DIRECTIONS FOR THE KURRACHEE HARBOR LIGHTHOUSE.

Latitude of lighthouse on Manora Point, 24° 47' 21" N.; longitude 66° 58' 15" E.

The light is a fixed one, 120 feet above the sea-level, visible in clear weather 16 miles; in hazy weather, prevalent during the south-west monsoon, about 7 miles.

Present light very inferior. A dioptric light of the second order recommended.

Tides.

High water, full and change, 10h. 30m. Average rise and fall, spring tides, 9ft. 6in.; average rise and fall, neap tides, 3ft. to 4ft. Depth of water in entrance channel at high water—Spring tides, 29ft.; neap tides, 24ft. to 26ft.

Draught of Vessels entering or leaving Port.

Vessels with a draught not exceeding 21½ feet can now enter and leave the port without difficulty or delay during all seasons of the year.

During the fair season, from October to 15th May, vessels with a draught not exceeding 24 feet can now enter and leave the harbor.

Fixed moorings are placed for such vessels.

Time of tide for entering Port.

Sailing vessels should enter port on the ebb-tide. Steamers can enter either flood or ebb, and stand at once into port.

Masters of ships should not, under any circumstances, attempt to enter the harbor without a pilot.

Harbor Improvements.

Among the extensive works executed, a break-water* has been built, running out from Manora Point in a south-by-east direction to a distance of 1,500 feet, into 6 fathoms of water. This affords complete shelter to the entrance channel during the south-west monsoon. Also a channel has been opened through the bar, with a depth of 20 feet at low water spring tides, 500 feet in breadth; the channel is marked by buoys, and these on entering should be kept on the port side about 150 feet.

NOTE.—A mail steamer arriving off the port at night and requiring a pilot should fire two guns.

Approaching the Port.—Coast of Sind.—Indus Banks.

The coast of Sind below the parallel of 24° north latitude should be approached with great caution; too much attention cannot be paid to the lead, more especially in passing the banks of the Indus. Banks of the Indus has extended about ten miles to the southward since 1856.

No sailing vessel should come nearer this coast than 20 fathoms by night or in rough weather, or under 12 fathoms by day in fine weather.

The tides during the springs are strong; the flood sets south-east and ebbs to the north-west.

From February to the end of the monsoon a strong south-easterly current is experienced, running at a rate of from 15 to 40 miles a day.

During the south-west monsoon, sailing vessels should make Ras Muari (Cape Monze), which is 18 miles west-half-north from Manora lighthouse, and keep to windward of the port, if the weather is thick, or if the tide does not suit for entering the harbor. Allowance must also be made for a strong set to the south-east, which prevails more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of east, or go under 15 fathoms near Cape Monze.

Masters of ships should endeavour to make the port at day-light, and can with safety approach into 8 fathoms to about two miles distance from the lighthouse, keeping it, in any bearing, from north-east to north, and heave-to for a pilot.

Anchorage in the Roads.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off and on, keeping the lighthouse bearing from north-by-east to north-east, one to two miles distant, until boarded by a pilot, or directed by signal.

September to end of March.—Anchorage lighthouse north-by-east to north-north-east, distant 1 mile 7 fathoms.

April and May.—Lighthouse north-north-east, distant half a mile 8 fathoms.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

To our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable Robert Molesworth and the Honorable Thomas Howard Fellows, two of our Judges of our Supreme Court of our Colony of Victoria, Thomas Spencer Cope, Esquire, Judge of the County Court of the city of Melbourne in our said colony, the Honorable George Paton Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly, of Melbourne aforesaid, barrister-at-law, and Alexander Kennedy Smith, Esquire, the Right Worshipful the Mayor of the City of Melbourne aforesaid.

WHEREAS by *The Patents Statute 1865* it is enacted among other things that if any person who has obtained letters patent under the said Act or any other Act relating to letters patent theretofore in force in Victoria, or (in case such person shall have parted with his whole or any part of his interest by assignment) if such person, together with the assignee where part only has been assigned, or if the assignee where the whole

