NOTE.—During the quarter under review the increase by excess of births over deaths was 2,402, viz., 986 males and 1,416 females. The increase by excess of arrivals over departures of males was 190, but a loss of 307 occurred by excess of departures over arrivals of females. This resulted in a net loss by emigration of 117 persons. The net gain to the population from all sources was 2,285, viz., 1,176 males and 1,109 females, as shown in the table.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Benalla, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act, 1874, and numbered 1, for suppressing nuisances, and for regulating traffic and processions, and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality, as provided for in sub-sections 8 and 17 of said section 213 of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. That if any person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal, or drive, draw, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle over, upon, or across any bridge or other crossing within the Shire of Benalla at any pace faster than a walking pace, such person shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.
2. That if any person shall, between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m., drive any horses, cows, bullocks, or other cattle (not being sheep) exceeding ten in number at any one time through the streets of any town within the Shire of Benalla without the consent of the council of the said shire or their proper officer first had and obtained, such person shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
3. That if any goat shall have been impounded within any pound in the Shire of Benalla under the provisions of any Act relating to the impounding of cattle, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released and all costs, charges, and expenses thereon be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand, directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.
