## "MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1862."—DUTCH VESSELS.

## PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1862," it is enacted, that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificate of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions; but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act 1854," have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine-room, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the first day of January 1876, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, the measurement whereof, after the said day of January 1876, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam ships, that merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of the Netherlands, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of January 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships: Provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Dutch steam ship desires the deduction for engine-room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Dutch rule, the engine-room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules.

A white beacon has recently been erected about midway between the foot of Queen street and the bank of the river; and a red beacon near the north side of the Falls bridge. These beacons, in one, N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., and S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. lead directly over this dangerous shoal.

There is a channel 120 feet wide, to the southward of this shoal, with 14 feet water at low tide. This channel should always be used in preference to that to the northward of the shoal, which is not above 30 feet wide and has only a depth of 12 feet over it at low water.

## AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

## CAPRICORN AND BUNKER ISLAND.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 168, dated 4th December 1874, on the existence of Irving Reef, near Masthead Island, Capricorn group:—

From information transmitted by Staff-Commander F. P. Bedwell, R.N. (in the extension of the Admiralty survey of the coast of Queensland to the off-lying groups of islands), the Capricorn and Bunker groups have been found to lie further to the west, and thus closer to the mainland, than previously supposed.

Capricorn Group.—Masthead Island (west point) lies East 27 miles from Cape Capricorn, and in lat. 23° 33' S., long. 151° 44' E. This position is 23 miles W.S.W. of the position formerly assigned to the island (the other islands of the group being similarly affected in position).

In order to clear the extensive detached coral reef, the western extreme of which lies W.S.W. 44 miles from Masthead Island; and also to clear Irving Reef, which lies W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. 54 miles from Masthead Island—the beach of Masthead Island should not be raised above the horizon.

The ebb tide out of Keppel Bay sets direct towards Masthead Island.

Bunker Group—No. 1 Island.—Also that No. 1 Bunker Island lies in lat. 23° 54' S., long. 152° 24' E., which would place the island (in common with the others of the group) about 14 miles to the westward of its hitherto charted position.

## AUSTRALIA, EAST COAST—NEW SOUTH WALES.

## REVOLVING LIGHT ON SUGAR-LOAF POINT.

THE Colonial Government of New South Wales has given notice that from the 1st December 1875 a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse on Sugar-loaf Point.

The light will be a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds; it is elevated 258 feet above the

level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 22 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the first order. In addition to, and below the revolving light, a fixed green light, of the fourth order, will be exhibited from the same tower, for the purpose of warning vessels from the Seal Rocks and adjacent dangers.

## BANKS' STRAITS.

THREE rocks have been discovered by H.M.C.S. Victoria off Eddystone Point. One, with only 5 feet upon it at low water, lies nearly two-thirds of a mile E. 6 N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. from Eddystone Point, and N.N.E. half a mile from Eddystone Rock. Another, with 14 feet upon it, lies three-quarters of a mile N.E. 6 E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. from Eddystone Rock, and one mile east from the Point; and the third lies E.N.E. a quarter of a mile from Eddystone Rock, and has 10 feet upon it at low water.

The births of 635 children, viz., 309 boys and 326 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 538 births were registered, or 97 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in January numbered 595, viz., 323 of males and 272 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 40. The deaths exceeded those in December by 10, and also exceeded the average of January during the previous ten years by 95. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 13.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102'9° on the 30th, and the lowest was 43'9° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (65'7°) was about three-quarters of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41'1°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 93'1° to a minimum of 52'0°. The least range (7'0°) was on the 31st, viz., from a maximum of 67'0° to a minimum of 60'0°. The mean daily range was 22'9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'781 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 52 per cent. to that mortality, as against 66 per cent. in January 1875; 57'5 in January 1874; 49 per cent. in January 1873; 56 in January 1872; 57 per cent. in January 1871; 58 per cent. in January 1870 and 1869; 62 per cent. in January 1868; 75 per cent. in January 1867; and 65'4 per cent. in January 1866.

Seven persons of the age of 75 years or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female, aged 75, of cancer; a consul, aged 78, and a sawyer, aged 73, of old age; a gentleman, aged 83, of prostatic abscess; a gentleman, aged 89, and a female, aged 90, of old age; a female, aged 90, of ascites.

Fifteen deaths from external causes were registered during the month under review. Of these 12 were set down as accidental, 1 as homicidal, and 2 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A laborer, aged 40, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a tree; a laborer, aged 40, died of hemorrhage from the lungs, the result of an accidental injury to the chest; a male of occupation unstated, aged 50, died of concussion of the brain, caused by his being thrown against the bulwarks by a lurch of a vessel; a female, aged 52, died of the result of an ununited fracture of the thigh; a stonemason, aged 54, died of gangrene of the leg, the result of a fracture; a male infant, aged 2 months, and a girl, aged 8, died of insolatio; a female child, aged 24, was accidentally poisoned with iodine; a painter, aged 21, died of poisoning with morphia, consequent on the subcutaneous injection of 1/4 grain of that drug; a youth, aged 15, was accidentally drowned; a seaman, aged 35, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a newly-born male infant died of suffocation; a laborer, aged 33, died of fracture of the neck and other injuries inflicted by a publican, who was committed for manslaughter; 2 females committed suicide—one, aged 42, by cutting her throat, and the other, aged 40, by drowning.

Eighty-seven deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 6 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum; and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 307, of which 167, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 140 or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 160 were under one year of age, 54 were between one and two, 44 were between two and three, 25 were between three and four, and 24 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 288. Of these, 156, or 54 per cent., were males, and 132, or 46 per cent., were females; 56 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were

between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 21 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

#### Local Government Act 1874.

*Part XI.—Regulation of Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.*

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality unless otherwise ordered by the council.
6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.
7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.
9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.
10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.
11. No motion for and address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.
12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.
13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.
14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.
15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.
18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall leave the chair on such occasions.
20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
21. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.
22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.
23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.
24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.
25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do shall be guilty of an offence.
26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.
27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.
28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.
29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, will be guilty of an offence.
30. The chairman shall in taking the sense of the council put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
31. At every meeting of the council all motions whether original motions or amendments shall be reduced into writing signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately upon their being moved and seconded.
32. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.
35.
