## ROAD IN THE BOROUGH OF AMHERST.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Amherst, has requested that a certain road within the said Borough be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land in the Borough of Amherst reserved or used for the road hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

The road round the Recreation Reserve at Talbot: Commencing at the south-west angle of the reserve in Bulwer street, being a point bearing N. 78° 50' W. eight chains one link from the south-east angle of allotment 4, section 27, township of Talbot; thence by a one-chain road on the west of the reserve by a line bearing N. 11° 10' E. eight chains seventy-nine links; thence on the north of the reserve by a line bearing S. 78° 50' E. twelve chains ninety-nine links; and thence by a road two chains forty-four links wide bearing S. 11° 10' W. four chains eleven links to allotment 1, section 25a, township of Talbot; the same being a point bearing N. 75° 5' W. from the eastern angle of the said allotment.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Heathcote has requested that a certain road within the said borough be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands in the borough of Heathcote reserved or used for the road hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE HEATHCOTE TO RUMYMEDE ROAD.—Commencing at a point on the east boundary of High street, bearing N. 42° 33' W. one hundred and twenty-four links from the west angle of reserve for Market place; thence N. 9° 58' E. six hundred and thirty-three links; thence N. 23° 8' W. five hundred and one links to the southern angle of section 33, parish of Heathcote; thence N. 42° 33' W. six hundred links to the west angle of section 33; thence N. 2° 27' E. five hundred and sixty-six links to the west angle of allotment 6, section 32; thence N. 3° 53' W. three hundred and twenty links to the north angle of allotment 7, section 32; thence N. 42° 33' W. one thousand six hundred and fifty links to the west angle of allotment 6, section 30; thence N. 19° 52' E. two thousand four hundred and forty-nine links; thence N. 21° 33' E. eight hundred and fifteen links; thence N. 7° 29' W. two thousand seven hundred and seventeen links to the boundary between the Borough of Heathcote and Shire of Melvor. The above lines will form the eastern boundary of the road which will be one hundred and fifty links wide.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the shire of Omeo has requested that a certain road within the said shire be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land in the Shire of Omeo reserved or used for the road hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

A road bounded on the south-west by a line beginning on the eastward boundary of the reserve for public buildings in the parish of Coburg, at the west angle of allotment 31; thence N. 53° 52' E. fifteen links; thence N. 315° 3' E. four chains forty-one links to the road on the northward boundary of the reserve; and on the north-east by the westward boundary of allotment 39, being fifty links in width from the public buildings reserve as reduced by the excision of the road.

## THE SHIRES OF DUNDAS AND PORTLAND.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of March 1876.

## PRESENT:

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the Government Gazette and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Dundas and Portland should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Dundas and Portland, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.—Bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of the parish of Pedykpendyke and the county boundary of Dundas; thence south to the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; westward by its boundary to the north-west angle thereof; south by the road to the north-east angle of allotment 3 A of section 1, parish of Gatam Gatam; west by the road to the north-west angle of said parish; thence south to the south-west angle of the parish of Urangara and east to the intersection of the road running between sections 2 and 3, parish of Toolang; south by the said road and to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; west to the north-west angle of the said parish and south by its western boundary to the River Wannan; thence down this river to the north-west angle of the parish of Murndal, in the county of Normanby; south by the west boundary of that parish to the intersection of the road from Greenhills to Coleraine; south-eastward by this road to the south-west angle of the parish of Murndal; east by the north boundary of the parish of Branxholme, and to the north-east angle of section 6; south by the parish boundary to the main road from Branxholme to Hamilton; north-eastward by that road to the intersection of the road at the north boundary of section 12, parish of Audley; east by this road to, and south along, a road from the north-east angle of section 13 of the said parish to the south-west angle of section 4, parish of Byambynee; east by the road on the south of said section to the north-west angle of allotment 2 A of section 6 of the same parish; thence southerly by the road bounding said allotment and the Lyne pre-emptive section on the west to the south-west angle of the said pre-emptive section; thence west by the road on the north of allotments 4 A, 5, and 6 A of section 14 of said parish to the road bounding that section on the west; thence south by this last road to the south-east angle of section 13, parish of Byambynee; westward to the south-west angle of the same section south to the main Louth Swamp; thence by the centre of that swamp and the Weerangourt Creek to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section and the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence south-easterly by that line to the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section 4 of the parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of section 4 and the south-western boundary of the township reserve of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the boundary of the county of Villiers; northward by said boundary to the eastern boundary of the county of Dundas; and by the eastern and northern boundaries of said county to the starting point, excluding the Borough of Hamilton.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND.—Commencing on the sea-coast at the south-east corner of the county of Normanby; thence north by the eastern boundary-line of South Australia to the south-west angle of the township of Lindsay; thence along its south boundary and its continuation east to the River Glenelg, down the River Glenelg to its junction with the Stokes River, up the Stokes River to the intersection of the western margin of the parish of Grassdale; north by this and the west side of the parish of Tabara to the junction of the road on the southern boundary of section 12 of last-named parish; easterly and north-easterly by said road along it and the south-eastern boundaries of sections 12, 10, and 9, parish of Tabara, to the main road from Green Hills to Harrow; northerly by said main road to the River Wannan; up that river to the north-west angle of the parish of Murndal; southward and eastward around that parish and part of the north and east sides of the parish of Branxholme to the main road from Branxholme to Hamilton; north-easterly by that road to the intersection of the road at the north boundary of section 12, parish of Audley; east by this road to and south along a road from the north-east angle of section 13 of the

