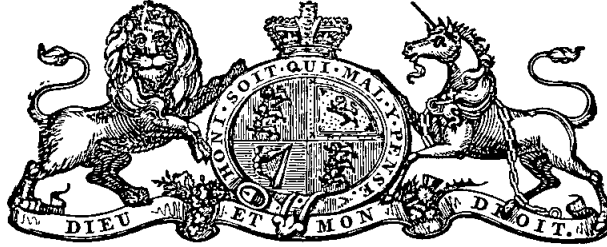

### NOTICE TO TRUSTEES APPOINTED UNDER THE "INSOLVENCY STATUTE 1871."

THE special attention of Trustees appointed under the 55th section of the Insolvency Statute of 1871 is directed to section 125, which prescribes that payment shall be made into the Treasury of any dividends which shall have been unclaimed more than six months.

A statement of the sums so paid in must be at the same time forwarded to the Treasury, supported by a statutory declaration as to its correctness.

### NOTICE TO OWNERS DESIRING TO INTRODUCE SHEEP, CATTLE, OR PIGS INTO VICTORIA BY SEA.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after 1st April next cattle, sheep, or pigs arriving in any of the ports of the colony of Victoria will not be allowed to land unless they are accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the owner, agent, or person in charge, setting out the colony in which the animals sought to be introduced were bred, together with their brands, if any, which declaration will require to be certified as correct, as far as known, by an inspector of stock in the colony from which they have been shipped.

### VOTE FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the following Regulations in connection with the vote of £6,000 for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c., viz.:-

1. Every city, town, borough, or shire council, committee of management, or other body having control of any public park or garden, such park or garden being beyond the limits of the City of Melbourne, shall furnish to the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, on or before the 3rd April 1876, a statement in the form hereto marked A, which statement (and vouchers if called for) must be verified by statutory declaration, in the form hereto marked B, by the town clerk of a city, town, or borough, the secretary of a shire, the clerk of a road board, or by such trustee or member of a committee of management who may have acted as treasurer.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may cause to be paid to the proper officer of each city, town, borough, or shire council, or other body, a sum equal to one-half of the difference between the expenditure incurred and the Government subsidy received; provided that, if the claims are in excess of the vote, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

3. In cases where no subsidy was received in 1875, claims must be accompanied by a statement showing in detail how the subsidy last received has been applied.

### BEET-ROOT SUGAR, FLAX, AND SILK, AND A MECHANICAL REAPER AND BINDER, ETC.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the following Regulations in connection with the vote of £5,000, 1875-6 (Div. 56, No. 2):—

#### BEET-ROOT SUGAR.

1. Any person or company desirous of competing for the sum of Two thousand pounds, set apart for the encouragement of the manufacture of Sugar from Beet-root grown within Victoria, shall intimate his or their intention in writing to the Minister of Agriculture.
2. Two clear days' notice in writing, at least, shall be given to the Minister of Agriculture of the intention to commence operations for the season in any competing factory.
3. An accurate record shall be kept in every such factory of—
  - a. The quantity of roots supplied;
  - b. The dates upon which the same were supplied;
  - c. The price paid per ton for the same;
  - d. The name and address of the person by whom the same were grown;
  - e. The quantity worked up;
  - f. The dates between which the same were worked up;
  - g. The purposes to which the same were applied;

and a copy of such record shall be furnished to the Minister of Agriculture on every fourteenth day from the date upon which the first supply of the season's roots was made, and shall continue to be so furnished until the whole of the roots shall have been converted into sugar, or otherwise disposed of.

4. Any officer appointed by the Minister of Agriculture to inspect beet-root sugar factories shall have power to visit such factories at any time during the hours of work, to inspect any portion or portions thereof, and to remove, in sufficient quantity for the purposes of analysis, samples of beet-root, or any product obtained during the several stages of the process of manufacture.

