Noie.—During the quarter under review the increase by excess of births over deaths was 2,402, viz., 986 males and 1,416 females. The increase by excess of arrivals over departures of males was 190, but a loss of 307 occurred by excess of departures over arrivals of females. This resulted in a net loss by emigration of 117 persons. The net gain to the population from all sources was 2,285, viz., 1,176 males and 1,109 females, as shown in the table.
