FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Thursday the first day of February next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Thursday the first day of February next ensuing until Tuesday the sixth day of March in the present year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

ARAFURA SEA.

The following information relating to Arafura Sea, the north, north-west, and west coasts of Australia, has been derived from various documents recently received in the Hydrographic Office 1876.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1876.]

Ki Islands $2^{\circ}30'$ easterly. Dampier Archipelago $1^{\circ}30'$ westerly. Port Darwin $1^{\circ}40'$ easterly. Champion Bay 5° westerly.

Arrow Islands.—*Trangan Island.*—A dangerous reef is said to exist about 8 miles from the S.W. point of Trangan Island.¹

² *Ki Islands.*—*Margaretha Harbor.* situated about 5 miles to the southward of Ki Doulan village, on the west side of Ki Doulan Island, is a capacious and well-sheltered harbor formed by Ki Doulan, Letman, and Oboor islands; the best anchorage is off Tuallah village, in 7 to 11 fathoms good holding ground.³

The passage leading from Margaretha Harbor to the southward, between Letman and Ki Doulan, is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length, and from 1 to 3 cables wide, with depths of 24 to 24 fathoms.

Directions.—Vessels entering Margaretha Harbor from the northward should steer in with Buket Kalamit (197 feet high), in line with Buket Krain, bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., until Loobi Rock bears east, whence a S. by W. course for $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles will lead to the anchorage off Tuallah.

AUSTRALIA.—NORTH COAST.⁵

Labyrinthian Shoals are a cluster of sand banks situated about 34 miles N.W. by W. from West Island, Sir Edward Pellew group, on the west side of Carpentaria Gulf. The two largest banks are above water, having on them a few bushes. It is safer to pass outside than inside these shoals, and not nearer than to a depth of 6 or 7 fathoms.

Maria Island. 180 feet high, on the south side of Limmen bight, can be approached apparently with safety from the southward, and from the eastward; but there is a rock said to exist about 11 miles E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from the S.E. point of the island.⁶

Anchorage.—Good anchorage can be obtained during the S.E. monsoon, with the S.W. point of Maria Island, bearing E.S.E.; and during the N.W. monsoon, with the S.W. point bearing N.W.

Water may be obtained during the dry season by digging on the western slopes of Maria Island.

Roper River.—The entrance to Roper River is situated at the head of Limmen bight, and may be recognized by a remarkable bluff named Gulnare, 136 feet high, terminating a range of hills to the northward of the river. There is a depth of 17 feet water, with Gulnare bluff bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. distant about 13 miles, and the entrance to Roper River W. by N., 3 miles.

The natives in the vicinity of Roper River are theivish and treacherous.

Fresh water can be obtained in Roper River during ebb tides, about 40 or 45 miles from the entrance; and firewood is plentiful in all parts.

Low Rock. formerly supposed to lie 14 miles north of Maria Island, Limmen bight, is said by Captain Lowrie, of the telegraph department steam vessel *Young Australian*, to lie 16 miles from that island.

Groote Eylandt. about 520 feet high, is situated about 60 miles north-east of Roper River entrance, and appears safe to approach from the eastward, but there are rocky islets and ledges off the north coast; and a dangerous cluster of rocky islets and reefs near Cape Beatrice, the S.E. point of Groote Eylandt, lying in a south-east and southerly direction from the cape. A reef is said to exist a considerable distance to the south of this reef which was formerly supposed to be the outer danger off Cape Beatrice.

North-east Isles are two small isles off the north coast of Groote Eylandt, the peaks of the larger of which is about 150 feet high.

Loerie Channel. about 20 miles to the westward of Groote Eylandt, lies between Bickerton island and the main land,

having depths of 7 to 5 fathoms, and is said to be a safe channel; but Warwick channel, between Bickerton Island and Connexion Island, 4 miles to the west of it, is not recommended.

Cape Wessel. 180 feet high, is the north-east extremity of Wessel group, and the N.W. point of Carpentaria Gulf; to the westward of the cape there is a sandy beach, and to the eastward there are red cliffs, off which the sea breaks heavily.

Cadell Strait. the west entrance to which is situated about 90 miles to the south-westward of Cape Wessel, and 10 miles east of Castlereagh Bay, is formed by Elcho Island and Napier Peninsula. The eastern entrance of the strait is obstructed by a dangerous rocky bar, with only 3 feet water in some parts; from the west entrance a bar having about 3 fathoms on it, extends about 3 miles, a good mark for recognizing which is Sandy Island, lying about 3 miles north-westward of the entrance. Sandy Island is composed of rock, situated on a sand bank which covers at high tide.

