CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH STATUTE" ENFORCEABLE THROUGHOUT VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of October 1875.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the thirty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310, § 30), it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereafter contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria, or in such parts thereof or in such places therein as in such Orders respectively might be expressed; and might in like manner from time to time revoke, alter, or vary any such Order; and all Orders for any of the purposes in the now reciting section mentioned should have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act; and all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the now reciting section should for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council might in any case by such Order direct, and such sum should go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: And whereas on account of the prevalence of scarlet fever in divers localities within this colony, it is expedient that the Central Board of Health should be enabled to enforce any regulations that may appear to be necessary for preventing the spread of the disease: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the provisions contained in the said Act for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria.

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

THE following information respecting the currents on the south coast of Australia, and also as to cautionary measures to be adopted in approaching Bass Strait from the westward, is supplementary to that contained in Hydrographic Notice No. 24, dated 19th November 1874: it has been derived chiefly from a report received from Staff Commander Henry J. Stanley, R.N., in charge of the Admiralty survey in the province of Victoria, 1875.¹

Currents.—The current, generally running to the eastward on account of the prevailing westerly winds, and appearing to follow the configuration of the coast line, will be found on hauling up for the Australian coast to be setting to the south-eastward of the Great Australian Bight, and should a north-west gale be experienced on approaching the land, its strength may be accelerated to 2½ knots per hour.²

Near the shore with easterly winds a current has been found setting to the westward, but this current is probably confined to the vicinity of the coast.

Winds.—Northerly or N.N.E. winds are as a general rule followed by a change to west and south-west winds.

Directions.—Ships bound to Bass Strait from the westward now generally keep in about 42° or 43° S. latitude until the meridian of 138° E. longitude is reached; they then haul up about N.E. or N.E. by N. to make Moonlight Head; this course intersects the parallel of 40° S. at about 120 miles west of King Island, the position named in the Australia Directory, Vol. i., p. 502.

During strong westerly winds it is advisable to maintain the 40th parallel after passing the meridian of Cape Leuwin, and with a view of giving King Island a wider berth, to haul up for Moonlight Head on reaching the meridian of 135° E.³

Several vessels have been wrecked on King Island by steering a direct course for Cape Otway, undue weight having been given to the dangers on the south coast of Australia and the much greater dangers on King Island apparently neglected. It is strongly recommended, therefore, that Moonlight Head, or some point on the coast even more to the westward, should be made, as the soundings on this part of the coast are well defined and regular. The one hundred fathom line of soundings is 35 miles to the south-westward of Moonlight Head, and the depth of 40 fathoms will be found at 10 miles from that headland. When approaching Bass Strait in thick weather, or when the navigator is uncertain of the vessel's position, the soundings should not be reduced to less than 40 fathoms.

Commanders of iron ships, especially of those newly built, are cautioned as to the necessity of ascertaining the errors of their compasses on approaching the Australian coast.

NEW ZEALAND PILOT.

Notice No. 1.

THE following information relating to a shoal recently found in New Plymouth or Taranaki road, New Zealand, has been received through the Customs Department at Wellington, N.Z., 1875.¹

[All Bearings are Magnetic. Variation 15° 10' Easterly in 1875.]

The chief harbor-master at Taranaki reports the existence, off the landing-place in the eastern part of that roadstead, of a shoal, upon which there is a depth of 17 feet at low-water spring tides. The shoal, consisting of large flat-topped stones, is about 20 yards across, with 4½ fathoms around it.

From the centre of the shoal, the flagstaff distant half a mile, is in line with a farm-house in the centre of a clump of trees bearing S. ½ E.; and the two white beacons on the sand hills westward of the landing-place are in line bearing S.W. by S.

These beacons in line, lead over the shoal, and kept open will lead clear on either side.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND—LIGHTS AT NELSON.

THE following information respecting the lights at Nelson, New Zealand, has been received from Commodore J. Goodenough, Senior Officer, Australia:—

The Boulder Bank Lighthouse is situated on the bank or island, 3 to 6 feet above high water, ¼ cables E. by N. of the previously assigned position.

The light shows red between the bearing of E. by N. (the south limit of the white light), and N.E. by N. over the approximate position of the outer white buoy.