has been assigned, shall, six months before the expiration or other determination of such letters patent, present to the Governor, in Council a petition for the extension of the term in such letters patent mentioned, and shall set forth in such petition that he or they has or have been unable to obtain a due remuneration for his or their expense and labor in perfecting such invention, and that an exclusive right of using and vending the same for some further period to be named in such petition in addition to the said term is necessary for his or their reimbursement and remuneration, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to refer the consideration of the said petition to commissioners to be appointed for that purpose in the manner thereafter mentioned: And whereas by our letters patent bearing date the twenty-second day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, under the hand of our trusty and well-beloved Sir Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, at that time Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of our said colony of Victoria, and sealed with the seal of the said colony, it was made known that we, of our special grace, certain knowledge, and mere motion, did give and grant unto Walter Laidlaw, of Tarnagulla, in the colony of Victoria, engineer, his executors, administrators, and assigns the special license, full power, sole privilege and authority that he the said Walter Laidlaw, his executors, administrators, and assigns, and every of them, by himself and themselves, or his and their deputy or deputies, servants or agents, or such others as he or they should at any time agree with, and no others, during the term thereafter expressed should and lawfully might make, use, exercise, and vend "An invention for raising quartz tailings in the condition they flow from the reducing and amalgamating machinery, or other gritty substances of a like nature, by means of an improved plunger pump" within the said colony of Victoria and its dependencies in such manner as to him, his executors, administrators, and assigns, or any of them, should seem meet, and that he the said Walter Laidlaw, his executors, administrators, and assigns, should and lawfully might have and enjoy the whole profit, benefit, commodity, and advantage from time to time coming, growing, accruing, and arising by reason of the said invention during the said term of years therein mentioned, to have, hold, exercise, and enjoy the said licenses, powers, privileges, and advantages unto and by the said Walter Laidlaw, his executors, administrators, and assigns for and during and unto the full end and term of fourteen years then next ensuing, subject, however, to the provisos and conditions in such letters patent contained: And whereas the said Walter Laidlaw duly made his will on the seventeenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and thereby gave, devised, and bequeathed all his real and personal estate unto his wife, Helen Laidlaw, and appointed her sole executrix of his said will: And whereas the said Walter Laidlaw died on the twenty-ninth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, without having revoked or altered his said will, and the said will was duly proved in the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria on the ninth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, by his widow and executrix, the above-named Helen Laidlaw: And whereas the said Helen Laidlaw did, on or about the fourteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, present a petition to our trusty and well-beloved Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Administrator of the Government of our said Colony, in Council, praying for an extension of the term of such letters patent, which petition is as follows:—

"To His Excellency The Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, in Council:

"The humble petition of Helen Laidlaw, of Tarnagulla, in the colony of Victoria, widow, and executrix of Walter Laidlaw, late of Tarnagulla, aforesaid, engineer, deceased: "Showeth—

"That on the twenty-second day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, a patent was granted to the said Walter Laidlaw, for a term of fourteen years thence next ensuing, for an invention 'For raising quartz tailings in the condition they flow from the reducing and amalgamating machinery, or other gritty substances of a like nature, by means of an improved plunger pump':

"ii. That the invention referred to was an original invention of the said Walter Laidlaw, and has not, so far as your petitioner knows, been improved upon, and that there is not any other machinery of a similar nature for effecting the same object:

"iii. That great public benefit has accrued from the said invention; that so far as your petitioner knows there has not been any other invention connected with the mining interest in the colony of Victoria that has effected so much saving of labor as the invention now referred to. It has enabled quartz crushing machinery to be erected at places convenient to mines, regardless of conformation of country, or making provision for getting rid of tailings or crushed quartz. Prior to this invention all crushed quartz had to be carried or removed with manual labor and cartage at great cost, but by means of this invention the tailings are raised and removed to reasonable distances and the water used with the pump is made again available for crushing and pumping purposes:

"iv. That the saving by means of this invention has been calculated at from Sixpence to One shilling per ton of quartz crushed at many mines in this colony:

"v. That the said Walter Laidlaw, the patentee, not having sufficient capital available when the said patent was granted to enable him to manufacture the patent tailings pump

so patented as aforesaid, granted licenses to certain manufacturers to make and vend them; that the said Walter Laidlaw afterwards found it impossible to keep a proper or sufficient check upon the number of pumps so made and vended; and in his endeavours to reap the reward of his invention he was involved in very heavy legal expenses, and that, although large losses were sometimes proved, the proceedings so taken were barren in results; that many of the licensees have hitherto failed or been unable to pay the royalty due by them; that your petitioner believes that the said patent has been infringed to a large extent, and that unless the term of the said patent is extended your petitioner will be unable to prove such infringement and obtain redress; and further, that many pumps have been made from which at present your petitioner has not any return:

"vi. That the said Walter Laidlaw died on the twenty-ninth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and by his will, which was duly proved in the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria on the ninth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, he bequeathed the said patent and all his rights and interest therein to his widow and executrix, your petitioner:.

"vii. That by reason of the adverse circumstances above referred to the said Walter Laidlaw did not obtain, and your petitioner, since his death, has not obtained, due remuneration for the said invention, and that your petitioner is solely dependent upon the proceeds of the said invention for her living:

"viii. And lastly that your petitioner, in the event of this application being granted, will undertake to continue to all parties who have heretofore acquired rights to use and vend the said invention the same rights during the currency of the extension.

"Wherefore your petitioner prays that Your Excellency, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of Victoria, will take the premises into your favorable consideration, and will grant an extension of the term for the exclusive right of using and vending the said invention for an additional period of fourteen years.

"And your petitioner will ever pray, &c.

"(Signed) HELEN LAIDLAW."

And whereas the said The Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Administrator of the Government of our Colony of Victoria, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of our said colony, has decided to refer the consideration of such petition to you: Now know ye that we, confiding in your learning, fidelity, and ability, do by these presents constitute and appoint you the above-named the Honorable Robert Molesworth and the Honorable Thomas Howard Fellows, Thomas Spencer Cope, the Honorable George Paton Smith, and Alexander Kennedy Smith to be our Commissioners, with all the powers conferred by *The Patents Statute 1865*, to meet on Saturday the eighteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, at the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon, and on such other day or days to which it may from time to time be convenient to adjourn until the matter shall be fully considered, at the Office of Patents and Copyrights, Swanston street, in the said city of Melbourne; and we require and authorize you, or any three of you, of whom you the said Robert Molesworth or you the said Thomas Howard Fellows shall be one, then and there to consider the said petition and to report to us, or to our heirs and successors, whether any, and, if any, what further extension of the said term should be granted according to the prayer of the said petition, and upon what, if any, conditions.

