## REGULATION UNDER THE "DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872" (No. 451).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of July 1876.

### PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872* it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the fourth section of the said Act; And whereas by Order, dated the 13th day of January 1873, the Governor in Council made certain regulations for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas by Order, dated the 4th day of August 1875, the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, made certain further regulations for the purposes aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the power conferred by the above recited Act, and every other power enabling him in that behalf, make the regulation following, that is to say:—

*Transfer of sheep from one ship to another within Victorian waters prohibited.*—No person shall, in any river, port, or harbor in Victoria, or elsewhere in Victorian waters, transfer or attempt to transfer, cause or permit to be transferred, or to be attempted to be transferred, assist in transferring or in attempting to transfer, any sheep from any one ship or vessel to any other ship or vessel.

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## NOTICE TO STOCKOWNERS AND OTHERS INTRODUCING STOCK INTO SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

THE following extract, taken from a notice published in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, is published for general information, viz.:—

"All persons introducing sheep, cattle, or horses to this province overland from the colony of New South Wales, or introducing cattle or horses from the colony of Victoria, shall give not less than twenty-four hours' notice in writing to the nearest Inspector of Sheep in this province, stating the brands of such animals, the place at which such animals will cross the boundary, the date of intended crossing, the place from which they were brought, the road they are desirous of travelling, and their destination: Provided that no notice will be required for horse or bullock teams; any person failing to show such notice has been given to be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds."

## POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS AT AVOCA TO BE FILLED UP.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the Township of Avoca.

## THE NEWSTEAD AND PORTLAND £10 LICENSING DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of October 1871 the whole of the shire of Newstead and certain portions of the shire of Portland were constituted £10 licensing districts (amongst other districts) under the said Act; and it is expedient to revoke such proclamation so far as it applies to the said shires: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation, so far as it applies to the shires of Newstead and Portland, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the whole of the Shire of Portland with the exception of the area within three miles of the townships of Branhorne, Digby, Heywood, Hotspur, and Tahara, and the village of Greenhills, postally known as Condah, to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

(*Nymphe*—Information from Navigating Lieutenant Alfred E. Stanley.)

Cruising round north end of Ovalau, Fiji, we discovered a sunken rock, least water 15 feet, and 7 fathoms close to and around.

The marks for it are centre of Tumuna Peak S.S.E., North Point E. by N.

(*Barracouta*—Extract from Remark Book of Navigating Lieutenant A. R. Wigham.)

*Levuka Harbor, Fiji*.—A coral head, with 8½ fathoms on it at low water springs, lies S. 41 E. 6½ of a cable from Observation Point.

This appears to be identical with the 4-fathom patch shown on the survey of *Levuka Harbor* by Navigating Lieutenant W. Tooker, H.M.S. *Dido*, Capt. W. C. Chapman, 1874.

Clearing mark.—The beacon erected on Half-tide Rock, in line with the right extreme of Ovalau N.N.W. ¼ W., clears the Horseshoe Head and patches which are off Nasosa; the buoys in the north entrance are not to be depended on.

The chequered buoy has been washed away; the red buoy has drifted from ¼ to ½ of a cable to the southward.

The chequered buoy, which was placed on a patch having 10 feet of water over it at low water, S.E. by E. 2½ cables from Observation Spot, has been removed. The rock has been blown up.

Up to the 1st December 1875 nothing had been done to replace the buoys in the north entrance.

*N'Galoa Harbor, Kaudavu*.—The following additional buoys and beacons have been placed in the passages and harbor, corrected 28/11/75:—

*Entrance*.—One red buoy on the south edge of Esk Reef, one red buoy on the north edge of Macgregor Patch, one black buoy on the north edge of Pearl Reef, one red buoy with a black and red perch on the south edge of Macgregor Patch. In the harbor—one beacon, iron, with a triangle-colored red and white in horizontal bands on the east edge of Wood Shoal, one red buoy on the west edge of Wood Shoal, one red buoy on the ¼-fathom patch which lies W. ¼ N. nearly 5 cables from the outer beacon (N'Galoa Island). The buoy which was formerly moored off the outer beacon point has been removed. At night hand-lamps are placed on shelves in the beacons, but, at present, they give but a dim light rendering it doubtful whether they could be seen farther out than the main channel. New lamps have been ordered.

## TONGA OR FRIENDLY ISLANDS, CHART NO. 2421.

*Tonga*.—A rock 27 feet high was seen by the Dutch ship *Meter*, January 1875, in lat. 19° 21' S., long. 174° 51' W. This is probably identical with the rock reported by H.M.S. *Blanche*, Hydrographic Notice No. 21, of 12th September 1871. See Notices, Pacific Ocean, 1873, page 78.

*Hapai Group*.—The shoal marked 6 fathoms lying S.W. by W. ¼ W. from Loochooga Island extends 2 miles further to the S.S.W. Soundings were obtained in 4½ fathoms with the island bearing N. 20 E.

