EXTRADITION OF BRITISH AND BELGIAN CRIMINALS.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty between Her Majesty and the King of the Belgians for the mutual surrender of Fugitive Criminals, as well as a copy of the Order in Council of the 21st ultimo, for carrying that Treaty into effect.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for amending the Law relating to the Extradition of Criminals*, and also by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to amend the Extradition Act 1870*, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twentieth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, between Her Majesty and the King of the Belgians, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians having judged it expedient, with a view to the more complete prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from the justice of their country, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up; their said Majesties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, John Savile Lumley, Esquire, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Her Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of the Belgians;

And His Majesty the King of the Belgians, the Count d'Aspremont-Lynden, Officer of His Order of Leopold, Commander of the Order of the Ernestine Branch of the House of Saxony, Grand Cross of the Orders of Leopold of Austria, of the Legion of Honour, of the Lion of the Netherlands, and of the White Eagle of Russia, &c., &c., Member of the Senate, His Minister of Foreign Affairs;

SA Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, ayant jugé opportun, afin de mieux assurer la répression des crimes dans leurs territoires respectifs, de se livrer réciproquement, sous certaines conditions, les personnes accusées ou condamnées du chef des crimes ci-après énumérés et qui auraient fui la justice de leur pays; les dites Majestés ont nommé pour leurs Plénipotentiaires, à l'effet de conclure un Traité dans ce but, savoir:—

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, John Savile Lumley, Esquire, Officier du Très Honorable Ordre du Bain, Son Envoyé Extraordinaire et Ministre Plénipotentiaire près Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges;

Et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, le Comte d'Aspremont-Lynden, Officier de Son Ordre de Léopold, Commandeur de l'Ordre de la Branche Ernestine de la Maison de Saxe, Grand Cordon des Ordres de Léopold d'Autriche, Grand-Croix des Ordres de la Légion, d'Honneur, du Lion Néerlandais, et de l'Aigle Blanc de Russie, &c., &c., Sénateur, Son Ministre des Affaires Etrangères;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

#### ARTICLE I.

It is agreed that Her Britannic Majesty and His Majesty the King of the Belgians shall, on requisition made in their name by their respective Diplomatic Agents, deliver up to each other reciprocally any persons, except as regards Great Britain, native born and naturalized subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, and, except as regards Belgium, those who are by birth or who may have become citizens of Belgium, who, being accused or convicted as principals or accessories of any of the crimes hereinafter specified, committed within the territories of the requiring party, shall be found within the territories of the other party:

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, and poisoning), or attempt to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
4. Forging, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged or counterfeited or altered.
5. Embezzlement or larceny.
6. Obtaining money or goods by false pretences.
7. Crimes by bankrupts against bankruptcy law.
8. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
9. Rape: Carnal knowledge of a girl under the age of ten years; carnal knowledge of a girl above the age of ten years and under the age of twelve years; indecent assault upon any female or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under twelve years of age.
10. Abduction.
11. Child stealing.
12. Kidnapping.
13. Burglary or housebreaking.
14. Arson.
15. Robbery with violence (including intimidation).
16. Threats by letter or otherwise with intent to extort.
17. Piracy by law of nations.

18. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting, or conspiring to do so.

19. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life or to do grievous bodily harm.

20. Revolt or conspiracy to revolt by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

21. Perjury and subornation of perjury.

22. Malicious injury to property, if the offence be indictable.

25. Aggravated or indecent assault.

Provided that the surrender shall be made only when in the case of a person accused, the commission of the crime shall be so established as that the laws of the country where the fugitive or person accused shall be found would justify his apprehension and commitment for trial if the crime had been there committed; and in the case of a person alleged to have been convicted, on such evidence as, according to the laws of the country where he is found, would prove that he had been convicted.

In no case can the surrender be made unless the crime shall be punishable according to the laws in force in both countries with regard to extradition.

