FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

'PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Str William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Monday the first day of February next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Monday the first day of February next ensuing to Monday the first day of March in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

(b.) The captain or master shall, in the landing and ship-

That the Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, and other bodies having control of any Public Parks or Gardens, such Parks or Gardens being beyond the limits of the City of Melbourne, shall furnish to the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, before the 15th February 1875, a statement, in the subjoined form, showing the amount expended on improvements by each body out of funds derived from local contributions from 1st January 1874 to 31st December 1874. DIVISIONS OF THE MARÝBOROUGH MINING DISTRICT.

In pursuance of the provisions contained in the 46th section of The Mining Statute 1865, the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, has abolished the Korong Division of the Maryborough Mining District, and has substituted for such division two divisions, to be named respectively, the Inglewood Division and the Wedderburn Division, the limits and boundaries thereof to be those hereinafter defined; and has determined that one member of the Maryborough Mining Board shall be elected within and for each such division, that is to say:—

INGLEWOOD DIVISION.—Commencing at the junction of Fenton's Creek with the River Avoca; thence north-easterly by a line to the summit of Mount Korong; thence north-easterly by a line to the north-west angle of the Powlett plains pre-emptive section on the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to a point north sixty-seven degrees thirty minutes east of Mount Moliagul; thence by a line bearing south sixty-seven degrees thirty minutes west passing over Mount Moliagul to the Avoca River; thence by the Avoca River to its junction with Fenton's Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.
