Twenty-four, or nearly 28 per cent. of the total deaths, were of children not exceeding the age of 3 years, 13 being under the age of 1 year. Eight deaths from scarlet fever are reported this week as occurring in the following districts:-Collingwood, North Fitzroy, South Melbourne, and South Yarra. The other districts are reported on favorably as regards health. One of the Kew deaths occurred in the Lunatic Asylum, and 17 of the South Melbourne and four of the Prahran deaths took place in public institutions.

The births of 671 children, viz., 337 boys and 334 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 718 births were registered, or 47 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in August numbered 351, viz., 198 of males and 153 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 320. The deaths were less than those in July by 22, and exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 53. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been fewer than the average of those ten years by 5.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.0° on the 17th and the lowest was 36.7° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (50.6°) was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.2°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 68.0° to a minimum of 42.8°. The least range (6.8°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 57.1° to a minimum of 50.3°. The mean daily range was 15.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.881 inches) was below the average.

Of the deaths which were recorded during the month 56 per cent. were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children who had not reached their fifth year, as against 30 per cent. in August 1874 and in August 1873; 32.5 per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; 41 per cent. in August 1870; 35 per cent. in August 1869; 43 per cent. in August 1868; 39 per cent. in August 1867; 44 per cent. in August 1866; and 49 per cent. in August 1865.

The mortality of old people during the month has been unusually high, no fewer than 24 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards having died during that period—a number which exceeds by 5 the maximum of all previous months. The following are the particulars:—A male of occupation unstated aged 85, died of chronic alcoholism; a laborer aged 75, a gardener aged 77, and a male of unstated occupation aged 79, died of dropsy; a gentleman aged 79, died of apoplexy; a farmer aged 76 and two females aged 76 and 78 respectively, died of paralysis; a female aged 75, died of softening of the brain; a female aged 76, died of aneurism of the abdominal aorta; a female aged 79, died of heart disease; a lapidary aged 75, two females aged 78 and 79 respectively, and a civil engineer aged 83, died of bronchitis; a laborer aged 75, died of broncho-pneumonia; a female aged 85, died of hepatitis; and a female storekeeper aged 76, two females aged 76 and 77 respectively, a cabinetmaker aged 85, two females aged 87 and 88 respectively, and a female servant aged 101, died of old age.

Sixteen deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 9 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, 5 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The particulars are as follows:—A squatter aged 33, died of injury to the brain, and an accountant, aged 50, of fracture of the spine—caused by falls from horses; a compositor, aged 49, died of fracture of the skull—the result of a fall in the lock-up whilst intoxicated; a blacksmith, aged 43, died of traumatic delirium consequent on accidental fracture of the leg; a heiler-maker, aged 45, was killed by a railway train; a baker, aged 38, was found drowned on the River Yarra; two female infants, aged 3 weeks and 9 weeks respectively, died of suffocation in bed; a male infant, aged 3 days, died of umbilical hemorrhage; a seaman, aged 45, died of the effects of a blow on the head—verdict, "manslaughter"; a laborer, aged 72, a station overseer, aged 40, and a laborer, aged 40, poisoned themselves—the first with carbolic acid, the second with strychnine, and the last with opium; a carpenter, aged 40, and a seaman, aged 42, drowned themselves—the latter whilst in a state of unsound mind; a Chinaman, aged 54, was judicially hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Sixty-eight deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 3 in the Alfred Hospital; 1 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 8 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 117, of which 68, or 58 per cent., were of males; and 49, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 68 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 234. Of these, 130, or 56 per cent., were males, and 104, or 44 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 12 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 17 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from local diseases were more than twice as numerous as those from zymotic diseases, the principal complaints being those of the nervous and respiratory systems. Deaths from zymotic diseases exceeded by 25 those in July, the chief increase being in scarlatina which caused 19 deaths against 3 and typhoid fever which caused 14 deaths against 10. Measles on the other hand caused only 3 deaths, as against 6 in July. 48 deaths resulted from phthisis, as against 50 in July; and 3 deaths from childbirth and metria, as against 7 in July.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.—PATENTS  
STATUTE 1865.

