Of the total deaths 16 or about 24½ per cent. were children not exceeding the age of three years, of whom twelve were under the age of one year. All the districts are reported on favorably as regards sickness. One death from diphtheria at Richmond and one at Williamstown are reported, the latter in a quarter where the disease appeared last year. The four deaths at Kew occurred in the Asylum. Nine of the South Melbourne deaths were in charitable institutions. Six at North Melbourne occurred in the Benevolent Asylum, and three at Prahran in the Hospital.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to Quarantine Districts, and has ordered that the portion of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be a Quarantine District within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GEELONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson; Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrumbidgee run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern

boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brenanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western, southern, and portion of the eastern boundaries of that run to the south-west corner of Yarraberb run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Campaspe River run; thence by the western and portion of the northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence down that river to its junction with the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the following Quarantine Districts, viz.: the Brenanah Quarantine District, the Powlett's Plains Quarantine District, the farms of Clancy and Mackin now in quarantine, shall form no part of this Clean District: Provided further that the whole of the Warparilla run shall belong to this Clean District.

The births of 739 children, viz., 364 boys and 375 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 706 births were registered, or 33 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in June numbered 357, viz., 205 of males and 152 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 382. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 94, but were in excess of the average of June during the previous ten years by 47. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 24.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.0° on the 24th and the lowest was 35.1° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (51.1°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (19.4°) took place on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 61.6° to a minimum of 42.2°. The least range (2.3°) was on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 51.5° to a minimum of 49.2°. The mean daily range was 12.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.866 inches) was rather more than an eighth of a degree below the average.

Males contributed 57 per cent. and females 43 per cent. to the mortality of the month. The proportion of deaths of children under 5 years of age was 32 per cent. as against 32 per cent. in June 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and 1870; 40 per cent. in June 1869; 45 per cent. in June 1868; 51 per cent. in June 1867; 41 per cent. in June 1866; and 41 per cent. in June 1865.

Twelve persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A laborer aged 75, of phthisis; a female inmate of the Immigrants' Home aged 76, of debility after erysipelas; a gentleman aged 76 and a female aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; a "littérateur" aged 79, and a female aged 82, of bronchitis; a female aged 79, of heart disease; a carpenter aged 81, of softening of the brain; and a blacksmith aged 81, a dealer aged 82, and two females aged 78 and 105 years respectively, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 19 were set down as accidental, 2 as homicidal, and 3 as suicidal. The particulars are as follows:—A shepherd, aged 72, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall when intoxicated; a groom, aged 38, also died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a ladder; a farmer, aged 63, died of extravasation of blood on the brain, also the result of a fall; a fencer, aged 31, died of fracture of the spine, likewise caused by a fall; a boy, aged 8, died of fracture of the thigh; a youth, aged 14, and a laborer, aged 66, died of the effects of kicks from horses; a convict, aged 38, was killed whilst at work at Williamstown, by a falling crane; a boy, aged 5, died of the effects of a wound on the head, caused by a fall from a fence; two female children, aged 2 and 4 respectively, died of burns; a tinsmith, aged 19, was killed by an explosion of gas; a seaman, aged 27, was accidentally drowned at Sandridge; a carpenter, aged 29, a farmer, aged 38, a seaman, aged 33, and a female, aged 45, were found drowned in the Yarra River; two male infants, aged 1½ and 4 months respectively, were suffocated by being overlain; a female infant, aged 3 weeks, died of the effects of a blow given by a Chinaman during a quarrel with its mother (verdict—"manslaughter"); a newly-born female infant was wilfully murdered by some person or persons unknown; a laborer, aged 45, committed suicide, by cutting his throat whilst of unsound mind; a waiter, aged 30, poisoned himself with oxalic acid; a female servant, aged about 35, was drowned and is supposed to have committed suicide.

Eighty-two deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 9 in the Alfred Hospital; 3 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 6 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 114, of which 67, or 59 per cent., were of males; and 47, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 73 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 243. Of these, 138, or 57 per cent., were males, and 105, or 43 per cent., were females; 13 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 14 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 36 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 10 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 73, as against 110 in May and 138 in April. Under this head typhoid fever caused 22 deaths, as against 38 in May and 28 in April. Measles caused 5 deaths only, as against 8 in May and 14 in April. The total number of deaths from measles in the district from the first outbreak of the epidemic to the end of June has been 719. The following are the deaths from childbirth and metria in Melbourne and suburbs during each month since the commencement of the year, placed side by side with the number of births registered:—
