NORTH ISLAND—EAST COAST.

The following information respecting Poverty bay and Ahuriri road is by Lieutenant W. H. G. Nowell, H.M. schooner *Sandfly*, 1875.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1876.]

Poverty bay.—The buoy on the rock off Gisborne, washed away in winter of 1875, has not been replaced.

Hawke bay.—*Ahuriri road and Port Napier*.—There are at present no marks for entering the port. Vessels drawing more than 9 feet cannot cross the bar.

A black buoy is moored off Meanee point; it should be left on the starboard hand entering.

Light.—The light at the entrance of Port Napier shows red between the bearings of S.E. by S. and S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., white from S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and red from S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. to S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. The white sector of light is intended to indicate the anchoring ground.

Nearly the whole of the swampy ground in the port has been reclaimed. A railway now runs into Napier; the station is near the site of the Maori pah which has been demolished. There are several houses on the eastern spit, also a landing pier on the south side of the spit.

Reported dangers.—A shoal, over which the steamship *Rangitira* recently grazed, is supposed to lie E.N.E. 2 miles from Kahau rocks (presumed to be identical with Kohau point, south of Hick's bay); the weather at the time being thick, the exact position of the danger could not be ascertained. Other dangers, the positions of which are unknown, are said to exist in the same locality.†

NORTH ISLAND—WEST COAST.

The following information respecting Hokianga river, Kaipara and Manukau harbors, is derived from the remarks of Navigating Lieutenant H. S. Penn, R.N., H.M.S. *Sappho*, 1876.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 14° easterly in 1876.]

Hokianga river.—The reef off North head is reported to have extended a cable to the southward, thus narrowing the channel between the heads to $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

Kaipara harbor.—North channel is now completely blocked up, and it is doubtful if either Main or Fanny channels exist. The only channel now used is North-east or Kemp channel, by which the barque *Galatea* passed in 1856; breakers were seen along both sides of this channel when H.M.S. *Sappho* used it.

On North Sand head are placed two beacons, which brought in line N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. lead through North-east channel in 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, low-water springs. The upper beacon is triangular and painted black; the lower is a small house painted dark-red. There is also a semaphore flagstaff seaward of the beacons, and the New Zealand system of signals will shortly be used for signalling to vessels.

Approaching Kaipara harbor bring North Sand head to bear N.E., and steer with it on that bearing until the beacons are seen—they are in the first dip of the land northward of the head, but being small are not easily seen until near the bar—keep them in line N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. On approaching Tory shoal, which is reported to have extended about half a mile to the north-westward, keep about 3 cables from the north beach as far as Ponto point, where the vessel will be boarded by a pilot. The soundings off North Sand head were found to be irregular.

A buoy is placed off the end of the spit which forms the north side of Tabora channel.

About a mile south of Ponto point is a buoy marking a newly formed shoal, nearly dry at low water, and extending E.N.E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the buoy.

Manukau harbor.—Fanny channel, which passes on the north-west side of Treachery shoal, is the one now generally used, and has 13 feet at low-water springs. South channel, which passes on the south-east side of Treachery shoal, between it and South head, is not used.

There are two white beacons on South head, each 43 feet high, and placed on sliding ways; these beacons, intended as

distant leading marks, are to be kept in line until four white beacons (each 10 feet square, and situated about 300 yards north of the larger beacon) are seen. The four beacons in line N.E. by N. lead through Fanny channel, until the three white beacons (43 feet high) on the north side of the entrance come in line; then alter course sharply to the northward, keeping the latter beacons in line until deep water is obtained.

Due attention should be paid to the signals from the semaphore (see New Zealand Pilot, 4th edition, page 188), as the channels are liable to shift: Fanny channel is the only one for which signals are made.

The lighthouse on South head is nearly of the same color as the surrounding land; it cannot be mistaken for a beacon, as the beacons are painted white.

The buoys off South head have been removed.

The pilot station is situated on South head. Pilots board vessels off the head; they do not proceed outside the bar.

