ROADS IN THE SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Eltham, has requested that certain roads within the said shire be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved or used for the roads hereinafter named and described to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:-

1. The one-chain road running east and west through the centre of sections 16, 17, and 18, in the parish of Nillumbik.
2. The one-chain road running south from section 10 through section 5, parish of Nillumbik, to the Yarra River.
3. The one-chain road running north from the River Yarra, on the eastern boundary of section 5, parish of Nillumbik, to the Diamond Creek.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand, eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

PROPOSED NEW SHIRE UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published, *viz.*:-

The petitioners state that they are ratepayers residing within the Shire of Wimmera, and that they are desirous that the district which they describe should be severed from the shire and constituted a new municipality; and they pray as follows:-

"We deem it expedient for the advancement of the general interests of the district that this shire should be divided into two parts, and we would respectfully request that Your Excellency will be pleased to constitute as a separate shire such portion of the present shire as is herein below set forth, *viz.*:-

"All that portion of the Shire of Wimmera which lies between the 35th parallel of south latitude and a line commencing from the South Australian boundary, and proceeding eastward along the present boundary of the Wimmera and Kowree shires to where that line strikes the pastoral boundaries of Rosebank and Mary Vale runs; thence along that boundary to the south-east extremity of Pleasant Banks run; thence along the boundary of Mary Vale and Spring Bank runs; thence to the south-eastern extremity of Spring Hill run; thence north along the boundary line of Spring Hill and Wyn-wyn runs, continuing north along the boundary of Heath Hill and Wyn-wyn; thence along the south-eastern boundaries of Winniam and Worrainworm runs; thence along the southern boundary of Black Heath West to the River Wimmera; thence down the course of that river to the south-western corner of Upper Regions run; thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the north-east corner of the same; thence following the boundary line between the Black Heath East and Bonegar runs to the north-east corner of Bonegar; thence along the southern boundary of Cannum run to the south-eastern corner of Antwerp run; thence along the boundary line of Antwerp and Cannum runs to the north-west corner of Cannum; thence in a straight line to Yarrambiack Creek; thence northward along Yarrambiack Creek to where it meets the western boundary of the Shire of St. Arnaud; thence along the western boundary of Swan Hill Shire."

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong has acquired the land of which the description is as follows, that is to say:-All that piece of land forming part of the allotment B 3 of the suburban lands of Dromana, in the parish of Kangerong, which is contained within the eastern, northern, and southern boundary line of the said allotment, and a straight line drawn from a point on the said northern boundary line one chain distant from the north-eastern corner of the said allotment to a point on the said southern boundary line one chain distant from the south-eastern corner of the said allotment: Now the said council doth by this Order direct that the aforesaid land shall be a Public Highway from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*; and the said council doth further by this Order declare that the said public highway shall be in lieu of the existing street hereinafter described, that is to say: Clarendon street from the south corner of allotment A 3 of the suburban lands at Dromana, in the parish of Kangerong, to Burrell road.

Order of the Council of the Shire of Wannon, made on the 14th day of July 1875.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Wannon, by an Order made on the 12th day of May, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, directed the taking of certain land for the diversion of the two-chain road leading from Coleraine to Den Hills, in the parish of Muntham, county of Dundas, in accordance with a plan deposited at the office of the said council, and such Order was confirmed by the Minister, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five: And whereas it is expedient to deal further with the said land, under the powers conferred by the three hundred and sixty-fifth and three hundred and sixty-sixth sections of the *Local Government Act 1874*: Now the Council of the said Shire of Wannon do hereby, on this the fourteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, order and direct that the land so taken,

commencing at a point on the eastern side of the Coleraine to Den Hills road six chains fifty links north-westerly from the south-western angle of allotment one n, section six, parish of Muntham, thence bounded by a line bearing north ten degrees eighteen minutes west three chains forty links, thence north seven degrees sixteen minutes east four chains seven links, thence north thirty minutes west seven chains seventy-three links, thence north nineteen degrees west one chain fifty-three links, thence north thirty degrees ten minutes west six chains twenty-five links, thence north fifteen degrees five minutes west five chains forty-three links, thence north one degree twenty minutes west fourteen chains twenty-three links, thence north fifty-eight degrees west nine chains eighty links, thence north seventy-four degrees forty minutes west seven chains seventy-four links, thence north fifty-four degrees twenty-eight minutes west four chains twenty links, thence north thirty-nine degrees forty-five minutes west seven chains forty-five links, thence north forty-seven degrees thirty-five minutes west three chains seventy-three links, thence north fifty degrees twenty-five minutes west five chains ten links, thence south eighteen degrees ten minutes west two chains fifteen links, thence south fifty degrees twenty-five minutes east three chains eighty links, thence south forty-seven degrees thirty-five minutes east four chains ten links, thence south thirty-nine degrees forty-five minutes east seven chains thirty-seven links, thence south fifty-four degrees twenty-eight minutes east four chains ninety-six links, thence south seventy-four degrees forty minutes east seven chains sixty-one links, thence south fifty-eight degrees east eight chains fifty-five links, thence south one degree twenty minutes east thirteen chains twenty links, thence south thirty degrees ten minutes east six chains twenty links, thence south thirty-nine degrees east six chains twenty-three links, thence south nineteen degrees east one chain, thence south thirty minutes east seven chains forty-three links, thence south seven degrees sixteen minutes west four chains nineteen links, thence south ten degrees eighteen minutes east three chains forty-four links, thence north eighty-seven degrees ten minutes east two chains ten links to the commencing point, shall be a Public Highway from and after the approval of this Order by the Governor in Council, and shall be in lieu of portions of the present surveyed road colored green on the said plan.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Mount Aspinall Agricultural Area Common, which amongst others was described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of November in the year 1866 by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, viz.:—allotment 1 A of section 15; allotments 1 A and 1 B of section 16; allotments 1 A and 1 B of section 20; allotment 1 A of section 21; and allotments 1 A and 1 B of section 31, parish of Bunaulg; area of extension, 2866 acres 16 perches.—(B.582.) RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made (see *Miscellaneous charges*). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice.
4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.
5. No grave to be of less depth than five feet six inches.
6. When giving the order for interment, a form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable and entered in the interment book.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months of the year.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
11. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair they may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, and registers of all grants, will be kept by the secretary for inspection.
13. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, will be prosecuted in accordance with the *Cemeteries Statute*.
14. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a duly authorized person, such certificate to be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.
15. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make alterations from time to time in the regulations.
