WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make an Order to declare any borough having in the year preceding such declaration a gross revenue of not less than Twenty thousand pounds a city: And it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might exercise any of the powers thereinbefore conferred after the presentation of a petition in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act for the exercise thereof, and after the publication of such petition as therein described and the lapse of one month at the least from the day of such publication, and except as thereafter provided not otherwise, but it should be in the discretion of the Governor in Council absolutely to refuse the prayer of any such petition or to grant the whole or any part thereof; and it was also enacted that every petition to declare any borough a city or town should be under the common seal of such borough: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, the Borough of East Collingwood was proclaimed as the Town of East Collingwood: And whereas by another proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of May in the year aforesaid the name of the said town, was altered to that of the Town of Collingwood: And whereas a petition under the common seal of the said town to declare the same a city has been presented by the Mayor and Councillors of such town to the Administrator of the Government in Council, and the substance and prayer of such petition have been duly published in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act: And whereas in the year ending the thirtieth day of September now last passed the gross revenue of the said Town of Collingwood was not less than Twenty thousand pounds: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the said Town of Collingwood a City by the name of the City of Collingwood.

ASYLUM.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as therein-after mentioned; and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be and they shall thereupon become and continue a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Administrator of the Government in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, doth by this present Order declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum, situate at Sandhurst, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Bendigo Benevolent Asylum."

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE
1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and might define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and might revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed should extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the townships in the Shire of Koroore hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

HARROW,
EDENHOPE, and

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerth run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenista run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Linlithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burri-burri, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manouia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carngham, Nuntingbool, Banshaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borambetta, Buntenston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

miles to the south-east corner of the parish of Nerring; thence westerly by the south boundary of that parish and a line to the north-west angle of the township of Marong; thence by the Inglewood and Wedderburn road westerly and north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Catio's run; thence by the eastern and northern boundary of that run to the south-west corner of the Powlett's Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and the Brennanah runs to Coyurah Springs run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run to Spring Hill run; thence by a portion of the western boundary of that run to Yawong Springs run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Strathfillan run, being the point of commencement.

Provided further that the Acheron quarantine run shall form no part of this district.

PANNURE TOWN COMMON.—The Pannure Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of February 1869, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundary of the township of Pannure lying south of the road from Warrumbbool to Geelong and the Mount Emu Creek. Area of extension, about 500 acres.—(75.S.2615.)

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for a Common.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE KAMAROOKA GOLDFIELDS COMMON.

Whereas by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chap. xiii. of the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the managers of the Kamarooka Goldfields Common have adopted and submitted to the Board of Land and Works the following draft regulations for the management of the said common:—

1st. The managers shall elect a chairman and appoint a secretary, treasurer, and herdsman, or any other officer or servant that may be required to carry out the rules of the common.

2nd. The managers shall meet at Sandhurst at two (2) o'clock p.m. on every fourth (4th) Saturday, commencing on the second (2nd) Saturday after the publication of these rules in the *Government Gazette*, two (2) to form a quorum, and may adjourn from time to time as required, and may also hold special meetings whenever the secretary or one (1) of the managers shall convene the same by giving two (2) days' notice to each manager (either personally or by post) of the time and place of such meeting.

3rd. All moneys received (revenue of the common) shall be paid to the treasurer, and by him into a bank as appointed by the managers, and all payments shall be made by cheque signed by two (2) of the managers and countersigned by the secretary.

4th. All persons entitled to depasture cattle must make application to the secretary, overseer, or herdsman, and on payment of the fee hereinafter mentioned, with the name and residence of the applicant, a license will be granted.

5th. Special licenses to dairymen to depasture cattle on the common may be granted on application to the managers and payment of the fees.

6th. Special licenses may be granted to butchers and other persons engaged in the trade of slaughtering to depasture (on such parts of the common only as the managers may think proper) cattle, sheep, and swine, on payment of the fees and subject to the rules of the common.

7th. All cattle, horses, sheep, swine, and goats depasturing on the common must be registered at the office of the managers, or they may be impounded.

8th. Diseased cattle will not be allowed to depasture on the common, nor be driven over, or conducted upon, over, or across the same.

9th. Any holder of a special license having diseased cattle on the common shall forfeit such license unless the diseased

cattle be removed on demand made in writing by the herdsman or any person authorized by the managers.

10th. The carcasses of all cattle, sheep, swine, or goats which may die on the common shall be burned or buried by the owners to the satisfaction of the managers (or whom they may appoint) within twenty-four (24) hours of the discovery of the same, or the powers of the managers will be immediately enforced.

11th. All cattle depastured on the common shall be mustered at any time for the inspection of the managers (or whom they may appoint) within forty-eight (48) hours after notice of such muster shall have been given to the owner or owners thereof.

12th. Bulls and entire horses will not be allowed to depasture on the common, unless the owners thereof are specially licensed for that purpose.

13th. The brand of the common, K.G.C., shall be placed on all cattle depastured thereon either in pitch or tar, or by some other reasonable method, but not by burning.

14th. The fees payable half-yearly will be—

Cattle, per head,	Four (4) shillings per annum.
Horses, "	Six (6) shillings per annum.
Sheep, "	One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per annum.
Goats, "	One shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per annum.
Swine, "	Two (2) shillings per annum.

15th. All special licenses will be granted subject to the rules of the common, and may be revoked at any time by the managers on any infringement thereof by the holders.

16th. The managers of the common (having the supervision of all officers and employees of the same) will allow such salaries, percentages, or other remuneration to such officers or employees as they may from time to time fix and determine, and all reasonable travelling and incidental expenses incurred by the managers and their employees will be paid from the receipts of the common.

17th. That these rules will commence and come into operation six (6) days after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

We, the undersigned managers of the Kamarooka Goldfields Common, have agreed to the foregoing rules for the management of the said common.

THE CLUNES WATER COMMISSIONERS.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100 and not exceeding £200, the annual sum of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200 and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300, the annual sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Warehouses and wholesale stores not being domiciles or used in retail business, the annual sum of Three pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