The positions of the islands in this group cannot be depended on to give correct bearings.

*Tongatapu*.—Breakers were seen on the N.W. side of this island in lat. 20° 54' S. long. 175° 28' W.

*Lefuka Anchorage*.—In the plan of this anchorage (upper corner of Chart No. 2421), Lefuka Point and the point S.W. of it are not correctly laid down. The bearings do not agree.

The unsounded ground north of the tongue like shoal on the S.W. side of the plan is full of detached shoals.

The information about the Tonga Group was given by the German Frigate *Gazelle*.

## Hydrographical Memo. No. 8.

The following observations are communicated for general information:—

*Nanuku Passage—Fiji Group*.—Probably the correction in latitude for Wallagilala Island given by Lieutenant H. J.

Rendell, in his survey of this passage, should be extended to the neighbouring reefs, for a line of heavy breakers was seen from the *Pearl* E. by N. 7½ miles from that island, extending 2 miles to the eastward, supposed to be identical with the Duff Reef which is shown on Chart of Fiji, No. 2691, 6½ miles to the S.W. ¼ W.

*Levuka Harbor*.—The coral knoll, shown upon Plan No. 1244, two-thirds of a cable S.S.W. from the Half Tide Rock was blown down on the 8th June 1876.

There is now at low tide a depth of 24 feet over the spot.

The Hamilton District is still free from scab; but during the quarter great mortality has occurred among the flocks from fluke and what is considered to be rot of the liver. Not less than one hundred thousand (100,000) have died from those causes (many of them of great value) during the quarter. The mortality commenced about the middle of April, and was at first confined to a small portion of my district. Since then it has spread over nearly the whole of it; and during the month of June it extended to the south side of the Glenelg River, and carried off numbers of sheep depasturing on stations that it was thought would be free from its ravages.

My opinion is, that if measures are not taken to check those diseased sheep from travelling over what is now sound country, that every run in the colony where sheep are watered at swamps or dams, will become diseased.

## KILMORE DISTRICT.

IN compliance with the 12th section of *The Scab Act*, I have the honor to report as to the state of the Kilmore District for the quarter ending 30th June.

The sheep in my district continue clean. I had a prosecution before the Murchison Bench against M. Spencer, and a penalty of Fifty pounds (£50) was inflicted. I may also bring under your notice that the losses from fluke have not been unusually severe this quarter, except on one station, where over two thousand (2000) store sheep, bred on sound country, brought on just before last shearing, died of it; while the deaths among those bred on the station have not been greater than in former years.

With regard to what has been termed the "new disease" in sheep, I can hear of no instance of it in my district.

Plenro pneumonia still continues to show itself; but, as a rule, cattle owners prefer reporting it, and destroying the infected animals, as advised, to risking a prosecution by turning them out on the roads and commons, as they formerly did, to the imminent risk of spreading the disease.

## TIMBER RESERVE.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the Government Gazette, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, proclaim the lands hereinafter described to be a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, that is to say:—

COBAW AND LANGLEY TIMBER RESERVE.—Three thousand one hundred and eighty acres, more or less, county of Dalhousie, parishes of Cobaw and Langley, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 10, parish of Cobaw; bounded thence by J. ## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

**WARANGA COMMON.**—About Two thousand six hundred and fifty acres, county of Rodney, parish of Waranga, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of the parish; bounded thence by a road bearing west to the road from Rushworth to Toolamba; thence by the last-mentioned road westerly and south-westerly to the boundary fence between the Toolamba and Waranga runs; thence by that fence south-easterly to the road forming the eastern boundary of the parish; and thence by that road bearing north to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(76.W.970.)

# PLACE FOR RECTIFYING AND COMPOUNDING SPIRITS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, to the granting a Duty upon Spirits Distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the Brewing of Beer and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession, or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned place in the town of Castlemaine as a place wherein the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

All that piece of land being portions of allotments A and B, town of Castlemaine, parish of Castlemaine, and county of Talbot: Commencing at a point two hundred and fifty feet three inches from the north-east angle of said allotment A; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and thirty feet nine inches; thence north fifty feet three inches and half an inch to the north-east angle of the block; thence west ninety-four feet by a curve having a radius of five hundred and sixty-four feet; thence south one hundred feet; thence west forty-nine feet; thence south thirty-four feet; thence west bearing north eighty-four degrees fifty-eight minutes one hundred and thirty-one feet; thence north fronting Barker street ninety-eight feet two inches and half an inch to the point of commencement.

No person shall cart or carry with carts drawn by horses or otherwise within the boundaries of the Shire of Caulfield any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other matter being offensive to smell, between the hours of Ten o'clock *post meridiem* on any day and Six o'clock *ante meridiem* of the next day.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.
