The remaining portion of the whole circle is obscured by the island itself.

The focal plane of the light is 95 fect above mean sea level, and in clear weather it should be seen at a distance of 14 miles.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of section 15 of The Mining Statute 1865, authorized F. W. Eicke and others, of Horsham, to enter upon and occupy, for the purpose of seeking for gold by boring and sinking a shaft, the piece or parcel of land described in the schedule hereto, subject to the conditions following:

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for purposes of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.

RULES OF THE BENDIGO VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

Rules of the Bendigo Volunteer Rifle Corrs.

Construction of the Corps and Enrolment of Members.

1. The corps shall consist of those members whose names shall appear on the muster-roll on the date on which these rules shall be approved by the Governor in Council, and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted members in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

From and after that date every person desirous of being enrolled shall forward to the commanding officer an application, in writing, supported by two members of the corps, and the following particulars, in writing, also, viz.:—

which particulars shall be posted in the orderly room for a
period of one week, and thereafter submitted to the general
committee, which shall have the power to admit or refuse the

2. Any member changing his address must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding within fourteen days of such change, under a penalty of Two shillings.

Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms and accourtements in the store at the orderly room, under a penalty of Five shillings.

3. The names of all members attending parades and drills shall be noted down in a book to be kept for that purpose,

and any member whose name shall not appear marked on such attendance-book as present shall be deemed to have been absent, unless reasonable excuse shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before commencement of parade or drill.

Any member coming late may report himself to the senior officer present, assigning a reason for his late arrival, and if such reason shall be deemed sufficient and accepted by the commanding officer, such member shall be considered as having been present at parade or drill.

Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations (unless such parade shall have been ordered in plain clothes), or whose arms, accourtements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

4. The civil business connected with the corps shall be managed by a general committee, a secretary, and treasurer. The general committee shall consist of two sergeauts, two corporals, seven privates, the secretary, and treasurer, besides the officers, who shall be ex efficio members of all committees.

The general committee shall be elected at a general meeting of the corps, to be held annually, at the expiration of which time all elected members shall retire from office, but will be eligible for re-election. The general committee shall meet at least once a month, on such day as they may agree upon; shall be at liberty to make rules for the conduct of its business; and five members of such committee shall at all times be sufficient to form a quorum.

The secretary shall be elected annually at a general meeting of the corps, and shall hold office for twelve months.

The secretary shall attend the meetings of the corps and general committee, keep clear and intelligible minutes or records of all proceedings at such meetings have custody of all letters and other papers connected with the corps entrusted to his care by the commanding officer, and conduct the correspondence relating thereto under direction of the officer commanding.

The secretary may at any time be removed from office by the vote of the majority present at any general or special meeting of the corps. In the event of such removal, or of the resignation of the secretary, the corps may at any general or special meeting elect a person to perform the duties for the remainder of the time for which such removed or resigned officer shall have been elected.

5. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accourtements, and clothing; and any damage done thereto, except on duty, shall be made good by the person holding the same, or in default may be fined to the amount of such damage.

Every member must produce his arms for inspection by the officer commanding or other officer appointed for that purpose, whenever and so often as may be required, and must also return such arms to the officer commanding whenever directed by him so to do, or deposit the same in the orderly room, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must forward his uniform and other property of the corps in his possession to the officer commanding, or in default he may be fined to the amount of the value of the property retained by him.

Any member expelled the corps within twelve months from receipt of new uniform shall pay to the officer commanding the full contract price of the same, or in default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding such contract price.

Any member who may damage, lose, destroy, or retain any weapon, hook, plate, or other property whatever belonging to the corps, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the officer commanding, or in default he will be liable to a fine not exceeding the value of the property so damaged, lost, destroyed, or retained.

All property whatsoever belonging to the corps shall for all purposes be considered as vested in the commanding officer and his successors, whose decisions on all questions as to value or amount, with reference to the fines and penalties aforesaid, shall be conclusive.

6. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or other person authorized by the commanding officer to receive the same within seven days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment may be proceeded against according to law. In the event of such line not being paid within seven days of the notification, the same shall be publicly intimated to the corps at their next parade, and the name of the defaulter posted in the orderly room until payment.

At every annual general meeting of the corps a balancesheet showing its actual financial position, together with a plan of the proposed distribution and expenditure of funds for the ensuing twelve months, may be submitted by the general committee (after approval by the commanding officer) for the information of the meeting. The accounts of the corps shall be audited by two auditors to be elected at the annual general meeting.
