## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Bet Bet Farmers' Common No. 3, which was described in Proclamations bearing date respectively the third day of June 1861 and the sixteenth day of November 1868, by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Bet Bet Creek where the south boundary of the existing common abuts thereon; bounded thence by that common bearing east to the south-east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south to the Carrisbrook Farmers' Common; thence by that common bearing west and southerly to the Maryborough Goldfield Common; thence by that common bearing west to the eastern boundary of the parish of Warrack; and thence by that boundary to the Bet Bet Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the point of commencement. Area, 2500 acres, more or less.—(75 S. 5086.)

## SURVEYORS AND DRAFTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received from candidates to fill the position of Pupil Draftsmen and Surveyors, in the Crown Lands Department, up to the 10th proximo.

Applications must be accompanied with certificates in accordance with the subjoined regulations.

The candidate will be required to produce a reliable medical certificate of sound constitution; nor will he be admitted if affected with any physical infirmity which may in any way interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties he may be called on to perform.

## QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 28 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including

the subjects above named; or producing such a certificate of competency in such subjects as shall satisfy this department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

#### PERIOD OF SERVICE.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass six months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass one year in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will have first to pass a probationary period of three months in the offices of the Lands and Survey Department, after which period, if his progress is considered satisfactory, he will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for one year and nine months, when he will be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field-book, plan drawing, including feature delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

#### REMUNERATION.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £78 per annum during the period of six months passed in the offices of the department, and at the rate of £91 during the eighteen months passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid £52 during the year passed in the offices of the department, £65 for the first year in the field, and £91 during the last year in the field.

3rd. Applicants of the third class will not be remunerated

for the first three months of probation, but during the remainder of the period spent in the offices (one year and nine months) will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum. The salary during the first year in the field will be £65, during the second £91. In the case of an applicant in this class passing the specified examination at the end of the first year, he will be paid during the first and second years in the field at the rate of £65 per annum, and for the third year in the field £91.

To obtain certificate of competency as a qualified surveyor it will be required of the candidate, after the end of the term spent in the field, that he pass two months in the Melbourne Observatory to acquire a knowledge of such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary in the duties he would be called on to perform as a departmental surveyor. He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation, from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, sub-division section line, topographical features, with areas and dimensions of subdivisions, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant of the third class would have to pass the first two years as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation, by logarithms, including areas and reductions of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction, including feature delineation.

# CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

**BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.**—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerri run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Bowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kakal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Birchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepile, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woorook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Lindtgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burrit-burrit, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Enu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carngnam, Nuttingbool, Bantshaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerri, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

**GREYLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Rute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

**GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in

*Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force; And whereas the Council of the shire of North Ovens, has requested that a certain road within the said shire be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved or used for the road hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

Description of one and a half chain road to lead from North Wangaratta to Eldorado, on the north bank of Reid's Creek: Commencing at a point in the centre of the three-chain Wangaratta to Albury road twenty-eight chains eighty-four links north-east of the western angle of allotment 1 of sections 10 A, in the parish of Carrangarrung. The road bears E.  $2^{\circ} 25'$  N. seventy-seven chains seventy-five links; thence bearing E.  $28^{\circ} 30'$  N. sixty-nine chains six links; thence bearing east thirty-six chains ninety-five links; thence bearing E.  $16^{\circ} 06'$  N. sixty-three chains fifty-six links; thence bearing E.  $38^{\circ} 08'$  N. seventy chains ninety-one links; thence bearing E.  $11^{\circ} 00'$  S. sixty-eight chains to a point fifteen chains east of Clear Creek; thence bearing E.  $22^{\circ} 35'$  N. one hundred and four chains to the termination, at a point on the edge of creek bank four chains fifty links east of Holman's culvert, about sixty-five chains south-west of the township of Eldorado.

**W**HEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, & 49) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Kyneton therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Kyneton the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Pyalong; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Kyneton as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Pyalong now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

#### MEDICINES, CHEMICALS, ETC.

**T**ENDERERS will receive until Ten o'clock a.m. on Tuesday the 25th instant from persons willing to furnish Medicines, &c., in such quantities as may be required for the service of the Government (except for Railways and Roads, and Aborigines, and Telegraphs) during twelve calendar months, commencing on the 1st July 1876.

Schedules of articles required, printed forms of tender, and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders must include the whole of the articles mentioned in the schedule, one price being stated for each article.

The prices must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and total amount of tender stated.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Oils, tinctures, decoctions, infusions, and liquid preparations generally must be delivered in oval glass bottles. Fuming and other acids, spirits of ammonia, and deliquescent salts must be delivered in bottles having ground glass stoppers when so ordered.

In cases where special manufactures are mentioned in the schedule the contractor will be bound to supply the goods in the original packages, having thereon the maker's label or other trade-mark, as a guarantee of the genuineness of the goods so supplied.

The value of all packages necessary for transport, whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices demanded; the weights and measures mentioned in the schedule are to be those of the new "British Pharmacopœia."

2. All articles must be of the best quality of their several kinds, and all preparations or compounds are to be those of the new "British Pharmacopœia," unless otherwise specially ordered.

3. All orders for supplies under this contract will emanate from the Chief Medical Officer, or from the departments requiring the supplies, and the articles must be delivered at such place in Melbourne or Williamstown districts as may be stated in the order; and for the purposes of this contract all Government offices within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office will be deemed to be within Melbourne; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown and Hobson's Bay. The goods are to be delivered free of all charges for packing, freight, cartage, &c.

8. If, from any cause, injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the Chief Medical Officer, the Inspector of Stores, or the head of the department ordering the supplies (as the case may be), will have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being understood that they will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.