The two beacons on the east shore for entering Nelson haven are—

Upper beacon—White, showing a white light at night.

Lower beacon—Red, showing a red light at night.

The light on the Pilot-house is discontinued.

When a vessel is known to be approaching Nelson haven at night, a light is exhibited on the beacon off Haul-shore Island.

The clump of trees hitherto used as a mark for crossing Nelson bar has disappeared, but a large white house on the site of the clump may be used in its stead; it is, however, a difficult mark for a stranger.

The Waimea River is reported to be rapidly closing, the south bank silting up to the northward.

FIJI ISLANDS.

THE following information relating to Kandavu Island is from a recent survey by the officers of H.M.S. *Challenger*, and a report by Navigating Lieutenant H. Hosken, H.M.S. *Pearl*, received from Commodore J. G. Goodenough, Senior Officer, Australia, 1874.¹

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 10° Easterly in 1875.]

KANDAVU (KADAVU) is the south-western island of the Fiji group, and forms the southern shore of Kandavu passage. From the eastern part of Ngaloa Bay, on the south-east side of Kandavu Island, a fringing reef extends to the north-eastward about 4 miles when it stretches off in a long prong abruptly to the southward, from off the outer end of which the high peak of Ngaloa Island bears S. 81° W., distant 8½ miles; thence after a break 1 mile wide, the reef trends north-easterly towards Koro Levu harbor, which is situated about 10 miles to the eastward of Ngaloa Bay. Thus it will be seen that an E. by N. course from off the entrance to Ngaloa harbor will lead clear of all reefs on the south side of Kandavu Island.

From the east extreme of Kandavu Island the reef takes a more northerly direction for about 3 miles, to abreast the north-east point of Ono Island, from which a reef stretches off to the eastward nearly 5 miles; thence it continues to abreast of North Rock nearly 13 miles to the northward, where a prong of Astrolabe Reef forms a prominent elbow, 1½ miles to the eastward of North Rock; between this elbow and the north extreme of Astrolabe Reef, the distance is about 2½ miles in a north-westerly direction.

During the visit of the *Pearl* the sea broke heavily over the eastern edge of Astrolabe Reef, but over the long north part there was only a slight ripple, and that was not seen until the ship was within a mile from it, thus rendering this part of the Astrolabe Reef dangerous to approach at night.

North Rock, about 8 feet high, is situated in a lagoon about 1½ miles within the north extremity of Astrolabe Reef. The northern portion of the top of the rock is white.

NGALO A HARBOR, on the south-east side of Kandavu, is protected from seaward by the reefs fringing that part of the island. Ngaloa Island, about 1½ miles in extent, is situated in the north-west part of the harbor; forming to the north-eastward North Bay, to the westward Inner Harbor, and to the south-west side Outer Anchorage.

North Bay is about 2 miles long in an east and west direction, and 1 mile broad, with depths of 19 to 20 fathoms near the centre, bottom sand and coral.

Inner Harbor is about ½ mile in extent with 4½ to 6 fathoms, muddy bottom.

Outer Anchorage has depths of 16 to 20 fathoms, muddy bottom; on the west side of Outer Anchorage a mud flat fringed by a coral reef, dries 400 yards from the Kandavu shore, having 6 fathoms close to the edge in some parts, with patches of

2 and 3 fathoms at $\frac{1}{2}$ of a cable; and 6 to 9 fathoms nearly 3 cables from the reef. Wood shoal, with rocks awash at low water, lies on the south-east side of Outer Anchorage, bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the south point of Ngaloa Island.

Channels.—Main channel, leading into Ngaloa Harbor is formed by Esk Reef on the north, and Pearl Reef on the south side; the channel is about 3 cables broad with a depth of 40 fathoms near the centre; at the inner entrance of Main channel, and bearing N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. 2 cables distant from the north-west end of Pearl Reef, lies McGregor patch, which dries at low water, and is marked by a white buoy on its south side. Between McGregor patch and the east extreme of Ngaloa Island there are several spots of 2 and 3 fathoms with 6 to 8 fathoms close to; the leading mark through Main channel from seaward, is the beacon on the southern hummock of Ngaloa Island in line with the beacon on Kandavu Island, bearing W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.