WHEREAS by *The Patents Statute 1865*, section 5, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make such Rules and Regulations as may appear to be necessary and expedient for the purposes of such Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made on the 12th February 1866, and in lieu thereof doth make the Rules and Regulations following:—

1. *Applications to be limited to one invention.*—Every application for Letters Patent, and every title of invention and specification, must be limited to one invention only; and no patent will be granted where the specification or title embraces more than one invention.
2. *Title to be set out distinctly.*—The title of the invention must point out distinctly and specifically the nature and object of the invention.
3. *Distinct claim to be made for special novelty.*—Every specification, after describing the details of the invention with precision, must contain a distinct claim for the special novelty thereof.
4. *Specifications, &c., to be legibly written.*—All specifications and copies left at the office of the Registrar-General, or afterwards required or allowed to be deposited by the Law Officer, must be written in a large and legible hand, and must be in strict accordance with section 7 of *The Patents Statute 1865*.
5. *When notice of intention to proceed must be lodged.*—Every notice of intention to proceed with an application for Letters Patent must be delivered at the office of the Registrar-General at least six weeks before the expiration of the period of protection.
6. *Law Officer to fix amount of deposit to be made by applicant or objectors.*—Where the Law Officer deems it expedient, he may make an order that the applicant or his agent, or the objector or his agent, shall deposit before the hearing any sum not exceeding Twenty-five pounds, to meet any order for the remuneration of any scientific or other persons whom the Law Officer may call to his aid, or for the costs of the hearing.
7. *Amended specifications.*—When an applicant is desirous of submitting an amended specification or drawings for the allowance of the Law Officer, such amended specification or drawings must be left at the office of the Registrar-General at least five days preceding the day of the hearing.

## UNITED SHIRE OF NEWHAM.

*Regulations for the Management of the Farmers' Common within the United Shire of Newham, under The Land Act 1869.*

WHEREAS by the 58th section of *The Land Act 1869*, and by virtue of the powers therein conferred, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hath appointed that every Farmers' Common and every Town Common proclaimed previously to the passing of *The Land Act 1869* shall be managed by the members for the time being of the council of the shire within the boundaries of which any such common is included: Now therefore the Council of the United Shire of Newham, subject to the approval of the Governor, makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

1st. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats, and the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture or dairying land held by that person either in fee or under lease or license issued under *The Land Act 1862*, *The Amending Land Act 1865*, or under *The Land Act 1869*.

2nd. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, of carriers' licenses, and farmers within the shire, shall be respectively entitled to depasture on commons situated within a distance of five miles from their place of residence, four head of large cattle, or their equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, shall be allowed to depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent of small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

3rd. The fees to be paid for depasturing on any common shall be as follows, viz.:—

(1) For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of Six shillings per annum.

(2) For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum.

(3) For every sheep or goat, at the rate of Two shillings per annum.

(4) All fees shall be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, April, July, and October in each year, and so on in proportion for any less period not under one month, and all cattle remaining on a common seven days after the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice.

(5) No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

(6) The managers may, from time to time, employ and remove such persons as herdsmen or otherwise as they may deem requisite and pay them out of the common fees; and such persons shall find security, to the satisfaction of the manager, for the due execution of their duties; and in case any cattle be missed from any common it shall be the duty of the herdsman as soon as possible, and within twenty-four hours after the same being missed by him, to give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle.

(7) The managers shall keep the books in the form prescribed in Schedule 24 of the Regulation of 26th May 1873, in which books shall be recorded the description and brands of the cattle depastured on the commons, the money received as commonage fees, the payments made from the fund derived therefrom, the dates of such payments, and the authority for making them; and shall give printed receipts in the form prescribed in the said schedule consecutively numbered, the butts of which receipts must be retained for inspection.

(8) The managers of each common shall keep an account current at the Bank at Woodend, and shall, without delay, pay to such account all moneys coming to their hands by virtue of their office, and shall make all payments by cheque, signed by any two of such managers, and, within one month after the termination of each year, publish, in a newspaper circulating in the shire, a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule 25 of the aforementioned regulations and forward copy thereof to the board.

(9) The managers may make such arrangements as they may deem necessary for receiving and branding cattle, and for returning the same to the owner thereof, and it shall be the duty of the herdsmen to afford every facility in finding and returning such cattle.

(10) No entire horse, nor any bull, shall be allowed to run upon any common.

(11) The managers may set apart a portion of the common for depasturing sheep thereon. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on the portion of the common (if any) set apart for their use; sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

(12) At the time of placing cattle on any common the owners thereof shall make a declaration setting forth the extent of land in their occupation, together with the number of acres under cultivation; and give the herdsman a memorandum in writing of the number, brands, and description of the cattle so placed on the common, and all such cattle shall have the owner's fire-brands thereon.

(13) Cattle shall not be taken off a common without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily; but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

(14) Any person, having right of commonage, or the managers of any neighboring common, may register with the herdsman of any common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of cattle so registered; and such cattle, if found on such common, shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or persons registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from such notice being given, otherwise they shall be impounded.

(15) No diseased cattle shall be placed upon any common, and cattle becoming diseased after being placed thereon shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof; and in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified, the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner.

(16) Managers of commons shall not be responsible for any cattle placed on their respective commons.