Cadell Strait is navigable about two-thirds of its length from the westward, and is said to afford a landlocked anchorage, capable of accommodating a large number of vessels.

Goulburn Islands are situated about 120 miles to the westward of Cadell Strait. The eastern coast of the northern island is low, and the tides in its vicinity are said to be strong and irregular.

Bowen Strait lies between Croker Island, on the west side of Mountnorris Bay, and the main land. The centre of Valentia Island, on the east side of Mountnorris Bay, kept on an E. by N. bearing astern will lead to the eastern entrance of Bowen Strait; the channel is broad and apparently safe for vessels drawing 15 feet water. There is said to be $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms least water N.E. of the shoals in the middle of Bowen Strait.

Port Essington.—During the S.E. monsoon good anchorage may be obtained between Smith and Black points, east side of entrance to Port Essington.

The natives will point out where fresh water may be found in the vicinity of this anchorage.

Currents.—Off Vashon Head, the west entrance point of Port Essington, the current sets to the westward between the months of March and October, increasing in strength towards Danger Point, the west entrance point of Bowen Strait, the direction of the current changes with the monsoon, average rate being one knot an hour.

Between Vashon Head and Cape Don, the east entrance point of Dundas Strait, dangerous reefs extend some distance from the shore, and the tides in that vicinity are strong and irregular, causing heavy overfalls and eddies.

Dundas Strait.—*Tides.*—The tides in Dundas Strait are irregular, and during springs run with great strength. As the flood stream comes from the eastward through this strait, and from the westward between Vernon islands, it appears probable the meeting of these tides takes place somewhere to the northward of Cape Hotham, south side of Van Diemen Gulf; the uncertainty, however, of this position renders the navigation of this part of the coast somewhat difficult.

Clarence Strait.—From Cape Gambia the south extreme of Melville Island (west side of Van Diemen Gulf), shoal water appeared to extend some distance in a south-westerly direction, 3 fathoms being obtained from the *Beagle* with the cape bearing N. by E. distant 5 miles; great care is therefore necessary when navigating Clarence Strait, especially in the channel north of Vernon islands.

Vernon Islands.—A red buoy, with triangle and ball, lies in 74 fathoms water, off the east end of East Vernon Island. Vessels from the north-eastward bound through the channel between East and South-west Vernon islands, should give the buoy off the East Island a berth of about 2 cables, and steer to the southward until the red buoy off the west point of East Island appears well open south of the island, thence proceed through the channel, taking care to avoid Henry Ellis Reef off the north-west point of South-west Island, which is nearly awash at low water.

Caution.—The channel between East and North-west Vernon islands is not recommended.

Port Darwin.—King's Table Hill, 194 feet high, twice its width open east of Table Head, is a good leading mark into port Darwin, and when Emery Point bears east steer for the anchorage off Fort Hill.

The best anchorage will be obtained in 8 fathoms, with Fort Hill bearing N.W. by W.

A mud flat, which dries at low-water springs, extends half a mile in a W.S.W. direction from the settlement.

Water, but not of a good quality, may be obtained from Peel's Well, about a mile N.W. from the settlement. The settlers depend principally on water collected during the rainy season.

*Tien-Tsin Harbor or Port Walcot.*¹⁰ situated about 4 miles to the southward of Cape Lambert, affords no shelter with easterly winds, and a heavy sea rolls in occasionally.

The pearl fishing vessels visiting Tien-Tsin harbor have to lie up a small creek, where they ground every tide on a rocky bottom.

On Jarman Island, south side of the entrance to Port Walcott, there is a beacon, which forms a good mark for recognizing the port.

Supplies.—Fresh beef and mutton, of good quality, can be obtained at Port Walcott; other supplies can be procured, but are expensive.

Cape Lambert.—The passage between Cape Lambert and Bezout Isle is reported unsafe, except for small boats.

Port Robinson.¹¹ about 10 miles westward of Cape Lambert, is a small but secure harbor (often used as a port of refuge by the pearl fishing vessels), lying about 4 miles eastward of Nickol Bay, and is reported by the pearl fishers as a better harbor than Tien-Tsin, the tides not being so strong, and the bottom sand and mud.

