The births of 767 children, viz., 411 boys and 356 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 664 births were registered, or 103 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in May numbered 489, viz., 268 of males and 221 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 278. The deaths exceeded those in April by 6, and were also in excess of the average of May during the previous ten years by 145. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 71.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.1° on the 5th, and the lowest was 34.8° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (52.4°) was nearly three-fourths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.9°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 72.1° to a minimum of 40.2°. The least range (6.5°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 54.1° to a minimum of 47.6°. The mean daily range was 16.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.102 inches) was above the average.

Males and females died in the proportions of 55 per cent. and 45 per cent respectively to the total deaths recorded. Thirty-eight per cent. of the latter were of children who had not reached the age of 5 years, as against 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1871; 38 per cent. in May 1870; 43 per cent. in May 1869; 45 per cent. in May 1868; 48 per cent. in May 1867; and 47 per cent. in May 1866.

The deaths of 7 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz., those of a draper, aged 76, who died of atrophy of the heart; a male cook, aged 77, and a mariner, aged 80, who died of paralysis, and a gardener aged 81, a housewife, aged 82, a gentleman, aged 84, and a female, aged 86, who died of old age.

Fifteen of the deaths registered during the month were from external causes. Ten of these were set down as accidental, 1 as homicidal, and 4 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A male infant, aged 20 months, and a carter, aged 44, were passed over by vehicles; a boy, aged 11, was killed by the fall of a tree; a boiler-maker, aged 24, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a boiler-plate falling on him; a picture-frame maker, aged 53, died of fracture of the pelvis; a cabman, aged 36, and a female, aged 41, were burnt to death; a youth, aged 16, was accidentally drowned in the River Yarra by the upsetting of a boat; two infants, a female, aged 13 weeks, and a male, aged 2 months, were suffocated in bed. A female infant, aged 2 months, died of the result of injuries occasioned by the intemperate habits of the mother, who was subsequently convicted of manslaughter. A male, of occupation unstated, aged 43, poisoned himself with arsenic whilst in a state of unsound mind; a housewife, aged 73, was found drowned in a tub and is supposed to have committed suicide; a laborer, aged 55, drowned himself in the River Yarra whilst of unsound mind brought on by intemperance, and a boot-salesman, aged 30, hung himself.

Eighty-five deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.,—47 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Immigrants' Home; 12 in the Alfred Hospital; 2 in the Lying-in Hospital; 6 in the Benevolent Asylum; 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 5 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 184, of which 96, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 88, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 98 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 24 were between two and three, 21 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 305. Of these, 172, or 56 per cent., were males, and 133, or 44 per cent., were females; 59 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were

between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Twenty-four deaths resulted from typhoid fever in May as against 26 in April and 17 in March. Deaths from phthisis numbered 49 as against 44 in April and 61 in March. Deaths from diseases of the circulatory and respiratory systems were above the average both in April and May.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF GOODS FROM MELBOURNE TO DENILQUIN BY RAILWAY VIA ECHUCA.

1. Goods may be exported under bond from Melbourne to Denilquin direct via Echuca, under the rules applicable to goods exported to Murray River Ports, and approved by Order 73/41 dated 29th November 1873. Such must be accompanied by a separate transire addressed to the New South Wales Officer of Customs at Denilquin. Care must be taken that the regulations as to the receipts for goods, or return of the Shipping Bills are duly observed.

2. Goods from Denilquin for Melbourne must be entered at Echuca; free goods under an import entry, or, if dutiable, they may be either duty paid there or constructively warehoused and passed on to Melbourne.

3. Goods from Denilquin for any intermediate places in Victoria must be cleared at Echuca.

THE accompanying Regulations for the transmission of goods under bond from Melbourne to warehousing ports on the River Murray are republished for general information:—

1. Bonded goods may be "exported" under bond from the port of Melbourne to warehousing ports belonging to New South Wales situated on the Murray, by rail via Echuca and Wodonga, and from thence by steamer or other approved means of conveyance to the port of destination.

2. Goods in bond at the port of Melbourne may, in the same manner, be "removed" under bond to Echuca, or to other warehousing ports belonging to Victoria on the River Murray.

3. Similar goods may be removed to or exported under bond from one warehousing port to another on the River Murray, under the usual regulations.

4. No drawback will be allowed on duty-paid goods entered outwards for ports belonging to New South Wales on the River Murray.

5. In the event of steamers or other approved means of conveyance not being in waiting at Echuca or Wodonga to convey goods entered out for other Murray ports, on their arrival by rail at either of those stations, the owners or agents of such goods will be required to place the same in bond (*in transitu*) until a vessel or other approved means of conveyance, is ready to convey them to their destination, when they are to be placed in such vessel or other means of conveyance, by and at the expense of the owner or agent thereof, under the supervision of the officers of this department.

6. No goods forwarded under bond for Murray ports shall be allowed to remain during *transitu* at the railway station, Echuca or Wodonga, for more than twenty-four hours after arrival: goods not shipped or removed from thence to their destination, or placed by the agents or owners thereof in a bonding warehouse, within the time specified, will be removed to a place of security by the officers of this department, at the expense and risk of the parties interested, and shall remain in such place, at their risk, until all expenses attending such removal and warehousing shall have been paid.

