NANUKU PASSAGE.

Taviumi is the largest island on the western side of Nanuku. Passage: from Vuna Point the south-west extreme of Taviumi Island, a recf on which the sea always breaks, extends 1½ miles in a westerly direction; the south point of the island is steepto, and may be approached within 2 cables.

From the south point, the east side of Taviumi Island trends about N.E. ½ N. 13 miles to a point off which a reef extends about 7 or 8 cables, thence the shore to the northward recedes, forming a deep bay fringed by a reef; the coast between the south point of the island and the point off which the reef extends is precipitous and steep-to, except abreast of Salia Jevu, which is 5 miles from the south point of the island, and where there is a small reef close in shore.

L'una Polnt Anchorage.—Anchorage can be obtained off Vuna Honse on the hill behind it.

Tasman Strait is formed by Taviumi Island on the west and Quamea Island on the east. Vuro-Vuro Bay on the north side of a small promontory, which is situated on the west side of the south-west part of the bay.

From the north point of Vuro-Vuro Bay a reef extends towards Quamea Island, contracting Tasman Strait in this part to less than one mile; the outlying reefs in the strait are easily distinguished on a clear day.

The tides in Tasman Strait run strong, the ebb setting to the northward and flood to the southward, therefore vessels should not attempt to pass through the strait under sail without a commanding breeze.

Quamea Island (Quamea) is thickly wooded, and the coast indented with deep bays; on the side of Quamea Island there is a narrow passage separating if from I ancela Island, insable only by boa

N. by E. about 14 miles from the larger Nukubasaga Islet. Na-gali Island is of coral formation, about 3 miles in circumference, about 30 feet high in some parts, and covered with coccon-nut trees; the east side of the island is steep-to, but there are several small rocks and islets lying off the west end. Fresh water could not be obtained on the island. Anchorage.—On the west side of Na-gali Island and formed by the coral reef extending from it is a lagoon, 12 miles in length from east to west, and 5 miles in breadth at its broadest part; no dangers were found in the lagoon, and good anchorage may be obtained in any part of it in 10 to 13 fathoms. There are several openings into the lagoon at the west end of the reef; the best entrance lies 8 miles W.S.W. from Na-gali Island.

Vatava Island (Korotuna), situated about 14 miles west of Na-gali Island, is about three-quarters of a mile in length from N.E. to S.W., and surrounded by a fringing reef extending about three-quarters of a mile from the shore.

Weilagitala Islands (Wailryllala) consist of two small coral islands joined by a sand spit, situated at the north-east part of a reef forming a lagoon, the entrance of which lies about 20 miles east of Nanuku Islets. The islands are low, and covered with tropical vegetation, but fresh water could not be obtained; they are not inhabited, but are visited periodically by natives of the larger islands, for the purpose of collecting cocanuts.

Anchorage.—On the south-west side of Weilagitala Islands is a lagoon formed by the reef extending from them; the lagoon is 3 miles long in a N. by W. and S. by E. direction, and 14 miles in breadth; it appeared free from dangers, and affords good anchorage in 15 to 18 fathoms, bottom sand and coral.

The entrance to the lagoon is on the west side of the reef, learing S.W. 4 S. from Weilagitala Islands; the entrance is half a cable broad, having a depth of 7 fathoms.

Dangerous Rock.—This rock, supposed to exist near the middle of Nanuku Passage, was searched for in H.M.S. Beagle, but could not be found.

Naitauba Island (Naitaba), lying about 44 miles E. \(\frac{1}{2}\) N. from the south point of Taviuni Island, is a high basaltic island, occupying a triangular space, with the apex to the south passage, the entrance to which is sometimes rendered impassable by the heavy swell.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF 1876.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

- 1. On Tuesday, 4th April 1876, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal [for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces]; for that of Madras; and for that of Bombay!—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.
- 2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of February 1876, evidence showing:—

 (a) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

- (a) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

 (b) That his age, on the 1st March 1876, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years. [N.B.—In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided.]

 (c) That he has no disease, constitution affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.²
- (d) That he is of good moral character.

He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.³

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be primâ facie satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

A deduction of marks will be made under each subject including Mathematics.

- 7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by viva voce examination, as may be deemed necessary.
- as may be deemed necessary.

 8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.
- 9. Selected candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be ex-amined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—3

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by vical vace examination, so may be deemed necessary. The last of these examination, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

- 10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his named removed from the list of selected candidates.
- 11. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that service.
- 12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W., from whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained.

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements :-

- 1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose? according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed, but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State or Government of India deem it necessary.
- 2. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India before he shall have passed the final examination, and received a cer-tificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.
- 3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.
- 4. It is the intention of the Secretary of State to allow the sum of £50 after each of the three first half-years of probation, and £150 after the last half-year to each selected candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.
- 5. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the Indin Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. For a candidate under age a surety will be required.
- 6. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants and giving a bond for £1000, jointly

'If a General Register Office certificate cannot be obtained, the instructions printed under "Evidence of Age" will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners.

'The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given siter personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st of January 1876.

'Two testimonials must be sent, bearing date not earlier than 1st January 1876. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late schoolmaster, or, if he has had employment of any kind, by his late comployer. If the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late school conduct from his college tutor.

EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

Civil Service of India.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the Superintendeut Registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause I, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.

- 1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.
- 2. To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

les for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enable the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other accord must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having beense produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement that after due in-

(b) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement that after due in quiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement that, after due inquiry, no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 82. A printed form, if required, will be suppled on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.-Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a nonument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for

of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

8. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made. (See Miscellancous Charges.) No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.

4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

6. No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.

10. Every coffin in a vault, or brick or other grave, to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be be used.

be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, they may be removed, by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected; and registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.

the secretary.

16. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, will be prosecuted in accordance with the Cemeteries Act.

17. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a duly authorized person, such certificate to be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.

18. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make alterations from time to time in the regulations.