#### ARTICLE II.

In the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty, other than the Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Majesty, the manner of proceeding shall be as follows:—

I. In the case of a person accused—

The requisition for the surrender shall be made to Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs by the minister or other diplomatic agent of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, accompanied by a warrant of arrest or other equivalent judicial document, issued by a judge or magistrate duly authorized to take cognizance of the acts charged against the accused in Belgium, together with duly authenticated depositions or statements taken on oath or upon solemn affirmation before such judge or magistrate, clearly setting forth the said acts, and containing a description of the person claimed, and any particulars which may serve to identify him. The said Secretary of State shall transmit such documents to Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, who shall then, by order under his hand and seal, signify to some police magistrate in London that such requisition has been made, and require him, if there be due cause, to issue his warrant for the apprehension of the fugitive.

Lesquels, après s'être communiqué réciproquement leurs pleins pouvoirs, reconnus en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des Articles suivants:—

#### ARTICLE I.

Il est convenu que Sa Majesté Britannique et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges sur, la demande faite en leur nom par leurs Agents Diplomatiques respectifs, se livreront réciproquement tous les individus, sauf relativement à l'Angleterre les sujets de Sa Majesté Britannique par naissance ou naturalisation, et relativement à la Belgique ceux qui sont nés ou naturalisés citoyens Belges, qui étant poursuivis ou condamnés comme auteurs ou complices, pour l'un des crimes ou délits ci-après spécifiés, commis sur le territoire de la partie requérante, seront trouvés sur le territoire de l'autre partie:

1. Meurtre (y compris l'assassinat, le parricide, l'infanticide, et l'empoisonnement) ou tentative de meurtre.
2. Homicide commis sans préméditation ou guet-apens.
3. Contrefaçon ou altération de monnaie, ainsi que mise en circulation de la monnaie contrefaite ou altérée.
4. Faux, contrefaçon, ou altération, ou mise en circulation de ce qui est falsifié, contrefait, ou altéré.
5. Soustraction frauduleuse ou vol.
6. Escroquerie d'argent, valeurs, ou marchandises sous de faux prétextes.
7. Crimes de banqueroutiers frauduleux prévus par la loi.
8. Détournement ou dissipation frauduleux au préjudice d'autrui, d'effets, deniers, marchandises, quittances, écrits de toute nature, contenant ou opérant obligation ou décharge, et qui avaient été remis à la condition de les rendre ou d'en faire un usage ou un emploi déterminé.
9. Viol: Attentat à la pudeur sur une jeune fille de moins de 12 ans, dans les cas prévus simultanément par la législation des deux pays.
10. Enlèvement de mineurs.
11. Enlèvement d'enfant.
12. Attentat à la liberté individuelle commis par des particuliers.
13. Vol avec effraction ou escalade.
14. Incendie.
15. Vol avec violence (comprenant l'intimidation).
16. Menaces d'attentat punissable d'une peine criminelle.
17. Prise d'un navire par les marins ou passagers par fraude ou violence envers le capitaine.
18. Echouement, perte, destruction, ou tentative d'échouement, de perte, ou de destruction d'un navire à la mer par le capitaine ou les officiers et gens de l'équipage.
19. Attaque ou résistance à bord d'un navire en haute mer avec violence et voies de fait envers le capitaine par plus du tiers de l'équipage.
20. Révolte ou complot de révolte par deux ou plusieurs personnes à bord d'un navire en haute mer, contre l'autorité du capitaine.
21. Faux serment, faux témoignage, et subornation de témoins.
22. Destruction ou dégradation de constructions, machines, plantations, récoltes, instruments d'agriculture, appareils télégraphiques, ouvrages d'art, navires, tombeaux; dommages causés volontairement au bétail et à la propriété mobilière, délits qui sont réprimés en Angleterre sous le nom de "malicious injuries to property."
23. (a.) Coups et blessures graves.
- (b.) Attentats à la pudeur sans violence sur des enfants au-dessous de dix ans.
- (c.) Attentats à la pudeur avec violence sur des personnes de l'un ou de l'autre sexe.

Toutefois, l'extradition ne sera accordée, dans le cas d'une personne accusée, que si la perpétration du crime est établie de telle façon que les lois du pays où le fugitif accusé sera trouvé justifieraient son arrestation et son emprisonnement si le crime avait été commis dans ce pays; et dans le cas d'une personne prétendument condamnée, que sur la production d'une preuve qui, d'après les lois du pays où le fugitif a été trouvé, établirait suffisamment qu'il a été condamné.

