EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE subjoined Regulations are published for general information.

SIR,—I transmit to you, at the request of the Civil Service Commissioners, the enclosed Regulations for an examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, which is to be held in April 1878.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF EASTER 1878.

N.B.—The Regulations are applicable to this Examination only.

1. On April 9th, 1878, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal; for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces; for that of Madras; and for that of Bombay. Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination, must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of February 1878, evidence showing:—

(a) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(b) That his age on the 1st March 1878, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years. [N.B.—In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided.]

(c) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(d) That he is of good moral character.

He must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the Examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the certificate of qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

* The total (1000) marks may be obtained by adequate proficiency in any two or more of the five branches of science included under this head.

Candidates are at liberty to name, before February 1st 1878, any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a *competent knowledge* of that subject.

¹ The number of appointments to be made, and the number in each Presidency, &c., will be announced hereafter. It will probably be about half the usual number.

² Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st January 1878.

³ The fee for this examination will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to candidates.

⁴ Nothing can be further from our wish than to hold out premiums for knowledge of wide surface and of small depth. We are of opinion that a candidate ought to be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer.—Report of Committee of 1854. A deduction of marks will be made under each subject, including Mathematics.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the selected candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the candidate next in order of merit and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected candidate. A selected candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected candidates before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that service.

12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W., from whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained.

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

1. Selected candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed, but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement, should the Secretary of State or Government of India deem it necessary.

2. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India before he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

3. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

4. It is the intention of the Secretary of State to allow the sum of £50 after each of the three first half-years of probation, and £150 after the last half-year to each selected candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

5. All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. For a candidate under age a surety will be required.

6. After passing the final examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants. The stamps payable on these documents amount to £1.

¹ Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.

² Including, besides the languages prescribed for the several Presidencies, such other languages as may, with the approval of the Commissioners, be taken up as subjects of examination.

³ This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the open competition is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1880 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

Form of Application; to be filled up by Candidates.

¹ If a General Register Office certificate can not be obtained, the instructions printed on the other side will show what evidence should be supplied. If evidence is already in the hands of the Commissioners, strike out "A certificate of my birth," and insert "Evidence is already in the possession of the Commissioners."

² The terms indicated by the marks of quotation must appear in the certificate, which must be given after personal examination, and bear date not earlier than 1st January 1878.

³ Two testimonials must be sent, bearing date not earlier than 1st January 1878. One of them should be given by an intimate acquaintance (not a relative) of not less than three or four years' standing; the other, if the candidate has recently left school, should be given by his late schoolmaster, or, if he has had employment of any kind, by his late employer. If the candidate has been at any University, he should send a certificate of good conduct from his college tutor.

⁴ If mathematics be named, state whether pure or mixed, or both are intended; if natural science be mentioned, state which branches.

EVIDENCE OF AGE TO BE REQUIRED FROM CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

I.—Every candidate born in England or Wales should produce a certificate from the Registrar-General of Births, Marriages, and Deaths, or from one of his provincial officers. This certificate may be obtained at Somerset House, or from the Superintendent Registrar of the district in which the birth took place.

II.—A candidate who is a native of India must have his age certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which he may have resided.

III.—Every other candidate *not producing the certificate mentioned in clause I*, must prove his age by statutory declaration, and should also, if possible, produce a record of birth or baptism from some official register, under which term may be included the parochial registers of baptisms, the non-parochial registers of baptisms and births deposited at Somerset House under Acts of Parliament, the register kept at the India Office of persons born in India, &c., &c. This regulation applies—

- To all candidates not born in England or Wales.
- To candidates who, though born in England or Wales, cannot produce the Registrar-General's certificate.

The Civil Service Commissioners reserve to themselves the right of deciding in each case upon the sufficiency of the evidence produced, but they subjoin the following general rules for the guidance of candidates:—

(a.) The declaration should specify precisely the date and place of birth, and should, if possible, be made by the father or mother of the candidate. If made by any other person, it should state the circumstances which enable the declarant to speak to the fact. If an entry in a Bible or other family record be referred to, the Bible or other record must be produced at the time of making the declaration, and must be mentioned in the declaration as having been so produced.