Port Robinson may be recognized from seaward by Roebourne Gap, which is remarkable, about three-quarters of a mile to the westward of it.

The country between this harbor and Roebourne (Port Walcott) is flat, with a road to within 3 miles of the landing place.

Directions.—A round green hill with dark red hills behind it, bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., leads through the best channel, in 12 feet water, into Port Robinson, where a vessel may anchor, in about 9 feet, a quarter of a mile inside the rocks at the entrance.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, in Port Robinson, at 11h. 15m.; springs rise 19 feet.

Soundings.—Between Port Robinson and Nickol Bay, at a distance of 3 or 4 miles from the shore, there are depths of 2 to 4 fathoms, and about 5 miles N. by W. from the entrance of the harbor lies a patch of rocks on which the sea breaks.

Monsoons.—In Carpentaria Gulf the S.E. monsoon sets in about the end of March, blowing with considerable force during July, August, and part of September; in October it becomes more easterly, and may be said to terminate about the middle of the month, when the N.W. monsoon and wet season commence: the seasons, however, vary. Heavy gales, sometimes cyclonic in character, occur in November and December, and heavy squalls take place occasionally during the period of the N.W. monsoon. On the coast, between capes Wessel and Don, the S.E. monsoon becomes unsteady and light, and often veers to E.N.E. towards the end of October. At Dundas Strait N.W. winds sometimes occur as early as September. Generally the S.E. monsoon lasts longer to the eastward than to the westward.¹²

DAMPIER ARCHIPELAGO.¹³

Delambre Island.—The encircling reef, formerly supposed to extend only $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Delambre Island, the easternmost of Dampier Archipelago, is said to extend beyond that distance, therefore vessels should approach this island with caution.

Flying Foam Passage, which is bounded on the north by Legendre Island, on the east by Dolphin Island, and on the west by Gidley and Angel islands, is about 4 cables wide, having a channel of 4 to 6 fathoms deep, with steep coral reefs, and several rocks wash at half-tide on each side. Between Gidley and Angel islands, also between Dolphin Island and the main land, there are boat passages; the latter passage cannot be recommended, as it contains numerous rocks, and the deepest water being, about 3 fathoms, close to Pelican rock.

At the south entrance of Flying Foam Passage there is a dangerous reef on which the sea only breaks at intervals, extending about one mile from the south point of Angel Island. There is also a small sandy island lying to the southward of this entrance, having a spit, which dries only at low water, extending from it towards the main land, with a deep channel between the spit and main.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, in Flying Foam Passage, at about 11h. 30m.; springs rise 16 to 17 feet. The tidal streams run strong through the passage during spring tides, and meet abreast the boat passage between Gidley and Angel islands.

Hampton Harbor.—Between the largest Intercourse Island (situated in the south-west entrance of Mermaid Strait) and the mainland, is formed Hampton Harbor which affords a well-sheltered anchorage in 3 fathoms, bottom sand and mud, with the centre of the island bearing north, distant about half a mile.

From the eastern point of the largest Intercourse Island, a ridge of rocks extends in an E.N.E. direction, and a rock which dries only at low-water springs lies midway between the largest Intercourse Island and the small island in the north entrance of Hampton Harbor; from this small island a sandbank and reef extend S.S.W. about three-quarters of a mile.

The passage westward of the largest Intercourse Island, leading to Hampton Harbor, is only suitable for boats.

About 2 miles south-west of Hampton Harbor there is a chain of islands extending about 6 miles in a south-westerly direction; these islands are separated from the mainland by shallow creeks.

Lewis Isle.—The valley formerly supposed to lie in a N.W. and S.E. direction across Lewis Isle, on the west side of Mermaid Strait, has been found to be a shallow boat channel.¹⁴

NORTH-WEST COAST.

Victoria Rock, on which the schooner *Victoria* struck in 1875, lies N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., 12 miles from Cape Preston, and N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. four miles from Sandy Island.

Fortescue River, situated about 14 miles to the south-west of Cape Preston, is navigable for vessels of moderate draught for a distance of about one mile from the entrance, and fresh water may be obtained about 2 miles further up the river.

From the entrance of Fortescue River Cape Preston is in line with the small mangrove island lying about 5 miles to the southward of the cape.