En aucun cas l'extradition ne pourra avoir lieu que lorsque le crime sera prévu par la législation sur l'extradition en vigueur dans les deux pays.

#### ARTICLE II.

Dans les Etats de Sa Majesté Britannique autres que les Colonies ou les possessions étrangères de Sa Majesté, la manière de procéder sera la suivante:—

A. En cas d'une personne accusée—

La demande d'extradition sera adressée au Premier Secrétaire d'Etat de Sa Majesté pour les Affaires Etrangères par le Ministre ou autre Agent Diplomatique de Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges. A cette demande seront joints un mandat d'arrêt ou autre document judiciaire équivalent, délivré par un Juge ou Magistrat dûment autorisé à prendre connaissance des actes imputés à l'accusé en Belgique, ainsi que les dépositions authentiques ou les déclarations faites sous serment ou sous affirmation solennelle devant ce Juge ou Magistrat, énonçant clairement les dits actes, et contenant, outre le signalement de la personne réclamée, toutes les particularités qui pourraient servir à établir son identité.

Le dit Secrétaire d'Etat transmettra ces documents au Premier Secrétaire d'Etat de Sa Majesté Britannique pour les Affaires Intérieures, qui, par un ordre de sa main et muni de son sceau, signifiera à l'un ou l'autre Magistrat de la Police à Londres que la demande d'extradition a été faite, et le requerra, s'il y a lieu, de délivrer un mandat pour l'arrestation du fugitif.

On the receipt of such order from the Secretary of State, and on the production of such evidence as would, in the opinion of the magistrate, justify the issue of the warrant if the crime had been committed in the United Kingdom, he shall issue his warrant accordingly.

When the fugitive shall have been apprehended he shall be brought before the police magistrate who issued the warrant, or some other police magistrate in London. If the evidence to be then produced shall be such as to justify, according to the law of England, the committal for trial of the prisoner, if the crime of which he is accused had been committed in England, the police magistrate shall commit him to prison to await the warrant of the Secretary of State for his surrender, sending immediately to the Secretary of State for a certificate of the committal and a report upon the case.

After the expiration of a period from the committal of the prisoner, which shall never be less than fifteen days, the Secretary of State shall, by order under his hand and seal, order the fugitive criminal to be surrendered to such person as may be duly authorized to receive him on the part of the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians.

#### II. In the case of a person convicted—

The course of proceeding shall be the same as in the case of a person accused, except that the warrant to be transmitted by the minister or other diplomatic agent in support of his requisition, shall clearly set forth the crime of which the person claimed has been convicted, and state the fact, place, and date of his conviction. The evidence to be produced before the police magistrate shall be such as would, according to the law of England, prove that the prisoner was convicted of the crime charged.

After the Police Magistrate shall have committed the accused or convicted person to prison to await the order of a Secretary of State for his surrender, such person shall have the right to apply for a writ of *habeas corpus*; if he should so apply, his surrender must be deferred until after the decision of the Court upon the return to the writ, and even then can only take place if the decision is adverse to the applicant.

### ARTICLE III.

In the dominions of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, other than the Colonies or Foreign Possessions of His said Majesty, the manner of proceeding shall be as follows:—

#### I. In the case of a person accused—

The requisition for the surrender shall be made to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of his Majesty the King of the Belgians by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty, accompanied by a warrant of arrest or other equivalent judicial document issued by a Judge or Magistrate, duly authorized to take cognizance of the acts charged against the accused in Great Britain, together with duly authenticated depositions or statements taken on oath or upon solemn affirmation before such Judge or Magistrate, clearly setting forth the said acts and containing a description of the person claimed, and any other particulars which may serve to identify him.

The Minister for Foreign Affairs shall transmit the warrant of arrest, with the documents thereto annexed, to the Minister of Justice, who shall forward the same to the proper judicial authority, in order that the warrant of arrest may be put in course of execution by the Chamber of the Council (*Chambre du Conseil*) of the Court of First Instance of the place of residence of the accused, or of the place where he may be found.

The foreigner may claim to be provisionally set at liberty in any case in which a Belgian enjoys that right, and under the same conditions. The application shall be submitted to the Chamber of the Council (*Chambre du Conseil*).

