By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN accordance with the tenor of a Despatch received from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby rescind so much of a Proclamation by the Governor of Victoria, dated 3rd February 1870, as directs that the red ensign, having the badge of the colony emblazoned on the fly, may be worn by merchant vessels registered in Victoria.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

THE whole of the Shire of Mount Rouse, with the exception of the townships of Dunkeld and Penshurst and a radius of two miles round the same, and also round the township of Caramut.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony at Melbourne, this sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED NEW SHIRE UNDER THE "LOCAL
GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be inhabitants of the part of Victoria sought to be constituted a shire, each of whom possesses rateable property within one or other of the Shires of Saint Arnaud or Wimmera, and that they are desirous that the districts which they jointly describe should be severed from such shires and constituted a new municipality under the name of the Shire of Karkaroc, with boundaries as follow:—

"Commencing at the River Wimmera at a point where it is intersected by the western boundary of the parish of Marma, by that river south-easterly to a point west of the southward angle of allotment 43, Marma; thence east to the main road between Horsham and Glenorchy, along that road and east along the boundaries of the parishes of Marma and Warranook to the north-east angle of the parish of Warranook; thence south by the east boundary of that parish to the road between Horsham and Navarre, opposite the south-east angle of allotment 197, parish of Riachella; eastward along same road to opposite the south-east angle of allotment 205, same parish; thence to the north-east angle of allotment 226, same parish; thence to the north-east angle of the parish of Callawadda, south to the Horsham and Navarre road at the south-west angle of allotment 84, parish of Bolangum; along the same road to the eastern boundary of the parish of Bolangum; thence north to the eastern boundaries of Bolangum, Wallaloo, Marnoo, and a line north to the Avon River; thence by that river northerly to Lake Buloke; thence by the eastern and northern margin of that lake to the intersection of the 143rd meridian; thence by that meridian north to the intersection of a line from the junction of Lalbert Creek with Lake Lalbert, direct westerly to the next northern point of Lake Goorong; thence by that line to Lake Goorong; thence by the east side of the lake to the Yarrambiac Creek; thence by the creek southerly to the northern boundary of the parish of Longerenong; thence east to the north-east angle of that parish; thence south to the point of commencement.

"Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road to be the boundary line."

REGULATION.

Each purchaser of an allotment of Crown Lands sold by public auction shall, at the time of such auction, pay to the officer appointed to receive the same a charge for survey of such allotment in accordance with the following scale:—

For an allotment containing 20 acres, or a less area, £1.
For an allotment containing an area in excess of 20 acres, 1s. per acre, or fraction thereof.

Provided that in the event of a purchaser of any such allotment having previously paid a charge or fee for the survey of such allotment, the Minister may, if he think fit, dispense with the payment at the time of auction of the whole or any portion of the charge for survey herein prescribed.

This Regulation shall apply to all allotments comprised in public sales by auction, of which notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, on and after this day.¹

3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wildfowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as shall be fixed by any regulation of the council to be made in that behalf in such water.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall without the authority of the proper officer of the council be driven through the gardens.

5. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or laborers by conversation or otherwise.

6. Children under the age of 10 years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

7. All dogs and goats and all poultry found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

8. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.

9. Any person offending against this bye-law or any such regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

10. Bye-law No. IX. of the said borough is hereby repealed.
