NOTICE is hereby given that a light will be exhibited on Green Island on and after 1st July next.

The illuminating apparatus is fixed Dioptric of the Fourth order showing a red light on the following bearings, which are magnetic and taken from Seaward:—

1. From N. 16° E. to S. 18° E. (146°)

and showing a green light—

1. From N. 16° E. to N. 44° W. (60°)

2. From S. 18° E. to S. 25° W. (43°)

The remaining portion of the whole circle is obscured by the island itself.

The focal plane of the light is 95 feet above mean sea level, and in clear weather it should be seen at a distance of 14 miles.

HORSES FOR THE BENGAL ARMY.

THE subjoined notice, regarding the purchase of re-mounts required for the Bengal Army, is published at the instance of the Government of India.

It is hereby notified with reference to the advertisement of the 8th June 1874, * that the Government of India are prepared to purchase 1000 horses, suitable for army purposes, during the year 1875-76.

The purchases will be made by re-mount agents or committees as in previous years at the stations named in the margin.

The purchases will, except under any special circumstances, be made only between the 1st October and 1st April.

The requirements of 1876-77 will be 600 horses, more or less. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, and they must be within the prescribed age—four to seven years.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

ROADS PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the Government Gazette proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands in the several parishes hereinafter mentioned, which are situate in the counties of Bourke, Dundas, Grant, Grenville, Hampden, Heytesbury, Moira, Mornington, Normanby, Ripon, and Rodney, such roads being delineated on a plan deposited at the Office of Crown Lands and Survey at Melbourne, that is to say:—

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED.

THE Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of section 15 of *The Mining Statute* 1865, authorized F. W. Eicke and others, of Horsham, to enter upon and occupy, for the purpose of seeking for gold by boring and sinking a shaft, the piece or parcel of land described in the schedule hereto, subject to the conditions following:—

1. The surface of the ground shall not be occupied for purposes of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.

RULES OF THE BENDIGO VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

Construction of the Corps and Enrolment of Members.

1. The corps shall consist of those members whose names shall appear on the muster-roll on the date on which these rules shall be approved by the Governor in Council, and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted members in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

From and after that date every person desirous of being enrolled shall forward to the commanding officer an application, in writing, supported by two members of the corps, and the following particulars, in writing, also, viz.:—

- Name in full,
- Age,
- Height,
- Occupation.

Private address and business address; which particulars shall be posted in the orderly room for a period of one week, and thereafter submitted to the general committee, which shall have the power to admit or refuse the candidate, subject always to the decision of the commanding officer for the time being and to the existing regulations of the force.

Address.

2. Any member changing his address must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding within fourteen days of such change, under a penalty of Two shillings.

Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the store at the orderly room, under a penalty of Five shillings.

Parades, Drills, &c.

3. The names of all members attending parades and drills shall be noted down in a book to be kept for that purpose,

and any member whose name shall not appear marked on such attendance-book as present shall be deemed to have been absent, unless reasonable excuse shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before commencement of parade or drill.

Any member coming late may report himself to the senior officer present, assigning a reason for his late arrival, and if such reason shall be deemed sufficient and accepted by the commanding officer, such member shall be considered as having been present at parade or drill.

Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations (unless such parade shall have been ordered in plain clothes), or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Management.

4. The civil business connected with the corps shall be managed by a general committee, a secretary, and treasurer.

The general committee shall consist of two sergeants, two corporals, seven privates, the secretary, and treasurer, besides the officers, who shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

The general committee shall be elected at a general meeting of the corps, to be held annually, at the expiration of which time all elected members shall retire from office, but will be eligible for re-election. Absence from three consecutive meetings (without sufficient excuse) will disqualify any elected member, and any vacancy caused by such disqualification or by resignation may be filled up by the committee.

The duties of the general committee shall be as follow:—
To consider and recommend as to the eligibility or otherwise of all candidates for admission to the corps; to consider and deal with such correspondence as may be submitted to them; to take charge of and be accountable to the officer commanding for all property belonging to the corps which the commanding officer may entrust to them; to consider, pass, and recommend for payment all just and proper liabilities which may from time to time be incurred in the management or for the benefit of the same; to report to the corps (under the direction of the officer commanding) on the expenditure and condition of its funds and property, and all other necessary matters.

To challenge and accept, or decline challenges for matches with the rifle or other weapons, under the direction of the officer commanding; to make and carry out all necessary arrangements for such matches; to select members to compete therein; to take charge of and arrange as to the competition for prizes; and generally to manage all matters connected with matches; subject in all cases to the consent of the commanding officer.

The general management of all matters connected with the band under the direction of the officer commanding, subject in all cases to the consent of the commanding officer; and generally to transact such business as may be submitted by the commanding officer.

The general committee shall meet at least once a month, on such day as they may agree upon; shall be at liberty to make rules for the conduct of its business; and five members of such committee shall at all times be sufficient to form a quorum.

The secretary shall be elected annually at a general meeting of the corps, and shall hold office for twelve months.

