NOTE.—The births in 1875 numbered 26,767, or about the same as in 1874. The deaths numbered 15,157, or nearly 3,000 more than in 1874, or than in any other year since the first settlement of the colony. The increase by excess of births over deaths was 11,610, as against 14,578 in 1874. The arrivals in 1875 were 32,744, or a larger number than in any year since 1869; the departures were 29,342, or a larger number than in any year since 1863. The excess of arrivals over departures was 3,402, as against 3,367 in 1874. The total increase of population was 15,012, as shown in the table. This increase was less than that in any year except 1867. The following are the figures :—

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerri run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burebetti run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Lintithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lako Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carngham, Nuntinghool, Banskaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerri, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

KILMORE CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Muddy Creek; thence up the Muddy Creek to the north-west corner of the Killingworth run; thence south by the west and south-west boundary of that run to the north-east corner of Murrindindi East run; thence south by the east boundary of that run and Muddy Creek or Lambourne run to the source of the Muddy Creek in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the Glenvale run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run to the aforesaid range; thence again by that range to the source of the Campaspe River; thence down that river to the Langworn run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Coliban River; thence down that river to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the Axdale East run; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence again by that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; again down that river to the Wharparrella run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the River Murray; and thence up that river to the commencing point. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose, to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that the Governor might from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provision of the said Act; and it was further enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Common hereinafter named by adding thereto the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:-

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone,

according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on burial of any poor person in such cemetery on order of a justice, or on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment will be received by the sexton or by any of the trustees.

6. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

7. A form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable, and entered in the interment-book in the same form.

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two o'clock to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked and cemented closely, or covered by a slab of stone or iron.

12. A plan of every monument, and a copy of every inscription to be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

13. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a model to be seen on application.

14. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

SHIRES OF WODONGA AND YACKANDANDAH.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, twenty-eighth day of February 1876.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Yackandandah) each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Wodonga: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act and no counter-petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Wodonga, and defining the boundaries of the ridings of the Shire of Yackandandah in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WODONGA.

Commencing on the Murray River at the western boundary of the parish of Belvoir West; thence south by the said western boundary to the range forming the northern watershed of the Cookinburra Creek; thence easterly by the said range and the range forming its eastern watershed and the eastern watershed of the Indigo Creek to the source of the Middle Creek; thence north-easterly by the centre of the Middle Creek to the Kiewa River; thence south-easterly by the Kiewa River to the northern boundary of the parish of Bethang; thence east by the southern boundary of the parish of Bonegilla to the Mitta Mitta River, and by the Mitta Mitta and the Murray rivers to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

YACKANDANDAH RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the range forming the eastern watershed of the Indigo Creek, due west of the junction of Yackandandah Creek with the Kiewa River; thence by the summit of that range south-easterly to the source of the Middle Creek; thence by the Middle Creek north-easterly to its junction with the Kiewa River; thence by the Kiewa River south-easterly to its junction with the Yackandandah Creek; thence by a straight line southerly to the summit of the Murrumurrangbong Range; thence by that range and the ranges forming the western watershed of the Kiewa River to the southern boundary of the shire; thence by the southern and western boundaries of the shire to the Yackandandah Gap; thence westerly to Mount Pilot; thence north to a point due west of the commencing point east to that point.

KIEWA RIDING.—Commencing at the Kiewa River where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the parish of Bethang; thence south-easterly by the Kiewa River to its junction with the Yackandandah Creek; thence by a direct line southerly to the summit of the Murrumurrangbong Range; thence by the Murrumurrangbong Range and the ranges forming the western watershed of the Kiewa River to the source of that river; thence northerly by the ranges forming the eastern watershed of the Kiewa River and the Sandy Creek and a direct line north-westerly to the junction of the Sandy Creek and the Mitta Mitta River; thence by the Mitta Mitta River to the southern boundary of the parish of Bonegilla; thence westerly between the parishes of Bethang and Bonegilla to the commencing point on the Kiewa River.

WODONGA RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Indigo Creek with the Murray River; thence easterly up the Murray River to the western boundary of the parish of Belvoir West; thence south by the said western boundary to the ranges forming the northern watershed of the Cookinburra Creek; thence easterly by the said range, and southerly by the range forming its eastern watershed and the eastern watershed of the Indigo Creek to a point west of the junction of the Yackandandah Creek and the Kiewa River; thence west to a point north of Mount Pilot; thence north to the Indigo Creek, and by the Indigo Creek north-westerly to the point of commencement.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby further order that the Council of the Shire of Wodonga hereby constituted shall consist of six members, and that such municipal district shall not be subdivided under this order.

