DIRECTIONS FOR THE KURRACHEE HARBOR LIGHTHOUSE. Latitude of lighthouse on Manora Point, 24° 47′ 21" N.; longitude 66° 58′ 15″ E.

The light is a fixed one, 120 feet above the sea-level, visible in clear weather 16 miles; in hazy weather, prevalent during the south-west monsoon, about 7 miles.

Present light very inferior. A dioptric light of the second order recommended.

Tides.

High water, full and change, 10h. 30m. Average rise and fall, spring tides, 9ft. 6in.; average rise and fall, neap tides, 3ft. to 4ft. Depth of water in entrance channel at high water —Spring tides, 29ft.; neap tides, 24ft. to 26ft.

Draught of Vessels entering or leaving Port.

Vessels with a draught not exceeding 21½ feet can now enter and leave the port without difficulty or delay during all seasons of the year.

During the fair season, from October to 15th May, vessels with a draught not exceeding 24 feet can now enter and leave the harbor.

Fixed moorings are placed for such vessels.

Time of tide for entering Port.

Sailing vessels should enter port on the ebb-tide. Steamers can enter either flood or ebb, and stand at once into port.

Masters of ships should not, under any circumstances, attempt to enter the harbor without a pilot.

Ilarbor Improvements.

Among the extensive works executed, a break-water* has been built, running out from Manora Point in a south-by-east direction to a distance of 1,500 feet, into 6 fathoms of water. This affords complete shelter to the entrance channel during the south-west monsoon. Also a channel has been opened through the bar, with a depth of 20 feet at low water spring iddes, 500 feet in breadth; the channel is marked by buoys,

and these on entering should be kept on the port side about 150 feet.

Nors.—A mail steamer arriving off the port at night and requiring a pilot should fire two guns.

Approaching the Port.—Coast of Sind.—Indus Banks.

The coast of Sind below the parallel of 24° north latitude should be approached with great caution; too much attention cannot be paid to the lead, more especially in passing the banks of the Indus. Banks of the Indus has extended about ten miles to the southward since 1856.

No sailing vessel should come nearer this coast than 20 fathons by night or in rough weather, or under 12 fathoms by day in fine weather.

The tides during the springs are strong; the flood sets southeast and ebbs to the north-west.

From February to the end of the monsoon a strong southeasterly current is experienced, running at a rate of from 15 to 40 miles a day.

During the south-west monsoon, sailing vessels should make Ras Muari (Cape Monze), which is 18 miles west-half-north from Manora lighthouse, and keep to windward of the port, if the weather is thick, or if the tide does not suit for entering the harbor. Allowance must also be made for a strong set to the south-east, which prevails more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of east, or go

south-east, which prevais more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of east, or go under 15 fathoms near Cape Monze.

Masters of ships should endeavour to make the port at daylight, and can with safety approach into 8 fathoms to about two miles distance from the lighthouse, keeping it, in any bearing, from north-east to north, and heave-to for a pilot.

Archarage in the Roads.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off and on, keeping the lighthouse bearing from north-by-east to north-east, one to two miles distant, until boarded by a pilot, or directed by signal. September to end of March—Auchorage lighthouse north-by-east to north-porth-east, distant 1 mile 7 fathous.

To our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable Robert Molesworth and the Honorable Thomas Howard Fellows, two of our Judges of our Supreme Court of our Colony of Victoria, Thomas Spencer Cope, Esquire, Judge of the County Court of the city of Melbourne in our said colony, the Honorable George Paton Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly, of Melbourne aforesaid, barrister-at-law, and Alexander Kennedy Smith, Esquire, the Right Worshipful the Mayor of the City of Melbourne aforesaid.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE STRATFORD RECREATION RESERVE.

- 6. No person shall be allowed to put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or to bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the consent of the committee.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other erection for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
- 8. No person except the servants employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, make the bye-laws following, relating to water supply to Melbourne and suburbs, that is to say:—

1. No person shall water the streets or thoroughfares with the water of the Board taken by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs, and thence distributed direct on to such streets and thoroughfares. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. The gratuitous water supply to the public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Yan Yean Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person turning on the

water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding! Five pounds.

- 3. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 4. No screwed tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board to which a hose could be attached unless a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 5. No pipe or apparatus to supply any water-closet with the water of the Board shall be fixed without the special permission of the Board, and in no case will such pipe be allowed to be fixed without a waste-preventing apparatus of approved construction; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Barrabool, made under the 213th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered One, for Regulating the Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Barrabool order as follows:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings

rottowed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Council.

2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering

Presentation of reports of committees.
Payments.
Ordinary business.
Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk, at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then six clear days prior to the next meeting of Council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addressses the Council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council, by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motio

infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of Council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the Council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions. occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to applogise for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Council, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The Council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the Council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be plut from the chair; but no councillor and be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be not in

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the numicipality, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality, from time to time, on the written order of the chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the Council the sum of Five pounds.