The Government will take the opinion of the Chamber of Indictments or Investigation (*Chambre des Mises en Accusation*) of the Court of Appeal, within whose jurisdiction the foreigner shall have been arrested.

The hearing of the case shall be public, unless the foreigner should demand that it should be with closed doors.

The public authorities and the foreigner shall be heard. The latter may obtain the assistance of counsel.

Within a fortnight from the receipt of the documents, they shall be returned, with a reasoned opinion, to the Minister of Justice, who shall decide and may order that the accused be delivered to the person duly authorized on the part of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty.

#### II. In case of a person convicted—

The course of proceeding shall be the same as in the case of a person accused, except that the conviction or sentence of condemnation issued in original or in an authenticated copy, to be transmitted by the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent in support of his requisition, shall clearly set forth the crime of which the person claimed has been convicted, and state the fact, place, and date of his conviction. The evidence to be produced shall be such as would, according to the Belgian laws, prove that the prisoner was convicted of the crime charged.

### ARTICLE IV.

A fugitive criminal may, however, be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the person issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant, if the crime had been committed or the prisoner convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which he exercises jurisdiction: Provided, however, that, in the United Kingdom, the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a police magistrate in London. He shall be discharged, as well in the United Kingdom as in Belgium, if within fourteen days a requisition shall not have been made for his surrender

A la réception d'un semblable ordre du Secrétaire d'Etat, et sur la production de telle preuve qui, dans l'opinion de ce Magistrat, justifierait l'émission du mandat si le crime avait été commis dans le Royaume Uni, il délivrera le mandat requis.

Lorsqu'alors le fugitif aura été arrêté, il sera amené devant le Magistrat de Police qui a lancé le mandat, ou devant un autre Magistrat de Police à Londres. Si la preuve qu'on produira est de nature à justifier, selon la loi Anglaise, la mise en jugement du prisonnier dans le cas où le crime dont il est accusé aurait été commis en Angleterre, le Magistrat de Police l'envoiera en prison pour attendre le mandat du Secrétaire d'Etat, nécessaire à l'extradition, et il adressera immédiatement au Secrétaire d'Etat une attestation de l'emprisonnement avec un rapport sur l'affaire.

Après l'expiration d'un certain temps, qui ne pourra jamais être moindre de quinze jours depuis l'emprisonnement de l'accusé, le Secrétaire d'Etat, par un ordre de sa main et muni de son sceau, ordonnera que le criminel fugitif soit livré à telle personne qui sera dûment autorisée à le recevoir au nom du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges.

#### II. S'il s'agit d'une personne condamnée—

La marche de la procédure sera la même que dans le cas d'une personne accusée, sauf que le mandat à transmettre par le Ministre ou autre Agent Diplomatique, à l'appui de la demande d'extradition, énoncera clairement le crime pour lequel la personne réclamée aura été condamnée, et mentionnera le fait, le lieu, et la date du jugement. La preuve à produire devant le Magistrat de Police sera telle que d'après la loi Anglaise elle établirait que le prisonnier a été condamné pour le crime dont on l'accuse.

Après que le Magistrat de Police aura envoyé la personne accusée ou condamnée en prison pour attendre l'ordre d'extradition du Secrétaire d'Etat, cette personne aura le droit de réclamer une ordonnance *d'habeas corpus*; l'extradition doit alors être différée jusqu'après la décision de la Cour sur le renvoi de l'ordonnance, et elle ne pourra avoir lieu que si la décision est contraire au demandeur.

### ARTICLE III.

Dans les Etats de Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, autres que les Colonies ou possessions étrangères de Sa dite Majesté, on procédera de la façon suivante:—

#### I. S'il s'agit, d'une personne accusée—

La demande d'extradition sera adressée au Ministre des Affaires Etrangères de Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges par le Ministre ou autre Agent Diplomatique de Sa Majesté Britannique; à cette demande seront joints un mandat d'arrêt ou autre document judiciaire équivalent délivré par un Juge ou Magistrat dûment autorisé à prendre connaissance des actes imputés à l'accusé dans la Grande Bretagne, ainsi que les dépositions authentiques ou les déclarations faites sous serment ou sous affirmation solennelle devant ce Juge ou Magistrat, énonçant clairement les dits actes, et contenant, outre le sigalement de la personne réclamée, toutes les particularités qui pourraient servir à établir son identité.

