Order of the Council of the Shire of Leigh made on the 13th day of October 1875.

In accordance with the powers vested in them by *The Local Government Act*, No. 506, ss. 365, 366, the Council of the Shire of Leigh do hereby order and direct that the new road on the west side of allotments 82, 83, 86, 87, 93, and 94, in the parish of Wurrook, county of Grenville, referred to in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of April 1875, and particularly defined by the plan and description hereunto annexed, shall be opened for public use, and shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act from the date hereof. And also that the said new road shall be in lieu of the existing road on the east side of the said allotments at the parish boundary, also defined by the annexed plan and description.

Description of New Road.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 94 in the parish of Wurrook, on the north side of the main three-chain road from Rokewood via Shelford

to Geelong; thence bearing north (on the west side of allotments 94, 98, 87, 86, 83, and 82, being portion of said allotments) for the length of 151 chains and 82 links to the north-west angle of allotment 82 in the said parish. The bearing and distance are taken on the east side of the road, which is one chain wide, and contains 15 acres 0 roods and 25 perches.

Description of Old Road.—Commencing at the intersection of the west boundary line of parish of Wurrook with the north side of the main three-chain road from Rokewood *via* Shelford to Geelong; thence bearing north (by the said parish boundary) for the length of 160 chains and 88 links to the Warrambine Creek, at the north-west corner of allotment 116, parish of Shelford West. Orders of the Council of the Shire of Ripon made on the 2nd day of December 1875.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Ripon deem it expedient for the easier gradient of the said road, at the site of the She Oak Hill, to make, under the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874*, a divergence thereof through land belonging to Mr. John Wilson, of Trawalla, as hereunder described: And whereas for the purpose of making the said new line of road the said council have, by purchase, acquired from the said Mr. John Wilson the following area of land, to wit, 2a. 2r. 39p.: It is ordered and directed that the land so acquired shall be a new road in lieu of the undermentioned old road, and contingent upon this Order being confirmed by the Governor in Council that such new road shall be a public highway from the date hereof.

Description of New Road.—Commencing at a point on the three chain wide road from Beaufort to Stockyard Hill thirteen chains ten links north from the angle of the said road near the south-west corner of allotment 4a, parish of Yangerahwill, county of Ripon; thence by a line bearing south 20° 38' east five chains; thence south 7° 30' east three chains seventeen links; thence south 1° 14' west five chains eighty-nine links; thence south 8° 23' west five chains twenty-three links to the said three-chain road; thence northerly by the east side of that road to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERROUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted, that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twentieth of December 1869, Part II. of the said Act was extended to the Shire of Wimmera: And whereas a portion of the said shire has been separated therefrom and constituted the Shire of Lowan: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. aforesaid to the Shire of Wimmera as now constituted, and to the new Shire of Lowan: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council do by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF LOWAN, and

THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA.
