The petitioners state that the gross revenue of the town of Collingwood, for the year ending 30th September last, was not less than Twenty thousand pounds.

"That Your Excellency in Council will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred on that behalf by *The Local Government Act 1874*, subsection XII., section 19, and declare this town to be a city by the name 'The City of Collingwood.'"

## NOTICE TO MASTERS OF VESSELS, AGENTS, AND CONSIGNEES.

THE attention of masters of vessels, agents, and consignees of goods is particularly directed to the following clauses of *The Customs Act 1857*, with respect to reporting vessels, and the penalties imposed for non-compliance :—

40. The master of every ship must report his ship, and particulars of cargo, within twenty-four hours after arrival.

41. If the master fails so to report, or makes a false report, he shall forfeit £100.

42. Goods not reported may be detained, and such goods may be restored on such terms as the Commissioner may think proper.

43. No goods shall be imported unless the master shall have a manifest of such goods, and if any goods shall be imported without such manifest the master shall forfeit £100.

47. Spirits, opium, and tobacco, must be specially reported, otherwise the same shall be forfeited unless the Commissioner shall permit them to be exported, and if the master wilfully fail to specify such goods, he shall forfeit £100.

Cases have so frequently occurred of late in which goods have either been wrongly reported, not reported at all, or not specially reported as required by the Statute, that it has been

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found necessary to issue this special caution as to the result of non-observance of the law.

Agents of vessels and consignees are particularly requested to take every precaution to enable masters of vessels to comply with the law.

The births of 628 children, viz., 304 boys and 324 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 776 births were registered, or 148 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in October numbered 462, viz., 248 of males and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 166. The deaths exceeded those in September by 64, and exceeded the average of October during the previous ten years by 183. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been in excess of the average of those ten years by 123 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80'7° on the 14th and the lowest was 38'5° on the 30th. The mean temperature of the month (56'3°) was one degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38'8°) took place on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 77'3° to a minimum of 38'5°. The least range (6'2°) was on the 20th, viz., from a maximum of 54'5° to a minimum of 48'3°. The mean daily range was 17'4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'818 inches) was a fraction below the average of the previous ten years.

Males and females died during the month in the proportion of 54 and 46 per cent. respectively. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 39 per cent. to the total number of deaths, as against 35 per cent. in October, 1874; 37 per cent. in October 1873 and October 1872; 41 per cent. in October 1871; 32 per cent. in October 1870; 40 per cent. in October 1869; 45 per cent. in October 1868; 40 per cent. in October 1867; 51 per cent. in October 1866; and 52 per cent. in October 1865.

Five persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, which is a number below the average. The following are the particulars:—A gentleman, aged 78, died of obstruction of the bowels; a surveyor, aged 79, of dysentery; a female, aged 76, a gentleman, aged 79, and a butler, aged 81, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths from external causes took place during the month. Twenty-one of these were ascribed to accident and two to suicide, and the remaining one was from execution. The following are the particulars:—A carter, aged 17, died of fracture of the thigh, and a railway porter, aged 28, of fracture of the leg, both caused by falls; a carpenter, aged 69, was killed by falling down stairs whilst drunk; a female, aged 38, died of effusion of blood on the brain, the effects of a fall whilst getting into a carriage; a girl, aged 6, died of the effects of a fall from a chair; a master mariner, aged 38, was killed by the fall of a screw propeller; a laborer, aged 38, died of rupture of the duodenum, the result of an accidental injury; a carter, aged 29, was passed over by a dray; a carter, aged 68, died of erysipelas and abscess of the arm, caused by a splinter of wood entering the thumb; a female, aged 49, died of the effects of a blow on the head (evidence not sufficient to show how caused); a female child, aged 2, died of concussion of the brain, the effects of a fall down stairs; two youths, aged 13 and 14 respectively, died of tetanus, occasioned in both instances by injuries to the hand by machinery; two female children, aged 1½ and 2 respectively, died of scalds; a laborer, aged 60, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a sailmaker, aged 25, was drowned near the Sandridge Pier, when drunk; a boatman, aged 55, was drowned by the upsetting of a boat in Hobson's Bay; two nightmen, aged 18 and 47 respectively, were suffocated in a cess-pit; a female infant, of 3 months, was overlain by its mother; a publican, aged 50, and an auctioneer, aged 43, poisoned themselves whilst of unsound mind, the latter with hydrocyanic acid; and a publican, aged 52, was judicially hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Eighty-four deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—86 in the Melbourne Hospital; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 12 in the Alfred Hospital; 6 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 8 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 180, of which 87, or 48 per cent., were of males; and 93, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 54 were under one year of age, 28 were between one and two, 46 were between two and three, 32 were between three and four, and 25 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 282. Of these, 161, or 57 per cent., were males' and 121, or 43 per cent., were females; 70 were between five and ten, 20 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 was upwards of eighty.

