#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

FRIDAY THE 29TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday within the United Shire of Beechworth.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

### SOUTH AUSTRALIA.—REGULATIONS AS TO THE SPECIAL IN- TRODUCTION OF CERTAIN SHEEP FROM VICTORIA TO THIS PROVINCE.

1st. An application must be made to the Chief Inspector of Sheep, Adelaide, for permission to introduce sheep, stating their number, description, and brands, endorsed by border inspector where possible, as coming from a healthy station; such application to be accompanied by a fee of *One penny per head* for the number of sheep intended to be introduced.

2nd. Such application must also be accompanied by a declaration (as usual in Victoria) that the sheep are clean and sound, and have been depastured on the same station for twelve months preceding the date of such application, and that no straggle or unsound sheep have been in contact with them.

3rd. One week's notice to the district inspector of the date of arrival of sheep at the boundary must be given. An inspector, if satisfied, after examination, that the sheep are clean and sound and the conditions fulfilled, will issue a certificate of health, authorizing such sheep to travel into South Australia to a destination to be stated.

4th. All sheep intended to be so introduced must be branded with the letter V in red paint.

5th. All sheep introduced by sea will require to be dipped twice, and put in quarantine for fourteen days, as previously done.

### HORSES FOR THE INDIAN ARMY.

The purchases will, except under special circumstances, be made only between the 1st October and 1st April.

Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, four to seven years.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

The births of 718 children, viz., 363 boys and 355 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 698 births were registered, or 20 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in August numbered 360, viz., 210 of males and 150 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 358. The deaths were less than those in August by 117, but exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 61. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been only 6 above the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 70.4° on the 28rd, and the lowest was 34.0° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (49.9°) was the same as the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.9°) took place on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 68.0° to a minimum of 40.1°. The least range (8.3°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 53.8° to a minimum of 45.5°. The mean daily range was 16.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.036 inches) was above the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent. and females 42 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Thirty-two per cent. of that mortality was of children under the age of 5 years, as against 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874 and in August 1873; 32½ per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; 41 per cent. in August 1870; 35 per cent. in August 1869; 43 per cent. in August 1868; 39 per cent. in August 1867; and 44 per cent. in August 1866.

Sixteen deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a plasterer aged 75, who died of paralysis; a housewife aged 75, of old age; a female cook aged 76, of enteritis; a bootmaker aged 77, of disease of the brain; two females, each aged 78, of bronchitis and old age respectively; two laborers, each aged 79, of fatty

degeneration of the heart and bronchitis respectively; a housewife, aged 79, of old age; a female inmate of the Kew Lunatic Asylum, aged 80, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 88, of bronchitis; a brickmaker, aged 84, of apoplexy; a plasterer, aged 84, of paralysis; two females, aged 84 and 85 respectively, and a carrier, aged 90, of old age.

Of the deaths recorded during the month, 21 were from external causes. 16 of these were set down as accidental, 2 as homicidal, and 3 as suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A newly-born male infant died of fracture of the skull (no evidence to show how caused); a male cook, aged 16, also died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a gangway; a farmer, aged 45, was accidentally killed by the kick of a horse; a grocer, aged 68, was killed by the upsetting of a dray; a seaman, aged 56, died of accidental fracture of the skull; a gingerbeer maker, aged 72, died of fracture of the leg; an engineer, aged 19, died of the result of an accidental injury to the leg received at the Victorian Railways; a bricklayer, aged 33, died of lockjaw, the result of an accidental injury; a male child, aged 1, died of scalds; a female, aged 40, died of burns, her clothes having caught fire; a painter, aged 42, died of lead poisoning; a mariner, aged 39, a stonemason, aged 60, and a coal merchant, aged 66, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a male inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, aged 42, died of suffocation, caused by "mud getting into the air-pipes;" and a female infant, aged 2 months, was accidentally suffocated in bed. A female infant died of suffocation at birth, caused by neglect of the mother, who was committed for trial for manslaughter; and a boy, aged 7, was passed over by a spring-cart, the driver of which was committed for trial for manslaughter. The suicidal deaths were all committed by persons of unsound mind, and were those of a female, aged 30, who cut her throat; of a female, aged 62, who poisoned herself with arsenic; and of a groom, aged 34, who hanged himself.