Le Ministre des Affaires Etrangères transmettra le mandat d'arrêt, avec les pièces annexées, au Ministre de la Justice, qui fera parvenir les documents à l'autorité judiciaire, à l'effet de voir rendre le dit mandat d'arrêt exécutoire par la Chambre du Conseil du Tribunal de Première Instance du lieu de la résidence de l'inculpé ou du lieu où il pourra être trouvé.

L'étranger pourra réclamer la liberté provisoire dans le cas où un Belge jouit de cette faculté et dans les mêmes conditions. La demande sera soumise à la Chambre du Conseil.

Le Gouvernement prendra l'avis, de la Chambre des Mises en Accusation de la Cour d'Appel dans le ressort de laquelle l'étranger aura été arrêté.

L'audience sera publique, à moins que l'étranger ne réclame le huis-clos.

Le Ministère public et l'étranger seront entendus. Celui-ci pourra se faire assister d'un Conseil.

Dans la quinzaine à dater de la réception des pièces, elles seront renvoyées avec l'avis motivé au Ministre de la Justice, qui statuera et pourra ordonner que l'inculpé soit livré à la personne qui sera dûment autorisée au nom du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique.

#### II. S'il s'agit d'une personne condamnée—

Le cours de la procédure sera le même que dans le cas d'une personne accusée, sauf que le jugement ou l'arrêt de condamnation délivré en original ou en expédition authentique, à transmettre par le Ministre ou l'Agent Diplomatique à l'appui de la demande d'extradition énoncera clairement le crime pour lequel la personne réclamée aura été condamnée et mentionnera le fait, le lieu, et la date du jugement. La preuve à produire sera telle que, conformément aux lois Belges, elle établirait que le prisonnier a été condamné pour le crime dont on l'accuse.

### ARTICLE IV.

Un criminel fugitif peut, cependant, être arrêté sur un mandat délivré par tout Magistrat de Police, Juge de Paix, ou autre autorité compétente dans chaque pays, à la suite d'un avis, d'une plainte, d'une preuve, ou de tout autre acte de procédure qui, dans l'opinion de la personne délivrant le mandat, justifierait ce mandat, si le crime avait été commis ou la personne condamnée dans la partie des Etats des deux Contractants où elle exerce juridiction: pourvu que, cependant, s'il s'agit du Royaume Uni, l'accusé soit, dans un pareil cas, envoyé aussi promptement que possible devant un Magistrat de Police à Londres. Il sera relâché, tant dans le Royaume Uni qu'en Belgique, si dans les quatorze jours une demande d'extradition n'a pas été faite par l'Agent Diplomatique de

by the Diplomatic Agent of his country, in the manner directed by Articles II. and III. of this Treaty.

The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes specified in this Treaty, committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

#### ARTICLE V.

If the fugitive criminal who has been committed to prison be not surrendered and conveyed away within two months after such committal (or within two months after the decision of the Court upon the return to a writ of *habeas corpus* in the United Kingdom), he shall be discharged from custody, unless sufficient cause be shown to the contrary.

#### ARTICLE VI.

When any person shall have been surrendered by either of the High Contracting Parties to the other, such person shall not, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the country from whence he was surrendered, be triable or tried for any offence committed in the other country prior to the surrender, other than the particular offence on account of which he was surrendered.

#### ARTICLE VII.

No accused or convicted person shall be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded shall be deemed by the party upon which it is made to be a political offence or to be an act connected with (*conneze à*) such an offence, or if he prove, to the satisfaction of the police magistrate, or of the Court before which he is brought on *habeas corpus*, or to the Secretary of State, that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or to punish him for an offence of a political character.

#### ARTICLE VIII.

Warrants, depositions, or statements on oath, issued or taken in the dominions of either of the two High Contracting Parties, and copies thereof, and certificates of or judicial documents stating the fact of conviction, shall be received in evidence in proceedings in the dominions of the other, if purporting to be signed or certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the county where they were issued or taken.