5. The manager of any competing factory shall, when required in writing so to do, furnish to the Minister of Agriculture a return showing the number of persons employed in the factory under his supervision, the average quantity of marketable sugar obtained from one ton of beet-root, and such further information as may be required from time to time.

6. The sugar as it is manufactured, unless required for immediate sale, shall be deposited in a room on the premises, and the key of such room shall be kept by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, and no sugar removed from the factory shall be included in any claim made on the vote, unless the same shall be removed in the presence of an officer of the Department of Agriculture.

7. When it is desired to dispose of a part or of the whole of the manufactured sugar, or to remove a part or the whole of the same from the factory, notice shall be given in writing to the Minister of Agriculture, and such notice shall specify the hour at which it is desired to remove the sugar for sale or otherwise.

8. When sugar shall have been removed from a competing factory, it shall not be re-admitted to the factory on any condition whatsoever, nor shall sugar of any description, excepting that manufactured on the premises from beet-root, be allowed within the factory.

9. Five hundred pounds will be paid to any person or company on production of a certificate from the inspecting officer that he or they have manufactured locally from one manufactory, between the dates 1st July 1875 and 30th June 1876, and in accordance with these regulations, a quantity of not less than 50 tons of sugar from beet-root grown within Victoria, and a sum of £10 per ton will be paid for every one ton manufactured in excess of 50 tons; but the whole sum to be paid away shall not exceed Two thousand pounds.

#### ESTABLISHMENT OF A FLAX-MILL.

1. Two hundred pounds will be paid to any person or company who may produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Government that he or they have manufactured locally, from one manufactory, and between the dates of the 1st July 1875 and the 30th June 1876, a quantity of not less than 20 tons of marketable fibre from flax grown within Victoria, and a sum of £10 per ton will be paid for every one ton manufactured in excess of 20 tons; provided the whole sum to be paid away do not exceed Five hundred pounds.

#### INVENTION OF FLAX HARVESTING MACHINERY.

1. One hundred and fifty pounds will be offered in premiums for the invention and manufacture of Flax Harvesting Machinery, subject to the following conditions:—

a. That an equal sum be offered jointly by the Adelaide Chamber of Manufactures and the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of South Australia, with the concurrence of the South Australian Government.

b. That such joint premium shall be open for competition in South Australia and Victoria.

c. That trials of the competing machines shall be held in either colony, unless the judges shall report that it is unnecessary to hold a second trial.

2. No Victorian machine will be forwarded for competition that has not been first submitted for trial and approved by judges appointed by the Minister of Agriculture.

3. The expenses incurred by persons appointed by the Minister of Agriculture to act as judges of Flax Harvesting Machinery, in South Australia and Victoria, together with the cost of the carriage of the competing machines, and other expenses connected with the trials or incidental thereto, shall be charged upon the vote.

4. The total expenditure in connection with the Intercolonial Competition of Flax Harvesting Machinery shall not exceed Three hundred pounds.

#### CULTIVATION OF MULBERRY TREES AND PRODUCTION OF SILK.

1. Three hundred pounds will be offered in premiums for the encouragement of the cultivation of Mulberry Trees and the production of Silk, subject to conditions as under.

2. To any person or company who, in the opinion of judges to be appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, may obtain the most satisfactory results from areas, as hereunder specified, planted with Mulberry Trees of not less than three years' growth, the subjoined premiums, viz.:—

3. Any person or company desirous of competing for the above-mentioned premiums must intimate their intention, in writing, to the Minister of Agriculture, specifying the premium or premiums for which it is their intention to compete.

4. Competitors shall afford the judges access at all reasonable times to their Mulberry plantations and buildings used in the rearing of the worms, and shall furnish them with such information as they may require from time to time.

5. Persons will not be permitted to compete for two or more separate premiums with one and the same area of Mulberry Trees.

6. No prize will be awarded where it cannot be shown, to the satisfaction of the judges, that operations are conducted with regard both to profit and the permanent establishment of the industry.