The secretary shall attend the meetings of the corps and general committee, keep clear and intelligible minutes or records of all proceedings at such meetings, have custody of all letters and other papers connected with the corps entrusted to his care by the commanding officer, and conduct the correspondence relating thereto under direction of the officer commanding.

The secretary may at any time be removed from office by the vote of the majority present at any general or special meeting of the corps. In the event of such removal, or of the resignation of the secretary, the corps may at any general or special meeting elect a person to perform the duties for the remainder of the time for which such removed or resigned officer shall have been elected.

That at each annual meeting of the corps a treasurer shall be elected, who shall receive and disburse all moneys (other than Government moneys) according to directions of the general committee, and subject to the decision of the commanding officer.

Property, Uniform, &c.

5. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing; and any damage done thereto, except on duty, shall be made good by the person holding the same, or in default may be fined to the amount of such damage.

Every member must produce his arms for inspection by the officer commanding or other officer appointed for that purpose, whenever and so often as may be required, and must also return such arms to the officer commanding whenever directed by him so to do, or deposit the same in the orderly room, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must forward his uniform and other property of the corps in his possession to the officer commanding, or in default he may be fined to the amount of the value of the property retained by him.

Any member expelled the corps within twelve months from receipt of new uniform shall pay to the officer commanding the full contract price of the same, or in default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding such contract price.

Any member who may damage, lose, destroy, or retain any weapon, hook, plate, or other property whatever belonging to the corps, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the officer commanding, or in default he will be liable to a fine not exceeding the value of the property so damaged, lost, destroyed, or retained.

All property whatsoever belonging to the corps shall for all purposes be considered as vested in the commanding officer and his successors, whose decisions on all questions as to value or amount, with reference to the fines and penalties aforesaid, shall be conclusive.

6. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or other person authorized by the commanding officer to receive the same within seven days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment may be proceeded against according to law. In the event of such fine not being paid within seven days of the notification, the same shall be publicly intimated to the corps at their next parade, and the name of the defaulter posted in the orderly room until payment.

At every annual general meeting of the corps a balance-sheet showing its actual financial position, together with a plan of the proposed distribution and expenditure of funds for the ensuing twelve months, may be submitted by the general committee (after approval by the commanding officer) for the information of the meeting. The accounts of the corps shall be audited by two auditors to be elected at the annual general meeting.

Meetings.

7. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, or, on receiving a requisition signed by not less than twenty members (provided the subject be not of a military nature) giving not less than three days' notice.

Such notice shall consist of an advertisement in two of the local daily newspapers, and an intimation on parade when practicable, or by circular forwarded by post to each member.

At every meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman.

No discussion shall take place except on a motion moved and seconded and delivered, in writing, signed by the mover, to the chairman, who shall add the name of the seconder.

Immediately on a motion or amendment being so delivered, it shall be read by the chairman for discussion, and shall not then be withdrawn without leave of the meeting.

Every amendment on a motion shall be dealt with in like manner, but only one amendment is carried it shall be held to have negatived the original motion and stand in its place, and it shall be competent, whether any amendment is carried or not to receive other amendments, one at a time, in like manner to be discussed and decided on until the subject is finally disposed of: Provided that no member shall propose more than one amendment upon any motion, and no member shall speak more than once upon any motion or amendment, except the original mover of the motion first proposed, who shall be entitled to one reply and no more during the debate on the subject.

The seconder of a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon if he have only seconded the same without remark; and any member may, with leave of the chairman, offer an explanation of any particular words he has used and which have been misunderstood, but shall not add new matter.

No question which is substantially the same as one which has been negatived at the same meeting shall be entertained at such meeting or adjournment thereof.

Any amendment to proceed with the next business shall, if carried, supersede the original motion and every amendment thereon.

The chairman of any meeting or committee shall have no vote except in case of equality.

No person shall be allowed to vote or take any part in the proceedings at any meeting who is not at the time an effective member of the corps, or who shall have an unpaid fine, penalty, or subscription recorded against him; but a newly joined member will not be so disqualified on the ground of non-effectiveness, if he shall have been a duly enrolled member of the corps for three months.

All motions shall be decided by the holding up of hands unless a ballot be previously decided upon by the meeting.

Minutes of committee meetings shall be read prior to the adjournment or close of same, but shall not be confirmed until the next meeting.

Minutes of "general" or "special" meetings of the corps shall be read and confirmed prior to the close of such meetings.

To constitute a "general" or "special" meeting of the corps there shall be present before commencing business thirty of the members then upon the roll.

No meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion to that effect.

Liabilities Incurred by the Corps for Members.

8. If on the first of July in any year a member's debit exceeds his credit by One pound or upwards, he may be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds.

9. If a member desire at any time to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings, whereby his debit exceeds his credit, provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds, and that the half may, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be remitted.

10. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any of the foregoing rules, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice, in writing, to the officer commanding, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition to be posted in the orderly room or on the volunteer notice board, or published in one of the local papers, such notice to be given at least one week before the meeting.

These rules were adopted by a meeting of the corps on the 16th June 1875.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Janieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.