7. The bond to be entered into at the port of removal or export must cover goods to their port of final destination; it will be unnecessary, therefore, for owners or agents of goods detained at Echuca or Wodonga under the circumstances referred to in preceding paragraph to enter into a further bond at that port. Should any goods be removed in a waggon or dray to the final port of destination, the owner of such waggon or dray must give security for £250 for every vehicle so employed, and be duly licensed to carry bonded goods.

8. The bonds entered into for the removal or export of goods to Murray ports shall contain a covenant binding the exporters of such goods and their sureties to produce, within a reasonable time to be stated therein, to the collector of the port of export, a certificate from the proper officer of Customs at the port of destination of such goods acknowledging the receipt thereof.

9. On an entry being passed for removal or export of goods from the warehouse, Melbourne, for Murray ports, via Echuca or Wodonga, such goods shall be forwarded by and at the expense of the owner, under the usual regulations, to the searcher of this department at the Railway Station, Melbourne, who will duly record the receipt, and transmission of such goods, and properly secure the carriages conveying the same.

10. A transire, in duplicate, containing particulars of goods forwarded under bond by rail, signed by the searcher of Customs at the railway station and countersigned by the railway officer, shall be transmitted by the train conveying the goods under cover to the officer of Customs, Echuca or Wodonga, along with shipping bills; and the duplicate of the former will be returned by the searcher to the Collector, Melbourne, along with the Customs entry of goods duly certified to by such searcher as having been exported or removed.

11. On the arrival of goods under bond by rail at Echuca or Wodonga, the declaration on the transire accompanying the same is to be signed by the guard or other railway officer in the presence of the officer of Customs; and should the goods be intended for either of these ports, such transire is to be treated as a coastwise report, and entries are to be passed accordingly.

12. If the goods are entered out and intended for ports in New South Wales, or for other Victorian ports on the Murray, the transire is to be retained by the principal officer of Customs, Echuca, or Wodonga, who will intimate to the Collector, Melbourne, the arrival at his station of the goods *in transitu*.

13. In a like manner, the officer of this department at the port of destination, when the goods are intended for Victorian ports, shall acquaint the Collector with their arrival at his station.

14. The officer of Customs at Echuca or Wodonga, as the case may be, is particularly directed to take care that all bonded goods forwarded to that port *in transitu* for other ports on the Murray shall be entered and borne on the vessel's manifest conveying the same to their final port of destination; or, if sent on by waggon, that the required bond and license has been obtained for carrying bonded goods, in which case the driver of each vehicle must be furnished with a cart-note or way-bill.

15. The master of every vessel trading to and conveying bonded goods from Victorian ports on the Murray shall be required to enter into a bond by himself and two sufficient sureties to conform to the Customs laws and regulations of this colony, and shall in every case where goods are removed by him from one warehousing port to another be a party to the removal or export bond entered into by the owner or agent of such goods.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 263), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and might define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and might revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed should extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR SITE FOR A RACECOURSE, ETC., KINGOWER.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect to the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 21st December 1875, as a site for a racecourse and for recreation, in the parish of Kingower:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No fires shall be lighted in the reserve without the consent in writing of the committee of management.
6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR SITE FOR RACING, ETC., AT NEWSTEAD.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the site temporarily reserved by Orders of 31st October and 28th November 1864, and diminished by Order of 9th June 1873, for racing and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Strangways at Newstead.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, or buildings in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein except with the consent of the committee.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord without the authority of the committee.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
 7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

PROPOSED NEW SHIRE UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners state that they are inhabitants of the part of Victoria sought to be constituted a shire, each of whom possesses rateable property therein, and the boundaries of which are as follow, viz.:—That portion of the Wimmera Shire commencing at a point where the southern boundary of the Shire of Wimmera intersects the eastern boundary of the Rosebank run; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of Rosebank and Pleasant Bunk runs to the south-western boundary of the Spring Bank run; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the latter run to its southern corner; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of the said run to the junction of Spring Hill and St. Mary's Lake runs; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the Spring Hill run to its junction with St. Mary's Lake and Wyn Wyn runs; thence north-westerly and north-easterly to the junction of the latter run with the southern boundary of Blackheath run; thence easterly by the boundary of the latter run and the Wimmera River; thence south-easterly to the north-west corner of the parish of Vectis East; thence easterly by the north boundary of the latter parish to its north-east

corner; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish to its south-east corner; thence south-westerly by the River Wimmera to its junction with the McKenzie Creek; thence southerly along the said creek to the south-west corner of the parish of Bungallilly; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Bungallilly and Drung Drung to the west boundary of the parish of Golton Golton; thence south along the western boundary of the latter parish to its south-west corner; thence east along the southern boundary of the said parish; and further east to the boundary between the Wimmera and Stawell Shires; thence southerly along the said boundary to the south corner of the Shire of Wimmera; and thence by the southern boundary of the Wimmera Shire to the commencing point.

They further state that the said area is capable of yielding on a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound the sum of £1,200, and they pray as follows:—

"That Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to make an order for severance of the hereinbefore described portion of the Wimmera Shire from the said Wimmera Shire, and constitute it a separate shire, to be called the Shire of Natimuk."