7. The expenses incurred by persons appointed by the Minister of Agriculture to inspect and report on Mulberry plantations shall be made a charge on the vote.

8. The total expenditure in connection with the cultivation of the Mulberry and the production of Silk shall not exceed Four hundred and fifty pounds.

#### INVENTION AND MANUFACTURE OF A MECHANICAL REAPER AND BINDER.

1. One thousand pounds will be paid to any person or company who may produce a machine that, in the opinion of judges to be appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, is capable of satisfactorily performing the operations of Reaping and Binding.

2. It is imperative that no greater number of persons shall be employed to work a combined Reaper and Binder than are required to work an ordinary reaper, viz., two men.

3. The bands shall be made of the material that is being cut by the machine, but the use of cord or wire is not prohibited.

4. The machine must combine simplicity of construction and lightness of draught with strength and durability.

5. Special attention must be paid to economy. The judges will be instructed to disqualify a machine that will not cut and bind a crop for a less cost, per acre, than that for which the same work could be performed by an ordinary reaper with the aid of manual labor for binding.

6. One or more trials, as circumstances may demand, will be held at times and in localities to be hereafter fixed, notice of which will be duly advertised.

7. Expenses connected with the trials and judges' expenses shall be charged on the vote.

8. The total expenditure in connection with the invention of Reaping and Binding Machinery shall not exceed Twelve hundred pounds.

#### EXPERIMENTAL CULTIVATION OF CEREALS AND OTHER FARM CROPS.

1. The balance (Five hundred and fifty pounds) shall be available for expenses connected with the experimental cultivation, in various districts, of cereals, and other farm crops.

**GRANT TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, 1875-6.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the following Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Six thousand five hundred pounds (£6,500) granted by Parliament to the Agricultural Societies, 1875-6 (Div. 56, No. 1), viz.:-

1. Each society shall furnish to the Minister of Agriculture, on or before the 3rd April 1876, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked D.

2. Fourteen days after the above-mentioned date the distribution of the vote shall be made, and a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to), will be allotted to each society and be made payable to the treasurer thereof on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it lie in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£6,500) a sum not exceeding Six thousand and nineteen pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. Four hundred and eighty-one pounds shall be paid to the Talbot Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its annual spring show, held on the 28th and 29th October 1875 under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society whose expenditure in prizes between 1st January 1875 and the 31st December 1875 amounts in the total to less than £100 shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

*Instructions.*

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1875 and the 31st December 1875, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for two-thirds of the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes, if the members' subscriptions and private donations were not less than two-thirds. If the members' subscriptions and private donations were, however, less than two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid in prizes, the amount of the claim must be made equal to the amount of the members' subscriptions and private donations.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statement appended.

Note.—It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay-office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space should not be filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only. A form of order on the Treasury deputing another person to draw, the amount granted is appended in case it should be wanted.

The births of 715 children, viz., 378 boys and 337 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 635 births were registered, or 80 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in February numbered 521, viz., 281 of males and 240 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 194. The deaths were 74 less than those in January, but exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 104. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 14 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102.9° on the 7th, and the lowest was 43.0° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (66.1°) was nearly a third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (43.3°) took place on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 93.3° to a minimum of 50.0°. The least range (10.4°) was on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 68.8° to a minimum of 58.4°. The mean daily range was 23.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.877 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females. Children under the age of 5 years died in the proportion of 55 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 65 per cent. in February 1875; 54 per cent. in February 1874; 53 per cent. in February 1873; 56 per cent. in February 1872; 65 per cent. in February 1871; 55 per cent. in February 1870; 60 per cent. in February 1869; 57 per cent. in February 1868; 74 per cent. in February 1867; and 58 per cent. in February 1866.

