## SUNKEN ROCK IN BANKS STRAIT.

A ROCK with only 10 feet water on it has been discovered by H.M. surveying steamer *Victoria*, off the Black Reef, from which it lies E. by S. 4 S. 3 miles. For the guidance of mariners it may be stated that the rock will take the place of a "14 fathoms" upon the Admiralty charts of Banks and Bass Strait, marked as "breaking heavily in southerly gales." As this rock is at the turning point in Banks Strait its position is one of great danger.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might substitute other weights for the weights set opposite the names of every or any of the species of fish mentioned in the second schedule thereto, or for the weights substituted for any of such weights by any previous proclamation, and might prescribe for every or any of the species of fish in the said second schedule mentioned a size less than which it should be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species, and might for any species of fish prescribe a close season or close seasons in every year, and that any proclamation made under the said Act might be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other such proclamation published subsequently to the one to be so explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded; and whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifth of October 1874, the period from the fifteenth day of October to the thirtieth day of November in every year was prescribed to be a close season for the fish known as Murray Cod, Murray Perch (golden), and Murray Bream (silver): Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the

advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the before-mentioned proclamation dated the fifth day of October One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing a close season for Murray Cod, Murray Perch (golden), and Murray Bream (silver).

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted, that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth of December 1869, Part II. of the said Act was extended to the Shire of Avon: And whereas a portion of the said shire has been separated therefrom and constituted the Shire of Maffra: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. aforesaid to the Shire of Avon as now constituted, and to the new Shire of Maffra: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF AVON, and  
 THE SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. of the day previous to the interment.
3. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or other graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
4. When giving the order for interment, a form of application for burial containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable, and entered in the interment book.
5. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
6. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Five o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.
7. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper condition and repair at the expense of the owners.
8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented; and covered by a slab of stone, slate, iron, or good blue or red gum planking.
9. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
10. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept and may be inspected.
11. By *The Cemeteries Statute*, any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and liable, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, to a fine of £20, or imprisonment for three months.
12. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.

## PROPOSED NEW SHIRE UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be inhabitants of the northern and north-eastern portions of the Shire of Yackandandah, each of whom possesses rateable property therein, and on the ground that the interests of the other portions of the shire are antagonistic to theirs, and that they have not shared equitably in the expenditure of the rates, they ask that the district which they describe should be severed from the shire and constituted a new municipality; and they pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by sections Nos. 19, 21, 22 of the *Local Government Act 1874* and separate the hereinafter described portion of territory from the shire of Yackandandah (said portion of territory containing an area of about 120 square miles, and including rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, a sum of upwards of Five hundred pounds), and cause the same to be proclaimed a separate and undivided shire under the title of the Shire of Wodonga."

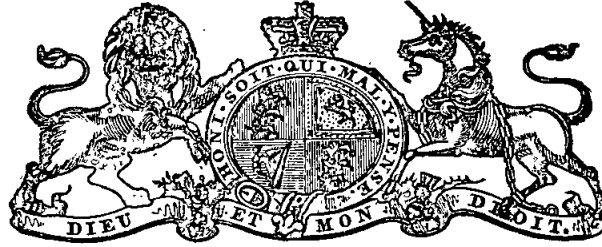

Fourth-class goods river-borne from Echuca to or beyond the Wakool Junction shall be allowed a rebate of 48s. per ton, provided that the requirements set forth in the Goods Classification of the Board of Land and Works dated 13th October 1875 have been complied with; and the rebate of 48s. per ton upon the said fourth-class goods as therein specified shall be and is hereby repealed.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF THE FIFTY-TON CRANE.

THE accompanying Rules and Regulations for the use of the 50-ton Crane, which have been approved by the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published for general information.

*Rules and Regulations for the use of the 50-ton Crane on the south side of the River Yarra.*

1. Any person desirous of using the crane must make application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the office of the Chief Harbor Master, such application to be lodged between nine a.m. and four p.m. on week days, which will be duly registered in order of receipt.

2. With application for registration and before registration is made a deposit of £3 shall be paid to the Secretary for Harbors and Navigation, which sum shall be allowed as part payment of crane rates, provided such rates shall be settled within seven (7) days after delivery of the account for same.

3. Ships requiring the use of crane and for which deposit has been paid shall have prior claim to use of wharf abreast of crane so long as they are using the crane.

4. Should any vessel not be in position to use the crane at such times as may be specified in writing by the Chief Harbor Master, and addressed to the person making the application, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the deposit fee being liable to be forfeited, subject to the decision of the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs; and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in getting crane ready for use, unless the inability to use the crane shall have occurred through stress of weather or other circumstances, which the Chief Harbor Master shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the deposit.

5. The working day shall consist of eight (8) hours, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. For every hour earlier or later than the fixed working day, ten shillings (10s.) is to be paid in addition to the rates.

## Rates for the use of Crane.

For each hoist exceeding 20 tons and not exceeding 50 tons ... 10s. per ton per lift.  
For each hoist exceeding 10 tons and not exceeding 20 tons ... 8s. "  
Ten (10) tons and under ... 4s. "

All necessary use of the crane, from the lifting of a piece of machinery off its carriage until stowed or adjusted in the vessel, or from the lifting of a piece of machinery from the vessel until placed on its carriage, shall be included in one hoist.

No single employment of the crane (when steam has to be specially raised) to be for less than the sum of £1, and if, during the day of eight hours, the rates do not exceed £3, the charge for such day and for such single lift to be £3.

WEST COAST OF MIDDLE ISLAND.