Barrow Island.¹⁵—The reef extending from Barrow Island towards the mainland is 14 miles long in a S.S.E. direction. It is of a dark color, and not easily distinguished at a distance, except on its west side during strong sea breezes when the sea breaks in 2 fathoms.

There are two islets off the south-west point of Barrow Island, with sheltered anchorage between the northern of the two and the south-west point of Barrow Island. This anchorage is difficult of access on account of the reefs, extending across the entrance, which can only be crossed at high-water.

Water.—Good fresh water may be obtained at this anchorage from a creek in Barrow Island.

Great Sandy or Beagle Islands,¹⁶ three in number, are connected with each other by a reef. From the N.E. island, which is rocky, the reef extends south to the middle island (a small sandy cay), thence in a south-westerly direction to the S.W. or largest island; from the south-west point of this island a reef extends about half a mile.

Anchorage.—Good anchorage, sheltered from the prevailing winds, may be obtained at Great Sandy islands, in 4 to 5 fathoms, sandy bottom, with the south-west point of the largest island bearing W.S.W.

Mary Ann Group consists of eight small islands, the greater number of which are composed of sand, some being fringed with reefs and others partially so. The passages between these islands are dangerous on account of the numerous sandbanks and shoals that exist.

A dangerous reef, on which the sea breaks heavily at times, extends in a northerly direction from the north-west island, and the uneven bottom in the vicinity of this reef causes heavy overfalls with the ebb tide during the sea breeze.

Tides.—Between the reefs extending from the north-west island of Mary Ann group, and from Barrow Island, the tides run at the rate of 3 knots during springs.

Port Weld, situated about 15 miles S.S.W. from Great Sandy Island, is formed by a small indentation in the coast line and Kate Kearney Island (a small mangrove island), in latitude $21^{\circ} 28' S.$, longitude $115^{\circ} 27' E.$ (approximate), and affords good anchorage in 2 fathoms, bottom sand and mud, sheltered from all winds except from the northward.

Tides.—It is high-water, full and change, at Port Weld about noon; springs rise 10 to 12 feet.

Water.—Brackish water may be obtained from a creek about 2 miles to the eastward of Port Weld.

Thevenard Island,¹⁶ lying W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., 35 miles from Port Weld, and formerly supposed to be about 3 miles long, is reported to be 7 or 8 miles long in east and west direction.¹⁷

Beadon is in latitude $21^{\circ} 35' S.$, longitude $115^{\circ} 1' E.$ (approximate). Vessels should anchor in 2½ fathoms, about a mile from the shore near the mouth of a small creek, with Direction Island bearing north; the bar to the creek is shallow, but inside there is a depth of 2 fathoms, where boats can lie in safety.

Good fresh water may be obtained from wells dug in the sand, just over the ridge of sand hills.

The small creek at Beadon, and Curlew Creek, about 7 miles to the south-west of it, are said to be mouths of the Ashburton River.

Tides.—It is high water, full and change, at Beadon, about 4h. 30m.; springs rise 7 or 8 feet.

Winds and Weather.—On the N.W. coast of Australia, during the summer months, especially in January and February, the sea breeze commences about 10 a.m., blows strong from S.W. to W.N.W. all day, and sometimes until midnight. When the wind backs to the northward it blows stronger; and about 4 or 5 p.m. the clouds generally become heavy over the land, with frequent lightning, and occasionally break over the coast line, with a heavy squall, about 7 or 8 p.m.

Lieutenant F. J. Rendell, H.M.S. *Beagle*, remarks, that between November 1873 and March 1874 the temperature was 92° in the day and 88° in the night, but the air is so dry that the heat is not oppressive; the climate is healthy, but the scarcity of water prevents the growth of vegetables.

During this season hurricanes have been experienced, but they do not appear to extend over a large area, nor to be of long duration. In November 1871 a hurricane destroyed all the houses at Roebourne, but was scarcely felt at De Grey River, 120 miles to the eastward, and Fortescue River about 80 miles to the westward, of Roebourne.

Tides.—In the vicinity of the numerous islands near the N.W. coast of Australia, in some parts the stream turns at half tide, rendering it difficult to distinguish between the flood and ebb; caution is therefore necessary in navigating this part of the coast to avoid being set on sand banks or reefs.

The rise and fall of tide gradually decreases from 18 feet at Port Walcott to 5 or 6 feet at N.W. cape.