said parish to the south-west angle of section 4, parish of Byambynee; east by the road on the south of said section to the north-west angle of allotment 2a of section 6 of the same parish; thence southerly by the road bounding said allotment and the Lyne pre-emptive section on the west to the south-west angle of the said pre-emptive section; thence west by the road on the north of allotments 4a, 5, and 6a of section 14 of said parish to the road bounding that section on the west; thence south by this last road to the south-east angle of section 13, parish of Byambynee, westward to the south-west angle of the same section, south to the centre of the main Louth Swamp; thence westerly by the centre of that swamp to the centre of the Lake Condah Swamp; southerly by the centre of the latter swamp and of Lake Condah to the south-east angle of said lake; thence by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 23 of the parish of Dunmore; thence south by the road bounding said allotment on the east to the intersection of the road bounding it on the south; thence west by that road to the north-west angle of portion 21, parish of Dunmore; thence south by the road bounding the last-named allotment on the west to the intersection of a road forming the north boundary of portion 16 in the parish of Tyrendarra; thence east by that road to the intersection of a road forming the west boundary of portions 17 and 33 of the last-named parish; thence south by that road to the sea-coast; thence westerly along the sea-shore to starting point, excluding the borough of Portland.

Whenever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

And the Honorable Joseph Jones, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### THE SHIRE OF BULLEEN SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of March 1876.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Bulleen has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Bulleen into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE TEMPLESTOWE RIDING.**—Bounded by a line beginning at the Koonung Koonung Creek immediately above the Doncaster bridge; thence eastward and northward to and along part of the Survey road, along Bogies, the Heidelberg, and part of Fergusson's road; passing allotments 1, 9, and 10 in the subdivision of the Carlton estate, parish of Bulleen, to the south-west angle of allotment 23; east along its south side, and thence to the Cemetery road; northward and eastward along the Cemetery, Chivers', and Anderson's Creek roads to the south side of section xvi., parish of Bulleen; west and north by part of Murnan's and by Speir's road to the River Yarra Yarra; and down this river to and up the Koonung Koonung Creek to the starting point.

**THE DONCASTER RIDING.**—Bounded by a line being the eastward side of the Templestowe riding, between Koonung Koonung Creek and the Yarra Yarra River; thence up this river to opposite the north-east angle of section xvi., parish of Bulleen; south to and along the Anderson's Creek road to and along Stinton's road to the Mullum Mullum Creek; up this creek to the south-east angle of section 26, parish of Warrandyte; and westward along the shire boundary to the starting point at the Koonung Koonung Creek.

**THE WARRANDYTE RIDING.**—Bounded by a line being the westward side of the Doncaster riding between the south-east angle of section xxvi., parish of Warrandyte, and the River Yarra Yarra at the north-east angle of section xvi., parish of Bulleen; thence eastward and southward by the shire boundary to the starting point at the Mullum Mullum Creek.

#### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the Carriage of Gunpowder, Blasting Powder, Gun Cotton, Dynamite, Giant Powder, Lithofracteur, and all other dangerous and explosive compounds used for firing or blasting purposes.

##### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF GUNPOWDER OR OTHER DANGEROUS AND EXPLOSIVE COMPOUNDS.

1. Gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds will not be received for carriage by railway unless packed in kegs or barrels closely bound or hooped without any iron about them, of quarter, half-quarter, or whole barrel sizes, the staves to be of half-inch minimum thickness; or in canisters made of tin, copper, zinc, or other suitable metal; or in cardboard boxes, strong and impervious to leakage, enclosed in wooden cases of half-inch thickness at the sides and one inch thickness at the ends; or in metallic cylinders of pattern similar in construction and security to those used by the Imperial Government for the conveyance of small quantities of powder by railway; or in packages made otherwise so strong and secure that no part of the contents can become scattered in the handling or removal thereof.

2. The contents of each keg or package must be specified on the outside thereof in letters not less than one inch in length; and the package must be fully and plainly addressed. A written or printed label must also be affixed describing how the contents are packed.

