3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wildfowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as shall be fixed by any regulation of the council to be made in that behalf in such water.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall without the authority of the proper officer of the council be driven through the gardens.

5. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or laborers by conversation or otherwise.

6. Children under the age of 10 years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

7. All dogs and goats and all poultry found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

8. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens content of the gardens are bellevent to time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance.