### BYE-LAWS OF THE MELBOURNE ORPHAN ASYLUM.

#### NAME AND OBJECT.

1. The institution shall be called the "Melbourne Orphan Asylum," and shall be conducted upon the principles of the Christian religion as held by the various branches of the Protestant church.

12. Orphan children shall be admissible without reference to the creed or country of their parents.

#### COMMON SEAL.

3. The following shall be the common seal of the corporation:—



4. The common seal shall be in the custody of the superintendent of the asylum, who shall be responsible for the safe keeping of the same, and it shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing except by order of the committee of management at a meeting at which four members at least are present, and of which due notice has been given.

5. The common seal shall be affixed by the secretary attested under his hand, and his signature shall be witnessed by the certificate of the chairman of the committee ordering it so to be used.

#### CONTRIBUTORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

6. Contributors shall be entitled to recommend children for admission to the asylum. All recommendations must be in accordance with the regulations of the institution and subject to them.

7. The annual contributions shall be computed from the first day of July in each year, and no contributor shall have more than one vote, or be entitled to vote at the annual meeting until the contribution for the past year shall have been paid; or at any special meeting called in the course of the year until the contribution for the current year shall have been paid.

8. Every donor of £20 or upwards, every minister who shall have collected in his church the sum of £50, every person who shall have collected £50 in one sum or more, and every person elected at a general meeting of contributors, on the recommendation of the committee, for special services rendered to the institution, shall be a life patron, with power to recommend children for admission into the institution. Every contributing or collecting firm or partnership may claim their privilege through some one member of such firm.

#### ANNUAL MEETING.

9. An annual meeting of contributors shall be held during the month of July in each year, due notice of which shall be given at least one week previously in one or more of the Melbourne daily papers, at which meeting the report and balance-sheet shall be presented. At the annual meeting no business shall be entered upon but the consideration of accounts and report which shall be then laid before the meeting.

10. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors in January, but if any vacancy shall occur in the office of president or vice-president previous to such meeting, the committee shall appoint one of its members to fill the same until such meeting.

#### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT AND SUB-COMMITTEES.

11. The institution shall be under the government of a committee, consisting of thirty members, comprising eighteen gentlemen (including a president, vice-president, and treasurer, five ministers, and ten laymen) and twelve ladies of the various branches of the Protestant church.

12. The committee shall meet once at least in every month, and shall have power to frame regulations for the management of the institution and any of its affairs, and may appoint sub-committees with power to act, or to report only, as the committee may direct; but no such regulation shall have effect unless it be passed at a meeting of the committee after written or printed notice of the proposed regulation shall have been sent to each member, and such regulation shall have been confirmed at the next following meeting of committee.

13. No meeting of committee shall be valid unless each member shall have been summoned by the secretary by writing posted at least forty-eight hours previously. If at the expiration of fifteen minutes after the time of meeting, there be not four members of committee present, such meeting shall lapse.

14. Every sub-committee shall appoint one of its members to be secretary and convener, and shall meet as directed by the

committee, and whenever further summoned by such convener, and shall record all its proceedings in a book signed by such convener and submit the same to the committee at its next meeting.

#### CHAIRMANSHIP AT MEETINGS.

15. At all general, special, or committee meetings the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

16. At every meeting of committee the president, or in his absence the vice-president, or in the absence of both of them some member of committee elected by the committee at the time shall take the chair, and order shall be maintained in the committee by the chairman, who shall have the same right to speak in any discussion as any other member of committee, but no member of committee shall speak twice on any subject except in explanation, or to a point of order; but the mover of any resolution shall have a right of reply.

The supervision of the domestic affairs of the institution and the admission and removal of children shall be entrusted to a sub-committee, consisting of the ladies of the committee; and children shall be admitted into the asylum at the monthly meetings of the ladies' sub-committee, but in cases of necessity they may be received without delay on the written order of one member, and the secretary of that sub-committee, accompanied by the certificate of the medical officer that such children are in a fit state of health for admission into the asylum.

