**POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN CERTAIN CITIES,
TOWNS, AND BOROUGHES, TO BE FILLED UP.**

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint
Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-
Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-
dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of
Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amend-
ment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the
Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation
in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth
section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and
after three months from the coming into operation of the said
section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon
there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil,
which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in
such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate
disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice
from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be
expressed in such notice not being more than one month from
the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not
exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of
the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should
not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the
Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive
Council, do by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions
of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the
cities, towns, and boroughs of Victoria which are hereinafter
respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Kyneton has requested that certain streets in the Town of Kyneton within the said Shire of Kyneton be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described and situate at Kyneton in the Shire of Kyneton to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

THE SHIRE OF BALLAN RE-SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of May 1876.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Ballan has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the Shire of Ballan into four several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

THE EAST RIDING.—Commencing on the Werribee River, at its confluence with the Myrning Creek; thence by the Werribee River north-westerly to the confluence of the Korjammunnip Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the last-named creek to its source at the most northerly of the three westernmost branches; thence magnetic north to the Great Dividing Range; thence north-easterly by the said Dividing Range to a point magnetic north of the most northern part of portion 54, parish of Blackwood; thence by a direct line south to the most northern part of portion 54, parish of Blackwood; thence southerly by the Myrning Creek to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing on the eastern branch of the Moorabool River, at a point on the north-east angle of the Bolwarra pre-emptive section; thence southward and eastward by the said river to the north-west angle of Yaloak parish; thence by the northern boundary of said parish to the Geelong and Mount Alexander road; thence by that road southwardly to the south-east angle of Bungeeltap East pre-emptive section; thence west by the south boundaries of the Bungeeltap pre-emptive rights east and west, and a direct line to the Bungal Creek; thence by that creek to the boundary between John Anderson's 80 acres, and William Welsh's 80 acres; thence by that boundary to the three-chain road; thence by that road and the south boundary of the Bungal pre-emptive right to the west boundary of the shire; thence by the west boundary of the shire north to the Melbourne and Ballarat main road; thence north-westerly by that road to the western branch of the Moorabool River; thence easterly and northerly by the said western branch to a point in a direct line with the north boundary of Bolwarra pre-emptive right; thence by a direct line to, and by, the said north boundary of Bolwarra pre-emptive right to the point of commencement.

THE CENTRAL RIDING.—Commencing at the source of the eastern branch of the Moorabool River; thence northerly and easterly by the Great Dividing Range to a point bearing magnetic north of the source of the most northerly of the three westernmost branches of the Korjammunnip Creek; thence by a direct line south to said source; thence southerly by the Korjammunnip Creek to the Werribee River; thence down the Werribee River to a point opposite the west boundary of the parish of Gorrockburkghap; thence south by that boundary to the south boundary of the parish of Yaloak; thence by the road forming the south boundary of the last-named parish westerly to Yaloak Creek; thence continuing on same road three chains wide, south of section 1, parish of Bungeeltap, to the east boundary of Stead's pre-emptive right; thence south to the south-east angle of said section; thence west to its south-west angle; thence by the Geelong and Mount Alexander road to the northern boundary of the parish of Yaloak; thence west by the north boundary of parish of Yaloak to the eastern branch of the Moorabool River; thence by that river northerly to the commencing point.

THE SOUTH RIDING.—Commencing at the intersection of the south boundary of Bungal pre-emptive right with the west boundary of the shire; thence by the west boundary of the shire south to the intersection of the north boundary of portions 135, 134, 133, and 72 in the parish of Meredith; thence east by the north boundary of portions 72, 49, and 48, parish of Meredith to the centre of the Moorabool River; thence northerly by the Moorabool River to the south boundary of portion 32 parish of Ballark; thence east by the south boundaries of 32, 33, 42, and 48 to the south-west angle of Ballark parish; thence further east by the south boundary of the parish of Beremboke and a direct line to the west boundary of the parish of Balliang; thence north by the west boundaries of the parishes of Balliang and Gorrockburkghap to the road forming the south boundary of Yaloak parish; thence westerly by that road to Yaloak Creek; thence continuing on same road, three chains wide, south of section 1, parish of Bungeeltap, to the east boundary of Stead's pre-emptive right; thence south to the south-east angle of said section; thence by the south boundary of Stead's pre-emptive right and Bungeeltap pre-emptive right east and west and a direct line west to Bungal Creek; thence by

that creek and the boundary-line between John Anderson's 80 acres and William Welsh's 80 acres to a three-chain road; thence north-westerly by that road to the south boundary of Bungal pre-emptive right; thence by the south boundary of Bungal pre-emptive right west to the point of commencement.

AUTHORITY TO MINE ON CERTAIN LANDS.

6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

7. A Bye-law of the City of Ballaarat, made under section 479 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 56, for Regulating the Corporation Cattle Market, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

In pursuance of the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat order as follows:—

1. That "rules for the better regulation and government of the Cattle Market of the Borough of Ballaarat," gazetted on the 11th day of September 1866, be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. That in this bye-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith, the word "stock" shall include horses, mares, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.

The word "inspector" shall mean the collector or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorised by the Local Government Act 1874, and shall include the assistants of the inspector.

3. That the Cattle Market situate at Alfredton, within the said city, shall be open for the reception and delivery of stock on every lawful day from sunrise to sunset.

4. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market an inspector thereof, whose duty shall be as follows:—

i. To see that this bye-law and the provisions of the Local Government Act 1874 relating to markets are duly observed.

ii. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.

iii. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.

iv. To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.

5. That no person shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another, without the authority of the inspector.

6. That every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

7. That if any stock brought to the market for sale, and not removed within twenty-four hours after the close of the market, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale.

8. That the owner or agent of stock intended to be brought to the market for sale on every Tuesday shall notify the number in writing to the inspector by Two o'clock p.m. on every previous Monday, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in respect of the number of stock so notified; Provided that if from accident, or some other good and sufficient cause, a delay should arise in bringing such stock to market, the inspector shall have the power of not enforcing payment of the said dues and charges.

9. That all owners or agents of stock intended for sale desiring to have the privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale must have such stock at the yards by Seven o'clock a.m. on the morning of sale, from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April, and by half-past Seven o'clock a.m. from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of August in each year; and that all stock arriving after the hours above stated will be sold in the order of their arrival, and in no case shall the number of horned cattle in one pen exceed twelve.

10. That the inspector shall give out publicly the order of auction sales at the hour appointed for the arrival of stock in the market.

11. That the sale by auction of sheep shall commence at Nine o'clock a.m.

12. That the sale by auction of fat lambs shall commence so soon as the sale of sheep by auction is concluded.

13. That the sale by auction of fat cattle shall commence at One o'clock p.m.

14. That the sale by auction of calves shall commence at half-past Twelve o'clock p.m., provided the sale of lambs shall be then concluded.

15. That the sale by auction of store cattle shall commence so soon as the sale by auction of calves is concluded.

16. That any owner or agent withdrawing his stock from auction sale, or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales shall be completed.

17. That no agent or auctioneer shall be allowed to draw lots for priority of sale for more than 2,000 fat sheep, 200 fat lambs, or for 120 fat cattle in one sale, unless the property of one owner.
