NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital and the Gaol are in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital is in Albert Ward; the Immigrants' Home is partly in Albert Ward and partly in Emerald Hill; the Lying-in Hospital is in Smith Ward; the Children's Hospital is in La Trobe Ward; the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum is in Kew Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District;" the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Town.

The births of 682 children, viz., 333 boys and 349 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 631 births were registered, or 51 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in November numbered 380, viz., 211 of males and 169 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 302. The deaths exceeded those in October by 32, and also the average of November during the previous ten years by 39. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 24 below the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.2° on the 14th, and the lowest was 42.1° on the 11th. The mean temperature of the month (59.5°) was a little below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (49.0°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 95.2° to a minimum of 46.2°. The least range (2.5°) was on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 57.5° to a minimum of 55.0°. The mean daily range was 20.5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.741 inches) was more than a tenth of an inch below the average.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths recorded during the month were of males, and forty-four per cent. were of females. Forty-two per cent. of the total mortality were of children who had not attained the age of 5 years as against 46 per cent. in November 1875; 47 per cent. in November 1874; 42 per cent. in November 1873; 48 per cent. in November 1872; 42 per cent. in November 1871; 48 per cent. in November 1870; 47 per cent. in November 1869; 49 per cent. in November 1868; 45 per cent. in November 1867; and 60 per cent. in November 1866.

Fifteen deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a tailor, aged 88, who died of diarrhoea; a female, aged 79, of bed sores; a male, occupation unstated, aged 76, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 76, of epilepsy; a grocer and a laborer, each aged 76, a gentleman, aged 78, and an architect, aged 82, of heart disease; a bootmaker, aged 76, and a butcher, aged 82, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a vegetable dealer, aged 77, and a gentleman, aged 80, of old age; a gentleman, aged 81, of a gun-shot wound in the elbow, accidentally received from a spring gun he had set at his door; and a grocer, aged 75, of accidental suffocation whilst eating.

Twenty-three deaths from external causes were recorded during the month; 18 of which are ascribed to accident and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 7, died of fracture of the skull, caused by falling down stairs; one, aged 11, died of injury to the spine, caused by an accidental fall, whilst with a nurse, 8 years ago; a carter, aged 27, and a laborer, aged 55, died of the effects of falls from carts; an auctioneer, aged 35, fractured his spine by falling on board a steamer; a laborer, aged 43, was knocked down by a cab; a bricklayer, aged 60, died of the effects of fracture of the ankle, caused by a fall from a scaffold; a machinist, aged 62, was passed over by a locomotive; a gentleman, aged 81, died of a gun-shot wound in the elbow, accidentally received from a spring gun he had set at his door; a male of unstated occupation, aged 71, died of accidental burns; a female child, aged 2 years, was poisoned with alcohol, accidentally taken; a female, aged 30, was accidentally poisoned with atropine, taken in mistake for salicine; a tea hawk, aged 53, died of "opium poisoning"; a carpenter, aged 16, whilst bathing, and a male of occupation unstated, aged 35, were accidentally drowned; a male of occupation unknown, aged about 35, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 2 years, and a grocer, aged 75, were suffocated with food. Of the persons who committed suicide—a gentleman, aged 43, shot himself in the head when of unsound mind; a male of occupation unknown, aged 57, cut his throat with a razor under similar circumstances; a doctor of medicine, aged 38, poisoned himself with chloroform; a butcher, aged 33, and a cabman, aged 53, whilst in a state of temporary insanity (brought on in the latter case by drink), drowned themselves in the Yarra River.

Seventy-seven deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum, and 1 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 158, of which 81, or 51 per cent., were of males; and 77, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 116 were under one year of age, 19 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 222. Of these, 130, or 59 per cent., were males, and 92, or 41 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 14 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from scarlatina increased from 9 in October to 11 in November. The total number of deaths from this complaint in Melbourne and suburbs since its first outbreak as an epidemic has been 1,273, of which 567 occurred in the current year. ## £10 LICENSING DISTRICTS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the shires and parts of shires hereinafter mentioned, to be respectively parts within

which the licensing magistrates for each respective district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The whole of the Shire of Ballarat.  
 The portion of the Shire of Camperdown, comprised within the parish of Skipton.  
 The Shire of Lexton.  
 The whole of the Shire of St. Arnaud.  
 The portion of the West Loddon Riding of the Shire of Swan Hill comprised within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Boort; thence southerly along the River Loddon to the southern boundary of the shire; thence westerly along the said southern boundary to the western side of the parish of Wychetella; thence north along the western boundary of the parish of Wychetella to the parish of Boort; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly along the boundary of the said parish of Boort to the starting point.

## POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS AT HORSHAM TO BE FILLED UP.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the township of Horsham.

## WILLIAMSTOWN RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

PETER Power, Thomas Mason, Richard Clough, John Hughes, David Purdie Maclean, William McPherson, William Leake, Thomas Sayers, and William Doherty, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Truganina, reserved for a Racecourse and Recreative purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned racecourse and recreation reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1st. No person shall enter or remain upon the racecourse or reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

2nd. No person, except the committee of management or secretary thereof, shall be permitted to enter the grand stand or any enclosure of the said racecourse without the consent of the secretary of the Williamstown Racing Club.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers; climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates; roll or throw stones or glass upon the said racecourse or reserve; nor shall fires be lighted within a hundred yards of the racecourse proper, as marked out by posts.

4th. No person, except authorized in that behalf by the committee, shall graze upon the said racecourse and reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or pigs; or bring any dog or

dogs thereon, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

5th. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms upon the said racecourse or reserve, or any enclosure thereof, except by written authority of the committee of management, or their secretary duly authorized.

6th. No person shall be permitted to train a horse or horses upon the said racecourse and reserve, without the permission in writing of the committee of management.

7th. No person shall erect upon the said racecourse and reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale on racing days any article, without the consent in writing authorized by the committee of the Williamstown Racing Club.

8th. No person shall be allowed to cart sand, rock, or other material across or along the racecourse, nor remove any turf, loam, sand, shell, or other material from any part of the reserve, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or waggon be driven across or along the racecourse proper, without the consent of the committee of management.

9th. No person, unless authorized by the committee of management, or by the Williamstown Racing Club, shall be allowed to ride or drive any animal with or without vehicles upon the said racecourse proper, that is to say, that part of the reserve used for racing purposes.

10th. The following is the scale of charges or fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the grand stand and saddling paddock, and to the remainder of the reserve:—

For admission of each person to the grand stand s. d.	
and saddling paddock, on days fixed for racing,	
such a sum as the committee of management may

For admission of each person to the remainder of

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the foregoing regulations.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; chaff to be made from oatens hay of the best quality.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desire it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1877; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

### CITY OF SANDHURST.

#### BYE-LAW No. 2.

*A Bye-law of the City of Sandhurst, made under sections 212 and 379 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 2, for regulating the Corporation Cattle Market and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the Market shall be held.*

**I**N pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1874*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst order as follows:—

1. That in this bye-law, save where there is something in the context inconsistent therewith, the word "Stock" shall include horses, mares, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.
2. The word "Inspector" shall mean the collector or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorised by the *Local Government Act 1874*, and shall include the assistants of the inspector.
3. That the cattle market, situate at Charleston road within the said city, shall be open for the reception and delivery of stock on every lawful day, from sunrise to sunset.
4. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market an Inspector thereof, whose duty shall be as follows:—
  - i. To see that this bye-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* relating to markets are duly observed.
  - ii. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.
  - iii. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most convenient.
  - iv. To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to summarily eject therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing, or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.
5. That no person shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the Inspector.
6. That every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.
7. That if any stock brought to the market for sale, and not removed within twenty-four hours after the close of the market, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale, or by the Inspector at the expense of the person placing or entering them in the said market for sale.
8. That the owner or agent of stock intended to be brought to the market for sale on every market day shall notify the number in writing to the Inspector by Six p.m. on the day previous, and shall be responsible for the dues payable in

respect of the number of stock so notified. Provided that if from accident or some other good and sufficient cause a delay should arise in bringing such stock to market, the Inspector shall have the power of not enforcing payment of the said dues and charges.

9. That all owners or agents of stock intended for sale desiring to have privilege of drawing lots for priority of sale must have such stock at the yards by Eight a.m. on the morning of sale from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April, and by Nine a.m. from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of August in each year, and that all stock arriving after the hours above stated will be sold in the order of their arrival, and in no case shall the number of horned cattle in one pen exceed twelve.

10. That the Inspector shall give out publicly the order of auction sales at the hour appointed for the arrival of stock in the market.