Boat channel, on the east side of Esk Reef, is about 300 yards long and 50 yards broad, with depths of $3\frac{1}{2}$ to $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

Schooner channel is an opening in the fringing reef $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the eastward of Boat channel, and is about 150 yards broad, with 10 to 12 fathoms near the centre; on the north-east side of the inner entrance of Schooner channel there is a patch of $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 fathoms. The left extreme of Anda Tavie Island, bearing N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., leads to the westward of this patch.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, in Ngaloa Harbor, at 6h. 38m.; springs rise 5 feet 3 inches, neaps 4 feet 5 inches.

CAUTION.—The buoys in Ngaloa Harbor are indifferently moored and are not to be depended on, and the beacons are only temporary structures.

ONASEUSE OR HUNTER ISLAND.

The following further information relating to the supposed position of Onaseuse or Hunter Island, has been received from Commodore J. G. Goodenough, Senior Officer, Australia, H.M.S. *Pearl*, 1875.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation $9^{\circ} 50'$ easterly in 1875.]

ONASEUSE OR HUNTER ISLAND is said to be in latitude $15^{\circ} 31'$ S., longitude $176^{\circ} 11'$ E. (Findlay's South Pacific Directory, 3rd edition, p. 628).

H.M.S. *Rosario*, Commander Dupuis, R.N., passed over this supposed position of Onaseuse or Hunter Island about Noon of the 26th of July 1874, without observing any indication of land or discolored water, the weather at the time being bright and clear.

H.M.S. *Blanche*, Captain Simpson, R.N., also passed 5 miles to the eastward of the same position, on the 20th February 1875, the weather at the time being nearly calm and clear, without observing any indication of land.

NORTH-EAST COAST, AND TORRES STRAIT.

(1) Establishment of Beacons on Reefs and Islands.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 17, dated 31st January 1875, on the establishment of beacons to facilitate the navigation of the Inner route leading to Torres Strait—

The Colonial Government of Queensland has given further notice that the following additional beacons have been erected in the Inner route, and in Prince of Wales Channel, Torres Strait:—

Vessels bound north and west must leave those beacons which are red and triangular on the port hand, and those that are black and square on the starboard hand.

Port side, bound north and west, red and triangular. Starboard side, bound north and west, black and square.

On a sand-bank, dry, with rocks, E.S.E., distant 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Look-out Point	X reef, north-west end.

reef. This beacon, referred to in Notice to Mariners No. 17, above quoted, has been shifted to the detached rock lying one quarter of a mile N.E. of it.

(2) Sunken Reef off Liban or Babi.

Also, that the Commander of the mail steamer *Normanby* reports having struck upon a reef extending about three quarters of a mile from the south end of Liban or Babi Island. The following bearings were taken from the vessel when aground, viz.—

Detached rock off south end of Liban ... N.E. by E.
Western point of the island, just open of the S.W. point, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

The reef did not dry at low water, but appeared to extend to some distance from the western side of the island; it is steep-to, there being 20 fathoms within half a cable.

A break was also observed on what appeared to be a sunken rock lying about 3 miles to the eastward of the south point of Liban Island.

Of the total deaths 33 or 30 per cent. were children not exceeding the age of 3 years, 15 being under the age of one year. Forty-four deaths are attributed to scarlet fever of which 13 occurred at Collingwood, 11 at North Melbourne, and 10 at Richmond, the remaining 10 being distributed among the districts of North Fitzroy, South Melbourne, West Melbourne, Sandridge, and Emerald Hill. The other districts, with the exception of Footscray and South Yarra, which are said to be healthy, are only mildly visited with the epidemic. Twelve of the South Melbourne deaths took place in public institutions, and 3 of the Prahran deaths were hospital cases.