Provided such warrants, depositions, statements, copies, certificates, and judicial documents are authenticated by the oath or solemn affirmation of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of State.

#### ARTICLE IX.

The surrender shall not take place if, since the commission of the acts charged, the accusation, or the conviction, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the country where the accused shall have taken refuge.

#### ARTICLE X.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes committed upon their respective territories, his surrender shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date, unless any other arrangement should be made between the Governments which have claimed him, either on account of the gravity of the crimes committed or for any other reasons.

#### ARTICLE XI.

If the individual claimed should be under prosecution, or condemned by the Courts of the country where he has taken refuge, his surrender may be deferred until he shall have been set at liberty in due course of law.

In case he should be proceeded against or detained in such country, on account of obligations contracted towards private individuals, his surrender shall nevertheless take place, the injured party retaining his right to prosecute his claims before the competent authority.

#### ARTICLE XII.

Every article found in the possession of the individual claimed at the time of his arrest shall, if the competent authority so decide, be seized in order to be delivered up with his person at the time when the surrender shall be made. Such delivery shall not be limited to the property or articles obtained by stealing or by fraudulent bankruptcy, but shall extend to every thing that may serve as proof of the crime. It shall take place even when the surrender, after having been ordered, shall be prevented from taking place by reason of the escape or death of the individual claimed.

The rights of third parties with regard to the said property or articles are nevertheless reserved.

#### ARTICLE XIII.

Each of the High Contracting Parties shall defray the expenses occasioned by the arrest within its territories, the detention, and the conveyance to its frontier, of the persons whom it may consent to surrender in pursuance of the present Treaty.

#### ARTICLE XIV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the colonies and foreign possessions of the two High Contracting Parties.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as near as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the respective Governors or Chief Authorities, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender, or refer the matter to their Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Belgian criminals who may there take refuge, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

## ARTICLE XV.

The present Treaty shall come into operation ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the respective countries.

After the Treaty shall so have been brought into operation, the Treaty concluded between the High Contracting Parties on the 31st July 1872 shall be considered as cancelled, except as to any proceeding that may have already been taken or commenced in virtue thereof.

Either party may at any time terminate the Treaty on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention.

## ARTICLE XVI.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Brussels as soon as may be within six weeks from the date of signature.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Done at Brussels, the twentieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

## GENERAL RULES UNDER "THE TRADE-MARKS REGISTRATION ACT 1876."

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following General Rules under the provisions of section 9 of *The Trades Marks Registration Act 1876* (No. 539), viz. :—

