COOK STRAIT.

Tom's Rock.—From a survey of this rock, made by Captain Johnson, of this department, it has been ascertained that its position is accurately laid down on the Admiralty chart, and that the direction for clearing it given in the "New Zealand Pilot" may be relied on. There are no outlying dangers, but for a half a mile seaward there is a bank with from 10 to 6 fathoms at low water springs. The shallowest part is where Karori Stream bears N. 4 E., and Karori Rock just on with Terawhiti. The tides set strongly over this bank, causing heavy rippings, particularly with the flood, which causes an appearance similar to a shallowly-covered reef.

Luna Rock.—This is a dangerous sunken rock discovered by Captain Fairchild. It is small in size, and has only 6 feet of water on it at low-water springs, with deep water all round. It bears from Karori Rock N. 57° W., distant five-sixths of a mile, and from Macmanman's house S. 79° W., distant from nearest bench half a mile. It lies 1½ cables outside of a line from Karori Rock to Terawhiti.

Owing to a strong flood tide which sets partly on the shore between Sinclair's Head and Cape Terawhiti, vessels from the westward bound to Wellington should be careful against being carried inshore of their course.

Shoal off Baring Head.—This shoal lies to the north and westward of Baring Head. It is about 1 cable in width by 3 in length, running parallel with the shore. It has from 7 to 4½ fathoms on it at low-water springs. The shallowest part bears from Baring Head N. 53° W., distant 2½ cables. It breaks in heavy weather. To clear it, keep Pencarrow Light N. by W., until Baring Head is one point open of Taourakira Head.

Boat Passage off Jackson's Head.—The master of the steamer *Hauea* having reported that she struck when drawing 14 feet of water one-third across from the main in the inner passage. Captain Fairchild, of the *Luna*, sounded it, and found the least water 4 fathoms, with very uneven bottom. This passage is, therefore, not recommended for vessels drawing over 12 feet.

SHIRE OF COLAC.

BYE-LAW No. 39.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Colac, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 39, providing for the health of the residents, the suppression of nuisances, and the restraining offensive trades within the Shire of Colac.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Part x. of the Local Government Act 1874, the Council of the Shire of Colac order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or suffer to be deposited in or by the side of any street or road, so as to be a nuisance to any person within the Shire of Colac, any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung or soil, or other offensive matter.

2. No person shall deposit or cause or suffer to be deposited in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any other public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the said council as a place for the deposit of such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter) any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil; and for the purposes of this bye-law any unsold or reserved public land other than any manure depot as aforesaid shall be deemed and be taken to be a public place as before mentioned.

3. The occupier of any premises within the Shire of Colac used for the purposes of any trade, business process, or manufacture whatsoever causing effluvia shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours; and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to remove therefrom any such matter as aforesaid such refuse matter may be removed by the officer appointed in that behalf or other authorized person at the expense of the occupier.

4. The occupier of any abattoir, slaughter-house, or place used for the purpose of having cattle or other animals killed therein shall cause such abattoir, slaughter-house, or place to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause the blood accumulated therein to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, which receptacle shall be emptied of its contents once at least in every twenty-four hours. Before any blood shall be removed from any premises as hereinbefore mentioned the occupier of such premises shall cause to be mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, per chloride of iron, Condy's fluid, chloride of lime, or such other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

Every person guilty of any breach of any provision of this bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Five shillings.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Colac, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered forty, providing for the health of the residents, the suppression of nuisances, and compelling persons to keep their premises free from offensive or unwholesome matters, in the townships situated within the Shire of Colac.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Part X. of the "Local Government Act 1874," the Council of the Shire of Colac order as follows:—

1. All drains whatsoever, and the water-closets, earth-closets, privies, cesspools, and ash-pits in the townships situated within the Shire of Colac shall be constructed and kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so as there shall be no overflow or soakage or leakage therefrom; and every cesspool within the said townships which shall be formed or made below the surface of the ground shall be also constructed so that the watertight walls or sides thereof shall project on all sides at least six inches above the surface of the ground in which such cesspools shall be formed or made.

2. All private passages, yards, ways, and other premises in the townships situated within the said Shire of Colac shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement or premises in the townships situated within the said shire shall cause the yard and ground adjacent or belonging thereto to be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth or other such refuse matter produced or accumulated on such premises to be collected in one place in such yard or ground, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition, and so that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause all such refuse matter so collected to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises, as often as such refuse matter shall amount to a quantity equal to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid the said council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier. Nothing contained in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any manure, ashes, or other refuse matter as aforesaid produced or accumulated thereon to be kept for the purpose of being used for manure on any garden or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided such manure, ashes, or other refuse matter shall not, previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land as aforesaid be kept so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. The occupier of any land in the townships situated within the said shire on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition, and so as not to be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause such dung, soil, or other manure to be once a week removed from such premises; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect

or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid the same shall be removed by the officer appointed in that behalf or other authorized person at the expense of such occupier. Nothing in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the occupier of any such premises as aforesaid from causing the dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon to be used as manure on any garden or on any land contiguous to such premises, provided that such dung, soil, or other manure shall not previous to the removal thereof for use as manure on any garden or land as aforesaid be kept so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

5. The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement in the townships situated within the said shire shall cause every privy cesspool thereon to be emptied and cleaned from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a depth of six inches from the top of the wall, sides, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except by some nightman duly authorized or licensed as such by the said council; and that the contents of any privy cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m.; and provided also that the contents of any privy cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith a quantity of chloride of zinc, carbolic acid, common salt, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

6. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement on or in which the privy or closet belonging thereto shall not be provided with a "cesspool" constructed in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law, shall at all times cause to be kept in such privy or closet a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in any box, pan, bucket or other receptacle in such privy or closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of dry powdered earth or other deodorizing material as aforesaid sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such bucket, pan, or other receptacle.

7. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited on any land, field, farm, or garden in the townships situated within the said shire any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing without the written consent of the said council; and any such offensive matter as aforesaid which shall with such consent of the said council be so deposited shall be immediately on the deposit thereof covered over by the person depositing the same with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvia from any such manure, soil, or other offensive matter before mentioned. Provided that nothing contained in this bye-law shall be construed or taken to prevent the use as manure for any garden or land of the contents of any earth-closet or any other privy or closet when such contents are deposited on any such field, farm, or garden in a perfectly deodorized state, and so as not to cause nuisance or offence, either at the time of the deposit or afterwards.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Five shillings.