11. That the sale by auction of sheep shall commence at Eleven a.m.

12. That the sale by auction of fat lambs shall commence so soon as the sale of sheep by auction is concluded.

13. That the sale by auction of fat cattle shall commence at Twelve noon.

14. That the sale by auction of calves shall commence at Half-past Twelve o'clock p.m., provided the sale of cattle and lambs shall be then concluded.

15. That the sale by auction of store cattle shall commence so soon as the sale by auction of calves is concluded.

16. That any owner or agent withdrawing his stock from auction sale, or not being present by his auctioneer punctually to commence his auction sale, shall not be allowed to sell by auction until the remaining auction sales shall be completed.

### THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

#### BYE-LAW No. 3.

*A Bye-law of the City of Sandhurst, made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered three.*

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst order as follows:—

#### REGULATION, ETC., OF BUILDINGS.

##### Regulations for Buildings.

1. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes, hereinafter in this subdivision called in common "chimneys," or of parts thereof respectively to be specified in the regulation.

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the distance from any class of building at which it shall be lawful to erect or construct a building for burning clay or other material.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings, and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

For regulating the construction materials, and enclosing by building or otherwise, of fire-places or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse, or gaswork, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam-engine be not used therein respectively.

For regulating the erection of tents.

For limiting a time, not in any case less than seven years from the coming into force of the limiting regulations, after which it shall not be lawful without the consent of the council, to use, keep, continue, or suffer to remain any building, roof, fire-place, furnace, or chimney, or the enclosure of any fire-place, furnace, or chimney, originally constructed or made without violation of law, and existing at the time of such coming into force, being of any such construction, height, thickness, materials, or description, or within any such distance of other buildings, as respectively, are contrary to any regulation existing at the time of such coming into force.

For appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds, which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund, by the proper officer of the council, for any inspection, superintendence, or other service made or performed by him under any such regulations, as hereinbefore in this section provided for.

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole or separately to a part or parts of the municipal district described by boundaries in such regulation and may provide with respect to the several matters of prohibition, restraint, and regulation hereinbefore in this section mentioned, either absolutely or with relation to classes, rates, situations, distances, or other like data to



be laid down or referred to in general terms therein, and with or without relation to a right of approval, disapproval, or inspection to be vested in the council or some proper officer of the council.

*Construction, &c., buildings, contrary hereto.*

2. If any person, after the coming into force of any such regulation in this subdivision aforesaid, and whilst the same is in force, shall construct, alter, repair, or renew within the limits prescribed in such regulation any building, roof, fire-place, furnace, or chimney, or put up any tent, or enclose any fire-place, furnace, or chimney, contrary to any of the cases aforesaid to such regulation, or shall, after the expiration of the time (if any) limited in that behalf, and notice from the council to remove or alter any building, roof, fire-place, furnace, chimney, or enclosure, to which the limiting regulation applies, use, keep, or continue the same, or suffer the same to remain or (if the case be so) to remain unaltered for more than twenty-eight days after the time when such notice has been given him, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day while such building, roof, chimney, fire-place, furnace, or tent, continues so constructed or standing, or continues so as unlawfully altered, repaired, renewed, or enclosed, or while (if the case be so) the same shall, after the expiration of the said twenty-eight days, be used, kept, continued, or suffered to remain as aforesaid.

*Buildings, &c., heretofore unlawfully constructed.*

3. If any building, roof, fire-place, furnace, or chimney shall, before the coming into operation of this bye-law, have been constructed, or any fire-place, furnace, or chimney enclosed or left unenclosed in violation of any law or bye-law thereto before in force, it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to the owner or occupier thereof respectively to remove or to alter or enclose, so as to conform to any regulation in force in that behalf under this subdivision, such building, roof, fire-place, furnace, chimney, and such owner or occupier shall remove, or in manner aforesaid, alter or enclose the same within twenty-eight days after the service of such notice upon him, and if such owner or occupier neglect or refuse within twenty-eight days after such notice so served, remove, or in manner aforesaid, to alter or enclose such building, roof, fire-place, furnace, or chimney, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which the same continues, or (if the case be so) continued so unaltered or unenclosed after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may first be convicted of any such offence under this section.

