I, WILLIAM McCREA, being the chief medical officer in attendance on the execution of Basileo Bondietti at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Basileo Bondietti at the said gaol, and I further certify and declare that the said Basileo Bondietti was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Central Criminal Court at Melbourne, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this eleventh day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

We do hereby testify and declare that we have this day been present when the extreme penalty of the law was carried into execution on the body of Basileo Bondietti, convicted at the Central Criminal Court held at Melbourne on the fifteenth day of November last and sentenced to death, and that the said Basileo Bondietti was, in pursuance of the said sentence, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

EXAMINATION FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Examiners for candidates intending to qualify as surveyors authorized to effect surveys for the Government of Victoria, which has been appointed in connection with the department of Lands and Survey, hereby notifies that the next Examination will be held in the Office of the Department of Lands and Survey, commencing on Thursday the 18th January next.

No candidate will be allowed to present himself for examination unless he produces evidence that he has been engaged for at least eighteen months in practical surveying in the field, the last twelve under a duly qualified surveyor recognised by the Department and constantly engaged in selection and departmental surveys.

Candidates will be required to give at least fourteen days' notice of their wish to present themselves for examination, enclosing with said notice the necessary certificate from a qualified surveyor, copies of any testimonials they may have, and a specimen of their drawing. (If original testimonials are forwarded they will be returned after the examination is completed.)

The Board will, at least seven days before the date fixed for the commencement of the examination, inform intending candidates whether they will be allowed to come up for examination or not, and they (candidates) must then pay the required fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

Candidates must be provided with the following:—A book of logarithms, a 40 and 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, pencil, and all necessary appliances for plan drawing.

All applications must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 4th January 1877.