WEST COAST.

Sharks Bay.—Water may be obtained in Sharks Bay, on Dirk Hartog Island, at Mr. Von Bibra's station, which is on the second point to the southward of Quoin Bluff; also on the west side of Useless Harbor, where there is a bare sandy patch.

Champion Bay.—Outer knoll buoy, on north end of Moore Point reefs, lies in 5 fathoms, with north extreme of Moore Point bearing S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. $\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

TALLYGAROOONA.—Twenty-four thousand seven hundred acres, more or less, being all the unappropriated Crown lands in the parishes of Kaarimba, Mundoona, Tallygarooona, Congupna, and Shepparton, county of Moira, with the exception of the three portions hereinafter described.—Parish of Kaarimba: Commencing at the point on the Goulburn River where the common boundary of the Kotupna run abuts thereon; thence by that boundary north-easterly to the road from Barmah to Shepparton; thence by that road south-easterly to Daniel Puggan's 19th section holding, No. 38516; thence west by that holding and by a line from the north-west angle of that holding to the south-east angle of J. Stacey's 19th section holding, No. 3688; thence by that holding and W. Purdie's holding and by a line bearing north eighty chains west eighty chains and south about two hundred and eight chains to the river aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point. Parish of Mundoona: Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish; thence by its north boundary bearing east to S. Crozier's 19th section holding; thence by that holding and a line bearing south to the southern boundary of the Strathmerton West run; thence by the southern boundaries of the Strathmerton West and the Strathmerton East runs to the aforesaid boundary of the parish; thence again by that boundary east to a point north of the north-west angle of G.

ALBERT PARK.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ALBERT PARK AND LAKE.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby, in addition to all existing rules and regulations relating to the Albert Park, make the following rules and regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of such park, particularly relating to the lake therein, and for the guidance and observance of licensees and owners of boats and boat-house sites therein:—

1. No boat shall be placed on the lake until permission be given by the Honorable the Minister of Lands.
2. Persons holding licenses for boat-house sites are hereby permitted to place boats, the sole property of the licensees, upon the lake. The owners of other boats must obtain express permission from the Honorable the Minister of Lands.
3. No person will be allowed to convey into or through the park any goods, or materials, or implements of any kind, unless he be the holder of a boat license, or the holder of a license for a boat-house site from the Honorable the Minister of Lands, or be allowed ingress or egress with any articles required for boating purposes.
4. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the lake, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes.
5. All boats shall be moored with flag-stones, or other like moorings, with chain or rope attached, placed so as not to impede or endanger the navigation of the lake.
6. All buildings constructed around the margin of the lake, or in the park, and all piers or jetties constructed in the water, shall be in strict accordance with the plans marked "Albert Park, Nos. 1, 2, and 3" and with the specification attached thereto, deposited in the office of Lands and Survey, unless permission be otherwise given by the Honorable the Minister of Lands and shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the Honorable the Minister of Lands, who shall have power at any time to cancel any license, or to require any building or erection to be altered or removed.
7. No refuse, rubbish, or debris of any kind shall be deposited in, around, or in any way so as to affect the lake, or in any other part of the park.
8. All works or buildings of any kind shall be constructed so as to leave a clear road of thirty-three (33) feet around the margin of the lake.
9. Every boat sailed upon the lake shall have its name painted in legible letters on its stern.
10. Occupants of boat-house sites shall only be allowed to keep for hire, or sailing upon the lake, one boat for every pound sterling paid as rent to the Crown for their boat-house site, and for every boat in excess of this amount such occupants will require to obtain separate licenses, and pay One pound sterling each as license fee.
11. Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any of the foregoing regulations, or who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown Lands or by a constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

- 1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, and his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.
- 2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.
- 3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University; after passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above-named; or produce such a certificate of competency in such subjects from the Board of Education of Victoria as shall satisfy this department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

All pupils must serve three months on probation during which period only half salary will be paid. After probationary period, should the report of the Board of Examiners be unfavorable, the services of the pupil draftsman will be dispensed with without further remuneration.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass eighteen months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

BENDIGO BENEVOLENT ASYLUM (INCORPORATED).

THE following are the Rules and Regulations of the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum (Incorporated):—

OBJECTS.

To relieve the infirm, disabled, or destitute, of all creeds and nations.

