SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of *The Education Act 1872* (No. 447, § 15), abolished the School Districts in the Shire of Echuca (No. 139, East Riding, and No. 140, West Riding), and in their place has constituted within the boundaries of the said shire (as originally proclaimed 24th May 1871) four new School Districts, as hereinafter described, to be distinguished by the numbers 310, 311, 312, and 313, each having a Board of Advice consisting of five members, that is to say:-

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 310.—Commencing at a point on the River Goulburn at the north-east angle of the shire of Waranga, by a line north-easterly to the Broken Creek; thence westerly by the Broken Creek to its junction with the River Murray; thence by the Murray to its confluence with the River Campaspe; thence southerly by the Campaspe to the north-west angle of the shire of Waranga; thence easterly by the south boundary of the shire (Echuca) to the commencing point.

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 311.—Commencing at a point on the River Goulburn, at the north-east angle of the shire of Waranga, by a line north-easterly to the Broken Creek; thence easterly by the Broken Creek to its confluence with Back Creek; thence by the Back Creek to a point where it intersects the southern boundary of the shire (Echuca); thence westerly and northerly by the said shire boundary to the commencing point.

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 312.—Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire of Echuca at its intersection by the Back Creek; thence north-westerly by the Back Creek to its junction with Broken Creek; and by Broken Creek to the River Murray; thence by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of the shire to the commencing point.

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 313.—To comprise all that portion of the shire of Echuca which lies to the west of the River Campaspe.

AMENDED REGULATION UNDER THE "DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872" (No. 451).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of August 1876.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872* it was, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make such regulations as might be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the fourth section of the said Act: And whereas by Order, dated the 10th day of July 1876, the Governor in Council made a regulation for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to amend the said regulation: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the power conferred by the above recited Act, and every other power enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council of the 10th of July aforesaid, and doth make the regulation following, that is to say:-

Transfer of stock from one ship or vessel to another within Victorian waters restricted.—No person shall, in any river, port, or harbor in Victoria, or elsewhere in Victorian waters, transfer or attempt to transfer, cause or permit to be transferred, or to be attempted to be transferred, assist in transferring or in attempting to transfer, any stock from any one ship or vessel to any other ship or vessel without the written authority of an Inspector of Stock.

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

† Consignments under this head amounting in the aggregate for the year ending 30th June 1877 to 3,000 bales or upwards, forwarded by one and the same consignor, will be allowed 6d. per bale.

Until further notice an allowance of 6d. per bale upon the above rates from Echuca and Wodonga will be made upon Wool the clip of Stations in New South Wales.

Wool to the Williamstown Pier may be consigned direct from country stations at 6d. per bale additional on the above rates, but only provided that the name of the vessel it is intended for be given on the consignment note. If the vessel is not at the Pier or not ready to ship the bales on their arrival, then the trucks may be brought back to Melbourne and unloaded there, all at the cost and risk of the owner.

An allowance will be made of 1s. per bale upon dumped wool carried by railway over 150 miles.

WILLIAMSTOWN LINE.

1. Melbourne to Williamstown 9d. per bale.†
2. Wharfage rate on wool for shipment arriving by lighters or other craft from any place on the shores of the bay or the Yarra ... 6d. per bale.
3. For the carriage of wool from the pier to the dumping sheds and back to the ship, if the wool is subject to wharfage as above ... 2d. per bale.
4. For the carriage of wool from the pier to the dumping sheds and back to the ship, if free of wharfage 4d. per bale.
5. For the carriage of dumped wool from the dumping sheds to the ship 1d. per bale.

† NOTE.—This rate is not cash without discount. Vessels loading will be required to take wool or other cargo from trucks in preference to lighters or other craft. If from delay in this respect, or from any cause not due to the department, the vessel is not ready to receive wool or general cargo within twelve hours after the arrival of the trucks, demurrage will be strictly enforced at the rate of 10s. per truck per diem until the trucks are unloaded by the consignee, or until the department, at the cost and risk of the consignee, unloads the trucks and sends the goods to store. Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

All bales of wool carried on the above lines weighing over 4 cwt. each will be charged 1s. for every cwt. or portion of a cwt. in excess.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

When the above rate per bale is below the goods minimum of 8s., each consignment must be equal to fourteen bales, otherwise second-class rates for actual weight will be charged.

Twelve hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station.

All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1872.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has altered the Regulations made in pursuance of *The Education Act 1872* (§ 18) in manner following, viz. :—

REGULATION TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR CLAUSE 5 OF SECTION X. OF THE REGULATIONS.

5. "The first general election of a Board of Advice in any school district shall be held as soon as convenient after the appointment of the returning officer of the district, and every such election and all subsequent elections shall take place on a day to be fixed by the returning officer, and notified by him by advertisement, as hereinafter mentioned."

REGULATION TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR CLAUSE 25 OF SECTION X. OF THE REGULATIONS.

25. "When any vacancy takes place in any Board of Advice, the Minister of Public Instruction shall cause the same to be notified to the returning officer, who shall thereupon proceed to fill up the vacancy by an election in the manner hereinbefore provided."

The births of 698 children, viz., 392 boys and 306 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 692 births were registered, or 6 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in July numbered 477, viz., 244 of males and 233 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 221. The deaths exceeded those in June by 65, and also exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 163. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 105 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.0° on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.0° on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (46.7°) was more than half a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (26.5°) took place on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 58.4° to a minimum of 31.9°. The least range (2.2°) was on the 4th, viz., from a maximum of 48.5° to a minimum of 46.3°. The mean daily range was 15.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.122 inches) was nearly a tenth of an inch above the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. were of females. Thirty per cent. were of children who had not reached the age of 5 years, as against 29 per cent. in July 1875; 33 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; 34 per cent. in July 1871; 39 per cent. in July 1870; 37 per cent. in July 1869; 44 per cent. in July 1868 and July 1867; and 40 per cent. in July 1866.

The deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards amounted to 28, which was the greatest mortality of persons at that period of life ever recorded in one month since these reports were first commenced in 1860, and exceeded by 4 the maximum of previous months, which was August 1875. The following are the particulars:—A shepherd, aged 75, died of dysentery; a seaman, aged 75, of alcoholic poisoning; a mason, aged 75, of bronchitis; a housewife, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of chronic disease of the liver and kidneys; a laundress, aged 76, of scirrhus of the liver; a nurse, aged 76, of peritonitis; a laborer, aged 76, of old age; a widow, aged 77, of kidney disease and sciatica; a widow, aged 77, and a carpenter, aged 78, of old age; a storekeeper, aged 78, of influenza; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 80, of pleuro-pneumonia; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 81, of disease of the heart; a carpenter, aged 82, of albuminuria; two females, aged 82 and 83 respectively, of old age; a gentleman, aged 83, of apoplexy; a shepherd, aged 85, and a carpenter, aged 86, of old age; a male of no occupation, aged 87, of chronic rheumatism; a widow, aged 89, of peritonitis; and two females, aged 89 and 106 respectively, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, 22 of which were ascribed to accident, and the remaining 2 to suicide. The particulars are as follow:—A butcher, aged 15, and a stonemason, aged 38, died of fracture of the skull, caused by falls from horses; a female housekeeper, aged 46, a laborer, aged 52, a tea broker, aged 37, and a laborer, aged

35, died of the effects of falls, the two first whilst intoxicated; a youth, aged 16, was killed by falling timber; a laborer, aged 50, was killed by a pile-driving machine striking him in its fall; a carpenter, aged 52, died of pneumonia, the result of accidental fracture of the ribs; a baker, aged 60, died of rupture of the heart, caused by "direct violence, how inflicted not known"; a carter, aged 35, a greengrocer, aged 38, and a female hawket, aged 40, were passed over by vehicles; a scaman, aged 48, died of erysipelas of head, induced by an accidental wound in a drunken squabble; a youth, aged 18, died of the result of an accidental gun-shot wound in the leg; a male child, aged 3, and a female gatekeeper, aged 40, died of burns, the latter having fallen into the fire during an epileptic fit; a laborer, aged 42 (an inmate of the Melbourne Hospital), accidentally poisoned himself by taking a dose of chlorodyne unknown to the attendants; a male child, aged 17 months, was accidentally drowned in a tub of water; a male infant died of suffocation a few minutes after birth; a male infant, aged 6 weeks, and female infant, aged 8 months, were suffocated in bed, the former from overlying, the latter by the bed clothes. A bootmaker, aged 51, and a female servant, aged 23, poisoned themselves, the former, who was of unsound mind, with sulphuric acid, the latter with a liniment.

One hundred and seventeen deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—61 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Immigrant's Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 15 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 145, of which 83, or 57 per cent., were of males; and 62, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 84 were under one year of age, 25 were between one and two, 21 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 332. Of these, 161, or 48 per cent., were males, and 171, or 52 per cent., were females; 31 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 42 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 11 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 15 were upwards of eighty.

CUTTING OF RED-GUM TIMBER ON CROWN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF MURRABIT PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove red-gum timber from the portion of Crown lands in the parish of Murrabit, comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

Parish of Murrabit.—Eight thousand five hundred acres, more or less, county of Gunbower, parish of Murrabit: Commencing at a point on the left bank of Gunbower Creek bearing east from the north-east angle of the Gannawarra pre-emptive section; bounded thence by a line, that section, and a line bearing westerly to the road from Echua to Kerang; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to the road forming the eastern boundary of A. McIntosh's 19th section block, No. 44,204; thence by that road bearing north to the Murray River; thence by that river and the Gunbower Creek aforesaid upwards to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(N.R.615.) (76A.1641.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Great Western Goldfield Common by adding thereto the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

GREAT WESTERN GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Great Western Goldfield Common, proclaimed by Orders dated respectively the 28th January 1861, the 10th June 1862, and the 27th May 1872, is hereby increased, by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries of the three separate portions hereinafter described, viz:—

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
6. The ground fees will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges, or on the certificate of a justice given under the Act No. 310.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or of some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. Any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 35th section of the Act 27 Victoria No. 201.
16. No dogs, horses, or cattle will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
19. No grave to be of a less depth than six feet.

[Extract from Remarks of Lieutenant W. U. Moore, in charge of surveying schooner *Alacrity*.]

Savu Savu Bay, Fiji.

Incorrectly placed as regards longitude. Latitude appears to be correct by chart (2691).

Longitude N.W. extreme Savu Savu Point, by officers of H.M. schooner *Alacrity*, is 179° 16' 54" E., assuming Levuka to be in 178° 49' 45" E.

In Mr. Barrack's sketch, Savu Savu Bay (No. 727), the reef of Savu Savu Point is not sufficiently extended to the westward. It appears to be more correctly laid down in chart No. 2691. The extreme is certainly not less than one mile from the point.

Passage through Direction Island reef.

In going from Savu Savu Bay to the westward, small sailing vessels gain time by passing through a break in the Direction Island reef, abreast of Direction Island. The following are the directions:—

Steer, in approaching the long reef, with right extreme Direction Island just open, left extreme Makongai Island; pass within a few yards of Direction Island, and take the most weatherly of three breaks in the western side of the barrier.

This course will, if the prevailing trade be blowing, save a tack to weather the south point of Direction Island reef.