Wairoa channel leading to Onchunga is well buoyed; the red conical buoys should be left on the starboard hand entering, the black buoys on the port hand. The piles hitherto marking this channel have been removed.

MIDDLE ISLAND—EAST COAST.

Port Lyttelton.—Breakwaters are now in course of construction from Naval and Officer points. When completed they will afford protection from S.W. winds to vessels anchored within them.*

Port Levy.—(On the rock off Baleine point there is a small beacon consisting of an iron staff and cage.*

OTAGO HARBOR.

The following information respecting Otago harbor is by William Thompson, Harbor Master, 1876.*

[Variation 16° $14'$ easterly in 1876.]

The depth of water at present in the channel across the outer bar is 18 feet at low-water spring tides, and across the inner bar 17 feet.

To enter at night bring the two leading lights on the sand-spit in line S.S.W. and steer on this course until the red light at the pilot station inside Tairua head opens out;† then steer for Harrington point, passing midway between that point and the sand-spit, and continuing a mid-channel course between the buoys on the inner bar—leaving the red buoys on the starboard hand, and the black on the port—and passing the lighthouse (moored in 12 feet, 14 cables S.W. by S. from the first red beacon) on the starboard hand about 70 yards distant. The channel thence to Dunedin is well marked by buoys and beacons, red on the starboard side and black on the port.

Pilots board vessels within a radius of 3 miles from Tairua head, unless the sea on the outer bar render it unsafe for a boat; this, however, seldom occurs. If unsafe, then the pilot boat is placed in mid-channel inside the bar and shows the pilot flag, for which the vessel must be steered as soon as the red-and-white beacon at the pilot station opens out to view. If the wind be strong and northerly, the vessel should run in under easy sail, to enable the pilot to board in safety, as there is not room to round a vessel to in the channel.

If the wind be northerly, or if it be necessary to wait for daylight, for tide or for a pilot, stand off and on, and do not bring the lighthouse to bear to the eastward of south; a vessel will thereby benefit by the northerly current and keep to windward.

Anchorage.—The outer anchorage is safe when there is no easting in the wind. Small vessels should keep as near the line of the leading lights as convenient, in 9 fathoms about half a mile from the shore; and large vessels about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles off shore in 15 fathoms, with Tairua head lighthouse bearing south.

The inner anchorage is between Howlett point and the first buoy on the inner bar, and is safe in any weather. For vessels anchoring below Harrington point, the nearer they are to the sand-spit the better; and above same point they should get into the bight a little, abreast of the old native village.

Only vessels of a light draught can work into the inner anchorage. When working out on the ebb care must be taken not to stand too close over to Heyward point, as the tide and swell set in that direction: the swell increases as the point is neared, and tends to cause the vessel to miss stays, thereby placing her in a critical position ere she can be brought up. The holding ground is not good; and this bight is dangerous to get into.

CHATHAM ISLANDS.

The following information has been derived from United States Hydrographic Notice, No. 69 of 1875.*

Ware-Kauri island.—*Wangaroa or Port Hutt.*—The only good harbor in Chatham islands is that of Wangaroa or Port Hutt, situated on the north-west side of Petre bay; the holding ground is rocky and tolerably good. The other anchorages are exposed.

The rocks in the vicinity of Chatham islands are generally marked by kelp.

Position.—By observations made by the United States Government Transit of Venus Expedition in December 1874, the longitude of Wangaroa harbor was found to be $176^{\circ}39'49''$ W. The prevailing winds during the stay of the party were westerly.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, at about 5 h.; tides rise $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

Supplies.—Fresh water can easily be obtained, also wood for fuel. Mutton and beef can be procured, but vegetables are scarce.

There are about 150 white inhabitants, composed of English and Germans, whose occupation is that of sheep-farming.

NEW ZEALAND—MIDDLE ISLAND, WEST COAST.

Revolving Light on Cape Foulwind.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 20 (2), dated 22nd February 1876, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse then in the course of erection on Cape Foulwind, west coast of the Middle island:—

The Colonial Government of New Zealand has given further notice that about the month of August 1876 the light will be exhibited.