- 1st. By receiving and maintaining such as may most require the benefits of the institution.
- 2nd. By giving out-door relief in kind to families and individuals in temporary distress; or, in special cases, a sum or sums of money.
- 3rd. By affording medical assistance and medicines through the establishment of a dispensary or otherwise.
- 4th. By affording facilities for religious instruction and consolation to the inmates of the asylum.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Qualifications and Privileges of Governors.

1. Every donor of £10 (ten pounds), or upwards, shall be a life governor; and every person who shall raise, by one or more collections in one year, the sum of £20 (twenty pounds) or upwards, from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum, and the executor first named in any will proving the same, and paying to the institution a bequest of £50 (fifty pounds) or upwards, shall have all the rights and privileges of a life governor.
2. Every subscriber of £1 (one pound) and upwards, in moneys, shall be an annual governor.
3. Every life governor shall have the privilege of recommending two, and an annual governor of recommending one case in the year. Should the case recommended not receive relief, then the ticket shall be returned.

Powers and Duties of Governors.

4. There shall be on the second Thursday in the month of January of every year a general meeting (of which seven days' previous notice shall be given in one or more of the Sandhurst newspapers) of the governors of the institution, seven to form a quorum; but should seven not be present within half an hour after the time appointed the meeting shall stand adjourned for one week to the same place, and at the same hour—and at such adjourned meeting three shall form a quorum—to be held in the town of Sandhurst, at such place as the committee of management shall appoint, to receive the reports and accounts of the committee and officers, to elect the committee of management, and auditors, for the ensuing year.

5. The committee of management shall consist of twelve governors and the *ex-officio* members, who shall, at the first meeting, elect from their own body their president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary.

6. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected); and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

General Committee.

7. The general committee shall meet at the asylum once in the week, or oftener if necessary, on such day and at such hour as the members may appoint; four to form a quorum. The order of business to be as follows:—To decide upon the admission and discharge of inmates, and applications for out-door and other relief; to receive the reports of the visiting committee, medical officers, superintendent, matron, and collector; to inquire into complaints, and to discuss the reports, if necessary; to see that the duties of the officers and servants are properly performed; and to direct the superintendent to hire and dismiss servants, nurses, and wardsmen.

Monthly Meetings.

8. A meeting of committee, of which four shall form a quorum, shall be held on the second Tuesday in every month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., to enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other necessities, to pass accounts, and to transact the general business of the institution, except applications for relief.

9. The president or, in his absence, the vice-president shall preside at all meetings, both of the committee and governors; but should neither the president or vice-president be present, then the meeting shall elect a chairman from amongst themselves; the chairman at such meeting shall have an additional or casting vote.

10. Should any member of committee be absent for four consecutive meetings, his office shall become vacant.

11. Should any vacancies occur in the committee of management or medical officers, the committee may, at the next monthly meeting, supply such vacancies; and should vacancies occur in the office of auditors, a special meeting of governors shall be called before the end of the year to supply such vacancies.

Special General Meetings.

12. The committee of management may convene a special meeting of governors, at any time, by giving notice at least seven days previously in one or more of the Sandhurst newspapers (the last insertion to be on the day of meeting), which shall contain the particular subjects to be brought before such meeting, and none other shall be discussed thereat. Any twelve governors may request the committee to call a special meeting at any time; and should the committee, after receiving such requisition, signed by twelve or more governors, refuse or neglect to call such meeting within seven days, then any twelve governors shall have power to convene such meeting upon giving notice as directed above.

Secretary.

13. The secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, and bring all business before the same.

Treasurer.

14. The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct, to the credit of the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by drafts on the bank, which shall be countersigned at the meeting by the chairman and secretary. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid, and report the same to each monthly meeting of the committee, and shall present a financial report to the Annual General Meeting of Governors, the same being previously examined and signed by the auditors.

Auditors.

15. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

Collector.

16. The collector, on appointment, shall give such security as the committee deem sufficient for the due performance of his duty. He shall pay to the treasurer weekly all sums that he may have collected, and furnish a report of the same to the committee at each weekly meeting.

17. The committee may frame such regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper government of the institution in its different departments, they not being repugnant to the bye-laws.

Altering Rules.

18. No bye-law, involving any of the general principles of the institution, shall be altered or repealed, except at a special meeting of contributors; and no such bye-law shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a meeting of governors specially convened for that purpose, and published in the *Government Gazette*, in accordance with clause 7 of the Act of Incorporation.

