RESTRICTIONS ON THE IMPORTATION OF CATTLE INTO TASMANIA AND PROHIBITION OF THE IMPORTATION INTO THAT COLONY OF THE CARCASSES OF CATTLE, SHEEP, AND PIGS FROM VICTORIA.

REFERRING to notice dated 5th May 1875, and published at page 883 of the *Government Gazette* of the 7th idem: It is hereby notified for public information that the Government of Tasmania has intimated that the importation into any part of Tasmania is prohibited of cattle imported for any purpose other than slaughter from (*inter alia*) any part of the colony of Victoria, unless the owner of such cattle shall produce to the inspecting officer appointed by the Governor in Council, at the port in Tasmania where the same shall arrive, a certificate in writing, signed by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, to the effect that such cattle were inspected and examined by him immediately before shipment, and that they were at the time they were so inspected and examined by him free from any contagious or infectious disease whatever which would be likely to propagate amongst men or animals any such contagious or infectious disease, or any other disease. It is also intimated by the Tasmanian Government that the importation into Tasmania is prohibited of the carcasses of cattle, sheep, and pigs which have been exported from (*inter alia*) the colony of Victoria.

THE following Regulations under which certificates will be issued by the "Municipal Surveyors' Board," appointed in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874*, were approved by the said Board and confirmed by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council on the 3rd May, 21st June, 13th September, and 11th November 1875, viz.:

1. Examinations of candidates for certificates of "Competency," "Service," or "Qualification" will be held in Melbourne, at a place to be from time to time hereafter appointed, commencing at Ten o'clock a.m. on the first Tuesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

2. Candidates must be in attendance in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day, and in the event of any adjournment at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward, fourteen clear days at least before the day of examination on which he intends to present himself, to the secretary of the Board, notice in writing of such intention, and at the same time must enclose his Articles of Indenture, or satisfactory certificates (with copies of same on foolscap paper) of not less than three years' preliminary service in the offices of some one or more competent engineer or surveyor; or of service for a like period as duly appointed surveyor of roads to a corporate body.

4. Satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, of the age and respectability of character of any candidate; and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-three years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Regulations Nos. 3 and 4 being duly complied with, the candidate will receive a notice from the secretary that his preliminary papers have been accepted or rejected, as the case may be, and if accepted must, upon receipt of notice to such effect, forward to the secretary the sum of (£2 2s.) Two pounds two shillings, the production of the receipt for which will be the candidate's passport to the examination room.

6. Two classes of certificates of competency will be issued (marked A and B), B being the ordinary certificate, and that marked A denoting that the candidate has passed with credit.

7. If a candidate presents himself more than twice, and is successful at the third or any subsequent examination, the last fee will be returned to him.

8. Gentlemen holding the B certificate under this or previous Statutes may present themselves for the purpose of obtaining the A certificate, on payment of a fee of (£1 1s.) One pound one shilling, and giving notice to the secretary, not less than fourteen clear days before the day of examination, of intention to come forward for said certificate.

When making application for the A, the B certificate must be returned to the secretary; and in the event of a first class

(A) being granted, the second class one (B) will be cancelled by the Board.

9. Candidates must provide themselves with drawing instruments, scales, and a book of logarithms.

10. Each examination will occupy the space of three days, during which six sets of questions will be issued to each candidate.

The 1st, 3rd, and 5th sets of questions will be issued at 10 a.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the secretary before 1 p.m. The 2nd, 4th, and 6th sets of questions will be issued at 2 p.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the secretary before 5 p.m.

The answers to the questions must be written on one side only of each sheet of paper, signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, with the question sheet on the top, and pinned together.

Any candidate detected in the act of using books or notes (except a book of logarithms), or of giving or receiving assistance, will be dismissed from the examination room.

### PROCLAMATION

THE DURHAM, SCOTCHMAN'S, NAPOLEON, WHIM HOLES, AND BLACK LEADS GOLDFIELDS COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 22nd April 1861, and increased by Order of the 26th November 1866, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CARAMUT TOWN COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chap. xiii. of the regulations made under *The Land Act 1869* by the Governor in Council, on the 25th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Warrnambool, as Managers of the Caramut Town Common, have submitted to the Board of Land and Works the following draft regulations for the management of the said common, in lieu of the regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 27th day of May 1872.

#### SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.—RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CARAMUT COMMON.

No. 1. All persons entitled to depasture cattle on the Caramut Town Common in respect of their right as resident householders, shall be allowed to run not more than four head of horned cattle, or three head of horned cattle and one horse, or three horses (calves to be charged for when six months old) upon complying with the provisions as to registration and payment of fees hereafter mentioned.

No. 2. All cattle shall be registered with the managers half-yearly, viz, 1st January and 1st July, and at the time of registration the owner of such cattle or horses shall sign a declaration that they are his or her *bona fide* property.

No. 3. The following shall be the fees payable half-yearly in advance:—Horses, 12s. per head per annum; horned cattle, 10s. per head per annum.

No. 4. All horses and horned cattle above six months old will be subject to commonage fees, and shall be branded with the common brand.

No. 5. No bulls or entire horses to run on the common unless approved of by the managers.

No. 6. The right of depasturing stock shall not be transferable, nor shall registered cattle be exchanged during the half-year.

No. 7. Persons neglecting to pay their fees at the commencement of each half-year will be liable to have their stock impounded.

No. 8. The managers to have the right to diminish the number of cattle at any time depasturing on the common, when a scarcity of feed shall render it necessary.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE INGLEWOOD BOROUGH COMMON.

The Council of the Borough of Inglewood, by virtue of the power vested in it by the regulations prescribed under *The Land Act 1869* in that behalf, has drafted the following Regulations, by resolution adopted on 13th October 1875:—

1st. The fees for depasturing to be as follows:—For every horse, 6s. per annum; for every head of cattle, 5s. per annum; for every sheep or goat, 2s. per annum; calves and foals from six months to two years old, half-price.

2nd. The fees shall be paid half-yearly, in advance; the half-years to terminate on the 31st December and 30th of June.

3rd. Previous to running stock on the common, the owners shall register the same with the town clerk or his deputy, together with the number, description, and brands, &c.

4th. All cattle (excepting horses) depasturing on the common shall be branded with the common brand, and the herdsman will be in attendance at the pound yards for that purpose every alternate Monday, from Ten to Twelve o'clock a.m.

5th. All horses depasturing on the common shall have round their necks a wire or strap, attached to which will be a metal tablet with the common brand thereon, which tablet will be supplied to the owners of the animals, at a small cost, by the herdsman.

6th. All stock found depasturing on the common—not registered, and without the common brand—shall immediately be impounded.

7th. Ratepayers in the borough, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may respectively depasture on the said common, within a distance of

five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to four head of small cattle.

8th. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the said common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

9th. Bulls or entire horses will not be allowed on the common without the consent of the managers.

10th.—All cattle suspected of being diseased shall be removed by the owners within twenty-four hours after notice to do so has been served upon them, and in default of compliance with such notice or order, the manager shall have power to destroy such cattle at the cost of the owners thereof.

11th.—Carriers and other travellers will be allowed to depasture teams twenty-four hours on the common free of charge; after that time a fee of One shilling per head per week, or part of a week, will be charged.

12th.—The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers any disease in the stock on the common. The managers will not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman. The herdsman shall visit and inspect the stock depasturing on all parts of the common twice at least in each week.

13th.—Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

14th.—Should the herdsman fail in carrying out any part of these regulations, or neglect any instructions of the managers in connection herewith, or the management of the common generally, he shall be immediately suspended.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY, FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all existing rules and regulations heretofore made relating to the Treasury Gardens, the Fitzroy Garden, the Carlton Garden, and the Flagstaff Garden, and doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the above-named gardens:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. All persons visiting or walking through the Treasury Garden shall keep on the footpaths.

2. No person shall interfere with the seats, trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds in any of the above-named gardens, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter, or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats and fences in or around the said gardens, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

4. No person, unless employed in the gardens under the direction of the overseer thereof, shall bring into the gardens any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

5. No person shall bring into these gardens any dog unless the same be held by a chain or cord.

6. No children under seven years of age shall be allowed in these gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

7. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said gardens any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

8. All goats and poultry found within these gardens may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

9. The Treasury Garden shall be closed to the public daily during such hours as the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may from time to time determine.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOTANICAL GARDENS.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all the rules and regulations heretofore made relating to the Botanical Gardens, and doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of such gardens:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, labels, fountains, fish, or birds therein, or step on the beds, borders, seats, or edges of the grass plots, or engage in any sport or game, or throw stones, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter therein, or light fires therein, or smoke, or annoy visitors, or carry flowers into the gardens.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences therein, or stick bills on such fences, or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or write thereon, or otherwise deface the same.

