FREEMAN'S CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

As in the Middle Channel, during strong easterly and south-easterly winds, a short breaking sea runs, which, from the present direction of the Channel, is at times nearly abeam and

liable to break on board vessels while entering; two red buoys, which are to be passed on the starboard hand at about a ship's length, are again laid down in Freeman's Channel.

There is not less than 10 feet in this channel at low water springs, so that most of the coasting steamers can make use of it in safety in bad weather, when the other channels into Moreton Bay are more or less dangerous.

The depth in this channel at low water will be kept posted up at the Port Office, and any change will be duly notified.

By His Excellency Sin George Ferrorson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might fire heshould think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation. And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of December 1872 the parish of Kapong, in the shire of Minhamite, was constituted a district in which certificates from the serion of proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1872 the West Riding of the Shire of Minhamite was constituted a district in which similar certificates might be granted: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the above mentioned proclamations, so far as they relate to the district above named: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria

IN pursuance of the provisions of The Local Government Act 1874 (No. 506, \$46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The signatures to the petition are twelve in number, and the petitioners state that they are a majority of the ratepayers resident in the eastern portion of the parish of Barnawartha, in the shire of Yackandandah; that owing to remoteness from the seat of local government they have little or no voice in or benefit from the expenditure of the municipal funds; they have no interest in common with Yackandandah which they have with Wodonga; and the reasons which suggested the separation from Yackandandah of the localities now forming the Shire of Wodonga have equal force as regards their

locality, and while attached to Yackandandah they are virtually deprived of the privileges of local solf-government.

"Your memorialists pray that you may be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by section 19 of The Local Government Act 1874, and separate the hereinafter described portion of territory from the Shire of Yackandandah, said portion of territory containing an area of about 18 square miles, and including rateable property cabable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof a sum of Thirty pounds (£30), and cause the same to be annexed to the shire of Wodonga.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign. called The Public Health amendment Act 1876, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the Government Gazette extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the Borough of Dunolly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sin George, Errouson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1899 it was amongst other things enacted, that not withstanding anything therein-before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove timber or bark as in the following description, viz., any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground are of less diameter than twelve inches, or the removal of bark from such trees, on or from any Crown lands within a radius of ten miles from the Post Office in the city of Ballarat.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE JOYCE'S CREEK AND CAPTAIN'S GULLY, GREEN GULLY, AND STRANGWAYS FARMERS' COMMONS.

FARMERS' COMMONS.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act, by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Newstead, as managers of the Joyce's Creek and Captain's Gully, Green Gully, and Strangway's Commons, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said commons: said commons:-

- 1. Persons entitled to commonage.—Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common shall be entitled to deposture eattle thereon.
- 2. Number of cattle allowed.—Each person entitled to the privileges of these commons shall be entitled to depasture four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him shall be entitled to depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land held by him.
- acres of such land held by him.

 3. Depasturing f-es.—The fees for depasturing cattle shall in all cases be paid in advance, and shall be as follows:—Large cattle Four shillings per head, small cattle One shilling and fourpence per head, for twelve months.

 4. Bulls and entire horses.—No bulls, entire horses, or rigs will be allowed to depasture on the common.

 5. Cattle to be produced by owners in mustering.—All cattle intended for depasturing upon the common shall he produced to the herdsman by the owner, either at the common yard or on the owner's premises, for branding and registration.

 6. Receipt for cattle.—The herdsman shall give a block receipt.

- 6. Receipt for cattle.—The herdsman shall give a block receipt for all cattle registered by him.
- 7. Goats.—No person will be allowed to run more than six head of goats upon the common.

- 8. Common register.—The common register shall be open, at the secretary's office, for the inspection of any person who shall have stock running upon the common, at all reasonable hours, without fee.
- 9. Contagious disease.—No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed upon the common.
- tagious disease shall be allowed upon the common.

 10. Herdsman's report.—The herdsman shall pay over to the treasurer all moneys received by him on account of the common within two weeks of their receipt, and shall furnish a written report to each monthly meeting of the managers; if, however, any special contingency arise in the interim of the meetings imperilling the interests of the common, he shall without delay report the same to the managers through their secretary. secretary.
- 11. No dead cattle shall remain on the common; should such not be removed within twenty-four hours after notice has been given to the owner, they shall be removed at the owner's
- 12. Penalty. Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

BYE-LAW No. 6.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Wangaratta, made under section 479 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 6, for requiating the Market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and in the immediate approaches thereto. (2.) For fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held. (3.) For licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the borough, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licenses. And (4) for regulating the use of the weighing machines provided by the council, and for presenting the use of false or defective weights, scales, and measures.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wangaratta order as follows:—

- 1. That a free monthly market, for the sale of stock, and farm, dairy, and garden produce, shall be held on Thursday the 26th day of October 1876, and on the last Thursday (Christmas Day excepted) in each succeeding month, from Six o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m.
- 2. That the market shall be open on every other lawful day from Six a.m. to Six p.m., for the sale of cattle and other live stock, subject to such tolls and dues as the council may from time to time by "special order" appoint.
- 3. That the council may, upon application, license yards and premises within the borough for the sale of cattle and other live stock therein, at such times only as the market-yards may prove inadequate.
- 4. That the sum of Five shillings be the amount to be paid for each such license.
- 5. That the weighbridge situated in front of the Royal Hotel, Wangaratta, shall be the market weighbridge, and be used, subject to such tolls and dues as the council may from time to time by "special order" appoint.
- time to time by "special order" appoint.

