WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things altering, for the purpose of adjusting, the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was further enacted that any error in any Order under Part I. of the said Act, or under any of the analogous provisions of the Acts thereby repealed, might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order; and whereas errors have occurred in the descriptions of the boundaries of the Shires of Maldon and Marong in the Second Schedule to the above recited Act; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter, adjust, and rectify

the boundaries of the said Shires of Maldon and Marong, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF MALDON.—Commencing at a point on the Loddon River where the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Laanecoorie abuts thereon; thence east by a line passing through the centre of that road to the Melbourne and Sandhurst Railway; thence south-easterly by that railway to a point in line with the north boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence east by a line and the said boundary to Barker's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the north boundary of the town of Harcourt; thence west and south by the boundaries of that town to Barker's Creek aforesaid; thence again by that creek downwards to the north boundary of the borough of Castlemaine; thence west and south by the boundaries of that borough to the south-west angle thereof; thence west by a line to the west boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; thence by that boundary to a point in line with the centre of the road forming the boundary between allotments 23 and 27 of section 8, parish of Muckleford; thence west by a line passing through the centre of that road to the road forming the west boundary of allotments 7 and 10 of section 8a; thence westerly by a line to the south-east angle of the parish of Maldon; thence west by the south boundary of that parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence south to the Loddon River aforesaid; thence by that river downwards to the road forming the south boundary of allotment 6 of section 1A, parish of Baringhup; thence west by that road to the main road from Maldon to Carisbrook; thence south-westerly by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 18 n of section 3, parish of Eddington; thence north by that allotment and allotments 16 n, 15 a, and 15 b, to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence west by that allotment, allotment 15 a, and the north boundary of the parish of Carisbrook to the Tullaroop or Deep Creek; thence by that creek to its junction with the Loddon River aforesaid; and thence again by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF MARONG.—Commencing at a point on the Loddon River where the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Laanecoorie abuts thereon; thence magnetic east by a line passing through the centre of that road to the Melbourne and Sandhurst railway; thence northerly by that railway to the southern boundary of the City of Sandhurst; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that city to the southern angle of the Borough of Eaglehawk; thence by the south-western, western, and northern boundaries of that borough to the eastern angle thereof; thence by the north-western and northern boundaries of the aforesaid City of Sandhurst to the Bendigo Creek; thence by that creek downward to the road forming the south boundary of allotment 12 of section 20, parish of Huntly; thence magnetic west by that road and magnetic north by the road forming the west boundary of the said allotment to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 15; thence northerly by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 125, parish of Kilmara-rooka; thence west by the south boundary of that parish and of the parish of Tandra and a road to the west boundary of the parish of Yallock; thence south by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 5 of section 15, parish of Salisbury; thence west by a road to the Loddon River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of continuous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas, by an Order in Council made on the thirteenth day of September 1875, the boundaries of the Shires of Ararat, Ripon, and Stawell were altered, adjusted, and rectified: And whereas it is expedient still further to alter and adjust the boundaries of the Shires of Ararat and Stawell: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter, adjust, and rectify the boundaries of the said Shires of Ararat and Stawell, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF ARARAT.—Bounded by a line commencing at the south-west angle of the township of Crowlands; thence in a direct line west, magnetic, to the intersection of the western boundary of the allotment selected by William Price, in the parish of Crowlands; thence south by the road to the north

boundary of the parish of Dunneworthy; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said parish to its intersection by the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence westerly and south-westerly by the said county boundary to the range which divides the waters of the Mount William and Concongella creeks; thence north-westerly by that range to the trigonometrical station; thence by a direct line for Hall's Gap to the intersection of the eastern boundary of the parish of Bellellen; thence southerly by that parish boundary to the south-east angle of said parish; thence by the south boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence north by its west boundary to the intersection of the before-described direct line between the trigonometrical station on the range dividing the waters of Mount William and Concongella creeks and Hall's Gap; thence west by that line direct to Hall's Gap; thence west to the crest of the Grampian Range; thence southerly by the said range and the western boundary of the county of Ripon to the south-west angle of said county; thence easterly by the southern boundary of said county to the intersection of the line of telegraph from Hexham to Beaufort; thence north-easterly by the telegraph line to the southern boundary of the parish of Moallaack; thence north to the south-east corner of allotment 4 b, section 13, of the said parish; thence northerly by a one-chain road to the Fiery Creek; thence up that creek to the junction of the Middle Creek; thence up the Middle Creek to its intersection by the southern boundary of the main road from Ballarat to Ararat; thence by a direct line bearing north-west, magnetic, to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence north-easterly by the said county boundary to the central source of the River Wimmera; thence down said river to the south boundary of the township of Crowlands; and thence west by said boundary to the commencing point—excluding the borough of Ararat.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.
