CURRENCY OF OLD COPPER COINAGE TO CEASE ON AND AFTER 1st SEPTEMBER 1877.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS His Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Circular Despatch of the tenth of April last, transmitted a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-fourth of March last, and a copy of Her Majesty's Royal Proclamation, issued in pursuance of such Order (copies of which Order and Proclamation are hereto appended), for the decimal of old British copper coins, from a date to be named in a Proclamation to be issued for such purpose in those colonies in which it is desired and in which they have not been already withdrawn from circulation; and in the said Despatch it is intimated that old copper coins, as aforesaid, will be received at the Imperial Mint at their nominal value up to the thirty-first of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, after which date they will only be received as metal: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and in pursuance of Her Majesty's Royal Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and in exercise of all other powers and authorities in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do by this my Proclamation name the first day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, as the date on and after which the current copper monies of the realm commonly called a penny, a half-penny, a farthing, and a half-farthing (other than and except the bronze monies current by virtue of Her Majesty's Proclamation, bearing date the seventeenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, or any Proclamation of subsequent date), shall no longer be allowed to pass or be current in any payment whatever within the Colony of Victoria and its dependencies.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Her Majesty's Royal Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine Her Majesty did, with the advice of Her Privy Council, declare and command that no copper monies whatsoever, other than and except such bronze monies as were then or are now current by virtue of Her Majesty's Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty, or any Proclamation dated subsequently to the said seventeenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty, should be allowed to pass or be current in any payment whatsoever within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland after the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine: And whereas it hath been represented unto Her Majesty in Council by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury that it would be expedient that the provisions of the said Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine should be extended to certain of the colonies and possessions: And whereas there was this day read at the board a draft of a Proclamation extending the provisions of the said Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth of May One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, accordingly Her Majesty, having taken the same into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Proclamation do take effect and come into force in such of the said colonies, possessions,

and dominions wherein proclamation shall have been made or shall be made for decrying the same copper monies from the date named in such last-mentioned Proclamation.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the requisite directions for causing publication to be made thereof in Her Majesty's said colonies and possessions, and for the other purposes referred to therein accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, after reciting that We had taken into consideration the state of the copper coin of this Kingdom, and had deemed it expedient, with the advice of Our Privy Council, that all copper monies of this Realm, commonly called a penny, a half-penny, a farthing, and a half-farthing, coined at Our Mint and current in Our dominions by virtue of any Proclamation prior to the seventeenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty, should be called in and re-coined: And further reciting that considerable quantities of the said copper monies before mentioned had been received and exchanged at Our Mint, so that only a small portion of such monies was remaining in circulation at the date aforesaid, We did, with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare and command that no copper monies whatsoever (other than and except such bronze monies as were then and are now current by virtue of Our Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty, or any Proclamation dated subsequently to the said seventeenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty) should be allowed to pass or be current in any payment whatsoever within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland after the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine: Now therefore, by this Our Royal Proclamation, and with the advice of Our Privy Council, We do think proper to declare and command, and We do hereby declare and command accordingly that, in whatsoever of Our colonies, plantations, possessions, and dominions there be current copper monies of this Realm, commonly called a penny, a half-penny, a farthing, and a half-farthing, other than and except such bronze monies as aforesaid, such copper monies be no longer allowed to pass or be current in any payment whatever within any of the said colonies, plantations, possessions, and dominions wherein proclamation shall have been made or shall be made for decrying the same copper monies from the date named in such Proclamation.

THE following information relative to the new harbor in Trinity Bay has been received from the Harbor Master at Port Hinchinbrook:—

The entrance to the river is shown on the Admiralty Chart, and lies south-west from False Cape. In the channel over the bar there is 9 feet at low water, with a rise of 12 feet at springs.

To enter, bring the eastern head of the river mouth to bear S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., and steer that course. When within about one mile of the Heads the water will deepen to 4 fathoms, which depth will be carried into the river.

REVOKED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by two several proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the twenty-second day of January and the fourteenth day of May in the year 1866, the cutting or removing of live timber, or bark, or stone, or gravel, from Crown lands situated within the parish of Wurdí-Youang described in such proclamations was prohibited: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the prohibition against the removal of stone and gravel: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamations hereinbefore-mentioned, so far as regards the removal of stone and gravel.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE NEWSTEAD TOWN COMMON.

THE Council of the Shire of Newstead, by virtue of the power vested in it under the regulations issued by the Governor in Council under *The Land Act 1869*, No. 360, has this day made the following regulations for the management of the Newstead Town Common:—

1. *Persons entitled to commonage.*—Householders residing within the township of Newstead and within one mile thereof.
2. *Number of cattle allowed.*—Each person entitled to the privileges of this common shall be allowed to depasture four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.
3. *Special licenses.*—Special licenses to depasture sheep intended for slaughter will be issued to any butcher approved of by the managers, the number not to exceed one hundred sheep at one time; fee thirty-three shillings per quarter.
4. *Depasturing fees.*—The fees for depasturing cattle shall in all cases be paid in advance, and shall be as follows (viz.):—Large cattle four shillings per head, small cattle one shilling and fourpence per head for twelve months.
5. *Bulls and entire horses.*—No bulls, entire horses, or pigs, will be allowed to depasture on the common.
6. *Cattle to be produced by owners in mustering.*—All cattle intended for depasturing upon the common shall be produced to the herdsman by the owner, either at the common yard or on the owner's premises, for branding and registration.
7. *Receipt for cattle.*—The herdsman shall give a block receipt for all cattle registered by him.
8. *Goats.*—No person shall be allowed to run more than six head of goats upon the common.
9. *Common register.*—The common register shall be open, at the secretary's office, for the inspection of any person who shall have stock running upon the common, at all reasonable hours, without fee.
10. *Contagious disease.*—No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed upon the common.
11. *Herdsman's report.*—The herdsman shall pay over to the treasurer all monies received by him on account of the common within two weeks of their receipt, and shall furnish a written report to each monthly meeting of the managers. If, however, any special contingency arises in the interim of the meetings, imperilling the interests of the common, he shall, without delay, report the same to the managers through their secretary.
12. *Dead cattle.*—No dead cattle shall remain on the common; should such not be removed within twenty-four hours after notice has been given to the owner, they shall be removed at the owner's expense.
13. *Penalty.*—Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight  
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, borough, town, district, or place in Victoria a city, borough, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of any Act then or thereafter to be in force relating to the registration of brewers and spirit merchants' premises, and from time to time to revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the township of Branhholme a place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, may be registered.

That sections numbers 2 and 3 of Part ix. of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, and Part No. xi. of said 13th schedule, excepting alterations of sub-sections of No. 3 as described below, and the excision of section No. 31 of said Part No. xi., be hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Cranbourne.

#### BYE-LAW No. 1.

##### PART IX.—SECTIONS 2 AND 3.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

2. If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage, the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### BYE-LAW No. 2.

##### PART XI.—REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:

1. Payments.
2. Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
3. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
4. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
5. Presentation of reports of committees.
6. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
7. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
8. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
9. Ordinary business.
10. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion-book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment will be withdrawn without leave of the council.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman or councillor as the case may require.

18. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative,

then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or upon an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

32. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

33. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

34. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

35. *Motion of adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

36. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

37. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

38. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

39. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committee.

40. *Meetings of the committee.*—The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

41. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

42. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

43. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

44. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

45. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

46. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

47. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

48. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

49. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

50. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municip-

ality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

51. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

52. *Miscellaneous.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

53. *Treasurer to disburse moneys in certain cases.*—It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds.

54. *Common seal.*—The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council or in the absence of such chairman unless two councillors be present.

55. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

56. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