And the Honorable Joseph Jones, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 506, § 19, 38, & 49) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Echuca therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Echuca the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Huntly; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Echuca as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Huntly now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF ECHUCA.—Commencing on the Campaspe River at its junction with a road north of allotment 20, parish of Diggora; thence north-westerly by the centre of that road to the centre of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway; thence north-easterly by the Melbourne and Murray River Railway to its junction with a road in the parish of Diggora north of allotment 89; thence by that road westerly to the western boundary of the parish of Warragamba at the north-west angle of allotment 68 in the said parish; thence south by the western boundary of allotment 68 to its south-west angle; thence north-westerly by the centre of the road forming the south-west boundary of allotments 59 and 58 in the parish of Kamarooka to the north-west angle of allotment 58; thence south-westerly and west by the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of allotments 61, 33, 24, 21, and 20 in the last-named parish to a point bearing magnetic north from a point in the road forming the eastern boundary of portions 125, 124, and 123 in the parish of Kamarooka, distant one hundred and seventy chains from the south-east angle of portion 125 in the parish of Kamarooka; thence by a line bearing magnetic north to Mount Hope Creek, and by that creek to its junction with the margin of Kow Swamp, and by the eastern margin of Kow Swamp to its junction with a creek which it bears from the said junction with Mount Hope Creek about twenty-nine degrees; thence easterly by the creek last reached to its junction with a creek running by Nanilla and Rowan's seventeen mile hut; thence north-westerly by the last creek to join a creek leading easterly to the Murray River, called on old maps Yaluk Creek (the distance between the last four points of junction would be, if in straight lines, about 3, 5, and 3 miles respectively); thence by the River Murray and the boundaries of Peechelba, Saint James, Yabba Yabba, Katandra and Tallygaroopma runs, including those runs, and by the Goulburn River to its junction with the western boundary of Ardpatrick run; thence by a line to the south-east angle of Rochester village reserve, and by the south boundary of that reserve and by the Campaspe River to the starting point.

THE SHIRE OF HUNTLY.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence east four hundred and ninety chains to the west boundary of the parish of Axedale; thence north one hundred and six chains to the north-west angle of allotment 10, section 11, parish of Axedale; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Axedale to the River Campaspe; thence following the River Campaspe bearing northerly to the north-eastern boundary of portion 20, parish of Diggora; thence by the northern boundary of said portion 20 and a direct line to the western boundary of the Railway Reserve; thence north-easterly by the said boundary of reserve to the north-east angle of portion 89, parish of Diggora; thence by the line bounding on the north portions in said parish of Diggora from No. 89 to No. 173, and from No. 91 to No. 68 in the parish of Warragamba, to the north-west angle of said portion No. 68; thence south by its west boundary to its south-west angle; thence by the south-west boundaries of portions 59 and 58, parish of Kamarooka, to the north-west angle of portion 58; thence south-westerly and west by the roads forming the north boundary of portions 61, 33, 24, 21, and 20 in the last-named parish to a point bearing magnetic north from a point on the road forming the east boundary of portion 125, 124, and 123, parish of Kamarooka, distant one hundred and seventy chains north of the south-east angle of portion 125, parish of Kamarooka; thence magnetic south to the east described point; thence by that road south (true) to the said south-east angle; thence by a line south to the south-west angle of allotment 12,

Tenders.

IRON CASTINGS.

TENDERS will be received until Ten a.m. on Tuesday the 28th March 1876, from persons willing to furnish Iron Castings, in such quantities as may be ordered for the Government Railways from 1st July 1876 until the 30th of June 1877.

Forms of tender, schedules of the articles required, and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Railway Storekeeper, Williamstown.

Tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tenders for Iron Castings," and deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury; or (if sent by post) they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days of unsuccessful tenders. Such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required in the amount of £100 for due fulfilment of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenderers must fill in opposite to each particular item in the schedule the price at which he undertakes to execute the work, according to the specification and conditions.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

SPECIFICATIONS.

The castings are required for locomotive engine work, carriage work, &c.

Whenever specially ordered the castings shall be run from the very best "cold-blast iron," and of such particular brand, quality, and mixture as may be described in the order; or of such other substituted mixture as may be approved or directed by the General Overseer of Locomotives, so as to produce a hard, close, soft, or other description of metal.