3. Consignments will be carried by powder van only, and, if practicable, in the same van throughout, and they will not be received at Footscray or any railway station save on certain days.

4. The days appointed for receiving gunpowder and other dangerous and explosive compounds at railway stations will be subject from time to time to such alterations as the current time-table may render necessary, and may be ascertained on application to the various station masters.

5. A powder van will be run from any station by the first available goods train, subject to twenty-four hours' notice, and provided that the railway freight of the consignment amounts to or exceeds £10.

6. Consignments from different consignors, or from one consignor to different consignees, though all to care of one carrier will be charged for separately.

7. In the event of senders neglecting to mark each package according to these regulations, the board may decline to carry the same, and direct the removal and storage of the packages at the cost of the owner.

8. Consignors at any railway station may ascertain, by enquiry of the station master, at about what time their consignments will be despatched, and if they neglect to make such

enquiry, or to advise the consignee, the board will not be liable for any loss or damage arising from such omission.

9. The board will not guarantee to despatch gunpowder and other dangerous and explosive compounds at any particular time, nor by any particular train, nor will it allow consignments, whether carried or to be carried, to remain on the railway premises longer than is absolutely necessary. And if a package carried by railway be not accepted and removed by the consignee it will be immediately sent to the nearest powder magazine at the owner's risk and expense, or returned to the sender, who will be required to remove it at once from the premises, and to pay the whole charges incurred for carriage, back carriage, and demurrage.

10. Any person bringing to a railway station, or leaving thereat, any packages containing gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds not labelled and addressed as aforesaid, or without having given written notice thereof to the porter or other servant of the board by delivery therewith of a consignment note of the said packages, filled up and signed according to the form and effect hereinafter mentioned, shall be liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds.

11. The board may at any time during the carriage of such goods, or while they are on the premises of the board, detain and stop the further handling and delivery of packages which appear defective. And the board may remove, repair, repack, and store such packages at the cost and risk of the owner.

12. Consignments will be carried at fourth-class rates. Minimum 2 cwt., provided the rate casts out Five shillings; but in no case shall the charge be less than Five shillings, for each consignment.

13. The duties of common carriers in respect of goods carried under this agreement are not undertaken by the board; nor is the board to be subject to any risk of loading, stowage, or unloading; nor is it to be answerable for loss or damage actual or consequential; nor for discrepancy in the delivery as to either quantity, number, or weight; nor for the condition of articles so carried; nor for any consequences arising from overcarriage, detention, or delay in or in relation to the carriage or delivery of them.

14. No servant of the board is authorized to receive or to undertake the carriage of gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds, or to give any receipt or acknowledgment for such goods, unless the sender or person bringing them to a railway station has required from the department and signed a special consignment note, setting forth, in form as follows, that such goods are carried solely upon the conditions hereinbefore mentioned, which are printed on the back thereof:—

CROWN LANDS DEPARTMENT—SURVEY BRANCH.  
SURVEYORS AND DRAFTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received from candidates to fill the position of Pupil Draftsmen and Surveyors, in the Crown Lands Department, up to the 10th proximo.

Applications must be accompanied with certificates in accordance with the subjoined regulations.

The candidate will be required to produce a reliable medical certificate of sound constitution; nor will he be admitted if affected with any physical infirmity which may in any way interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties he may be called on to perform.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or producing such a certificate of competency in such subjects as shall satisfy this department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass six months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass one year in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will have first to pass a probationary period of three months in the offices of the Lands and Survey Department, after which period, if his progress is considered satisfactory, he will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for one year and nine months, when he will be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field-book, plan drawing, including feature delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £78 per annum during the period of six months passed in the offices of the department, and at the rate of £91 during the eighteen months passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid £52 during the year passed in the offices of the department, £65 for the first year in the field, and £91 during the last year in the field.

3rd. Applicants of the third class will not be remunerated for the first three months of probation, but during the remainder of the period spent in the offices (one year and nine months) will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum. The salary during the first year in the field will be £65, during the second £91. In the case of an applicant in this class passing the specified examination at the end of the first year, he will be paid during the first and second years in the field at the rate of £65 per annum, and for the third year in the field £91.

To obtain certificate of competency as a qualified surveyor it will be required of the candidate, after the end of the term spent in the field, that he pass two months in the Melbourne Observatory to acquire a knowledge of such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary in the duties he would be called on to perform as a departmental surveyor. He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation, from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, subdivision section line, topographical features, with areas and dimensions of subdivisions, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant of the third class would have to pass the first two years as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation, by logarithms, including areas and reductions of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction, including feature delineation.

**CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."**

**I**N pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

**BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.**—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerri run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Lanzi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepile, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woorook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Lintlithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Piery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carngam, Nuntinghool, Bانشaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerri, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.
