## GRANT FOR PURCHASE OF BOOKS FOR MECHANICS' INSTITUTES OR PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 1874-75.

THE Committees for the Management of Mechanics' Institutes or Public Libraries in country districts claiming to participate in the grant of £3000 for the purchase of Books are hereby requested to send in their applications BEFORE THE 15TH OF FEBRUARY NEXT.

The conditions attached to the item in the Appropriation Act are as follow:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to sum, in the aggregate not less than £5, collected by private subscription or local rates during 1874.
2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

## PETITION FOR THE CONSTITUTION OF A PORTION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND AS A BOROUGH.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1874, the substance and prayer of the undermentioned Petition are published, viz.:—

The petitioners are inhabitant householders of the southern portion of the town of Richmond, described in the prayer of their Petition. The conditions required by the Act, as to area and population, are applicable to such portion; and they state that they desire to be established as a separate borough, on the ground that their connection with the remainder of Richmond is injurious to their interests, as well as for other reasons which they set forth.

And the Petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that your Excellency, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, will be pleased to constitute and proclaim a separate and independent municipality that portion of the present town of Richmond bounded on the north by a line commencing in the Punt road at north-west angle of section twenty-three and running east to the river Yarra-yarra; on the south by the said river; on the west by the Punt road; and on the east by the River Yarra-yarra; and that you will be pleased to give to such municipal district the name of South Richmond, and order that the municipal council of such district shall consist of six members."

Seven of the deaths at Kew took place in the Lunatic Asylum, and seventeen of the South Melbourne, and two of the Prahran deaths occurred in charitable institutions. Of the total deaths recorded, 224, or nearly two-thirds, were children not exceeding the age of three years. The most prevalent causes of death among children being measles and diarrhoea, the latter in many cases supervening on the former, and on teething. Head and bowel affections are stated to be prevalent in most of the districts, and as being very severe at Emerald Hill and Sandridge. Six fatal cases of sunstroke are reported. One case of typhoid fever from South Melbourne, and one from Richmond. The excessive mortality of the week is clearly traceable to the extreme heat of the weather, which appears also to have caused a greater prevalence of infantile diseases, and the next weeks record of deaths will probably be heavier than usual in consequence.

The births of 681 children, viz., 357 boys and 324 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 586 births were registered, or 95 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in December numbered 659, viz., 347 of males and 312 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 22. The deaths exceeded those in November by 269, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 251. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 157.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102.7° on the 17th, and the lowest was 44.1° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (63.3°) was nearly half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.8°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 102.2° to a minimum of 56.4°. The least range (9.0°) was on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 63.9° to a minimum of 54.9°. The mean daily range was 22.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.815 inches) was about the average.

Nine persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—An inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 75, who committed suicide; a female, aged 78, of old age and dysentery; a female, aged 78, of senile debility and diarrhoea; a male, aged 99, of fracture of the hip joint; a female, aged 76, a gentleman, aged 79, two laborers, aged 80 and 94 respectively, and a fisherman, aged 85, of old age.

As is usual in the month of December the number of deaths from violent causes was large, amounting to 29, of which 23 were set down as accidental and 6 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 5, and a carter, aged 24, received fatal injuries by falling from carts; a boy, aged 13, was killed by being thrown from a truck; a farmer, aged 43, died of fracture of the spine caused by a fall; a laborer, aged 47, died of fracture of the skull caused by a brick having fallen on his head; a gardener, aged 70, died of the effects of injuries to the arm through a dray wheel passing over it; a seaman, aged 27, was crushed to death by a truck; a male, of occupation not stated, aged 99, died of fracture of the hip joint; a female, aged 35, died of inflammation of the lung from external violence; a male infant, aged 8 days, died of the effects of an accident received at birth; a female, aged 8, succumbed to the operation of amputating the leg at the hip joint; a male infant, aged 15 months, and a female, aged 35, were burnt to death at Sandridge through the explosion of a kerosene lamp, and a female, aged 45, died of the effects of burns received by falling into the fire; two boys, aged 1 and 3 died of scalds; a publican, aged 48, died of sunstroke; a male child, aged 2, was accidentally poisoned by taking fly poison; two farmers, aged 20 and 25, two males, aged 12 and 17, and a laborer, aged 35, were drowned, the two first by the upsetting of a boat in the River Yarra; a male, aged 75 committed suicide in the Benevolent Asylum by cutting his throat; a clerk, aged 26, a coachsmith, aged 35, and a miner, aged 40, poisoned themselves with strichnine, muriatic acid, and opium respectively; a tailor, aged 22, drowned herself in the Yarra; and a female, aged 23, hanged herself.

Eighty-two deaths, or 12 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital; 10 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 9 in the Alfred Hospital; 2 in the Lying-in Hospital; 7 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Industrial Schools; and 2 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage. In the Cremorne Lunatic Asylum, Richmond; also, 1 death took place during the month.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 395, of which 210, or 53 per cent., were of males; and 185, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 199 were under one year of age, 108 were between one and two, 50 were between two and three, 31 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 264. Of these 137, or 52 per cent., were males and 127, or 48 per cent., were females; 47 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 16 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 was upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases during the month reached the large number of 320 as against 112 in November and 64 in October. This great increase has been principally caused by measles, which during the month of October proved fatal in only 2 cases; during November the number had increased to 43, whilst during the month under review the number of deaths from this cause was 180, of these, 138 or 76 per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, and 42 or 24 per cent. were of persons over 5, of these 6 were over 20 years of age. The districts where the disease was most prevalent were Bourke, Smith, Gipps and Victoria Wards of the City of Melbourne, and Hotham, Emerald Hill, Richmond, Collingwood, Fitzroy, and Williamstown. In many cases bronchitis, pneumonia, congestion of the lungs, and diarrhoea were complicated with measles. Dysentery and diarrhoea caused 76 deaths in December, against 30 in November. Scarlatina and diphtheria were fatal in 20 cases.

The mortality during the month of December was the greatest which has been recorded since January 1867, when Melbourne was also visited with an epidemic of measles. During that month the number of deaths was 687, of which 140 resulted from measles and 45 from scarlatina and diphtheria.

The number of deaths in the quarter ending 31st December 1874 was 1,355, and the mean temperature in the shade was 60.6°. The deaths thus numbered 383 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, and the mean temperature was nearly a third of a degree in excess of an average extending over the same period.

During the year 1873 the number of deaths in Melbourne and suburbs amounted to 5,075, being in the proportion of 21.78 to every 1,000 of the living population.

EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the Superintendent Registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate not producing the certificate mentioned in clause I, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register; under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

1. To all candidates not born in England or Wales.

2. To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enable the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement that, after due inquiry, no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

<sup>1</sup> If a General Register Office certificate cannot be obtained, the instructions printed under "Evidence of Age" will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners."

<sup>2</sup> The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given after personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st of January 1875.

<sup>3</sup> Two testimonials must be sent, bearing date not earlier than 1st January 1875. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late schoolmaster, or, if he has had employment of any kind, by his late employer. If the candidate has been at any University, he should send a certificate of good conduct from his college tutor.

<sup>4</sup> If mathematics be named, state whether pure or mixed, or both are intended; if natural science be mentioned, state which branches.