 6. That the council shall appoint a market inspector, who shall also be inspector of provisions and coliector, and whose duties shall, inter alia, be as follows:—(1.) To see that the market regulations be observed. (2.) To demand and receive all market tolls and dues, and pay same over to the borough treasurer within forty-eight, hours of receiving. (3.) To allot the principal and drafting yards, pens, &c. to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient. (4.) To preserve order, cleanliness, and regularity in the market, and to take proceedings against all persons causing a riot or disturbance, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of the market. (5.) To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.

 7. That every person who shall obstruct the inspector or his
- 7. That every person who shall obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duties, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling; and, in addition thereto, shall pay the cost of repairing or making good any such damage.

 8. That any nerson who may be found drunk or disorderly
- 8. That any person who may be found drunk or disorderly within the market, or cursing or swearing, or using gross or profane language, or abusive language therein, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Forty shillings sterling.
- 9. That the parties or party placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues and tolls accruing thereon; and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all dues, tolls, and charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.
- 10. That all cattle brought to the market for sale shall be yarded before Nine a.m., and removed between the hours of Half-past Two and Four p.m., or between Five and Six p.m.
- Half-past Two and Four p.m., or between Five and Six p.m.

 11. That sales of stock by anction in the market shall take place in order of priority, to be determined as follows, viz.—So soon as may be after Nine a.m. on each market day the auctioneers having sales to make shall, under the superintendence of the inspector, draw lots for precedence, and the order so determined shall be maintained throughout that day, provided that no auctioneer shall be entitled to occupy the rostrum for a longer period than one hour at a time, but shall then, if required, give place to the next (if any) entitled to precedence; and any auctioneer infringing this arrangement shall be deemed guilty of obstructing the inspector in the discharge of his duties.

Minutes of Meeting to be Read at next Subsequent Meeting.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

Order of Business at Meetings.

- 3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

 (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.

 - (2.) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon
 - (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
 - (4.) Presentation of reports of committees.
 - (5.) Payments.
 - (6.) Ordinary business.
 - (7.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 - (8.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
 - (9.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
 - (10.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Divisions.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman. Address to Governor.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council. Motions.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council, and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

Notice of Motion to be given.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

Petitions.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

Motions to be Moved in Order in Motion Book.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

Motion to be proceeded with by Councillor giving same except with consent.

with consent.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

Draft of Address or Petition to be Submitted at Previous Meeting.

11: No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

Order, &c., of Debate.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Nature of Motion to be Stated.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

Motion not to be Withdrawn without Leave.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

Motion to be Seconded.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

Mover of Motion.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

Designation of Councillors.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

Priority of Councillors.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman to Rise in Addressing Council.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

Councillor not to speak Second Time on same Question.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

Points of Order.

21. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Councillors not to Digress, &c.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

Councillors to Apologise for Disorderly, &c., Expression.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

Councillor called to Order to Sit Down.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

Councillor twice Offending Guilty of an Offence

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an afferm.

Councillor not Attending Order for Call. -

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

Councillor may Demand Documents.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Question how Declared.

30. The chairman shall in taking the sense of the council put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

Motions, i.e., to be in Writing.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

No Second Amendment until Previous one Disposed of.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

Effect of Rejection of Words in Original Motion.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next

question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

If Amendment be Negatived a Second one may be Moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

Motion for Adjournment.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Protests.

Protests.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against: and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

Lapsed Questions.

Lapsed Questions.

38. If a debate or any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Committees.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

Meetings of the Committee.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

Petitions.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

Petitions to be Respectful.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

Councillors to Affix their Names.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

Petitions to be in Writing.

45. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

To be Signed by Petitioners.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

No Letters, &c., to be Attached.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

. Councillors Confined to Statement of Certain Facts.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

Appointments, &c., of Officers.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

Salaries of Officers, &c.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesuid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

No Councillor, &c., to be Surety for Officer.

51. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

Expense of Preparing Security.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

Miscellaneous.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same heing considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

Treasurer to disburse Moneys in certain cases.

Treasurer to disburse Moneys in certain cases.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds.

Common Seal.

Common Seal.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman unless two councillors be present.

Suspension of Rules.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

Penalty.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