The light will be a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy *every half minute*, elevated 190 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The lighthouse, 53 feet high, is built of wood and painted white.

Also, that notice will be given of the date of the exhibition of the light.

AUSTRALIA—QUEENSLAND.

(1) *Alteration in Light at Bustard Head.*

The Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice that from the 3rd April 1876 the following alteration would be made in the lights exhibited on Bustard head, viz.:—

The two small leading lights heretofore exhibited to mark the position of the outer rock off Bustard head would be discontinued, and a near approach to the rock would be denoted by a light exhibited from a square tower, bearing S.E. by S. distant 500 yards from the Bustard head lighthouse, and elevated 280 feet above the level of high water.

This light is of the fifth order between the bearings of S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., but it will also be seen as a natural light as far southward as the bearing S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., and also between the bearings of S.E. and E.S.E.

This light is so screened as to be obscured between the bearings of S.S.W. and S. by E., to a distance of one mile outside the rock at high water, the northern line of eclipse running in a W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. direction.

NOTE.—Vessels when passing Bustard head, in order to clear the outer rock, should keep this auxiliary light in sight until the ray of red light exhibited from the principal lighthouse is passed.

INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAIT.

(2) *Light-vessel at Piper Islands.*

Also, that a dioptric light is now exhibited from a light-vessel moored at Piper islands, inner route to Torres strait.

The light is elevated 35 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The light-vessel is moored in 13 fathoms, with the following bearings, viz.:—North Piper island W. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., and k islet N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. These bearings place the light-vessel in lat. $12^{\circ}14'S$, long. $143^{\circ}16'E$.

CORAL SEA.

(3) *Discovery of a Coral Reef.*

The Colonial Government of New South Wales has given notice that Captain Love, of the American barque *Malay*, reports having discovered a reef about 45 miles eastward of Flinders reefs.

This reef (Malay reef) is about a mile in circumference, and is in lat. $17^{\circ}58'S$, long. $149^{\circ}20'E$. This position is considered correct, as a departure was taken from Herald cny the day previous to sighting the reef.

TASMANIA—BANKS STRAIT.

Existence of Sunken Rocks.

1. Information has been received from Staff-Commander Henry Stanley, R.N., in charge of Admiralty Survey, of the existence of a rock lying off the north-east coast of Tasmania, and in the track of vessels.

This danger (Salamander rock) has 10 feet on it at low-water spring tides; it lies E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Swan island lighthouse, and N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from George rock. These bearings and distances place the danger in lat. $40^{\circ}49'40''$ S., long. $148^{\circ}21'15''$ E.

This is considered to be the rock on which the s.s. *Salamander* struck in 1869, although the position is about 2 miles southward of that reported by the *Salamander*.

The "*Salamander*, P.D." has consequently been removed from the chart.

2. Also, of the existence of a sunken rock (Harry rock), having 18 feet on it at low water, lying N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. nearly 3 miles from Swan island lighthouse.

3. Also, of the existence of a sunken rock (Rochfort rock) at the west entrance of Franklin inlet, having 10 feet on it at low water, and lying N.E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Double rock, near Badger island.

Intended Lighthouse on Eddystone Point.

3. Also, that it is intended to erect a lighthouse on Eddystone point, north-east coast of Tasmania.

The births of 631 children, viz., 326 boys and 305 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 757 births were registered, or 126 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in October numbered 348, viz., 193 of males and 155 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 283. The deaths exceeded those in September by 16, and were in excess of the average of October during the previous ten years by 49. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 12 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 83.3° on the 4th, and the lowest was 42.8° on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (57.2°) was about the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.4°) took place on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 81.8° to a minimum of 46.4°. The least range (7.3°) was on the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 60.2° to a minimum of 52.9°. The mean daily range was 19.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.826 inches) was below the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the recorded mortality of the month. Deaths of children under the age of 5 years were in the proportion of 29 per cent. to the total number, which is the smallest percentage recorded for that month during the last eleven years, the proportions being 39 per cent. in October 1875; 35 per cent. in October 1874; 37 per cent. in October 1873 and 1872; 41 per cent. in October 1871; 32 per cent. in October 1870; 40 per cent. in October 1869; 45 per cent. in October 1868; 40 per cent. in October 1867; and 51 per cent. in October 1866.