The births of 776 children, viz., 392 boys and 384 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of September. In the month of August 671 births were registered, or 105 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in September numbered 398, viz., 219 of males and 179 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 378. The deaths exceeded those in August by 47, and were 129 in excess of the average of September during the previous ten years. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 71 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74.8° on the 25th and the lowest was 33.9° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (51.9°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.4°) took place on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 74.8° to a minimum of 43.4°. The least range (9.1°) was on the 1st, viz., from a maximum of 49.1° to a minimum of 40.0°. The mean daily range was 18.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.971 inches) was a little above the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males and 45 per cent. were of females. Deaths of children under the age of 5 years amounted to 35 per cent. as against 25 per cent. in September 1874, 36 per cent. in September 1873; 31 per cent. in September 1872; 37 per cent. in September 1871; 32 per cent. in September 1870; 33 per cent. in September 1869; 37 per cent. in September 1868; 40 per cent. in September 1867; 41 per cent. in September 1866; and 51 per cent. in September 1865.

Thirteen persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.: a brewer aged 75 of cancer, a female aged 75 of gastritis, a female aged 78 of dyspepsia, a gardener aged 79 of hemiplegia, a female aged 80 of bronchitis, a surveyor aged 80 of emphysema, a tailor aged 76, and a female aged 82, of heart disease; a laborer and two females, all aged 77, a female aged 81, and a laborer aged 86 of old age.

Nineteen deaths from external causes took place during the month, of which 14 were ascribed to accident or negligence, and the remaining 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A laborer, aged 15, was killed by a fall down a shaft; a midshipman, aged 16, died of fracture of the thighs, caused by a fall from the mast of a ship; a seaman, aged 20, and a land agent, aged 43, died of injuries, also the result of falls; a gardener, aged 33, died of pyæmia, caused by an injury to the arm; a blacksmith, aged 21, died of hemorrhage, caused by an accidental gun-shot wound in the thigh; three male infants, two aged 1 month and one aged 6 weeks, were suffocated in bed; a blacksmith, aged 60, was accidentally suffocated in a forge; a shipwright, aged 70, was choked with a piece of meat; a cabdriver, aged 27, succumbed to the effects of inhalation of chloroform administered for a surgical operation; a male infant, aged 2 days, died of effusion of blood into the brain, the result of an accident at birth; a male infant, aged 4 hours, died of umbilical hemorrhage; a drover, aged 36, and a french polisher, aged 51, poisoned themselves—the former with cyanide of potassium, the latter with hydrocyanic acid; a carter, aged 34, and a town clerk, aged 43, were found drowned in the River Yarra, and are supposed to have committed suicide; and a female servant aged 18, committed suicide by throwing herself from a window.

Ninety-two deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital; 10 in the Immigrants' Home; 6 in the Alfred Hospital; 5 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 10 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 140, of which 78, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 62, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 72 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 12 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 258. Of these, 141, or 55 per cent., were males, and 117, or 45 per cent., were females; 35 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 20 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, 5 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

Deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 116 as against 76 in August and 51 in July. The increase is chiefly due to scarlatina, which caused 3 deaths in July, 19 in August, and 60 in September. Phthisis caused 37 deaths in the month under notice as against 48 in August. Childbirth and metria caused only two deaths, which is the smallest number set down to those complaints for many months past.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 30th September 1875 was 1,122, and the mean temperature in the shade was 49.6°. The deaths exceeded by 257 the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or by 70 if allowance be made for the increase of population. The mean temperature was four-tenths of a degree below the average.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands herein-after described as a common, that is to say:—

LALLAT COMMON.—Two thousand one hundred and eighty-five acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands

