PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING THE FIRST DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1875.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st September 1874 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued. It will be equally available for any election that may take place before the compilation of the new roll in October next.

No elector whose name is on a roll of ratepaying electors for any province or district is entitled to a renewed elector's right for such province or district (*vide* sects. 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and sec. 21 of Act No. 334).

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "COMPULSORY VACCINATION ACT," No. 501.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council, in accordance with and under the provisions of the fifth section of the *Compulsory Vaccination Act*, No. 501, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Every Public Vaccinator appointed under the provisions of the *Compulsory Vaccination Act*, No. 501, or under those provisions of the Act No. 264 which are thereby repealed, shall be paid the sum of Two shillings and sixpence for each child born after the first day of January 1875 who shall be successfully vaccinated by him, and who shall not have been previously successfully vaccinated.

2. Every Deputy-Registrar shall be paid the sum of One shilling for the registration of each case of successful primary vaccination duly registered by him, in accordance with the provisions of the *Compulsory Vaccination Act*, No. 501.

12. MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wapian run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West Run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GEELONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Porreist run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bambara; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern

TOWN OF CORRYONG.—County of Benambra, parishes of Towong and Colac-colac:—Commencing at the east angle of allotment 2A of section Q, parish of Towong; bounded thence by a road bearing S. 52° 30' E. eighty-nine chains seventy links; thence by a line bearing S. 55° W. ninety-four chains sixty links to the west angle of allotment 2A of section Z, parish of Colac-colac; thence by allotment 2A of section Z, a line, and allotment 2A of section Q, parish of Colac-colac, bearing N. 52° 30' W. sixty-one chains; and thence by a line and allotments 2A and 2B of section Q, parish of Towong, bearing N. 37° 30' E. ninety chains twenty-two links to the point of commencement.—(75.S.701.)

COMMON ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the Heathcote United Town and Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of November One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries firstly hereinafter described, so as to increase such common, and by deducting from the said common the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries secondly hereinafter described, so as to diminish the said common, that is to say:—

ADDITION.—Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the existing common at its intersection with the eastern side of the road forming the western boundary of James Lacey's 42nd section block; bounded thence by a road bearing south-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 77, parish of Spring Plains; thence by that allotment, and by allotment 75 bearing east and south to a point distant one chain west from the north-west angle of allotment 75 (A1); thence by a line, by the last-named allotment and by a line bearing east to Pohlman's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the north angle of James Kilroy's licensed land; thence by that land bearing south-easterly, north-easterly, south, and west to the north-east angle of allotment 81; thence by that allotment bearing south and west to the north-east angle of allotment

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

BYE-LAW FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.—[No. 1.]

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following Bye-laws:-

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the council, that is to say:-

All properties situated in such streets as are reticulated by the mains of the council shall pay a uniform rate of One shilling in the £ upon the net rateable value of such properties when used for domestic purposes solely.

2. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for water-closets and baths exceeding one water-closet and one bath to each tenement or premises separately rated, or for any cattle or for horses, or for any steam-engine, or for washing carriages when such horses or carriages are kept for hire, or for the purpose of any trade, manufacture, or business whatever, or for watering gardens, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes.

3. Water required for other than domestic purposes (except in cases of special arrangement with the council) shall be supplied by measure only at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity of which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate if supplied otherwise than by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

5. Owners or occupiers of properties and tenants exempt from assessment, laying on the water, will be supplied at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Every person who shall have agreed with the council for a supply of water by measure shall at his own expense provide a meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working condition, to the satisfaction of the council, or such officer or servant as the council may appoint; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be imme-

diately given by such person to such officer or servant, and a registration of the quantity of the water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected. The key of all meters to be in the custody of the council, or any officer or servant whom they may appoint.

7. Water troughs will be charged at the rate of Forty shillings per annum.

8. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse power per annum each.

9. Any person desiring to affix any service pipe to the main pipe shall make application to the council, or to its officer or servant, by giving notice in writing three clear days before tapping the main pipes.

10. All pipes, bibs, and cocks, and attachments must be approved of by the officer or servant duly authorized by the council in that behalf before such pipes, bibs, or cocks are fixed to the main pipe or service pipe.

11. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe or service pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice, in writing, of such alteration being given to the council, and the consent of the council or duly authorized officer thereto first had and obtained.

12. No person but the officer or servant of the council duly authorized in that behalf shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council, when required for the purpose of affixing service pipes thereto.

13. If any person shall neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer or servant of the council that such service pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, and if after the expiration of twelve hours from the time of receiving such notice such person has not repaired such service pipe, he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of his continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

14. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully and negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

15. Any person damaging any stand-pipe or other portions of the water works of the council shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds without prejudice to the right of the council to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to property of the council.

16. In the foregoing bye-law whenever the words "officer" or "servant" shall occur, the same shall be deemed and be taken to be any officer or servant of the council duly authorized in that behalf.

17. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and from which not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

18. The rates shall be paid fourteen days after notice, except in cases where water is supplied by measurement; these payments shall be made every six months, viz., 1st January and 1st July in each year.

19. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

20. Before any such license shall be granted by the council the person applying for the same shall deposit with the council an approved guarantee of the sum of Thirty pounds sterling, to provide for any damage that might accrue.