Twenty-six deaths were registered during the month of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a widow, aged 78, who died of cancer; a female, aged 92½, who died of chronic tumor under the arm; a carter, aged 75, of senile gangrene; two females, aged 76 and 78 respectively; a baker aged 80, and a gentleman, aged 86, of apoplexy; a baker, aged 79, and a storekeeper, aged 80, of paralysis; a female inmate of the Lunatic Asylum, aged 81, of disease of the brain; a widow, aged 76, a laborer, aged 82, a printer, aged 83, and a female, aged 85, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 75, of bronchopneumonia; a late superintendent of police, aged 76, of disease of the bowels; two housewives, each aged 75, a carpenter and a hairdresser, each aged 76, three females, aged 76, 77, and 80 respectively, a tailor, aged 82, and a ship's carpenter and a seaman, each aged 84, of old age.

Fourteen deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, twelve of which were accidental, and the remaining two suicidal. The following are the particulars:—A hawker, aged 13, was killed by a dray passing over him; a groom, aged 23, died of the effects of a fall from a horse whilst performing in a circus; a painter, aged 49, died of a compound fracture of the leg; a laborer, aged 50, died of fracture of the ribs caused by a fall into a quarry; a horse-breaker, aged 60, was killed by a kick from a horse; a youth, aged 15, died of abscess of the brain, the result of an accidental gunshot wound; a fireman, aged 40, died of pyæmia, caused by an injury to the foot; a female, aged 47, died of burns, probably received when intoxicated; a chemist, aged 36, died of the effects of an overdose of chloroform accidentally taken; a boy, aged 6, and two seamen, aged 40 and 35 respectively, were accidentally drowned, the last whilst drunk; a gardener, aged 32, and a clerk, aged 52 (an inmate of the Kew Lunatic Asylum), committed suicide by hanging themselves.

Eighty-six deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 2 in the Children's Hospital; 4 in the Alfred Hospital; 2 in the Lying-in Hospital; 4 in the Benevolent Asylum; 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 104, of which 58, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 46, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 63 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 14 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 244. Of these, 135, or 55 per cent., were males, and 109, or 46 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 8 were between sixty and sixty-five, 11 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Councils of the City of Sandhurst and the Borough of Williamstown have requested that the streets hereinafter named should be proclaimed: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands in the City of Sandhurst and the Borough of Williamstown respectively reserved or used for the streets hereinafter named and described to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

In the City of Sandhurst—Holt street in section 92 c, Sandhurst, total width sixty-six feet, extending from Baxter street to Arnold street, the footways thereof to be twelve feet wide.

SHIRE OF HAMPTON.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners state that they are ratepayers and inhabitants resident within the Shire of Hampton, and are solicitous that the portion of the shire hereafter described should be severed therefrom and constituted a separate municipality.

They represent that the shire is too large (50 by 90 miles), and unmanageable, and comprises localities not possessing community of interest; that the seat of government (Camperdown) is 50 miles from the northern boundary, rendering thereby a fair representation impracticable; that the subdivision into ridings is inimical to the interests of those of the petitioners who hold property in the northern portions of the east and west ridings, while their contributions to the rates are expended in the southern portions of those ridings; that they are the principal contributors to the shire revenue; and that the portion of the shire sought to be severed is capable of yielding, upon a rate of 1s. in the pound, a sum sufficient to make and maintain all the roads necessary, and would much exceed £500. And the petitioners pray accordingly.

