DESERTERS FROM BRAZILIAN AND TUNISIAN MERCHANT SHIPS.

THE accompanying Orders of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, which have been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of His Majesty the Emperor of Brazil.

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the empire of Brazil shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of His most Serene Highness Mohammed Essadock Bey, Lord of the Regency of Tunis.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the Regency of Tunis, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TREATY OF COMMERCE AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ITALY.

DECLARATION prolonging the duration of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Her Majesty and the King of Italy of the 6th of August 1863.

Signed at Rome, 22 May 1876.

WHEREAS the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of 6th August 1863, would cease to be in force on the 26th June 1876, in consequence of a denunciation made by the Italian Government, and the two Governments having recognized the utility of prolonging its duration, the undersigned, duly authorized to this effect, have agreed to declare as follows:—

The Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Italy of the 6th August 1863, will continue to remain in force until the 30th April 1877.

In faith of which they have signed the present Declaration, made in duplicate, and have affixed their seals.

Done at Rome, on the 22nd of May 1876.

SNAG ON BULLER BAR.

SHIPMASTERS visiting the Buller River, Westport, are requested to pay particular attention to the leading marks for crossing the bar, which are as follow:—

During the Day.

The white beacon surmounted by a red flag and the flagstaff in one, bearing at present S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. (magnetic) leads over the bar from seaward.

During the Night.

A red light on the beacon kept in one with the bright white light on flagstaff leads over the bar, on same bearing as above (S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.). Those marks are placed to clear the snag, hence the necessity of keeping them in one as nearly as possible until the bar is passed, which may be known by the water deepening. The semaphore arm on flagstaff should also be attended to if moved by the signalman. As far as can be ascertained at present from soundings taken, the snag seems to have some ten feet on it at high-water neap tides, and the trunk appears to be only a foot to eighteen inches above the bottom.

TORRES STRAIT.

THE following information has been received from Commander G. P. Heath, R.N., Portmaster at Brisbane, 1876.¹

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1876.]
Melanie Rock, eastward of Pison Islands, has 3 feet water on it, is about half a mile in extent, and half-moon shaped. The peak of North Bay point kept to the eastward of the peak

1622 feet high near Cape Bowen, leads to the westward of the rock.

Duffield Rock.—A rock awash at low water has been reported by Captain Duffield to exist in lat. $10^{\circ} 30' S.$, long. $142^{\circ} 50' E.$, about 12 miles north-eastward of Mount Adolphus Islands.

Hannah Bank.—A sandbank (approximate position $9^{\circ} 51' S.$, $140^{\circ} 36' E.$ on which there is a *boche-de-mer* station, has been reported by Captain Hannah to lie 7 miles E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the south-easternmost of Bourke Islands. The bank is situated near the south-western end of a reef 4 miles long, N.E. and S.W., and 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles wide. A series of reefs extends thence nearly 8 miles to the north-east in the direction of Canoe Cay, as far as the south entrance of Darnley Island channel.

Shoal Ground.—Soundings of 4 and 7 fathoms were obtained upon a rocky shoal in lat. $9^{\circ} 24\frac{1}{2}' S.$, long. $143^{\circ} 55\frac{1}{2}' E.$, the centre of the shoal bearing N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the dry sandbank which lies to the north-east of Darnley Island. The shoal ground extends 2 miles N.W. by N. and S.E. by S., but is less than a quarter of a mile wide.

Bramble Cay—Anchorage.—To vessels entering Torres Strait from the eastward late in the day it is preferable to anchor near Bramble Cay, rather than to stand on after dark for anchorage under Stephens Islet, where the water is deeper and the holding ground not so good.

Three Sisters.—A shoal, with apparently $2\frac{1}{2}$ or 3 fathoms water, lies to the southward of Three Sisters, with Poll Islet bearing N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., sandbank S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Warrior Island.—A coral reef surmounted by a sandbank which is awash at low water, lies W.N.W. $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the north end of Warrior Island. The reef is a mile long N.N.W. and S.S.E.

Dangers.—A small rock, nearly awash, lies in the following position, namely: lat. $90^{\circ} 40\frac{1}{2}' S.$, long. $142^{\circ} 56\frac{1}{2}' E.$

Another rock, nearly awash, lies in lat. $9^{\circ} 38' S.$, long. $142^{\circ} 57\frac{1}{2}' E.$

A rocky shoal upon which the *Chevert*, drawing 15 feet, touched, extends 2 miles south-westward from the sandbank which is shown on the chart in lat. $9^{\circ} 15\frac{1}{2}' S.$, long. $143^{\circ} 3\frac{1}{2}' E.$ A series of coral reefs, dry at low water, and shoals with channels between, were found between this sandbank and the coast of New Guinea.

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

Positions of Boscawen and Keppel Islands and of Curaçoa Reef.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 47, dated 21st April 1876, on the positions of Boscawen and Keppel Islands and Curaçoa Reef:—the following is an amendment in regard to the positions contained in that Notice, viz.:—

Boscawen Island (central part) lat. $15^{\circ} 52' S.$, long. $173^{\circ} 50' W.$
Keppel Island " " $15^{\circ} 58' S.$, " $173^{\circ} 52' W.$
Curaçoa Reef " " $15^{\circ} 31' S.$, " $173^{\circ} 44' W.$

Curaçoa Bank.—Resulting from the re-investigation of the the above positions:—the 10 fathoms bank sounded on in H.M.S. *Curaçoa* in 1865 has been placed S. $38^{\circ} E.$ $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Curaçoa Reef, or in lat. $15^{\circ} 40' S.$ long. $173^{\circ} 40' W.$

Reported Shoal near Fiji Islands.