Eighty-four deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—42 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 117, of which 71, or 61 per cent., were of males; and 46, or 39 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 65 were under one year of age, 18 were between one and two, 19 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 243. Of these, 139, or 57 per cent., were males, and 104, or 43 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 17 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 12 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

Eight deaths were caused by typhoid fever as against 17 in July and 42 deaths by phthisis as against 59 in that month. One death resulted from metria and 1 from the consequences of childbirth. Two other deaths also occurred after childbearing, viz., 1 from scarlatina and 1 from phthisis.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the area of the United Borough, Goldfield, and Farmers' Common of Ararat and Cathcart, described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May 1870, by deducting therefrom the land in the Borough of Ararat, which has been temporarily reserved for Public purposes by Orders dated respectively 1st May 1865 and 25th September and 11th December 1871.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PITFIELD COMMON, SITUATED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.**

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chap. xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Grenville, as managers of the Pitfield Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works the following Regulations for the management of such common:

That ratepayers in the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of the common, may respectively depasture on the common four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle, on payment to the managers of the fees hereinafter prescribed, and provided that no person be allowed to depasture more than four goats.

That the fees for depasturing on the common shall be paid in advance, and shall be at the rate of six shillings per annum for horses, four shillings per annum for horned cattle, two shillings per annum for sheep, and two shillings per annum

for goats; and that the quarters shall commence respectively upon the first Saturday in the months of March, June, September, and December in each year.

That the managers shall appoint certain times and places for the registering and branding of cattle, shall give notice thereof, and shall by their herdsman attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid; and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle shall be in attendance with their cattle at the time and place appointed, for the purpose of assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such cattle before the same shall be branded.

That all cattle found upon the common not registered and without the common brand, shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be forthwith impounded, or the owners of such cattle may be proceeded against by summonses.

That no bull or entire horse shall be depastured without the sanction of the managers.

That no pigs shall be depastured on the common.

That the managers shall not be responsible for any loss or injury of or to any cattle depasturing on the common.

That the managers may destroy any goats found upon the common, unless such goats are registered and branded with the common brand, and unless the fees for the depasturing of such goats be duly paid.

That every person offending against any regulation for the management of the common shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

LIGHTS AT LITTLE SEA HILL, KEPPEL BAY.

TWO small Lights, which, when in line, cut the position of the Timandra Bank buoy, are now exhibited at Little Sea Hill, for the purpose of assisting vessels in rounding the Timandra Bank, and reaching the anchorage under Sea Hill Point at night.

Directions.—After passing the Keppel Rocks on a West course, as at present directed, be careful not to bring the two lights at the Pilot Station in line before crossing the line of lights at Little Sea Hill. When both these lines of lights are crossed, which should be done within a short distance of the point of intersection, the Timandra Bank buoy will be passed; then steer S.S.W. for the Lightship, and if intending to anchor under Sea Hill Point, haul up when the upper light is eclipsed on a S.E. by S. bearing, and steer S. by E. ½ E. While standing in, this light will again be visible, and when it bears N.E., anchorage will be found in 5 fathoms at low water.

It must be borne in mind that between Sea Hill Point and the Timandra Bank buoy both flood and ebb tides set strongly across the line of lights at Little Sea Hill.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned to be a part within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The Lyndhurst Riding of the Shire of Cranbourne.

## BELFAST GAOL.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864* (27 Vict. No. 219), it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (hereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same were situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also hereinafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of September instant it was declared that the buildings and premises at Belfast used as a gaol should cease to be a gaol: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation and to restore the said gaol: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and I do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify that the buildings and premises at Belfast hitherto used as a gaol are and shall be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

BYE-LAW No. 44 OF THE TOWN OF FITZROY, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874, FOR SUPPRESSING THE NUISANCE CAUSED BY ADVERTISING VEHICLES.