ST. KILDA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when the orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of the *Cemeteries Act* of 1864 it is enacted that "Any person so digging and making such vault, grave, or tombstone, or erecting and placing such monument in such cemetery, by and with such permission as aforesaid, and upon payment of the fees aforesaid, shall be entitled to have maintained and kept up such vault, grave, or monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever."
3. Applications for such permission must be made at the cemetery, and a certificate of permission, in the form set out in Schedule A to these rules, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.
4. The fees and charges for the burial of any poor person in the cemetery will be remitted on the certificate of either a minister of religion or a justice of the peace, or upon other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the subject of such interment was, at the time of death, too poor to pay the necessary charges, and that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the same.
5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug on payment of the necessary fee; but persons requiring brick graves or vaults will have to construct them under the direction of the trustees.
6. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave without the production of the certificate of the right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be tendered with the order.
8. Upon making application for an interment, the name, age, late residence, occupation or relation, cause of death, and all other necessary particulars as per Schedule B, must be furnished to the officer to whom such application shall be made.
9. The time fixed for the funeral shall be the time when the procession is to arrive at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. The usual hours fixed for burials are from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six p.m. from the month of September to that of April, both inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four p.m. during the other four months of the year; but on Sundays the only hours for burials are from Two o'clock p.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be repaired and kept in proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave shall be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron; and every coffin in a public or private grave must have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
12. A drawing of every tombstone or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
13. The plans of all fences must be submitted to the trustees.
14. Six working hours' notice, from 7 o'clock a.m. to 6 p.m., of each interment must be given, or in default thereof an extra fee shall be charged of 10s. 6d. for a public and 21s. for a private grave, except when the necessity of immediate interment shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.
15. No burial shall take place without the necessary certificate from a deputy registrar or a coroner.
16. Any person not behaving in a decorous manner in the cemetery, or who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as the law directs.
17. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in, any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
18. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected.
19. The cemetery grounds will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
20. No smoking is allowed within the cemetery.
21. No dogs are allowed within the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.
22. No burial shall take place between the hours of 7 o'clock p.m. and 7 a.m. without the special permission of the trustees.
23. Hearses and mourning coaches only will be permitted to enter the cemetery.
24. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges.
25. These rules are in substitution of all pre-existing rules and regulations.

- 2nd. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule A.
- 3rd. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on the production of a certificate, signed by two respectable householders, that the relatives or friends of deceased are unable to pay them.
- 4th. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. the day previous to the interment.
- 5th. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or of some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
- 6th. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Seven p.m. from September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year; except on Sundays, when the hours will be from Two to Five p.m.
- 7th. All monuments, vaults, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- 8th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
- 9th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval; as they are required by the 17th section of the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, due reference being paid to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

10th. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, they may be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owners thereof.

11th. All persons destroying graves, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

12th. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept and may be inspected.

13th. No servant or other person, employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

15th. No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.

16th. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

17th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations at any time in these charges and regulations.

PROPOSED NEW SHIRE UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of five several petitions, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which have been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport severally to be inhabitant householders and ratepayers residing within the Shires of Marong, East Loddon, Echuca, and Swan Hill, and that they are desirous that the districts which they severally describe should be severed from the aforesaid shires and jointly petition that the said areas be constituted a new municipality, and they further state that the said area is capable of yielding, on a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound, the sum of £500; and they pray as follows :—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to make such orders as may be necessary to sever so much of the shires of Marong, East Loddon, Echuca, and Swan Hill as is included within the hereunder described boundaries, and to constitute the same a new shire :—

BOUNDARIES.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the municipal boundary of Eaglehawk; thence easterly by the northern and north-eastern boundaries of the said municipality to its junction with the municipal boundary of Sandhurst; thence by the north-western and northern boundaries of the municipality of Sandhurst to the Bendigo Creek; thence north by the western boundary of the shire of Huntly to the south-east angle of allotment 125, parish of Kamarooka; thence north along the road which forms the eastern boundary of that allotment to the north-east angle of allotment 1, parish of Kamarooka; thence west to the south-east angle of the parish of Dingee; thence north by the eastern boundary of the parishes of Dingee and Mitiamo to the north-east angle of the last-named parish; thence direct north by a surveyed road to the north-east angle of Mount Hope Creek pre-emptive right; thence west by the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive right to the Mount Hope Creek; thence westward by the northern boundary of the parish of Terrick Terrick West to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence west to the north-east angle of the selection of Michl. 4. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the inspector in the discharge of his duty shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this bye-law.

5. No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the said market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the council as a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction of the council in writing. All produce or implements of every description must be removed out of the market yards before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following that upon which they are sold or offered for sale, otherwise a charge of 5s. (Five shillings) per week will be made for a space not exceeding 200 superficial feet. All horses or cattle must be removed out of the market before Twelve o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale, provided that all horses or cattle sold or offered for sale at the monthly sales on Saturdays shall be removed from the market yards before Eight o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.

6. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or default of this bye-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