The deaths of fourteen persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz., those of a laborer, aged 75, who died of phthisis; a female, aged 76, of abscess of the shoulder; a contractor, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 77, of paralysis; a contractor, aged 78, of old age; a domestic servant, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 79, of inflammation of the liver; two females, aged 80 and 81 respectively, of apoplexy; two males, both aged 84, of cancer and "vomiting" respectively; a female, aged 84, of senile gangrene of the foot; a female, aged 85, of apoplexy; and a female, aged 88, of old age.

Twenty-nine deaths from external causes were registered during the month. Twenty-three of these were set down as accidental, and six as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 8, a farmer, aged 34, and a carrier, aged 52, were passed over by vehicles; a female, aged 9, was accidentally killed by falling through a skylight; a quarryman, aged 27, died of fracture of the legs, caused by the upsetting of a dray; a sailor, aged 19, died of concussion of the brain, the result of a fall into the hold of a vessel; an engineer, aged 47, died of fracture of the skull, caused by an accident with machinery; a quarryman, aged 43, and a baker, aged 54, died of the results of accidental falls; a boy, aged 12 months, died of scalds; a girl, aged 12 months, was burned to death by her clothes catching fire; a boy, aged 3, a cooper, aged 41, and a female, aged 57, died of poisoning; a female, aged 33, died of poisoning with carbolic acid (supposed to have been accidental); a female, aged 49, died of poisoning with atropine, administered medicinally; three youths, aged 13, 14, and 17 respectively, were accidentally drowned in the River Yarra; a clerk, aged 40, and a mate, of occupation unstated, aged 45, were found drowned; a female infant, aged 3 months, was accidentally suffocated; a male, aged 18, was killed by the bite of a shark whilst bathing in Hobson's Bay. A clerk, aged 42, died of embolism, the result of wounds on the hands, self-inflicted whilst suffering from religious mania; a male, of age and occupation unknown, committed suicide by cutting his throat; a female servant, aged 17, and a cigar-maker, aged 29, drowned themselves in the River Yarra; a bootmaker, aged 40, and a carpenter, aged 45, were found drowned, and are supposed to have committed suicide.

Ninety-one deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 3 in the Lying-in Hospital; 3 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Pentridge Stockade; 1 in the Industrial Schools; 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum; and 1 on board the training ship *Nelson*.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 274, of which 140, or 51 per cent., were of males; and 134, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 187 were under one year of age, 50 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 247. Of these, 141, or 57 per cent., were males, and 106, or 43 per cent., were females; 36 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 11 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 5 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, 7 were upwards of eighty, and of 1 the age was unspecified.

**CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."**

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

**BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT**—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerth run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that, and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries thereof to Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbest Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Linnitigow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenroald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Piery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carnglam, Nuntingbool, Banshaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borambesta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

**GERLONG CLEAN DISTRICT**—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Polah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bambray; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

**GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT**—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in

*Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

#### [CIRCULAR.]

Downing street, 3rd December 1875.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you a copy of a Note which has been received at the Foreign Office from the French Ambassador at this Court, with a translation, showing the steps taken by the French Naval Authorities with the view of frustrating a design which was reported to have been contemplated in Australia for facilitating the escape of convicts from New Caledonia.

I feel assured that your Ministers would readily co-operate with the French Government for the defeat of such a scheme, and I have requested the Earl of Derby to point out to the Marquis d'Harcourt that, if the assistance of the Governments of the Australasian Colonies is wished for, it would be desirable that further particulars, especially with regard to the locality of the apprehended danger, should be supplied.

It will be desirable to publish in the colony under your government the Police Regulations which the French Authorities have considered it necessary to adopt.

#### Marquis d'Harcourt to the Earl of Derby.

[COPY.] London, le 30 Octobre 1875.  
MONSIEUR LE COMTE.—M. le Gouverneur de la Nouvelle Calédonie a été prévenu que des préparatifs étaient faits en Australie en vue d'une entreprise ayant pour objet de faciliter l'évasion des déportés, à l'aide de navires qui se rendraient sur les côtes de notre colonie pénitentiaire. Pour parer à cette éventualité Monsieur le Commandant de Fritzbuër a pris les mesures suivantes.