*Buildings, &c., heretofore improperly constructed, but without violation of law.*

4. If any chimney shall have been commenced or constructed before the coming into operation of this bye-law, and shall be of other height, thickness, construction or materials, or enclosed otherwise than respectively required by, or left unenclosed contrary to the tenor of any regulation in force under this bye-law, but shall have been so constructed, enclosed, or left unenclosed without violation of law, and if the proper officer of the council, upon inspection had (which inspection any ratepayer may, upon payment of Five shillings, demand and require), shall deem that such chimney, by reason of want of proper height, thickness, or enclosure, or by reason of its being constructed of inflammable materials, causes reasonable danger of fire to any buildings, or causes a nuisance through not properly carrying up the smoke, it shall be lawful for such officer to give notice to the owner and occupier of the premises in which such chimney is, forthwith to take down, or alter, or enclose such chimney as the case may require, for prevention of such danger or nuisance, and if such owner or occupier do not within seven days after such notice comply with the same, then any two justices, if they are satisfied that for the reasons aforesaid such chimney causes such danger or nuisance, may order the same to be removed, altered, or enclosed, as they may see fit, by the said officer, and reasonable compensation shall be paid out of the municipal fund to all persons who shall be put to expense or suffer damage in complying with any such notice, or through the execution of such order.

*RUINOUS OR DANGEROUS BUILDINGS, ETC.*

*Notice to owner, &c., of ruinous building.*

5. If any building or wall or anything affixed thereon be deemed by the proper officer of the council to be in a ruinous state, and dangerous to passengers or to the occupiers thereof, or of the neighboring buildings, such officer shall immediately cause a proper board or fence, and if he shall deem it necessary, props to be put up for the protection of passengers and of such occupiers, and shall also, if he shall deem it necessary, cause the neighboring buildings to be properly shored up, and shall cause notice in writing to be given to the owner of such building or wall, if he be known and resident within the municipal district, and shall also cause such notice to be put on the door or other conspicuous part of the said premises or otherwise to be given to the occupier thereof (if any) requiring such owner or occupier forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such building, wall, or other thing as the case may require.

*Justices may limit time for removal, repair, &c.*

6. If such owner or occupier do not begin to take down, repair, or secure such building, wall, or other thing, within a space of three days after such notice shall have been given or put up as aforesaid, and complete such taking down, repairs, or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, such officer may make complaint thereof to two justices, and it shall be lawful for such justices to order the owner or in his

default the occupier (if any) of such building, wall, or other thing, to take down, re-build, repair, or otherwise secure to the satisfaction of such officer the same or such part thereof as appears to them to be in a dangerous state, within a time to be fixed by such justices.

*And in default, &c., council may do act.*

And in case the same be not taken down, rebuilt, repaired, or otherwise secured within the time so limited, or if no owner or occupier can be found on whom to serve such order, the council shall with all convenient speed cause all or so much of such building, wall, or other thing, as shall be in a ruinous condition, and dangerous, as aforesaid, to be taken down, rebuilt, repaired, or otherwise secured, in such manner as shall be requisite, and all the expenses of putting up every such board, fence, and props, and of shoring up such buildings, and of taking down, rebuilding, repairing, or securing such building, wall, or other thing, shall be paid by the owner thereof, and any two justices may order such payments.

*Materials may be sold.*

7. If any such building or wall as aforesaid, or any part of the same, be pulled down by virtue of the powers aforesaid, the council may sell the materials thereof, or so much of the same as shall be pulled down, and apply the proceeds of such sale in payment of the expenses incurred in respect of such building or wall, and the council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner of the building or wall on demand.

*Land may be taken and sold in certain cases.*

8. If such owner cannot be found within the municipal district, or sufficient distress of his goods and chattels within the municipal district cannot be made, and the said expenses, or any part thereof, remain unpaid, the council, after giving twenty-eight days' notice of their intention to do so by posting a notice in a conspicuous place on such building or wall, or on the land whereon such building or wall stood, may take such building or land, provided that such expenses, or so much as remain due, be not paid, or tendered to them within the said twenty-eight days, making compensation to such owner of such building or land in the manner provided by Part VII. of the Public Works Statute 1865. In the case of lands taken otherwise than with the consent of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the council shall be entitled to deduct out of such compensation the amount of the expenses so unpaid as aforesaid, and may sell, or otherwise dispose of the said building or land for the purposes hereof.

## THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

## BYE-LAW No. 5.

**A** Bye-law of the city of Sandhurst, under sections 213 and 479 of The Local Government Act 1874, for regulating the market place and the buildings and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto; for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held; for regulating the use of the weighing machines provided by the Council; and for preventing the sale or exposure for sale of unwholesome provisions in the market.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by The Local Government Act 1874 the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Sandhurst order as follows:—

1. *Site of market.*—Division and appropriations of site.—*Interpretation of the word "market."*—That the market known as the Sandhurst general market shall be held at the place and in the buildings and spaces already appointed and used for the purposes of such market; and the portion of the said market between Bull street and Mundy street shall be used and appropriated for the sale of corn, grain, green fodder, hay, straw, poultry, eggs, milk, butter, cheese, fruit, vegetables, and other provisions, and shall be called the general market; and the building at the corner of Williamson street and Hargreaves street, and such other buildings as the council may hereafter appoint, shall be used and appropriated for the sale of meat, fish, poultry, eggs, milk, butter, cheese, fruit, vegetables, and other provisions, and shall be called the retail market; but throughout this bye-law, except where repugnant to the context, the words "the market" or "the said market" shall mean and include both the said markets.

2. *Stallages, rents, &c.*—All produce and wares exposed or offered for sale in the said market shall be subject to the payment of such stallage, rents, tolls, and dues as are now or may hereafter be fixed, made, and approved.

3. *Appointment of inspector.*—*Duties of inspector.*—There shall be appointed for the said market an inspector, who shall be called the market inspector (and the lessee for the time being of the said market may be such inspector), and the duties of such inspector shall be as follows:—

To enforce all bye-laws and regulations now or at any time made or passed respecting the said market.

To take charge of and keep (except when the same shall be leased) the market weighbridge.

To inspect all meat and other provisions offered or exposed for sale in the said market and to seize all unwholesome meat and provisions and to carry the same before a justice, and if the same be ordered to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of to cause the same to be so destroyed or disposed of in such a way as to prevent the same being exposed for sale or used for the food of man.

To cause to be erected, and if, and when erected, to be kept in proper order, all boards, lists, schedules of stallage, rents and tolls from time to time required to be set up and to be kept set up in the said market; and generally to perform all duties required to be done by him under this bye-law and any bye-law to be hereafter passed in this behalf.

4. *Wholesale market days and hours.*—The days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held in that portion thereof between Bull street and Mundy street shall be every day (except Sundays, fast-days, and public holidays) from sunrise to sunset. Provided that the market for the sale of fruit and vegetables (not being in the retail market) shall be held on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays only.

5. *Retail market days and hours.*—The days on which such retail market shall be held shall be every day (except as aforesaid) and the hours during each day on which such market shall be held shall be as follows:—

From 1st November to the 1st March, 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.	
Saturdays ...	6 " 11 "
From 1st March to the 1st May ...	7 " 7 "
Saturdays ...	11 " 11 "
From 1st May to the 1st August ...	7 " 6 "
Saturdays ...	10.30 " 10.30 "
From 1st August to the 1st November, 7 ...	7 " 11 "
Saturdays ...	11 " 11 "

Provided that on every Wednesday throughout the year the said last mentioned market shall not be held later than two o'clock in the afternoon.

6. *Obstructions by carts, &c.*—Any person resorting to the said market who shall keep any cart, wheelbarrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market, contrary to the directions of the inspector, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

7. *Other obstructions.*—Any person who shall place any produce, article, or thing whatsoever, so as to obstruct any thoroughfare in the said market, and shall neglect or refuse

to remove the same on being required so to do by the inspector, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

8. *Damaging stalls, &c.*—Any person who shall drive any nail, hook, or peg, into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of, or otherwise damage, any market building, stall, shed, or standing, or in anywise fit up, alter or enclose the same without the consent or contrary to the directions of the inspector, neglect or refuse to take down any hook, nail, pen, or fittings in his or her stall, when required by the inspector so to do, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

9. *Using stalls, &c., without permission.*—Any person who shall use or occupy any building, shed, stall, or standing, without the permission of the inspector shall on conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

10. *Throwing rubbish, &c., into stalls, &c.*—Any person who shall sweep or throw, or cause to be swept or thrown, any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the stalls, sheds, streets, gutters or footways, of the said market, and shall allow the same to remain shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

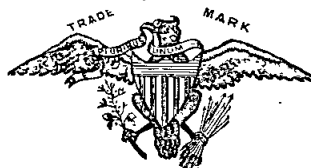
