W HEREAS by The County Court Statute 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts should be holden for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, probate, and administration, under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court should be holden; and it was also enacted that the judge of each county court should attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council should have directed that such court should be holden at such times as such judge should appoint for that purpose, so that a court should be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council should in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Excentive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, probate, and administration, under the said Act, shalf be holden at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

# PROPOSED TRANSFER OF AREA UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874.".

IN pursuance of the provisions of The Local Government Act 1874 (No. 506, \$46.) the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners state that they constitute a majority of the ratepayers in that portion of the borough of St. Kilda which is described in their petition, and that they are desirous that the area so described be severed from the borough of St. Kilda and attached to the shire of Caulfield.

Area described in the petition :-

"In the parish of Frahran, county of Bourke, bounded on the north by the main Dandenong road; on the east by a road on the east side of allotment N 176 B, parish of Prahran— known as the Orrong road; on the south by the Glen Huntly road; and on the west by a road intersecting the Dandenong road on the west side of the cemetery reserve known as Hotham street.

"Your petitioners therefore pray that, in the exercise of the powers conferred by The Local Government Act 1874, Your Excellency will be pleased to make an order to sever the portion of Victoria situated in the parish of Prahran, county of Bourke, hereimbefore described, from the borough of St. Kilda, and that the said area may be a portion of the shire of Caulfield, as the same is now described in the second schedule of The Local Government Act 1874, and may be a new subdivision of the said shire to be called the East St. Kilda riding of the said shire, the existing subdivision of the said shire being retained."

DESIGNS are invited for a First-class and also for a Second-class Carriage for the Victorian Railway lines, under the following general conditions:—

1st. The designs must be of such a nature that the carriages will work with the present rolling-stock.

2nd. Comfort and convenience must be combined with strength of construction, elegance of finish and appearance, at the same time avoiding unnecessary weight where possible.

3rd. Ingress and egress to be provided for by end doors opening on to platforms, and a through passage including the necessary conveniences for long journeys.
