PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 24TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT ENSUING a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Ballaarat.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that the Governor might from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it was also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 49.

A Bye-law for the further regulation of Public Vehicles, Stands, and Fares, made under part 10 of the Local Government Act.

IN pursuance of part 10 of the Local Government Act 1874, the Council of the City of Sandhurst ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1. That no owner or driver of a licensed vehicle shall ply for hire within the City of Sandhurst without having a plate affixed on the step at the back thereof, with the number of the license, the number of passengers the same is allowed to carry, the name of the owner, and the line of road for which the vehicle is licensed legibly painted thereon.

2. Any owner of a licensed vehicle desirous of renewing his license on the first day of January in any year must make application in writing at the Town Clerk's office on or before the previous fifteenth day of December; and any driver of a licensed vehicle desirous of renewing his driver's license must make application in writing at the Town Clerk's office on or before the fifteenth day of May in each and every year.

3. No driver shall smoke any pipe or cigar while driving or attending upon any licensed carriage, nor shall any passenger smoke any pipe or cigar in or on any licensed carriage if any other passenger objects thereto.

4. No person shall be licensed to drive a licensed vehicle under the age of sixteen years.

5. No driver of the first or other vehicle on any rank shall refuse or neglect to take his stand in his proper turn on the appointed corner and drive in due course to his destination.

6. The owner or driver of every licensed passenger vehicle shall have painted, so as to be distinct and legible, on the front glass of each of the lamps belonging to such vehicle, the number of the license of such vehicle, in figures one inch in length, and shall keep the same so painted during the whole time that such vehicle shall ply for hire or be used for the conveyance of passengers, and such lamps shall be used only for and with the vehicle the number of the license of which shall be so painted on them.

7. Every owner, or driver, or attendant on any licensed vehicle shall, while the same shall either be in the rank or on the corner stand, remain with it either in the centre of the road when on the rank, or in full command of it when on the corner stand.

8. No driver of any licensed vehicle in any public street shall feed any horse attached thereto save by means and out of a nose-bag containing the forage and attached to the head of such horse, or shall remove the blinkers or bit of such horse; and shall keep any such horse, if vicious, properly muzzled.

9. The owner of every waggonette enclosed with curtains, licensed to carry passengers, shall cause to be placed inside thereof a lamp in such a position and manner as shall be directed by the said council, and the driver of such vehicle shall keep the same lamp properly lighted whenever such vehicle shall be used to ply for hire or carry passengers at any time after sunset and before sunrise.

10. Interpretation.—The words "Town Clerk" where used in this bye-law shall be understood to mean the Town Clerk of the City of Sandhurst. The word "owner" shall signify any person possessed of a beneficial interest in any public vehicle; and the word "driver" shall mean any person driving or attendant upon any public vehicle.

11. For every offence against any provision of this bye-law the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary way before any justice or justices of the peace.

CITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 50.

A Bye-law of the City of Sandhurst, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 50, for regulating the establishment of stands for wood-carters, and fixing a license fee for the same.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst order as follows:—

That the part of section 3, Bye-law No. 11 of the Municipality of Sandhurst, fixing a market for the sale of firewood, and that part of Bye-law No. 19 of the Municipality of Sandhurst establishing a penalty for the sale of firewood in any place except that named in Bye-law 11, be and the same are hereby repealed.

That the stands for wood-carts be in Market square, between Bull street and Mundy street, and in Wattle square, and any other places that may be hereafter fixed by regulation of the city.

That the wood-carters shall take up their position on such appointed stands as the city inspector may direct.

All wood-carters plying to sell wood to the public shall register their names and addresses at the Town Hall, and obtain a license, for which they shall pay the sum of One shilling per annum.
