Strangers are cautioned not to use the South Channel as long as the North Channel is open, as the Signalman has no command over the South Channel with the semaphore.

BANKS STRAIT.—SUNKEN ROCK.

A rock in the direct track of vessels trading between Melbourne and Hobart Town, or New Zealand, has been discovered by H.M. Surveying Steamer *Victoria*. It lies E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Swan Island lighthouse, and N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the George Rocks, and has only 10 feet over it at low water. The name Salamander Rock has been given to it from the supposition that it was it upon which the s.s. *Salamander* struck, but the rock discovered lies two miles and a quarter to the southward of the position given by the *Salamander*.

Eddystone Point open of George Rocks leads between the Salamander and Eucalyptus rocks two miles west of the former and one mile east of the latter.

"WINES, BEER, AND SPIRITS SALE STATUTE 1864
AMENDMENT ACT."

PURSUANT to clause 14 of the regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the *Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute* 1864 amendment act, it is hereby notified that an application has been received from the Shire Council of Portland for the revocation of the proclamation of the 23rd October 1871 authorizing the issue of £10 publicans' licenses within a certain portion of the Shire of Portland, with the object of having the whole of the Shire, with the exception of the area within three miles of the townships of Branxholme, Digby, Heywood, Hotspur, and Tahara, and the village of Greenhills, postally known as Condah, proclaimed as a district within which licensing magistrates may grant certificates for publicans' licenses for which shall be charged the annual license fee of £10. And it is hereby further notified that representations in writing by any persons interested in opposing or promoting such application will be received by me, at the Crown Law Offices, up to Thursday the 1st June next.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballarat; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwarrah run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Kuramben runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepile, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Lintlithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Piery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carrgham, Nuntingbool, Bانشaw, Warrenheip, Peerwarrah, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballarat; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

GERLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Pollah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamra; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in

Government Gazette of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

KILMORE CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Muddy Creek; thence up the Muddy Creek to the north-west corner of the Killingworth run; thence south by the west and south-west boundary of that run to the north-east corner of Murrindindi East run; thence south by the east boundary of that run and Muddy Creek or Lambourne run to the source of the Muddy Creek in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the Glenvale run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run to the aforesaid range; thence again by that range to the source of the Campaspe River; thence down that river to the Langworn run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Coliban River; thence down that river to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the Axedale East run; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence again by that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; again down that river to the Whurarella run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the River Murray; and thence up that river to the commencing point. The Murrindindi East and Muddy Creek runs are now included in this district.

The births of 664 children, viz., 330 boys and 334 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 694 births were registered, or 30 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in April numbered 483, viz., 260 of males and 223 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 181. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 93, but were in excess of the average of April during the previous ten years by 104. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 22 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 79° on the 15th, and the lowest was 41° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (56'8") was nearly two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31'2") took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 75'7" to a minimum of 44'5". The least range (8'3") was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 60'3" to a minimum of 52'0". The mean daily range was 19'3". The mean atmospheric pressure (29'923 inches) was rather more than a tenth of an inch below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality registered during the month. Children under the age of 5 years died in the ratio of 40 per cent. to the total number, as against 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; 47 per cent. in April 1869; 52 per cent. in April 1868; 56 per cent. in April 1867; and 54 per cent. in April 1866.

Sixteen persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded as having died during the month under review, viz., a fisherman, aged 75, of stoppage of the bowels; a male servant and two females, each aged 75, who died of old age; a female, aged 78, of the result of fracture of the thigh; a gentleman, aged 79, of paralysis; a male of occupation unstated, aged 82, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 82, of bronchitis; a farm laborer and a female, each aged 83, of old age; a female, aged 84, of bronchitis; a gentleman and a dressmaker, each aged 85, of anasarca and dementia respectively; a female, 87, of dementia; and a female, aged 95, of atrophy of the heart.

Eleven deaths from external causes were registered during the month, all of which were ascribed to accident. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 9, was killed by a fall from a scaffold at St. Patrick's Cathedral; a female, aged 36, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a cab; a male of occupation unstated, aged 72, died of fracture of the ribs, caused by falling from the roof of a house on to a picket fence; a laborer, aged 55, died of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 78, of fracture of the thigh—both occasioned by falls; a boy, aged 3, died of burns accidentally received; two boys, aged 9 and 11 respectively, were accidentally drowned whilst bathing in the River Yarra; and three infants—a male, aged 3 weeks, and two females, aged 3 months and 5 months respectively, died of suffocation, the first whilst in bed with parents.

One hundred and two deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 13 in the Alfred Hospital; 3 in the Lying-in Hospital; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 3 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 194, of which 99, or 51 per cent., were of males; and 95, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 113 were under one year of age, 45 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 11 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 289. Of these, 161, or 56 per cent., were males, and 128, or 44 per cent., were females; 32 were between five and ten, 21 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 13 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were

between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom should have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, might be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who should have paid as aforesaid should be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it was also enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution might be incorporated to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and

(if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons should have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council might declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they should thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and should have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Wangaratta Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Wangaratta Hospital, situate at Wangaratta, in the colony of Victoria, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Wangaratta District Hospital."

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the several districts hereinafter mentioned to be respectively parts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—