18. The ladies' sub-committee shall meet at least once in each month, and shall report in writing all its proceedings to the committee at the monthly meetings.

19. No child shall be removed without an order signed by the secretary and one other member of the ladies' sub-committee, provided always that all the proceedings of the sub-committee shall be conducted according to such regulations as the committee shall from time to time frame, and shall be subject to the supervision and control of the committee, whose decision as to the admission or removal of children, and as to all other matters connected with the management of the institution shall be final.

20. The asylum shall be visited daily by one or more of the ladies' sub-committee, who shall leave enclosed in an envelope any suggestions or remarks she or they may deem necessary, addressed to the secretary of the committee.

#### TENDERS.

21. Tenders shall be invited for all provisions or other goods above the value of five pounds supplied to the institution, and no member of committee, or officer of the institution, shall be a contractor, or become security for a contractor for such supplies, directly or indirectly, or be present at the discussion of, or record his vote upon any matter in which he shall by himself or his partners have any pecuniary interest.

#### SECRETARY.

22. The committee shall appoint a secretary, who shall act in all matters connected with the institution under the direction of the committee, and may be removed from office by them.

#### SUPERINTENDENT AND MATRON.

23. The asylum shall be under the care of a superintendent and matron with such assistance as the committee may think necessary.

24. The superintendent shall live in the house and shall not leave it except on necessary occasions; he shall not be absent for more than three hours at any one time, nor after ten o'clock at night, without the sanction of the secretary of the committee. He shall have the immediate superintendence and general control of the entire establishment, and shall have the power of hiring and dismissing servants, but shall not have the power of appointing or dismissing the matron. He shall see that the house and grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order. He shall inspect the food of the children and see that it is properly prepared and of good quality. He shall keep an inventory of all the property of the institution, and he shall be responsible for the whole. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by contractors or tradesmen, and see that they are of proper quality and quantity, and shall not suffer any waste or allow any provisions or any other property to be taken from the premises. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of the institution under the instructions of the honorary secretary, and shall enter and keep the books of the institution. He shall attend Divine service at least once every Sunday.

25. The matron shall live in the house and shall not leave it without the sanction of the superintendent. She shall attend to any directions the superintendent may give her. She shall have the superintendence of the female domestics, and enforce personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty on the part of any of them, she shall report the same to the superintendent. She shall see that the girls are properly washed and clothed. She shall daily inspect the beds and see that they are properly made and clean, and also superintend the proper cooking of the food. She shall attend Divine service at least once every Sunday. She shall not, except by the consent of the secretary of the committee, leave the institution in the absence of the superintendent.

## COLLECTORS.

26. Each paid collector shall make a return to the committee at their monthly meetings of his weekly transactions, and have his accounts properly audited by them. He shall keep a cheque receipt book and give printed receipts for all subscriptions. He shall keep a bank pass-book and lodge his takings every day or when the sums collected amount to £5.

## VISITING THE ASYLUM.

27. The public may visit the asylum on Tuesdays and Thursdays only, between the hours of two and four, and all visitors shall be required to enter their names in a book to be kept for that purpose.

28. The relatives or connections of the children shall be permitted to visit them once a month.

## BEQUESTS.

29. All bequests, not specially appropriated, made to the institution, shall be paid to a separate fund, to be called the endowment fund, due regard being had to the conditions under which such bequests are made. And all such moneys shall be invested from time to time in such manner as the committee shall direct; the interest only of such endowment fund being available for the maintenance of the institution.

*Extracts from Act No. 27 Victoria 226 (under which the Institution is incorporated) providing for the Election of Committee, &c., &c.*

[MEMO.—By clause 1.—All persons who shall have paid not less than £1 per annum, or £20 in one donation, are to be deemed contributors.]

Clause 4. Every such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall be governed by a committee of not less than 7 members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being, and such committee, or any four of them, shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities by this Act vested in the corporation, and one-fourth part of such committee, or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one-fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of such institution, and the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer of every such institution shall, by virtue of their respective offices, be members of such committee.

Clause 7. It shall be competent for the corporation of any such institution to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, and generally for all matters whatsoever effecting the management of the institution.

If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act, are required to go out of office.