3. No person shall bring any dog into the said gardens unless held by a chain or cord. All goats or poultry found therein may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

4. Children under ten years of age shall not be allowed within the gardens unless accompanied by adult friends or nurses, whom they shall not leave while in the said gardens.

5. No person, unless authorized by the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, in writing, shall offer for sale any article therein.

6. Unless the Minister of Lands and Agriculture shall otherwise direct, the gates of the Botanical Gardens shall be closed from Six o'clock p.m. until Eight o'clock a.m. daily, except on Sundays, when the gardens shall be open to the public between the hours of One p.m. and Six p.m. throughout the year. Any person found in the gardens during unauthorized hours shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

7. Any person found taking or injuring plants, flowers, or fruits, shall be summarily removed from the gardens and may be prosecuted.

8. Entrance into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes is prohibited, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in these gardens without the permission in writing of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture first obtained.

9. No person in a state of intoxication or who is not decorously dressed shall enter or remain within the gardens, and no person shall commit any act of indecency in these gardens.

10. If any person offend against any of these rules such person may be forthwith removed from the gardens by a bailiff of Crown lands or a police constable.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ALBERT, YARRA, FAWKNER, AND STUDLEY PARKS, AND THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE DOMAIN.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all rules and regulations heretofore made relating to Albert Park, Yarra Park, Fawknor Park, Studley Park, and the Government House Domain, and doth hereby make the Rules and Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of such parks and domain:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. Unless otherwise directed by the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, the double gates at the Albert Park shall, from the 1st April to the 30th September, be closed to the public

from Six p.m. to Six a.m., and from 1st October to the 31st March, from Sunset to Six a.m.

2. No vehicle used for hire or transport of goods, stores, or materials of any kind, nor any vehicle bearing either name or number shall be allowed within these parks and domain (except in the roads in Studley Park) without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, and no person shall ride or drive within the said parks and domain except on the roads laid out therein. In the Government House Domain this regulation shall not apply to His Excellency the Governor or to any person resident within such domain.

3. No person on horseback or leading any horse shall enter the Yarra Park and Fawknor Park, and no vehicle shall be allowed therein without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture.

4. No person shall offer any article for sale in these parks and domain without the permission, in writing, of the said Minister.

5. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, or birds in the said parks and domain, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter, and no fires shall be lit within such parks and domain unless under the authority of the said Minister.

6. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats and fences in and around the said parks and domain, or stick bills on those fences or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface or write thereon.

7. No person shall depasture any horses or cattle in the said parks and domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, and then in such portions thereof only as may be specified in such permission.

8. No person shall disturb the wildfowl in Albert Park.

9. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said parks and domain any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

10. Entrance into plots of ground enclosed for plantations or for other purposes is prohibited.

11. All goats and poultry found in the said parks and domain may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the 108th Section of *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order of 11th November 1875, as a site for Recreation in the township of Traralgon.

## BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BYE-LAWS.

## MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the bye-laws following, relating to water supply to Melbourne and suburbs, that is to say:—

1. No person shall water the streets or thoroughfares with the water of the Board taken by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs, and thence distributed direct on to such streets and thoroughfares. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. The gratuitous water supply to the public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Yan Yean Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person turning on the water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. No screwed tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the board to which a hose could be attached unless a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. No pipe or apparatus to supply any water-closet with the water of the board shall be fixed without the special permission of the board, and in no case will such pipe be allowed to be fixed without a waste-preventing apparatus of approved construction; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. All baths and cisterns supplied with the water of the board must be provided with waste-indicating pipes properly placed and approved by the board, and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. In the construction of these bye-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation.

8. These bye-laws are in addition to the bye-laws of the board concerning water supply to Melbourne and suburbs made and passed by the board, under its common seal, on the 18th day of June 1874.