1. The fees specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be payable to the Registrar-General.
  2. For the purposes of these rules, goods are classified in the manner appearing in the Second Schedule hereto. Classification of goods.
  3. If any question arise as to the class to which any particular description of goods belongs, the matter shall be determined by the Registrar-General. Determination of doubt as to classes.
  4. A trade-mark may be registered in pursuance of the same application by the same person in respect of all or any goods, subject to the payment of the additional fees specified in the First Schedule in respect of the registration of different trade-marks or the extension of the same trade-marks to goods in different classes. Registration of different trade-marks or trade-marks in different classes.
  5. Any person desiring to register a trade-mark shall make application to the Registrar-General in the form of the Third or Fourth Schedule hereto. The application to be on foolscap paper, having a margin on the left hand of not less than one inch and a half. Application for registration.
  6. A description of a trade-mark shall be given, and shall be accompanied when practicable by a drawing or other representation in duplicate, not more than three inches square, on foolscap paper, by pasting or otherwise fastening on such paper a specimen of the trade-mark. When a drawing or other representation or specimen cannot be given in manner aforesaid, a specimen or copy of the trade-mark may be sent either of full size or on a reduced scale. The Registrar-General may, if dissatisfied with the drawing or other representation of a trade-mark, require a fresh drawing or other representation either before he proceeds with the application or before he registers the trade-mark. Nature and size of representation of trade-mark.
- The Registrar-General may also in exceptional cases receive and keep in his office a specimen or copy of any trade-mark which cannot conveniently be placed on his register.
7. Any application for the registration of a trade-mark made by or on behalf of a corporate or quasi-corporate body, shall be made by the secretary or other principal officer of such body; and the Registrar-General may require such proof as he thinks fit that the application made is duly authorized by such body. Application by corporate body.
  8. As soon as may be after the receipt of an application, the Registrar-General shall require the applicant to advertise such application in the *Government Gazette*, and in such other newspaper as the Registrar-General may if he think necessary direct, during such time, in such form, and generally in such manner as the Registrar-General may determine. Advertisement of application.
  9. For the purposes of such advertisement, the applicant may be required to furnish the Government Printer and the printer of such other newspaper with a wood block or electrotype of the trade-mark of such dimensions or with such information or means of advertising the trade-mark as may be determined by the Registrar-General. Means of advertising trade-mark to be supplied.
  10. Notice of objection to any application may be given to the Registrar-General by sending the same in duplicate, on foolscap paper, stating the grounds of the objection. The Registrar-General shall send one copy of such notice to the applicant. Notice and proceedings for objection.
- Within three weeks after receipt of such notice, or such further time as the Registrar-General may allow, the applicant may send to the Registrar-General a counter-statement on foolscap paper; and if he fail to do so, his application shall be deemed to be withdrawn.
- If the applicant send such counter-statement, the Registrar-General shall require the objector to give sufficient security for such costs as may be awarded in respect of such objection; and if such security is not given within fourteen days after such requirement, or within such further time as the Registrar-General may allow, the objection shall be deemed to be withdrawn.
11. On the expiration of three months from the date of the first appearance of the advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, the Registrar-General may, if he is satisfied Time of registration of trade-mark.

that the applicant is entitled to registration, register the trade-mark in respect of the description of goods for which he may be entitled to be registered and the applicant as the proprietor thereof.

**Date of registration.** 12. When a trade-mark shall be registered, the date on which the application for registration was received by the Registrar-General shall be deemed to be the date of registration.

**Assignments.** 13. When a trade-mark has been assigned, any person claiming to be registered as assignee shall send to the Registrar-General an application in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall forward therewith an assignment by deed duly executed.

**Transmissions** 14. When a trade-mark is transmitted by operation of law, the person applying to be registered as the transmittee shall send to the Registrar-General an application in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

**Evidence to be produced on transmission** 15. When a person applies to be registered as the transmittee of any registered proprietor, or as the assignee of a transmittee, there shall be produced to the Registrar-General the following evidence :—

When the business concerned in the goods with respect to which the trade-mark is registered is carried on in Victoria—

- A. If such transmission has taken place by the death of any person—The probate of the will of such deceased person, or the letters of administration to his estate, or an office copy thereof.
- B. If such transmission has taken place by the marriage of the female proprietor—A certified copy of the register of such marriage or other legal evidence of the celebration thereof, and satisfactory evidence of the identity of such female proprietor ; and
- C. If such transmission has taken place by the insolvency of the registered proprietor or other operation of law—Such evidence as may for the time being be receivable as proof of the title of the applicant.

And when the business concerned is not carried on in Victoria, there shall be produced similar evidence to that hereinbefore prescribed, or such evidence as would be received as sufficient evidence in the Supreme Court of Victoria.

**Removal of trade-mark after seven years unless fee paid.** 16. At the expiration of seven years from the date of registration or within six months thereafter, unless the fees prescribed for continuance be paid, the trade-mark may be removed from the register.

**Payment of additional fee after expiration of seven years.** 17. If before the expiration of the said six months the registered proprietor pays the said fee, together with the additional prescribed fee, the Registrar-General may, without removing such trade-mark from the register, accept the said fee as if it had been paid before the expiration of the said seven years.

**Power of Registrar-General to restore trade-mark.** 18. When a trade-mark has been so removed from the register, the Registrar-General may, if he is satisfied that it is just so to do, restore such trade-mark to the register on payment of the additional fee prescribed and compliance with such conditions as he may think just.

**Trade-mark like one removed not to be registered for five years.** 19. Where a trade-mark has been removed from the register for non-payment of the fee or otherwise, such trade-mark shall nevertheless for five years after the date of such removal be deemed for the purpose of section 8 of the Act No. 539 to be a trade-mark which is already registered.