The boundaries of the portion of the shire sought to be severed:—“Commencing at a point on the east bank of Mount Emu Creek about three and a half miles west from the south-east corner of the parish of Darlington; thence up the said Mount Emu Creek to the north-east angle of the parish of Skipton; thence south about eight and a half miles to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 26, parish of Boryalook; thence southerly down the Gnarkeet chain of ponds to the north-west angle of the parish of Pollah North; thence east to the Woody Yallock River about seven and a quarter miles to the north-east angle of the parish of Wilgul North; thence by the said river and along the margin of the Salt Lakes and Junction Creek to the eastern shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the northern and part of the western shores of the said lake to the south-east corner of allotment 104 n, parish of Corangamite; thence west by the southern boundaries of the said allotment 104 n and 105 a and b to a road one chain wide; thence north by the said road to the three-chain road leading from Camperdown *via* Foxhow to Geelong; thence south-westerly by the said road to the south-west angle of allotment 3 of the said last-mentioned parish;

thence north and west by a road one chain and a half wide to the western boundary of the parish of Taarak; thence north by a road one chain wide to its intersection with another road one chain wide running east and west at the south-east corner of the parish of Pircarra; and thence by the southern boundaries of the said parishes of Pircarra and Darlington about ten miles and a half to the commencing point.”

IN pursuance of the powers given in and by clause 44 of subdivision 9 of Part 1 of the 12th schedule to the Borough's Statute, adopted by Bye-law No. 42, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Fitzroy make the following regulation, that is to say:—

That it shall not be lawful between the hours of Six o'clock in the forenoon and Twelve o'clock at night to lead any unbroken horse or to drive into or through any part of the Town of Fitzroy any unyoked cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria, or of any other colony, to any other part.

Adopted by the Council of the Town of Fitzroy on the 27th day of October 1876, and confirmed by the said Council on the 24th day of November 1876.

4. The Council of the municipality of Glenelg hereby orders and directs that the land contained within the area of the deviation of a road passing through allotment 15 of section 1 in the parish of Sandford in the shire of Glenelg shall, on and after the 1st day of December 1876, be a public highway, and

shall be in lieu of a surveyed road passing between allotment 14 and allotment 15 of section 1 in the said parish of Sandford in the shire of Glenelg.

5. The Council of the municipality of Glenelg hereby orders and directs that the land contained within the area of the deviation of a road within the Chetwynd pre-emptive section in the parish of Ganoo Ganoo in the shire of Glenelg shall, on and after the 1st day of December 1876, be a public highway, and shall be in lieu of that portion of the surveyed road from which the deviation was made.

6. The Council of the municipality of Glenelg hereby orders and directs that the land contained within the area of a new surveyed road passing through allotments 17 and 18 in the parish of Ganoo Ganoo in the shire of Glenelg shall, on and after the 1st day of December 1876, be a public highway, and shall be in lieu of a surveyed road passing along the western side of allotments 17, 18, and 29 in the said parish of Ganoo Ganoo in the shire of Glenelg.

7. The Council of the municipality of Glenelg hereby orders and directs that the land contained within the area of a new surveyed road passing through allotments 2, 3, and 4 of section 11, and allotment 9 of section 12, in the parish of Casterton in the shire of Glenelg, shall, on and after the 1st day of December 1876, be a public highway, and shall be in lieu of a surveyed road passing between allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 12, and allotment 3 of section 11, on the one side, and allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 13 on the other side, in the said parish of Casterton in the shire of Glenelg.

That Part No. XI. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, excepting as regards sections numbered 7, 8, 11, 33, 40, 53, 54, and 55, excised, be hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Wodonga; and that Bye-law No. 1, for regulating Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c., as passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yackandandah, be hereby repealed as far as regards the said Shire of Wodonga.

Local Government Act 1874.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee

presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5.) Payments.
- (6.) Ordinary business.
- (7.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

8. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

10. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

11. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

12. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

13. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

14. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

15. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

17. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

18. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

19. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a

previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

20. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

21. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

22. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

23. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

24. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

25. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

26. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

27. *Question how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

28. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

29. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

31. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

32. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

33. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

34. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

35. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

36. *Meetings of the committee.*—The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

37. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

38. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

39. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

40. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

41. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

42. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

43. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

44. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

45. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

46. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

47. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

48. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

49. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
