prevails more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of east, or go under 15 fathoms near Cape Monze.

Masters of ships should endeavour to make the port at day-light, and can with safety approach into 8 fathoms to about 2 miles distance from the lighthouse, keeping it, in any bearing, from north-east to north, and heave to for a pilot.

Anchorage in the Roads.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off and on, keeping the lighthouse bearing from north-by-east to north-east, 1 to 2 miles distant, until boarded by a pilot, or directed by signal.

September to end of March.—Anchorage lighthouse north-by-east to north-north-east, distant 1 mile 7 fathoms.

April and May.—Lighthouse north-north-east to north-east, distant half a mile, 8 fathoms.

SOUTH ENTRANCE, MORETON BAY.

IN consequence of changes which have taken place in the South Entrance to Moreton Bay, the following alterations are made in the Sailing Directions for entering by that channel:—

To carry the deepest water over the Bar, near the crossing now in use, keep the westernmost rocky knoll, just open to the eastward of the centre hummock of the triple hill at the back. When over the Outer Bar, haul up and gradually bring the rocky knoll in a line with the centre hummock, passing the western spit of the detached break at a short cable's distance, and keeping those marks on until the beacons at the south end of Moreton Island are well open of the north-east end of the south break.

The beacons in line lead in, over the Bar, to the northward of the detached break, in 14 feet 6 inches low-water springs, past the south break, and up the Main Channel as formerly.

There is also a channel over the Bar, on the south side of and at a short cable's distance from the detached break, with about 13 feet 6 inches at low-water.

As it cannot be expected that so many channels will long remain open to their present depth, due precaution must be observed in taking the Bar.

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanaita East run to Gohareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemeteries to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owner.
- Wooden fences allowed, but, if not kept in proper repair, they will be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone, granite, slate, or iron.
- A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unbecoming or inappropriate; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemeteries in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper or composition clamps must be used.
- No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.
- No vehicles (except that conveying the body) nor horses allowed in the grounds, unless in the case of invalids.
- No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemeteries.
- It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done any damage to any

monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, paling, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemeteries, or guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Statute in that case made and provided.