NOTICE is hereby given that the danger off Kiourangi Point, West Coast of Middle Island, has been surveyed and found to be a most dangerous rocky shoal, of nearly three-quarters of a mile long by half a mile broad, having near its southern end a shallow patch with only 3½ fathoms on it, Kiourangi Point bearing S. 30° E. (magnetic), distant 4½ miles. Vessels should approach this danger very cautiously in heavy weather, as the sea breaks heavily for a considerable distance. The passage inshore is about 3½ miles wide, and is clear of danger.

Notice is also given that the shallow banks inside the Steeples, Cape Foulwind, and the entrance to the Buller River, have been surveyed. Masters of vessels taking shelter inside the Steeples should, with the wind from seaward, get under weigh on the ebb, as the flood sets on the Steeples. Vessels bound for the Buller should be guided by the signals exhibited on the flagstaff, and steer in as shown by the semaphore arm, as a strong current is sometimes felt across the entrance and on the bar.

The bar bears from the outer Steeple E. ½ N. magnetic, distant 5½ miles. The lighthouse on Cape Foulwind is in course of construction, and the light, which will be revolving, once every half-minute, is expected to be ready for lighting about June or July 1876.

The position of the flagstaff at the Buller is—latitude, 41° 45' 55" S.; and longitude, 171° 42' 7" E.

A similar buoy to the above, and surmounted in the same manner, also painted red, has been placed on the west spit of the Middle Vernon Island in 7½ fathoms at low water.

The following sailing directions are recommended for vessels coming from the north-eastward:—

Give the red buoy on the east end of the island a berth of one-sixth of a mile, continuing a southerly course until the red buoy on the west spit shows well open to the south of Middle Island; then shape a course through the passage, a good look-out being kept for the Henry Ellis Reef just a-wash at low water.

Of the total deaths 39 or 28½ per cent. were children not exceeding 3 years of age, 17 being under 1 year. The total deaths referred to scarlet fever is 63 against 55 reported last week, the heaviest returns being from Collingwood, which recorded 8 cases (3 in town of Fitzroy and 5 in that of Collingwood), North Fitzroy 6, Hotham and Carlton 14, Richmond 11, and Emerald Hill 6. The districts of Flemington, Footscray, Hawthorn, and Kew appear to be the only ones free from the epidemic. The death at Kew occurred at the Lunatic Asylum. At South Melbourne 15 deaths occurred in public institutions, and 2 at Prahran in the hospital.

## TOWN OF GEELONG.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN KNOWN AS "JOHNSTONE PARK."

WHEREAS by section 108 of The Land Act of 1869, it is enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind Rules and Regulations for the Care, Protection, and Management of all Public Parks and Reserves. Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of the Public Park and Garden in the Town of Geelong known as "Johnstone Park":—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds therein, or throw stones, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths, or in the pavilion, or any other reserved place.

2. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences or gates or stick bills thereon, or to cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, pavilions, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or to write thereon.

3. No person shall be allowed to bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found at large therein may be destroyed.

4. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale refreshments or goods of any description, except by the written consent of the Mayor on behalf of the Town Council of Geelong.

5. The park shall be open daily (except as provided in clause No. 10) from 6 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; and any unauthorized person found therein after these hours may be treated as a trespasser.

6. At moonlight concerts in the said park, or any other public occasion therein, for which permission shall have been given by the Town Council of Geelong, the time of closing the park may be fixed by the said council.

7. During wet weather the entrance gates to the park will be closed for such time as may be necessary to preserve the walks, flower-beds and other reserves therein.

8. No person shall be permitted to enter, or to remain in the said park or garden, who offends against decency, as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

9. All pic-nic parties shall be located in such portions of the park as may be arranged between the managers of such parties and the superintendent, under instructions from the mayor, such arrangements to be made at least one day previous; and all such parties must, through their managers, deposit a money guarantee (in accordance with the nature of accommodation required) for the removal of all rubbish, &c., as provided in Clause 1 of these regulations.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act; Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a common, that is to say:—

**TERRICK TERRICK WEST COMMON.**—About five thousand acres, county of Gunbower, parish of Terrick Terrick West, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of Mary Lynch's 18th section block, No. 22219; bounded thence by a line bearing north about three

## REGULATIONS FOR A COMMON.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the common hereinafter mentioned.

*Regulations for the Management of the Malmesbury Borough Common.*

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame Regulations for the management of Commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the borough of Malmesbury, as Managers of the Malmesbury Borough Common, has submitted to the Board of Land and Works the following draft regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing in the borough, shall be entitled to depasture cattle upon the said common.
2. Each person so entitled shall be allowed to depasture four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
3. The fees for depasturing shall be as follows:—Large cattle, four shillings (4s.) per head per annum; small cattle, two shillings (2s.) per head per annum, payable in advance.
4. Bulls and entire horses will not be allowed upon the common without a special license from the managers.
5. Goats will not be allowed upon the said common unless branded and having an approved yoke upon them.
6. Foals and calves under six months and kids under three months old to depasture free.
7. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed upon the common.
8. All cattle and goats for depasturing on the common shall be registered and branded on or before the eighth day of October in each year, after which date all goods found unregistered or unbranded, and not having on yokes, shall be destroyed, and all cattle unregistered and unbranded shall be impounded.
9. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her rights of commonage.

10. Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

11. These regulations shall be in force on and after the first day of November 1875.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Sandhurst has requested that certain streets within the said city be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, subject to the rights of the Crown to authorize mining beneath the surface of the portions of the streets east of the land held under mining lease by the Golden Lion Mining Company, and as regards the portions of the streets west of the boundary-line of the said company's lease subject to the same rights and also to all those of the company, that is to say:—

1. Wattle street from High street to Hargreaves street.
2. Creek street from Wattle street to Short street.
3. Burr street from Creek street toward High street, as delineated on a tracing deposited in the office of the Department of Railways and Roads.