Electing to Appointments.

19. That in electing to the appointment of officers by the committee, when there are more applicants than required, the voting shall take place by ballot. In all cases the salary or wages of such appointment shall be determined before proceeding to the election.

Miscellaneous.

20. That no application for admission to the asylum, or for out-door relief, be received without the ordinary form being filled up and signed by a governor, accompanied with a governor's ticket, except in special cases.

Tenders.

21. Tenders for all supplies shall be invited for such period as the committee may determine upon, and the particulars of all tenders shall be duly recorded in the minute book. No member of the committee of management shall supply any article for the use of the institution for which he shall receive pecuniary or other compensation.

Visiting Committee.

22. The house visiting committee, consisting of three members, shall be elected every three months by and from the committee of management.

Duties of the Visiting Committee.

23. It shall be the duty of the visiting committee, or one of its members, to visit the asylum at least once a week, to inspect the several wards, and to report thereon at the weekly meetings of committee; also, to offer any suggestion as to the necessary repairs, alterations, and improvements, or general management of the institution.

Internal Government of the Asylum.

24. The superintendent shall have the charge, control, and management of the institution, and of the inmates and hired servants thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the committee.

25. Neither the superintendent nor the matron shall be absent from the institution between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m., nor for more than two hours at any other time (except on Sundays for three hours), without the permission of the committee.

26. Any inmate behaving in a disorderly manner, or introducing or having in his or her possession spirituous liquors, shall be forthwith reported to the committee, and will be liable to be dismissed; or any inmate leaving the premises without permission, or who having obtained such, and returning intoxicated, shall not be re-admitted, without the sanction of the committee. All inmates considered capable are to give their services under the direction of the superintendent, either in the work of the house, grounds, or otherwise, or be liable to be dismissed by the committee.

27. Any inmate being guilty of improper or rude behaviour, or of using indecent or profane language, or defacing or injuring the property of the institution, or neglecting to obey the directions of the medical officers, superintendent, or matron, shall be forthwith reported to the committee, and be liable to dismissal.

Religious Instruction.

28. The inmates of the institution shall be at liberty to receive, at any time, religious instruction and consolation from the minister of the congregation and denomination to which they belong, and such minister shall have access to the institution at any time; but the committee shall appoint such times as may be most convenient for public worship or service being held in the institution.

Duties of the Superintendent.

29. He shall visit and report upon the out-door cases for relief, under the direction of the committee. He shall have power to suspend servants for gross misconduct, until the next meeting of committee.

30. He must keep an exact inventory of all the goods belonging to and in the asylum, and shall present a report to the committee at the first meeting of January and July of each year.

31. He shall keep a register of the cases treated by the medical officers, a periodical abstract of which he shall prepare, to be laid before the committee half-yearly, embracing the numbers, diseases, and results. On the admission of applicants into the asylum, he shall write the name, age, and date of admission, &c., on a card to be kept suspended over the bed. He shall keep a book in which he shall insert the name of every inmate for whom the medical officers shall have prescribed either wines, spirits, ale, or stout, the name of the medical officer who has ordered the same, and the precise quantity ordered each day; which book he shall lay before the committee at their usual weekly meetings. He shall keep such medical books and papers as the medical officers may require for the use of their department. He shall examine, both as to quantity and quality, all supplies, and enter an account thereof in the supply book, which shall be laid before the committee monthly. He shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of inmates, and also of all out-door alms-people, the nature of the relief given, and period of its continuance, in the register book.

32. He shall keep a diet book, according to the dietary of the committee and according to the orders of the medical officers as to the sick inmates, so as to exhibit the individual and aggregate consumption of provisions. He shall regularly visit every part of the institution connected with the men's department daily, to enforce proper order and cleanliness.

33. He shall report all disorder, neglect, and misconduct to the next ensuing meeting of committee.

Matron.

34. The matron shall superintend and daily visit the apartments of the female inmates, and maintain order and cleanliness therein, and furnish an inventory of all articles, and report monthly to the committee on the condition of her department.

35. The superintendent and matron shall respectively preside at the meal tables of the male and female inmates, and duly say grace before and after meals.

Attendants.

36. The wardsmen and wardswomen shall carefully keep clean their respective wards, and attend to the inmates therein who may be sick, according to the directions of the medical officers, superintendent, or matron.
