NOTICE TO SHIPMASTERS.

Ships entering Spanish Ports in Distress.

It has come to the knowledge of Her Majesty's Government that cases have occurred where British vessels, having been compelled, through accident or stress of weather, to put into Spanish ports, have, although not trading with any of those ports, been subjected to heavy Fines and Confiscation of Cargo on the part of the Spanish Customs Authorities, on account of inaccuracies, however trifling or accidental, in the ship's manifest, the production of which has been demanded by the Customs House Officers immediately on the vessel's reaching port.

As it appears that proceedings of this nature are sanctioned by the letter of the Spanish law, Shipmasters are hereby warned of the difficulties to which they may be exposed when putting into Spanish ports under circumstances of the nature above mentioned, should any inaccuracy whatever be discovered in connection with the ship's cargo or papers contrary to the laws of Spain.

REGULATIONS FOR CLEANING AND DRESSING RICE IN BOND.

THE following regulations for dressing and cleaning rice in bond, which have been approved by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government in Council, are published for general information, viz.:-

1. The dressing and cleaning rice in bond will be allowed for home consumption or exportation upon the following conditions:-

2. Applications to be made in writing, specifying the building in which it is desired that dressing or cleaning rice in bond shall be carried on.

3. The buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and must be constructed of stone or brick, and shall be so arranged that there shall be a store for all the rice which it is intended to clean or dress, and also a separate store wherein the rice after cleaning or dressing shall be placed, together with the residue, from which latter place the deliveries for home consumption or exportation shall be made. The dressing and cleaning-house shall be capable of being secured under the locks of the Customs department, as well as all other places for the storage of rice above mentioned.

4. The proprietor or occupier shall provide at his own cost all such locks and weighing machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable "locker's office," and shall keep the same in good repair.

5. Rice may be entered direct from the ship, or transferred from any bonded warehouse to the receiving store, into which it must be weighed and a correct account thereof kept by the locker.

6. The dressed rice and "residue" must be placed in the store approved for the purpose; and none of the residue shall be removed except under such regulations as to proportion, chargeable with duty determined by the Commissioner, and upon the certificate of inspection by the landing surveyor.

7. The hours to be observed for the receiving and for delivering rice or residue for home consumption or exportation shall be the same as in bonding warehouses, but the cleaning or dressing of rice may be carried on between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and 6 p.m., except on Saturdays when the premises should be closed at 2 p.m. The fee for the attendance of the Customs officer shall be £250 per annum, payable quarterly in advance on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October respectively. Should any extended time be required for dressing or cleaning such may be allowed by the Collector of Customs upon payment of 8s. per hour overtime.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR COLERAINÉ UNITED TOWN COMMON.

THE Officer administering the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Rules and Regulations for the United Town Common of Coleraine.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE UNITED TOWN COMMON OF COLERAINÉ.

1. All resident householders in the town proper shall be allowed to depasture four head of cattle or four horses.
2. Carriers coming from a distance, and travelling teams, will be allowed to depasture their teams for twenty-four hours free of charge.

3. No entire horses or bulls over nine months old, or cattle known to destroy fences, will be allowed on the common without the permission of the managers, and all foals and calves on arriving at the age of twelve months must be paid for as full-grown animals.

4. The agistment fees shall be two shillings and sixpence for every head per quarter, payable in advance.

5. All stock found trespassing on the common, without being registered with the herdsman, will be impounded by the person in charge of the common.

6. No diseased cattle, or cattle that have been on a run where diseased cattle have been depastured, or have been in contact with diseased cattle within previous three months, shall be permitted on the common, and any such cattle must be removed within six hours after a notice, signed by two managers, shall have been served on the owner, or any person in whose charge they may be, under a penalty of Ten pounds, to be recovered at the nearest court of petty sessions.

7. Any person cutting or destroying any growing timber on the common, or driving or disturbing cattle on the common, will forfeit his privilege of depasturing under these rules, and be liable to prosecution.

8. No person shall remove stock from the common without first giving notice to the herdsman.

9. The herdsman shall visit the pound-yards every day, Sundays excepted, and when registered stock are impounded he shall inform the owners thereof without delay. When registered stock are missing from the common, the herdsman shall immediately inform the owners.

10. Persons depasturing horses on the common can have them yarded every morning before Nine o'clock, Sundays excepted, on giving notice to the herdsman on the previous evening.

11. The herdsman shall inform all persons who have registered stock on the common when the time of registry expires, and if not registered again within six days of that notice the stock shall be impounded.

12. Any permanent resident not being an householder shall have the privilege of grazing one horse on the common on paying the usual fee.

13. Any laboring man not being a resident in the town of Coleraine, but who is employed within the town, shall be allowed to depasture one horse on the common by paying One shilling per week in advance.

14. The herdsman shall report to the managers any cattle known to rush or to endanger the safety of any person, and on being so authorized by two of the managers shall give notice to the owners to remove them within twenty-four hours, and in default shall proceed to impound such cattle.

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders are given.

2. Orders for interment must be given six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced, before two of the trustees, that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten to Seven in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten to Four in the remaining four months, except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Two to Five p.m.

6. Applications for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument, in the cemetery, to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

8. Drawings or plans of every stone, tomb, tablet, or monument to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the trustees for approval before admitted into the cemetery.

9. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

10. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, fence, railing, tree, plant, or shrubbery in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 35th section of the Act 27 Victoria No. 201.

11. No grave to be of a less depth than eight feet.

12. Registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.

13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