**Publication of rectification or alteration of register.** 20. Whenever the register is rectified or altered in any particular, the Registrar-General shall, if he consider that such rectification or alteration should be made public, publish, at the expense of any person interested, by advertisement or otherwise, the circumstances attending such rectification or alteration.

**Notice to Registrar-General of opposition in any matter.** 21. When any person objects to the registration of any assignee or transmittee or to any rectification or alteration of the register, the Registrar-General shall give to the applicant or his agent for such registration, rectification, or alteration the like notice, and may require security for costs in like manner as in the case of a notice of objection to the original registration of a trade-mark. The Registrar-General in such case may, if he think fit, require the parties interested to submit their claims to the Court.

**Submission to Court of conflicting claims.** 22. Where the Registrar-General refuses to comply with the claims of any persons until their rights have been determined by the Court, the manner in which the rights of such claimants



may be submitted to the Court by the Registrar-General, or by the claimants if the Registrar-General so require, shall, unless the Court otherwise order, be by a special case; and such special case shall be filed and proceeded with in like manner as any other special case submitted to the Court under the provisions of the *Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*, or any Act amending the same.

23. The special case may be agreed to by the parties, and, if they differ, may be settled by the Registrar-General. Settlement of special case.

24. Applications, statements, notices, and documents required by the Act No. 539 or by these rules to be served or sent shall be in writing or print, or partly in writing and partly in print, and may be delivered personally, or sent by post, and if sent by post shall be deemed to have been served and received respectively at the time when the letter containing the same would be delivered in the ordinary course of post; and in proving such service or sending, it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was prepaid, duly stamped, and put into the post properly addressed. Notices and service by post.

25. In these rules words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural and the plural the singular. Interpretation.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Heyfield Common by adding thereto the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS AT SANDRIDGE  
TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the Borough of Sandridge:

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The wood is to be split out of large forest timber (of suitable quality for lighting engine fires) into billets of convenient sizes for the use of the engines, and is to be cut into billets of 2 feet in length, and no small branches will be received.

The whole of the firewood, when delivered (whether for the Loco. or Pumping Engines), is to be stacked where pointed out, at the contractor's expense, in stacks of such sizes as will be directed, ready for measurement. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring, and the billets are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks, in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stacks.

A separate price is to be stated for delivery at each station, and tenderers must specify the description of wood, and, if mixed, in what proportion of kind. Delivery to commence on the acceptance of the tender.

Tenderers are to state the price at per ton of 50 cubic feet. No wood will be measured until it shall have been stacked fourteen days, so as to have settled down, and must then stand 5 feet high by 2 feet wide.

Tenders must be upon the printed forms, and no tender by telegram will be received.

Security will be required to the amount of ten per cent. on the total amount of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect. The security must be completed within ten days of the acceptance of tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, for Ten per cent. of the amount of the security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. The firewood is to be delivered at each place mentioned herein, and at the rate of at least 150 tons per week for the first four items above-mentioned, and 50 tons per week for the others.

For each and every week's delay in the delivery beyond the times specified in this contract the Government shall be entitled to deduct, as and for liquidated damages, the sum of Five pounds sterling.

The Railway Storekeeper shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the specification, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality or kind of timber, the same is to be decided by the General Overseer of Locomotives, whose decision shall be final.

#### BYE-LAWS OF THE BRIGHT SHIRE COUNCIL.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5.) Payments.
- (6.) Ordinary business.
- (7.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.



33. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

52. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Miscellaneous.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. *Treasurer to disburse moneys in certain cases.*—It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds.

#### BYE-LAW NO. II.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

2. *Damaging trees.*—If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Removing soil, &c., from public places.*—If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. *What shall be deemed a secure fence in case of goats.*—For the purpose of those provisions of any Statute now or hereafter to be in force whereby any person may be authorized to destroy goats, land shall be deemed to be securely enclosed and fenced if the same be enclosed or fenced with a substantial three-railed fence of the usual height, and the openings in which (if any) shall at the time of trespass be secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of like closeness and strength with the fence, or if such land be enclosed or fenced with any fence and gates, or fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with such first-mentioned fence.