*A Bye-law of the Town of Fitzroy, made under the provisions of section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered forty-four, for suppressing the nuisance caused by advertising vehicles.*

WHEREAS the use of advertising vehicles in streets and thoroughfares is a nuisance, and it is necessary for the public safety to prevent the same, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Fitzroy, in pursuance of the powers for suppressing nuisances conferred by the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874, order as follows:—

"That from and after the date of this Bye-law coming into operation any person who shall carry about on any carriage, or on horseback, or on foot, in any thoroughfare or public place within the Town of Fitzroy, to the obstruction or annoyance of the inhabitants or passengers, any picture, placard, notice or advertisement, whether written, printed, or painted upon or posted or attached to any part of such carriage, or on any board or otherwise, shall on conviction thereof before any one or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10."

"That from and after the date of this Bye-law coming into operation any person who between any sunset and the following sunrise shall in upon or along any of the roads or streets within the Town of Fitzroy drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed at the off-side of the front of such vehicle and lighted, or any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, and merchandise, or of persons only, without having a good and serviceable lamp securely fixed and lighted at each side of the front of such vehicle, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding £5."

## BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.

BYE-LAW No. 26.

*Bye-law making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.*

THE Council of the Borough of Creswick doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £20 and under, £1 per annum.

(2) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £21 and not exceeding £50, £1 5s. per annum.

(3) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £100, £1 10s. per annum.

(4) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, £2 5s. per annum.

(5) On every house or tenement of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, £3 per annum.

(6) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £200, £3 15s. per annum.

(7) On every hotel of the annual value of £50 and under, £2 per annum.

(8) On every hotel of the annual value of £51 and not exceeding £100, £3 per annum.

(9) On every hotel of the annual value of £101 and not exceeding £150, £4 per annum.

(10) On every hotel of the annual value of £151 and not exceeding £200, £4 10s. per annum.

(11) On every hotel above the annual value of £200, £5 10s. per annum.

(12) Livery and coach horse stables, and other premises where horses are constantly kept, in addition to the above to be charged at the rate of 8s. per stall per annum.

(13) In hotels, one stall allowed for every £50 annual value, every additional stall to be charged at the rate of 8s. per annum.

(14) Water-troughs, £1 each per annum.

(15) Water supplied by meter, 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

(16) Water supplied at stand-pipes, Sixpence per load not exceeding 180 gallons.

2. All persons using water for other than domestic purposes must consume by meter, and shall provide such meter of approved gauge at their own expense; and in the event of the rate per meter not amounting to the rate as per valuation, the latter must in every instance be paid.

3. No person consuming water by meter shall remove or alter the position of such meter, or in any way interfere with the same, without the permission of the Council, nor until the registration of the quantity of water used has been taken.

4. If any meter should cease registering, during the time it is undergoing repair the Council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year; and if any person shall neglect to repair such meter after having received notice from any officer of the Council that such meter requires repairing, such person shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds per day for every day after such notice that such meter is not repaired.

5. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Council, he shall obtain from the Council a license in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such license shall be granted by the Council the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the sum of £1 as the fee for such license. The Council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Council, or shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Council, or in any way tamper or interfere with any pipe, service-pipe, valve, cock, or other portion of the waterworks the property of the Council, without the permission, in writing, signed by the Town Clerk on behalf of the Council being first obtained, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10. Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a

further penalty of Two pounds per day after notice of the offence from any officer of the Council.

11. The Council may make a special agreement with persons requiring water for steam boilers.

12. All rates and charges made or charged herein under the authority of the said Act shall be paid quarterly in advance; and in the event of any person failing to pay the same on demand, or in the event of any person quitting or removing from premises supplied with water without paying the rates, the said rate may be recovered in a summary way before a police magistrate by any person appointed by the Council to collect and recover the same.

13. In the construction of this Bye-law the word "Council" shall mean the Borough Council of Creswick.