Lorsqu'un bâtiment se rapprochera de la côte nord-est de l'île des Pins, soit de jour, soit de nuit, la canonnière en station dans la baie d'Uro se portera immédiatement à sa rencontre, et lui fera connaître qu'aux termes des règlements locaux il ne peut avoir de communications avec l'île qu'après en avoir obtenu l'autorisation du commandant territorial jusqu'à l'établissement duquel elle devra le convoier. En cas de refus, la canonnière restera sur les lieux; si le navire mouille et ce ne sera possible que dans les eaux territoriales; elle devra jeter l'ancre entre lui et la côte et surveiller les mouvements.

Elle saisira toutes les embarcations qui tenteraient de communiquer avec la terre, ainsi que celles venant du rivage qui voudraient se rendre à bord, et elle empêchera le bâtiment de lever l'ancre sans avoir été visité. Enfin, si des déportés étaient trouvés à bord, le navire serait frappé d'embargo et l'équipage poursuivi conformément aux lois.

Dans le cas où ces dispositions seraient reconnues insuffisantes, M. le Gouverneur de la Nouvelle Calédonie se réserve d'interdire absolument l'accès de l'île des Pins en dehors du mouillage d'Uro, en vertu des pouvoirs qui lui sont conférés, de telle sorte qu'on puisse éloigner ou saisir tous les bâtiments qui essaieraient d'entrer ou de séjourner dans les eaux territoriales des autres points de la côte.

Je serai reconnaissant à Votre Excellence de vouloir bien porter à la connaissance du département anglais compétent les mesures de police que je viens d'énumérer et que notre Gouvernement est obligé de prendre pour assurer la garde des détenus de la Nouvelle Calédonie.

#### The Marquis d'Harcourt to the Earl of Derby.

[TRANSLATION.] London, 30th October 1875.  
MONSIEUR LE COMTE.—The Governor of New Caledonia has been forewarned that preparations have been made in Australia, in furtherance of a plot of which the object is to facilitate the escape of convicts with the assistance of ships which should repair to the coasts of our penal colony.

To guard against this contingency, the Commandant of Fritzbuër has adopted the following measures:—Should a vessel approach from the north-east coast of the Ile des Pins, whether by day or night, the gun-boat stationed in the bay of Uro will go immediately to meet it, and will intimate to such vessel that, by the terms of the local regulations, it can only have communication with the island after having obtained the consent of the Territorial Commander for doing so, before whom the gun-boat will have to escort such vessel. In case of refusal the gun-boat will remain on the spot; if the vessel anchors (and this will only be practicable in territorial waters), the gun-boat will cast anchor between it and the shore, and watch its movements. She will seize all shore-boats which may endeavour to communicate with the land, as well as those coming from the shore with the intention of coming alongside, and she will prevent such vessel from weighing anchor without having been visited. Lastly, if any convicts are found on board, the vessel shall be laid under embargo, and the captain and crew prosecuted conformably with law.

Should these arrangements be proved to be insufficient, the Governor of New Caledonia reserves to himself the power of interdicting absolutely access to the Ile des Pins outside the

anchorage of Uro, in virtue of the powers which are conferred on him, so as to enable him to send away or seize all such vessels as may endeavour to enter or to remain in the territorial waters of the outer points of the coast.

I shall be grateful to Your Excellency, if you would kindly bring to the knowledge of the proper English department the measures of police which I have just enumerated and which our Government is obliged to take, in order to ensure the custody of the prisoners of New Caledonia.

The following Notice to Mariners, respecting Leading Lights to be established at the entrance to the Port of Dunedin, together with sailing directions for that port, prepared by Captain Thomson, Harbor-master, are published for general information.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after 1st April next two leading lights will be exhibited from two white towers erected on the Sandspit, the site of the present leading beacons at entrance to the Port of Dunedin.