(b.) If the candidate was born in England or Wales, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no entry has been found in the books of the Registrar-General; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(c.) If no extract from any register is produced, the declaration must contain a statement, that after due inquiry no such record is believed to exist; or a separate declaration must be made to that effect.

(d.) Statutory declarations must be exactly in the form prescribed by the Act of 5 and 6 William IV., c. 62. A printed form, if required, will be supplied on application to the Civil Service Commissioners.

N.B.—Clergymen, as such, are not qualified to take declarations.

THE FISHERIES ACT 1873.

It is hereby notified for general information, in accordance with the provisions of *The Fisheries Act 1873*, that it is intended at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice appearing in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council, by Proclamation to be published in the *Gazette*, under the powers conferred by the 37th clause, to repeal the Proclamation dated 22nd January 1877 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd February, and to declare and define the mouth of the River Yarra, within which nets and fixed engines may not be used, to be as follows, viz.:—Within a line drawn from the end of the Railway Pier, Williamstown, N.W. to the Red Beacon Light at the entrance to the River Yarra; and from thence N. & W. to a post on the north or Sandridge shore. The bearings are magnetic.

SALE AND USE OF POISONS ACT 1876 (No. 559).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of October 1877.

WHEREAS by the 12th section of *The Sale and Use of Poisons Act 1876*, the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, from time to time, make any regulations as to the sale or custody of poisons or otherwise as to carrying into effect the objects of the said Act; and whereas the said Pharmacy Board of Victoria have recommended to the Governor in Council that the provisions hereinafter mentioned should be made for the purpose of more effectually carrying into effect the objects of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order make the following regulations, that is to say:—

DEALER IN POISONS.

1. Any person not being a legally qualified medical practitioner or a registered pharmaceutical chemist of Victoria, who desires to obtain a certificate to sell poisons under the provisions of the said Act, shall make an application to the Pharmacy Board of Victoria in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule hereto, and shall furnish and forward to the board the information and certificates therein mentioned.

2. The board upon receipt of such application may grant to the person therein named, if it thinks fit so to do, a certificate in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto upon payment to the registrar of the board of a fee of Twenty shillings per annum, or a proportionate part for any period less than a year.

3. Such certificate shall continue in force until the 31st day of December next ensuing the date thereof, and thenceforward upon payment to the registrar of the board for each and every year a fee of Twenty shillings, unless and until such certificate shall have been cancelled by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf.

4. The registrar, upon payment to him of such fees, shall give a printed receipt for each and every fee, and also endorse on the back of such certificate the date of payment and the period for which such fee is paid.

SALE AND CUSTODY OF POISONS.

5. The holder of a certificate to sell Poisons shall keep a book in the form prescribed by the Second Schedule to the *Sale and Use of Poisons Act 1876*, and make such entries therein and take such steps in selling poisons as are required and directed by the provisions of the said Act. The book shall be open for the inspection at any time of the police or of any person authorized by the Board in that behalf.

6. Every holder of a certificate as a dealer in poisons shall provide a cupboard, substantially made, fastened, and secured with a sufficient lock and key. Such cupboard shall be of not less dimensions than two feet six inches wide, one foot six inches deep, and three feet high, and shall be fitted inside with sufficient shelves and divisions to keep each description of poison therein contained in a separate division; and such cupboard shall have the word "Poison" conspicuously painted or written thereon.

7. Every holder of a certificate shall keep the key of such cupboard in his possession; he shall not permit such cupboard to remain open or unlocked, or to be opened by any person except himself; nor shall he authorize or permit any person to handle or sell for him the poisons therein contained; he shall not delegate or entrust any duty, task, or obligation imposed by the said Act in connection with the custody and sale of poisons to any other person under any pretence whatever, but shall perform such duty, task, or obligation himself.

8. In the event of the holder of a certificate becoming incapacitated by absence or illness from attending to the sale of poisons, the Board may authorize some fit and proper person to act as a substitute for such holder of a certificate under such circumstances, and such substitute shall for all purposes in connection with the sale and custody of poison be deemed to be the holder of a certificate, and be personally responsible whilst he is so acting.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove She-oak trees from the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

The unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the counties of Bendigo, Borung, Gladstone, Gunbower, Kara Kara, Moira, Rodney, and Tatchera.—(76.P.518.)