The castings are to be clean, sharp, free from surface scale, shell, cold shuts, blow holes, honeycomb, cinder, or any other imperfections, and are to be sound in every respect and thoroughly close in grain. When specially ordered the castings are to be run with heads or runners of such weight as may be requested, and no extra charge shall be made or allowed for same, and the contractor will be required to remove the head or runner from the casting where possible, and charge the casting at the net weight only, trimmed and cleaned. In cases where it is necessary to cut off the head in a lathe or machine, such head will be cut off by the Government, and returned to the Melbourne Station, there to be delivered to the contractor free of cost or carriage.

Whenever ordered, the castings are to be moulded in loam without a pattern, and loam price will be paid according to schedule, but no extra charge will be allowed for patterns, strickles, or loam boards. The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction; and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Government will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Melbourne Station free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing, and no cost for carriage from Spencer-street Station to the contractor's place of business will be allowed. Any pattern lost by the contractor must be replaced by him.

Whenever only one or two castings are required, and they can be moulded from the broken originals, the contractor will be bound to mould from such patterns without requiring the Government to supply a wooden or other pattern for same, and no extra price will be allowed.

All pipes and bends must be moulded in loam whenever required, and a loam pattern made. A loam pattern must be struck up for any casting when a pattern cannot be supplied, and when only one casting or so is required, and when of that simple form that it can be made from a loam pattern; and no extra rate or charge will be allowed for the loam pattern beyond the loam price stated in schedule. The Government will supply all necessary striking boards, but no plates or cramps.

All patterns, loam boards, &c., supplied by the Government must be returned by the contractor in good order to the Government with the castings, and delivered to the Railway Stores, at Williamstown, and no allowance will be made for return carriage.

CONDITIONS.

1. All orders for supplies under these contracts must issue from the Secretary of Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise ordered by the Secretary.

2. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

3. Notwithstanding the delivery of any castings into the store and a receipt having been given for them, should such castings turn out unsound, not in accordance with pattern or instructions, or in any way whatever defective, or of different quality of iron to that ordered, they must be taken away from the Railway Store at Williamstown at the expense of the contractor, and other castings must be supplied in lieu thereof, without delay and without additional charge.

4. The contractor must furnish with each delivery detailed invoices or bills of parcels, in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order of the goods, otherwise they will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time.

5. The contractor will prepare his own account, on the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

6. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer requiring the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the Commissioner of Railways; and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere; and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

9. Irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and it will be in the power of the Government, upon repetition of such irregularities, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Should the contractor, in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief or the General Overseer of Locomotives, fail to furnish work in accordance with the specification, then, in seven days after due notice to that effect shall have been given in writing, the Secretary for Railways shall have full power to re-advertise and re-let this contract to any other person the Government shall think fit; and at the expiration of seven days after such notice shall have been given to the contractor, this contract shall become null and void.

11. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving a notice in writing of full three calendar months to the opposite party; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the manufacture by the Victorian Railway Department, or the importation of castings of the same kind for the use of the Department of Victorian Railways, or by any contracts made by the Agent-General for Victoria for such castings, or by any such castings being made at any Government establishment.

2. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief, the Traffic Manager, and the General Overseer of Locomotives. The goods will be subject to the examination and test of an inspecting officer appointed by any of the above. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from the contractor from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than the orders which have been issued during the year; nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. 3. 6. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

7. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within twenty-four hours after notice has been given of such rejection, and, if not so removed, the Railway Storekeeper is hereby empowered to send same to Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the branch requiring the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Commissioner of Railways, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such censure, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the manufacture by the Victorian Railway Department, or importation of any of the articles for the use of the department of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal or other Government establishments.

14. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will be absolutely forfeited, and the contractor disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

15. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

THE Council of the Borough of Malmesbury doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate, from the date hereof, upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district of the borough, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:

1. On every house or tenement, of the annual value of £20 and under, the annual sum of Ten per cent. on such valuation.
2. On every house or tenement, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £25, the annual sum of Two pounds.
3. On every house or tenement, above the annual value of £25, and not exceeding £40, the annual sum of Two pounds ten shillings.
4. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £40, the annual sum of Three pounds.
5. On every hotel of the annual value of £50 and up to £80, the annual sum of Ten per cent. on such valuation.
6. On every hotel above the annual value of £80, and up to £100, the annual sum of Eight pounds.
7. On every hotel above the annual value of £100 the annual sum of Ten pounds.

If any person, not being supplied with water by the council, takes or uses any water from any tank, watercourse, conduit, or pipe belonging to the council of the above borough, he shall for any such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.