The towers are 360 yards apart, and bear from each other S.S.W. and N.N.E.

From the upper or inner tower a green light will be shown 36 feet above sea level, and from the lower or seaward one a white light 26 feet above sea level; both fixed, with an illuminating arc of 75°, that may be seen from seaward between S. 41° E. and S. 34° W. at a distance of six to seven miles.

A small fixed red light will also be shown on the red-and-white beacon at the Pilot Station (not visible from seaward).

In foggy weather a gong will be sounded on Tairoa Head every fifteen seconds.

All bearings are magnetic.

#### SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR ENTERING THE PORT OF DUNEDIN.

Being off the bar two miles in 16 fathoms water, bring the leading lights in one, which will then bear S.S.W. by compass; steer on this course until the red light on the Pilot Station opens out; then haul up for Harrington Point, passing half-way between it and the Sandspit, continuing a mid-channel course between the buoys on the inner bar, keeping the red on the starboard side, and black on the port, passing the lightship on the starboard hand about 200 feet off.

Having passed the lightship (which is moored in 12 feet at low-water spring tides, and about 14 cables' length S.W. by S. from the first red beacon), the channel upwards to the Dunedin wharves is well defined with buoys and beacons colored as aforementioned.

The depth of water at present in the channel across the outer bar is 18 feet at low-water spring tides, and across the inner bar 17 feet.

The outer anchorage is safe when there is no easting in the wind. Small vessels anchoring in same should keep as near the line of the leading lights as convenient, in 9 fathoms about half a mile from the shore, and large vessels about one and a half miles off in 15 fathoms. Tairoa Head Lighthouse bearing by compass about south. The inner anchorage is between Howlett Point and the first buoy on the inner bar, and is safe in any weather. Vessels anchoring below Harrington Point, the nearer they are to the Sandspit the better; and above same point they should get into the bight a little, abreast of the old native village.

On nearing the port of Dunedin, and the wind northerly, if necessary to wait for daylight or the tide, when it is not safe for a pilot to board, stand off and on, not bringing the light-house to bear to the eastward of south, and thereby benefit by the northerly current to keep to windward.

The pilot boards vessels within a radius of three miles from Tairoa Head, unless the sea on the bar renders it unsafe for the boat, which seldom occurs throughout the year; if unsafe, then he places his boat in mid-channel inside of the bar showing the pilot flag, for which a vessel entering without a pilot must be steered as soon as the red-and-white beacon at the Pilot Station opens out to view. If the wind is strong and northerly the vessel should run in under easy canvas, to enable the pilot to board in safety, as there is not room to round a vessel in the channel.

Vessels of a light draught only can work into the inner anchorage, and when working out on the ebb care must be taken not to stand too close over to Heyward's Point, as it is very deceptive going with the tide and swell which sets in that direction; the swell increases as you near the point, and tends to cause the vessel to miss stays, thereby placing her in a critical position ere she can be brought up, and by club-hauling under-weigh on the opposite tack. The ground is not good for holding, and a dangerous bight to get into.

The lighthouse on Tairoa Head is an excellent day beacon as well as by night: the tower is white, and the lantern dome dark-green; the light is red and fixed, and visible twenty miles in clear weather.

All bearings are magnetic.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE CORNELIA RIDING.**—Bounded by a line beginning at the north-west angle of the shire, on the shore of the eastern passage of Western Port; thence southward and westward by the said shore to the Bass River; up this river to and eastward along the main tramways of Mr. Stewart and Mr. Lee and a line east from the termination thereof to the eastward boundary of the shire; and northward and westward by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

**THE WOOLAMAI RIDING.**—Bounded by a line beginning at the mouth of the Bass River; thence up this river to and eastward along the main tramways of Mr. Stewart and Mr. Lee and a line east from the termination thereof to the eastward boundary of the shire; thence southward and westward around the boundary of the shire to the starting point.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown land as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. 3. 6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 5, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.