The Colonial Government of New South Wales has given notice, that Captain Wilson of the schooner *Zephyr* reports the existence of an extensive shoal, on which there was a rock awash. Position (deduced from indifferent observations) lat. $15^{\circ} 58' S.$, long. $177^{\circ} 10' W.$

[The bearing is magnetic. Variation $9\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1876.]

BANKS STRAIT—TASMANIA.

(1) *Sunken Rocks off Eddystone Point.*

Information has been received from Staff Commander Henry Stanley, R.N., in charge of Admiralty Survey, Victoria, of the existence of three outlying dangers (*Victoria Rocks*) off Eddystone Point, Tasmania, viz.:—

One rock, with 5 feet of water on it at low water, lying E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. two-thirds of a mile from the point, and N.N.E., half a mile from Eddystone Rock. The second rock with 14 feet on it, east, one mile from Eddystone Point, and N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.,

NEW ZEALAND—MIDDLE ISLAND—OTAGO HARBOR.

Leading Lights for Outer Bar.

The Colonial Government of New Zealand has given notice, that from the 1st April 1876 two leading lights would be exhibited from towers erected on the sides of the two beacons hitherto used as a leading mark for crossing the outer bar.

The towers bear from each other N.N.E. and S.S.W., distant 300 yards.

The upper, or inner, light is a *fixed green* light, elevated 86 feet above the level of the sea. The lower, or seaward, light is a *fixed white* light, elevated 26 feet above the sea. A small *fixed red* light, not visible seaward, would be exhibited on the red and white beacon at the Pilot Station inside Tairoa Head.

Light-vessel inside Inner Bar.

A light-vessel is moored on the south edge of the sand flat extending from the Sand Spit in 12 feet at low water spring tides, at a distance of about one and half cables S.W. by S. from the first red beacon.

Fog Signal on Tairoa Head.

In thick or foggy weather a *gong* will be sounded on Tairoa Head every fifteen seconds.

NOTE.—The leading lights in line S.S.W. lead over the outer bar until the red light at the Pilot Station opens out, when the course should be altered for Harrington Point; and passing half way between it and the Sand Spit, continue a mid-channel course between the buoys on the inner bar; the light-vessel should be left on the starboard hand about 70 yards off.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

SHIRE OF WARANGA.

Regulations for the Management of the Commons within the Shire of Waranga, called the Mooropna and Toolamba Commons respectively, under "The Land Act 1869."

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chap. xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Waranga, as managers of the commons within the shire, have submitted to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the Mooropna and Toolamba commons respectively, that is say—

In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen,

steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, over 18 months old; the words "small cattle" any of the aforesaid under 18 months old and sheep; and the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture or dairying land held by that person either in fee or under lease or license.

Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and farmers within the shire shall be respectively entitled to depasture on the aforesaid commons situated within a distance of five miles from their place of residence, four head of large cattle, or their equivalent, of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one tenth portion of the land occupied by him, shall be allowed to depasture on such commons one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent of small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

The fees to be paid for depasturing on the said commons shall be as follows, viz. :—

1. For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer at the rate of four shillings per annum.

2. For every mare, gelding, colt or filly, ass or mule, at the rate of six shillings per annum.

3. For every head of small cattle, at the rate of one shilling and fourpence per annum.

4. All fees shall be paid annually in advance, and all cattle running on the common seven days after the period for which payment has been made shall be impounded.

5. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to run on the said common. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

6. The managers may, from time to time, employ and remove such persons as herdsmen, or otherwise, as they may deem requisite, and pay them out of the common fees, and such persons shall find security, to the satisfaction of the managers, for the due execution of their duties, and in case any cattle shall be missed from the said commons of Mooropna and Toolamba, it shall be the duty of the herdsmen, as soon as possible and within seven days of the same being missed by him, to give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle.

7. The managers shall keep books in the form prescribed in schedule 24 of the Regulations of 26th May 1873, in which books shall be recorded the description and brands of the cattle depastured on the commons, the money received as commonage fees, the payments made from the funds derived therefrom, the dates of such payments, and the authority for making them, and shall give printed receipts in the form prescribed in the said schedule consecutively numbered, the butts of which receipts must be retained for inspection.

8. The managers may make such arrangements as they may deem necessary for receiving and branding cattle, and for returning the same to the owner thereof, and it shall be the duty of the herdsmen to afford every facility in finding and returning such cattle.

9. At the time of placing cattle on the common the owner thereof shall make a declaration setting forth the extent of land in his or her occupation, together with the number of acres under cultivation, and give the herdsmen a memorandum in writing of the number, brands, and description of the cattle so placed on the commons, and all such cattle shall have the owner's fire brands thereon.

10. Cattle shall not be taken off the commons without notice to the herdsmen from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure in a quiet way, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsmen shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

11. Any person having right of commonage, or the managers of any neighbouring common, may register with the herdsmen of the said commons of Mooropna and Toolamba the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose for every head of cattle so registered; and such cattle if found on such commons shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or persons registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from such notice being given, otherwise they shall be impounded.

12. No diseased cattle shall be placed upon the commons, and cattle becoming diseased after being placed thereon shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsmen to the owner thereof, and in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner.

13. The managers of the commons shall not be responsible for any cattle placed on the commons.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for such offence.

PLEASANT CREEK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PLEASANT CREEK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

(Made under the provisions of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, No. 201.)

1. All the charges must be paid to the sexton when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
4. Order for interment to be given either to the sexton, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fee. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them.
6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
10. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
15. No interment shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age.