And we do hereby appoint our trusty Johnson Hicks, clerk of patents, to be secretary to you our Commissioners.

In testimony whereof we have caused the seal of our said colony to be hereunto affixed. Witness our trusty and well-beloved The Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Officer administering the Government of our Colony of Victoria, at Melbourne, in our said colony, this twenty-third day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-ninth year of our reign.

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerth run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbest Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woorook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Linitingow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenonald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carngham, Nuntinghool, Bانشaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

NORTH-EASTERN CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Broken River; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Benalla run; thence northerly to the south-east corner of the Yabba-yabba run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run to the south-west corner of St. James' run; thence south-easterly by the southern boundary of that run to the western boundary of the Peechelba run; thence southerly and easterly by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Killawarra run; thence southerly by the western boundary of that run to the north-west corner of Springs Station run; thence by that run southerly to the north-west boundary of Emu station run; thence south-westerly by the north-west boundary of that run to the Broken River aforesaid; thence up that river to the Samaria run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of Samaria run to Fern Hill run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of Fern Hill run to Dueran run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Dueran run to the King River; thence by that run and by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Howitt, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the Mount Hotham; thence north easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of the Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary to Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence easterly by a straight line to the north-west corner of Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 15th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence by that river to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the Roschial run and the following allotments in the Agricultural area of Verdon, county of Delatite, viz.: allotments B, 16, 19, 20, 23, 50, E, 46, 41, 40, 39, 49, 45, 42, 38, 69, 43, 44, 62, 63, 68, 61, 103, 102, F, 64, 67, 70, 71, 72, 73, 65, 66, 94, 95, 90, 89, 88, 82, 81, 74, 93, 91, 86, 87, 83, 75, 80, 79, 84, 85 are also included in this district.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—[The boundaries of this district are co-terminous with the Sandhurst district.]—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brennanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that run easterly to the north-west angle of Calto's run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Inglewood and Wedderburn road; thence by that road south-easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Marong; thence by lines easterly to the south-east angle of the parish of Nerring; thence by the west boundary of the parish of Sandhurst bearing south three miles; thence east sixty chains to the south-west boundary of the borough of Sandhurst; thence easterly, north-easterly, and northerly to its intersection with the Sandhurst and Axedale road; thence by that road easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Axedale; thence south to the south-west angle of that township reserve; thence easterly to the Campaspe River; thence down that river to its junction with the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the whole of the Warparilla and Axedale runs, and also the whole of the borough of Sandhurst, shall belong to this district.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE STRATFORD RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 30th December 1867 for Racing and Recreative purposes at Stratford:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The management of the Stratford Recreation Reserve, being lot 21 A of section eight (8), parish of Stratford, shall be under the local supervision of the following committee:— Messieurs, W. E. Power, Alexander Hamlyn, Francis Baylis, John Pruden, Edward Hagan, D. H. Weir, and Henry Leake.
2. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
3. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the reserve who offends against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall any one be permitted to light fires in the reserve.
5. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or to roll or throw stones in the reserve.
6. No person shall be allowed to put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or to bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the consent of the committee.
7. No person shall be allowed to erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other erection for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
8. No person except the servants employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERS AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the bye-laws following, relating to water supply to Melbourne and suburbs, that is to say:

1. No person shall water the streets or thoroughfares with the water of the Board taken by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs, and thence distributed direct on to such streets and thoroughfares. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. The gratuitous water supply to the public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Yan Yean Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person turning on the

water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. No screwed tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board to which a hose could be attached unless a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. No pipe or apparatus to supply any water-closet with the water of the Board shall be fixed without the special permission of the Board, and in no case will such pipe be allowed to be fixed without a waste-preventing apparatus of approved construction; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. All baths and cisterns supplied with the water of the Board must be provided with waste-indicating pipes properly placed and approved by the Board, and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. In the construction of these bye-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation.

8. These bye-laws are in addition to the bye-laws of the Board concerning water supply to Melbourne and suburbs made and passed by the Board, under its common seal, on the 18th day of June 1874.

SHIRE OF BARRABOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Barrabool, made under the 213th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered One, for Regulating the Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Barrabool order as follows:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Council.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Presentation of reports of committees.
5. Payments.
6. Ordinary business.
7. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
8. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
9. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
10. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the Council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk, at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then six clear days prior to the next meeting of Council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council, by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of Council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the Council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The Council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the Council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Council by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the Council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the

Council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the municipality, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the Council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Council, or for any work to be done by the Council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be prepared at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality, from time to time, on the written order of the chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the Council the sum of Five pounds.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the Council, or, in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon, notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a vote of two-thirds of the Council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misdemeanour, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
