FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Monday the first day of February next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Monday the first day of February next ensuing to Monday the first day of March in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

An Abstract from the Order in Council amending the 5th clause of the Order of the 16th of June 1859, and providing that all vessels shall present and report themselves at Noumea.

(May 4 1871).

1. The prescriptions of clause 5. of the Order in Council of the 16th of June 1859 are substituted for by the following provisions :

(a.) Any vessel, of whatsoever nationality, bound for New Caledonia or its dependencies shall first present and report herself at Noumea.

(b.) The captain or master shall, in the landing and shipping of person or persons inscribed on the ship's list as passengers or otherwise, comply with the regulations set forth in the decree of the 19th of March 1852.

(c.) The authority referred to in clause 5 of the said decree, and whose interference is necessary in the landing and shipping of passengers and others, is established at Noumea.

(d.) It is with this authority that the ship's list shall be laid on the arrival at Noumea. No landing or shipping of passengers or others can take place on any other part of the coast whatsoever.

(e.) All offenders against the foregoing provisions shall be liable to the penalties enacted in the decree of the 19th of March 1852, without prejudice to those enacted in clause 248 of the Code pénal against whomsoever shall abet the escape of any convicted person or persons, receive, or conceal the same.

(f.) At Noumea, the captain or master shall, upon application, receive a permit, to sail to any part of the coast of New Caledonia and dependencies reserved to the coasting trade.

He shall always be bound to return to Noumea to get his outward clearances.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE VOTE OF £7,000 FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, &c.

THE Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the Regulations herewith, in connection with the sum voted by Parliament for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, &c.

1. That the Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, and other bodies having control of any Public Parks or Gardens, such Parks or Gardens being beyond the limits of the City of Melbourne, shall furnish to the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, before the 15th February 1875, a statement, in the subjoined form, showing the amount expended on improvements by each body out of funds derived from local contributions from 1st January 1874 to 31st December 1874. Such statement (and vouchers, if necessary) shall be verified by a statutory declaration, to be made in the subjoined form, by the Town Clerk of a Borough, the Secretary of a Shire, the Clerk of a Road Board, or by such Trustee or Member of a Committee of Management who has acted as Treasurer for his colleagues.

2. That on receipt of the above statement so verified the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may cause to be paid to the proper officer of each Borough Council, Shire Council, Committee of Management, or other body, a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been expended on improvements out of funds derived from local contributions during the period before mentioned, provided the whole sum shall not exceed Seven thousand pounds, and if the sums claimable are in excess of this amount, that they be reduced *pro rata*.
